

All these seemingly contradictory conclusions bring out this fact: Life is evolution; at no place in the travel of the human soul can a line be drawn to prove one right and another wrong. You must have your experience, and I must have mine. If we would truly progress and not be stumbling blocks to others, we must maintain that which has become a law to us and give others the right to their claims, although our views have not one point of mutual contact.

Traveling In The Astral

So MANY readers of THE OCCULT DIGEST have asked for a sane and simple rule which will enable them to understand and enjoy little journeys into what is commonly called the "astral." Accordingly, I am setting forth the results of my own experiences in opening the door to that great unknown world of silence—or the astral vibration—as far as is possible with the limited English at command and the lack of practical comparison which can be made.

To begin with, the great danger of astral traveling does not lie in the traveling. The danger is to the unguarded physical body. Therefore the first step should be to guard the body. See that the heart action is perfect, that the blood stream is pure and the mind at rest, free from worry and care. All fear should be eliminated, the body perfectly relaxed, with the mind keen and alert, so that you may enjoy the journey.

The second great danger is unconscious astral traveling. Demand consciousness. Refuse to sleep or to be entranced. Set your mind against this outrage of your intelligence just as you would against having your eyes blinded and being compelled to look through the eyes of another. Unconscious astral traveling is nothing more nor less than hypnotism in which reflected scenes are thrown onto your mental mirror by a stronger power than your own. Conscious astral traveling is accomplished only after we have mastered the physical emotions and desire to sleep. In conscious astral traveling we attract other minds as companions, rather than as masters of our bodies.

THE real danger lies in the psychic not being protected against the marauding mind which is seeking, ever seeking revenge or more earthly pleasures or experiences.

Conscious astral traveling reduces this danger to a minimum, as one intuitively knows whom to trust and whom not to trust.

In our daily physical travels we are constantly in danger of being overtaken by foes. We are accustomed to these beings and do not fear them, but keep right on our even or uneven way, looking back upon our encounters with them as experiences or lessons.

Let us set out at the beginning to cease thinking that astral traveling is governed or controlled by one group or many of individuals at home or abroad, whether seen or unseen. Astral traveling is mind traveling or thought delving, intense concentration, or uninterrupted meditation. It can be developed just as you train your ears to shut out unwanted noises or your eyes to see only what pleases you to see.

DO NOT desire to travel promiscuously and with companions who choose you against your will or better judgment. Before you even think seriously about your journey, make up your mind how you are going to travel, what realms of thought you are going to visit, and—most important—decide who will accompany you. When your companion presents himself, put him to the acid test unless you are well enough acquainted with him to be sure of his identity. For remember, souls who desire more experiences or who need a vehicle to carry out their purpose are always attracted by the unwary traveler as moths are attracted by a light.

The uninitiated are as great a menace to others in the astral as a drunken driver is to other travelers on the physical highway. We are all astral travelers—all like young birds just leaving the nest, and, like the birds, when strong enough we will overcome our environment and fly, so to speak, from place to place. In other words, we will all be attuned to the universal vibration of soul life and will seek as companions those with whom we are in harmony through thought transference. We will do without the gruesome and crude assistance of the professional hypnotist or controlling spirit guide and the more fantastic, mysterious adept. either of whom is necessary only to those wanting to take the dangerous short cut of unconscious astral travel.

Hypnotism and Suggestion

A Two Part Study

Part I

HE word "hypnotism" is derived from the Greek word "upnos" meaning sleep. But hypnotism is in fact a recent-day name for the science. Through the ages it has been known as Hindu Science, Will Power, Witchcraft, Unnatural Sleep, Psychology, Somnambulism, Mineral Power, Mesmerism, Personal Magnetism, and often as Soul Power.

Although hypnotism is a comparatively new word, the science itself is as old as man. Symbolical figures found in the tomb of Isis in Egypt seem to indicate certain symptoms peculiar to what we now call hypnotism.

Hypnotism has long been known in most oriental countries. The mythology of India depicts Vishnu with fire emanating from his fingertips. But it is only recently that hypnotism has been stripped of all the mysticism that formerly surrounded it. It has been shown that hypnotism is a science based on inexorable laws of our being, and is not a state wrought through some satanic ingenuity of the operator as was formerly supposed.

The time is fast approaching when Americans will lay aside their old skepticism and accept hypnotism at its true evaluation, for it promises a great deal indeed to those suffering from the habitual use of alcohol, morphine, and tobacco.

Since man has a dual character, or that is to say, he possesses two distinct minds which under certain psychological conditions are capable of independent action, it is readily seen that hypnosis is possible. We all know that these two minds exist. I am sure that we have all felt within us a keen perception of truth which was wholly independent of education or the testimony of the bodily senses.

The two minds may well be called the objective and subjective minds, the objective mind the one

> which guides and controls man's material environment, and the subjective the one which takes cognizance of his environment by a method entirely independent of the physical senses. Some call this method "perception by intuition." It is through the subjective mind that hypnotism performs. When a person is in a hypnotic state, it is the intelligence of his subjective mind which is made manifest.

Hypnotism is characterized by a series of phases intimately associated. Hypnotists differ as to the number of phases, some saying that there are four, some seven, and some nine. However, the most important phases or states are (1) hypo-lethargic, (2) lethargic, (3) cataleptic, and (4) somnambulic.

Know The Facts

1 00 long have most of us taken the phrase Hypnotism and Suggestion as a synonym for "danger." And this in spite of the mass of evidence which investigators have piled up in favor of the science as a means of relieving and curing many mental and physical troubles. Perhaps it is because so much has also been written about the evil that is done when a naturally weak subject falls into the hands of an unprincipled operator. However, admitting that hypnotic suggestion is a powerful agent which, if wrongly used, produces extremely harmful results, it would seem only fair to assume that it would produce results beneficial in the same degree if rightly used. The practice of hypnotism and suggestion properly belongs only to able and responsible persons who have made the most thorough preparation for it, but every man and woman should know the outstanding facts about the science which are so clearly set forth here by Mr. Garrison.

THE HYPO-LETHARGIC STATE

THE hypo-lethargic is a state of deepest sleep. Animation is totally suspended. It is clearly a degree of absolute, inert sleep. Sometimes it is hard to tell this state from the lethargic, the only difference being a more marked condition of sleep.

The body organisms are deprived of all power of reaction. Many hypnotists say that the trance of hypo-lethargy may last for days or weeks.

LETHARGY

THIS is closely related to the hypo-lethargic state. There is a great tendency of the muscles to contract under the influence of the slightest pressure, which tendency is termed hyperexcitability. The eyes of the person in the lethargic state either remain closed or half-closed, and the face remains impassive. As a rule the pupils of the eyes are greatly dilated. The eyes themselves are unusually bright. Pressure on the globes of the eyes is often used to bring about the lethargic state, although there are many other methods of producing this state.

The peculiar stage of hyperexcitability is manifested by the rigidity of the muscles under the slightest influence, such as a magnet, friction or massage. This contraction disappears upon repetition of the identical method used to produce it.

An interesting fact is that hermetically sealed tubes of medicine placed upon the neck of a person in the lethargic state will induce emotions peculiar to the drugs used. Thus, alcohol in a tube placed on the neck induces drunkenness; water used this way induces hydrophobia; while ipecac induces vomiting, and so on.

In this state, various emotions may also be induced by the use of colored balls. Dr. Luys uses hollow glass balls colored blue, red, green, or yellow. When a person in the lethargic state opens his eyes and looks at the colored ball, a distinct emotion is manifested. For instance, the blue ball induces terror, the yellow causes laughter. The emotion is the more marked if a larger ball is used. Emotion is also induced under the influence of a magnet. If the hypnotized person grasps the north pole of the magnet, the resulting emotion is joy and mirth, while the south pole is violently repulsed by him.

There are certain points upon the body, such as the arm, back, forehead, and so on, which when pressed induce the lethargic state. These are known as the hypnogenic points. However, some subjects are not susceptible to pressure and it may then tend to waken them.

In the hypno-lethargic state of hypnosis, the most delicate surgical operations are possible, since complete anaesthesia is attained. The patient is made insensible to the pricking of needles or other sharp instruments.

THE CATALEPTIC STATE

I N the scale of the usual hypnotic phases, the cataleptic state is just above the lethargic. The

cataleptic state may be induced either by directly throwing a fully awake subject into it, or by gently lifting the eyes of a patient already in the lethargic state. It may also be induced by the subject's looking at some bright light or by his hearing a sudden sound such as a Chinese gong or the beat of a tomtom. Often I have known a passing vehicle to induce this state.

The cataleptic state is characterized by perfect and complete rigidity of all the muscles, the subject remaining fixed in any position. A look akin to horror is usually to be observed upon the face. If the arm of the patient be raised by the hypnotist, it remains as it is placed. The explanation of this singular phenomenon is that the subject is recipient of the idea of the corresponding attitude. Another feature is imitative speech. Subjects have been known to carry on talk in a foreign language unknown to them in their normal state.

The most marvelous experiment is possible with one in the cataleptic state. This is the rock-breaking test. The patient is put in a cataleptic state and his head placed on the back of one chair, with his feet on another. Passes are made over the body and it remains rigid. A large, heavy rock is then laid on the body. This rock has been known to weigh as much as five hundred pounds. A powerful man then proceeds to break the rock with a large sledge hammer. Usually a command from the hypnotist is sufficient to end the patient's rigidity.

The different emotions in the cataleptic state are plainly influenced by appearances. For instance, if a sad picture is shown the patient, he assumes a sad expression. If the fists are closed, the face assumes an expression of anger. The subject may also reflect impressions of music. Such reactions as these are frequently observed in somnambulists, but I have never known them to attain the degree of intensity shown in the cataleptic reactions discussed above. This, I believe, is due to the fact that cataleptic reactions are caused by the complete transformation of the patient into an absolute automaton.

An even higher degree of automatism than this may be acquired. It is known as initiation-complete. To induce this condition, the subject is caused to look fixedly at the operator. If this is continued for some time, the subject soon becomes unable to direct his gaze elsewhere. He copies the operator's every movement. It is in this sub-phase that the most beautiful attitudes imaginable may be assumed. The attitude of ecstasy, especially, has a most graceful aspect. It seems as though the patient is elevated to greater heights. Apparently he is conscious of melodious sounds and he seems to seize and concentrate them all within himself. It is well to notice that the (Turn to page 26)

AN INQUIRY Into That Very Remarkable Phenomenon-

Memory

By D. W. STARRETT

HERE have been many books written upon the subject of memory. To understand it well, we must know something about the anatomy of the brain. Here we take for authority William Hanna Thompson's book, "Brain and Personality." In this book the brain is divided into the forebrain (or prefrontal area); the sensory brain (or parietal area), the middle top section; the visual (or occipital) area, the extreme back part; and the hearing (or temporal) area, slightly back of and above the ears.

Obviously, there are only three departments through which one may know of conditions outside

of the brain, namely, sensing, seeing, and hearing. All knowledge comes to these departments as vibratory motion. There is no other way by which they may acquire knowledge.

Vibratory motion reaches the departments by way of six openings through the skull, which openings are the ears, eyes, nose, mouth, sensations of the skin, and the great sympathetic nervous system which acts as a wireless antenna. The vibrations which impinge upon the nervous system pass through the solar plexus, thence on to one or all of the three departments mentioned a bove, through the cerebellum—the human phone station—to the brain.

If the vibrations are to be reasoned about, they pass to the forebrain, where they become conscious memory. If they are not to be reasoned about, they pass down through *Broca's Area*, thence to the vocal cords, where they are returned whence they came—the Cosmos. In this latter case they become subconscious memory. Thus, conscious memory is that in which one reasons about the vibrations coming to the forebrain, before they are acted upon; and subconscious memory is that in which the impressions passing through one or all of the three departments are not reasoned about until

they are acted upon. In the first case, one will be correct in his reasoning, on an average of seven times out of ten; in the latter case, one will suffer from the lack of reasoning before performing the actions, on an average of seven times out of ten. Thus it is plain that one should reason, as far as possible, before performing new acts, in order to secure the best success.

It is evident, from these facts about the departments of the brain, that there can be but three kinds of memory, whether conscious or subconscious memory, namely, sensory, seeing, and hearing memories. Under these main memories there

are eight submemories; three in the sensory—taste, touch and odor; two in the seeing—seeing words and objects, and three in the hearing—hearing words, music and objects. It is generally understood that there are five senses, but these facts prove the contrary.

What is memory, and whence does it come?

Conscious memory is the recalling of vibrations which have passed through one or all of the three departments of the brain and which have been reasoned about in the forebrain. Subconscious memory is the recalling of vibrations which have only passed through one or all of the three departments and have gone on to the vocal

cords, through Broca's Area, and were not reasoned about at the time. Here is an example of subconscious memory: A man stands gazing out of the window, but is thinking of an interior problem; his eyes are open, and the light reflecting all objects before them into the brain; hours afterwards, he recalls the getting off the street car of a beautiful young lady, directly in front of his eyes.

All memories are invested in words or signs, for if one loses the ability to use a code, he will entirely lose conscious memory.

Psycho-Symbolism

By EDWARD B. JEFFREY

THE SOCIAL FRAMEWORK

HE capital letter M is a "sign" of sociality, a mixing, meeting, congregating, and so on. It illustrates the tendency of all things in nature with similar objects and aims to congregate in one place or body. It is the fabric on which the whole social scheme is constructed.

This simple diagram is representative of all the "frames" or "skeletons" that support, or elevate a body.

It appears simplicity itself. It is two uprights, and two props, braces, or supports. But not less than two of each will make such "sign," or the "case" it stands for. Roughly, it outlines the "braces" to put over the shoulders. Anatomically, it appears that composite part of the "frame"—the collar bone, shoulder blades, breast, and back. On this swings the whole of the body, just as the braces suspend our pantaloons.

The uprights are as the whalebones that strengthen corsets. They are the uprights on which walls are built. They give strength to withstand shock from without, they tie up the parts within. Incidentally, they produce "form." The braces meet centrally, and tighten both sides. The fabric therefore cannot fall in on itself to chaos, or out of itself to ruin. Such in principle is the picture of any building in outline.

The lack of such frame is readily seen in the tottering walls of an old abbey or in the burnt-out shell of a ruined factory. Houses, churches, and factories, are, however, but a few of the structures made by man. The ship, bridge, car, or loom, each have their waist, buttress, chassis, or frame, with bearings, struts, and stays. They are each built or erected.

In all these fabrics there could be no sort of internal order were there not this organization to admit, enclose, or support it. Short of such, everything would be disorganized. It is this organization—usually based on the skeletons—that divides the higher order of animals from the jellyfish.

In the "ideal signs" the parts fit exactly, and all others must follow suit if they are to support and elevate a body rightly. The object of it is to support a covering and protect the works or workers within. It also indicates an economical fitting together of the parts, so that there is ample room for machinery, without crushing any section of it.

Analyzed, the symbol shows four pen strokes to complete the "sign." Of these, two are the plain figure 1. This signifies that all that is necessary to make a society is two, but the two do not make a society until they meet on a common ground of mutual agreement, and each is shown as meeting the other half way. It indicates that man and woman together were necessary, but all that were necessary, to make the first social meeting.

These gestures of drawing together, assembling, mixing, grouping, banding, in close contact, without losing identity however, is a law of man and beast. It is the herd instinct for mutual support, protection, and well being.

The "sign" shows the frame to be parts joined, hence a composite structure. A crowd of units also forms a composite. This may explain the problem of why one man apart will act far differently from the same man in a mass. In the crowd, should he lose his identity and independence, he becomes but one body or one cell of a whole, and is consequently swayed by the feelings of the mass. It is well known that even a very gentle creature—beast or man—can instantly become a veritable tiger, once he is mixed and identified with a tigerish mob.

It is significant that the letter M or "frame" on which the classification of animal "types" depends, is the "type" standard on which the printer bases his kinds of "type." Each font is ruled by its M or "em."

A "SIGN" OF THE FIRST EMIGRATION

THE symbol N is a diagram representing uniformity, equality, rank or class. It consists of "two units of the same standing." There is no dif-

ference in size, quality, condition, or degree between the two. They are simply two uprights, marks, or figures, not variable in any way. In "mind" they illustrate two states of consciousness, or realization of position. The first is the actual position held, the second the position one is capable of taking on "extending" all his powers. The amount and nature of extension shows the "figure's" possibilities, reach, and limitations. This is when the "sign" is oneself, considered subjectively. Probably only madmen ever extend their powers to the utmost.

The "type" N, the ideal form, signifies that the position of one man in relation to another is uniform—that they both have feet of clay, and stand level. But it also shows that each has the capability to extend his position. At the same time the level is maintained. This points to "rank" and "class" distinctions as having no justification for their existence. The symbol is in this case representing objective thought.

The "ideal" feeling, then, is to consider oneself no better, no worse, or rather neither superior nor inferior to another. On the other hand, it indicates that one man may go further, progress, open out, extend, or move for himself, more than another. But there should be no feeling of pride of triumph, no elation nor superior feeling on account of higher success. After all, N is subjective to M, or the arm or branch is but part of the structure, society or machine.

Anatomically, the outline compares with the *latissimus dorsi* muscle, that is, the arm and forearm, including the shoulder and elbow joints. The "type" portrays the normal state, as the hand raised to the height of the shoulder.

This gesture or raising of the arm is a salute or "sign" of equality among the Fascists. Scouts and guides use a similar movement. Variations inferring superiority on the one hand and inferiority on the other, are the salutes of soldiers to officers; raising one's hat to a lady, or person of rank; or the bishop raising his arm over his congregation; while the king knights a subject with a gesture of arm and sword. The policeman too raises his "arm of the law" as a signal.

Arms made the man at one time. The primitive test of self-safety was the capacity to use the arms, which later were specialized into "arms" or weapons. Heraldry still recognizes "arms" as a distinct "sign" of "rank." "Rank" is indicated in the army on the sleeve and shoulder. By extending his arm, man kept his foes at arm's length, at spear's length, gun shot length, and so on. It enabled him to make way for himself over the land, even as a tree sends out "branches" beyond the "trunk" or "stock."

The process appears a provision of creation to open the "ranks," as soldiers extend the arms in drill to get more ground in which to maneuver.

They thus obtain "elbow room," or a sphere large enough for their future actions. Were this not so, new branches of a family, or new members of one class, would settle or root in one spot and grow too "rank." The young would have no chance to feel their feet, but would live on the strength of the parents, robbing them, yet stunting themselves.

Again, if there were no law limiting growth upwards and outwards, well favored growths would choke out others, or the branches would absorb all the sustenance of the area. They do so as it is, but eventually are checked.

Mechanically, the diagram illustrates the arm or crank of an engine, rotary, or other means of producing perpendicular or horizontal motion. It can bend, turn, or wind, and it extends.

It is like the branch of a business or arm of service. It carries power beyond itself.

THE HUMAN ENGINE

THE capital letter O "represents" one of the mechanical powers. It is a circle, or more nearly an ellipsoid, a "sign" of circulation. It "illustrates" a process of moving round in a prescribed channel. It "signifies" something moving from point to point, or hand to hand, so as to return. It indicates revolution round an axis; a rotary movement, but not making a true wheel or circle in that the diameter varies.

Anatomically, it appears to "stand for" the rotary pump of the body—the heart. As a circulation the blood is propelled from point to point round the body and comes back from the extremities with some of its power exhausted.

Mechanically, it compares with the wheel and axle, or, when the principle is extended, to an engine. The cylinders and tubes remain stationary, but the valves open and close, forcing the stream in one direction. The power is turned into various kinds of action. Afterwards it is drawn back to be reheated and reinforced. Pumping and fire engines are modifications of the same process.

In each case, if the "engine" is "overloaded" with work, or "overcharged" with steam, a "chamber" of the steam vessel, or valve, is liable to burst, leak, or strain. If not repaired immediately it is liable to further damage itself, or it may injure other parts by throwing extra work upon them. The principle underlying the working of each is expansion and compression.

It implies the further principle of radiation from a central point to an outside circumference. Illustrations are the rays of light from the sun; the rays or spokes of a wheel; the diffusion of a liquid, as water from the rose of a watering can. The arteries radiate from the heart, and veins return to it. The metals of a railway radiate from a metropolis, whilst others carry a freight into it.

The Heart Line

HE Heart Line is that line which runs below the mounts, in the upper part of the hand. It usually begins either at some point on or near the Mount of Jupiter or between the index and middle fingers. Sometimes it extends over and rises at some point on or near the Mount of Saturn.

The Heart line indicates (first) the physical state of that organ; (second) the mental characteristics and qualities of the affection as a result of that physical state; (third) events in the love life.

The perfect Heart Line is that which is clean cut, without islands of cross lines, dots or spots; well-colored, not deeply furrowed, and starting either from the Mount of Jupiter or between the index and middle fingers, extending to the percussion or side of the hand. Such a Heart Line indicates a good physical condition of the heart, good circulation, strong affection. Its possessor will have few love affairs, but those he has will affect him deeply. He will have confidence in those he loves, and a disappointment will affect him severely.

The Heart Line may be deep and well-cut, smooth and thin, broad and shallow, or formed of small links like a chain. It may be pink in color, or red, white or yellow.

With the deep, well-cut Heart Line, there is little likelihood of heart disease. One will not make a display of his feelings, will not enjoy great demonstrations from others, will love deeply and consistently but will not wear his heart on his sleeve.

The smooth, thin line indicates egotism, an arid heart, inconstancy at times, and the durations of the affections are shortened. Any display of love that one with such a Heart Line may make will be from a desire to further his own selfish ends.

Where the line is broad and shallow, the heart action will be physically weak and the affections will correspond. One will be sentimental to excess, very emotional, very im-

pressionable, quick to take offense, and of an Every Month for Our Readers—One of These Fine Talks on Palmistry

extremely nervous disposition with regard to everything relating to the sentimental side of the heart action. He is incapable of a lasting affection.

When the line is made up of small links like a chain, the heart action is irregular, the circulation poor, and there is a general poor physical condition of the heart. One with this line thinks he is in love one day, but changes his mind the next. There is no permanent health or affection.

Pink is the best color, for it indicates a good physical condition of the heart, reliability and steadfastness in the affections. Red adds intensity to the heart action and all affairs of the heart. It sometimes shows a heart action so strong as to be dangerous. White indicates a weak physical condition of the heart, and is often a sign of coldness in the affections. Yellow indicates a poisoned state of the heart, adds suspicion and jealousy to love, which often degenerates into tyranny. The yellow Heart Line is less to be depended on than the Heart Line of any other color.

Where the line is blue, it indicates congestion and sluggishness of the heart organ.

When the Heart Line is absent in the hand, it indicates one who is cold-blooded and selfish, one who desires personal success to the detriment of all others. Such a marking should always arouse distrust, as the possessor will be egotistical, faithless, vicious, and take pleasure in ill-doing.

The shorter the Line of Heart, the less the higher sentiments of the affections will manifest themselves.

The double Heart Line is rarely seen, but when it appears, it denotes that one is capable of the greatest devotion in friendship and love. It also denotes a disposition to female maladies.

The Line of Heart may rise from three well-defined positions, (first) the middle of the Mount

of Jupiter; (second) between the first and second fingers; (third) and from the center of the Mount of Saturn.

Rising from the Mount of Jupiter, it indicates idealism in love. One's love is an adoration to him, and love, even with poverty attached, is attractive to him.

When the line begins at the root of the Mount of Jupiter, it foretells losses or misfortune in enterprise. One with this sign should never undertake any speculative enterprise, but be content with sure investments without risks, and business deals which have been studied well.

Rising between the first and second fingers, the line shows the practical, common sense, middle ground of the affections. One is never carried away by sentiment, but views love from a practical standpoint.

Rising from the Mount of Saturn, it indicates love by way of the senses rather than the heart. If one becomes attached to another, the affections will be tinged with the idea of pleasure from the sexual relations.

It should be borne in mind that the perfect Heart Line is the one which rises either from the Mount of Jupiter or between the index and middle fingers, running in a straight, continuous, and not deeply furrowed line, at the base of the Mounts of Jupiter, Saturn, Apollo, Mercury, and ending on the percussion (refer to 2 on plate).

If the line rises under Saturn and ends under Saturn, it either means that the heart will soon stop beating, or that the heart which began with the right kind of affection soon changes to coldness, distrust, and that one has little affection left. It is an unfortunate sign (4).

If the line end under Apollo, it indicates that only those possessed of graceful, symmetrical bodies, and minds full of similar charms and attributes will attract one. He would

not be interested in marrying any person not of this type (A).

If the line end under Mercury, the indications are that the affections are largely influenced by finance. One would not enter into marriage with a person who could not further his ambitions in a temporal way. This is especially true if the line turns upward at the end (B).

If the line end on upper Mars, one will love ardently, and while love lasts will brook no opposition, but his affairs will be of short duration. This ending produces a narrow triangle, consequently a secretive disposition (C).

A line rising from the Heart Line under Jupiter shows that ambition will govern love (2).

A line rising from the Heart Line under Saturn indicates that one will be attracted to a person of scholarly attainments, or who has scientific talents or aptitudes (3).

A line rising from the Heart Line under Apollo indicates that one is attracted to people who are artistic and brilliant (5).

A line rising from the Heart Line under Mercury indicates that the Mercurian qualities of shrewdness and ambition will attract one (6).

Sometimes a distinct line will drop from the Heart Line and gradually fall to the Head Line, merging into it. This indicates the heart has surrendered to the head and thereafter will be guided by it (D-E).

Cross bars cutting the line mean constant heart irritations, either illness or worries in the affections. The Heart Line broken into several pieces denotes inconstancy in affections and in love (F).

When the Line of Heart commences with a small fork on the Mount of Jupiter, it is an invari-

able sign of a happy, tranquil marriage.

When the line lies so low that it droops down under the Line of Head, it is a certain sign of unhappiness during the early years of life (G).

When the line commences with a fork so wide that one branch rests on Jupiter, the other on Saturn, it indicates an uncertain disposition, and one who is not likely to remain happily married.

When the line is barren of branches and is thin, it indicates coldness of heart and want of affection. When bare and thin towards the percussion, it usually de-

Hair lines dropping from the Line of Heart show a perpetual conflict between heart and head. These lines are read as love sorrows and disappointments. Hair lines rising up to the Line of Heart from the Line of Head indicate those who have influenced the affections, and by being crossed or uncrossed, indicate whether these influences have brought good fortune or the reverse (H-J).

When the Heart Line droops downward towards the Head Line, it indicates a union or a marriage which will cause much suffering and loss.

THE STORY of the Sailor's Return

In the Consul's Study

By An Ex-Consul

As told to D. C. RETSLOFF

OLD chills chase up and down my spine; goose flesh rises all over my body and the memory of one evening throws me into a spell of nervousness that lasts for hours.

In 1900 I was stationed at Buena Ventura as U. S. Consul. It was there that the events I am relating here took place and so unnerved me that I resigned my position and retired to private life.

The evening shadows were dropping over land and sea as I sat on the veranda of the ancient adobe, erected in 1850 by the famous buccaneer, Jose Llanos. Just before the tropical darkness fell I saw three boats making port. Two of them were lumber schooners, the other trailing quite some distance behind, was a shadowy gray, trim little sloop.

I walked to the end of the veranda, lowered the stars and stripes, folded the flag and laid it in the covered box standing against the adobe wall. Then I turned to the bay. It was the first time in my three years' service there that I had seen a trio of boats enter the harbor at the same time. And I could not remember ever hearing of a sloop visiting our port.

I sat down in a reed chair close to the railing, filled my pipe and watched the white riding lights of the schooners at the tops of the masts as the boats swung on the tide. I wondered why there was no light showing on the sloop. For possibly an hour I sat and smoked and dozed.

Suddenly something aroused me. I straightened in my chair as I saw a white form slip between two big clumps of pampas grass in the terraced garden below. I strained my eyes trying to determine what it was. My servants never left their quarters after dark; they were mortally afraid of the ghosts which tradition said roamed about the premises of the old buccaneer.

I stood up and leaned over the edge of the railing. The wind rustled the brown skirts of the palms; the dry stalks of the pampas grass rubbed together. I waited—a second passed. I turned my head and through the French doors leading into my study I glimpsed something white. Immediately a tale concerning the ghost of old Jose

Llanos flashed through my mind. For several seconds I remained motionless, then forcing a calmness I did not feel, I entered the living room, opened a drawer in the table, took from it a .45 service automatic and crossed to my study.

The doors were slightly open. Gripping the gun, I reached in, switched on a light, and commanded in Spanish, "Hands up!"

A tall man dressed in the white suit of a sailor, stood in front of my flat-topped desk. He did not move. I could not see his features distinctly and there was a sort of misty haze surrounding him.

"I am the American Consul, why are you here?" I demanded.

Without a sound he backed to the wall. One of his thin hands motioned for me to sit down. Horrified, trembling like a leaf, I dropped into the chair behind my desk.

I felt like I was being chloroformed. I knew I laid my gun down. Something commanded me to take several sheets of paper from a drawer and pick up a pencil from the tray.

I knew perfectly well what I was doing, still had no power to resist. The man in white soundlessly crossed the floor. He approached my desk; he leaned toward me. Although only three feet separated us, I could not distinguish his features. The hazy light surrounded him like a thin, grayish white veil.

Twice he lifted his right hand; twice it fell to his side. The third time it went up, it fell only as far as the top of the desk on its downward drop and rested about twelve inches from my own.

Then I felt my pencil begin to move. I will never be able to explain the feeling that swept over me. I could hear the scratch, scratch, scratch on the paper but could not see a mark, although I knew I was writing words.

For a long time the pencil traveled across the large sheets, then I felt myself falling. When I returned to my senses I could not understand why I was on the floor of my study. News Items of Especial Interest to Occultists

Theosophists Hold World Conference

Some 10,000 leading Theosophists, representing over 40 countries, attended the World Congress of the Theosophical Society in Chicago, at the Hotel Stevens, during August. At the informal reception for Dr. Annie Besant and the International Delegates, held in the Grand Ball Room, Saturday evening, August 24th, there was opportunity to mingle among the most delightful personalities, but none aroused more admiration than Dr. Besant herself, standing calm and clear-eyed at the receiving line. Dr. Besant is 82.

All meetings were presided over by Dr. Besant and she also made the opening address as well as other important addresses which received considerable notice from the press. Mr. L. W. Rogers, national president, welcomed the delegates to America. There were many other noted speakers at the Congress, including Dr. A. P. Warrington, Mr. Geoffrey Hodson, Dr. George S. Arundale, Mrs. Rukmini Arundale, Dr. James Cousins, Mrs. Margaret Cousins, Mr. A. E. S. Smythe, Mr. Hari Govil, Rev. Irving Cooper, and Mr. Max Wardall. Mr. C. Jinarajadasa, who was to have lectured Monday evening, was unable to get away from Central America, and Dr. Besant took his place on the platform. The Congress was closed with a banquet Thursday evening, August 29th.

The September issue of *The Theosophical Messenger*, official publication of The American Theosophical Society, devotes considerable space to a report of the Congress, and *The Canadian Theosophist*, issue of September 15th, has also a very interesting and detailed report.

Prejudice Resented By American Jews

"Will the anti-Jewish prejudice stop with homes, hotels and clubs, or will it be carried over into the medical staff of hospitals, the faculties of colleges and the courtrooms?" asks Mr. N. Herman in the Sentinel, Chicago Jewish weekly paper.

Mr. Herman urges American Jews to "lift the veil of complacency from your eyes and learn the uncomfortable truth."

"Today the Jew suffers from prejudice," he asserts, "when it comes to buying a home in a respectable American neighborhood, or when he seeks a summer hotel, where he finds later that the Jews are barred. How will it be in the next few years when even more and more Jewish doctors and lawyers and teachers from New York will be emigrating to the less Jewish towns of America in search of a more comfortable livelihood? This spreading of the Jews throughout the country will not ease the problem of Nordic racial prejudice, but will, on the contrary, make it sharper."

Electrical Robots to Dig Tunnel Under New York

One hundred "robots," "hogs," "donkeys," and hoists are under construction in Schenectady, N. Y., to help build a tunnel almost as deep below New York City as the Woolworth Building towers above it. The tunnel will be 500 feet below sea level and at some points 850 feet below the surface.

The electrical equipment will include 16 electric mine hoists for shafts. Air for drills and shovels will be furnished by 400-horsepower, motor-driven compressors. There will be 62 electrical mine locomotives to run along the bottom of the tunnel.—Grit.

Secretary of Labor Warns of Unemployment

James J. Davis, Secretary of Labor, issued a warning that unemployment, chiefly in the coal and textile industries, will seriously affect business unless steps are taken to check it, in his recent address at the annual convention of the American Industrial Leaders' Association in Philadelphia.

500 Londoners Plan to Live One Hundred Years

Dr. Maurice Ernst is the founder of a club of five hundred men and women in London whose aim is to reach the age of 100. Dr. Ernst says that the members are not required to follow any particular fads, but may drink liquor, smoke, or eat—provided they do it in moderation.

"A man who thinks he is going to die at fifty believes in a short life and a merry one, and lives for himself," asserts Dr. Ernst. "If he believes he is going to live another fifty years, it gives him added interest in life and a less selfish outlook."

Scientist Claims Man May Permanently Retain Youth

News dispatches from England tell of the prediction of "permanent youth" by Prof. F. A. Crew, of Edinburgh University, as a result of experiments.

"Man knows the causes of ageing," the professor is quoted as saying, "the cause of the loss of proteins and when he knows the methods by which that loss may be replaced, he may prolong his life indefinitely.

"Science, as well as religion, affirms that in the future mankind may, if it be so desired, not only remain permanently youthful, but also may live forever."

Age a Matter of Mind Helen Keller Declares

Although she is nearly fifty years old, Helen Keller keeps cheery and busy, according to one of her visitors, who tells of her interview with Miss Keller in Grit.

"Age is a matter of the mind, and my spirit never grows old," she said recently as she celebrated her fortyninth birthday.

Miss Keller lives in Forest Hills, Long Island, where she takes great delight in her flower gardens. At present she is endeavoring to raise a \$2,000,000 fund for the American Foundation for the Blind.

Boy Scouts Hate War Says Their Chief

Tid Bits (London), quotes Sir Robert Baden-Powell, Bart., Chief Boy Scout, as follows:

"The Boy Scouts are working for peace. Every man who has any heart in him is ANTI-WAR. Peace will come when the heart of every man, woman, and child beats with affection for his neighbour. War cannot produce those heart-beats. War can only produce heart-beats of anguish and grief and hate. That is why I and all good Scouts hate war!"

Woman Robbed of \$250,000 In Jewels, But is Good Loser

At least one woman in the world knows how to take philosophically the loss of mere jewelry. In reporting the robbery of a quarter million dollars' worth of precious gems from her home in Massachusetts one evening last August, the press quotes Mrs. Sydney E. Hutchinson as saying:

"It is folly for a wealthy woman to have and wear a fortune in jewelry when paste serves the purpose just as well. I am not sorry that the jewels are gone. I am only thankful nobody was killed or wounded by the prowler."

"New light on Christ's walking on the waters was thrown recently by a the waters was thrown recently by a scientist, who has been making a special study of Einstein's newest theory of relativity. As a result of his investigations Professor H. H. Sheldon says that he may find it possible to assert that the Biblical narrative at which the sceptics have so long mocked is in fact explicable by scientific laws. which the sceptics have so folig mocked is in fact explicable by scientific laws. The miracle can be accepted by the most sceptical minds as soon as they recognise the fact that the basic laws of relativistic mechanics and of electricity can be reduced to one formula, and that the power of electromagnetism can influence and completely control gravitation,' said Prof. Sheldon. According to Einstein's latest mathematical theory there is only one submatical theory there is only one substance and one universal law containing electric and gravitational components, both of which are united into a single formula, and each of which influences the other. Dr. Sheldon now believes that as a result of this discovery such things as keeping aeroplanes aloft without engines or material support and stenning out of a terial support, and stepping out of a window into the air without fear of falling, are avenues of investigation falling, are avenues of investigation easily suggested. 'If this theory stands up as a proof that electricity and gravitation are virtually the same, we can actually isolate ourselves from the force of gravitation,' he declared. In actual proof of these seemingly incredible possibilities, Dr. Sheldon showed how a bar of permalloy, which is usually sensitive to magnetism, will remain suspended, seemingly by air alone, if a magnet is placed underneath it.



touching it, the indications are that one will allow his heart to be guided by the head and will direct his love affairs through his reason.

When the lines of Head, Heart, and Life are very much joined together, it is an indication of severe misfortune in matters of the affections, and often foretells a violent death.

subject upon waking is unconscious of all that occurred during the trance. This loss of memory following the imitation-complete phase is known as posthypnotic amnesia. There have been times, however, when I have known patients to manifest an acute hypermnesia (abnormal memory) upon waking, but this is unusual.

A condition of hemi-hypnosis may be induced very easily in the cataleptic state. In hemi-hypnosis, the patient seems to be divided in two. One eye is closed by the operator and the other allowed to remain open. The hand corresponding to the open eye ceases all movement, while the hand corresponding to the closed eye continues its movement. Whatever affects the side of the closed eye has no affect on the side of the open eye. Thus emotions such as laughter or surprise are manifested only on one side of the face.

THE SOMNAMBULIC STATE

THERE are three distinct phases of the somnambulic state. These are (1) the phase in which the subject speaks; (2) the phase in which movements are made; and (3) the phase in which long or complicated actions are performed.

Somnambulism has a marked affinity with insanity. All sorts of hypnotic hallucinations are possible. The patient will scream in terror at what appears to him to be a horrible monster but which is in reality only a broom. However it is sometimes difficult to implant the hypnotist's will in this state, especially if the suggestion he imparts is out of harmony with the patient's usual character. Nevertheless, the patient reluctantly carries out the operator's command.

Patients in the somnambulic state are capable of miraculous manifestations. They may describe places they have never seen. Usually the subject presents a very acute hyperamnesia. A patient of mine once repeated in Spanish the poem "Himo Nacional Argentina" which I had recited to him. When awake he could speak no Spanish.

When a subject is in the somnam-

bulic state, he is no longer an automaton as in catalepsy, but has an individual character. The operator's tone of voice is much more effective than his words and the patient receives the impression almost entirely by tone.

Every one of the senses may be affected by suggestion. The patients see, hear, smell, and feel and even touch objects that exist in name only. If a subject is told that an electric bulb is a candle, he attempts to extinguish it by blowing and is not disconcerted by the fact that it does not go out, but continues to blow.

Latent memories and imaginative faculties are aroused. This is called active somnambulistic automatism. This phase is characterized by the taking away of spontaneity. The mind is especially susceptible to deceptive illusions. In the latter, the psycho-sensorial phenomena are unconscious in character. We may deduce, in fact, that active somnambulism is the most profound and advanced stage of hypnosis, during which motor-automatism is ever present. If the patient has been placed in this state a very great number of times, it will sometimes be observed that amnesia (loss of memory) exists upon his awakening.

Dr. Charcot once suggested to a patient that a picture existed on what was really a blank card. This card was placed among others which were also blank, but the patient picked the right card from among the others simply because the portrait had become to him an exteriorized sensation. It had form and was a real image to him. Dr. Charcot believes that some insignificant mark has, due to his unusual visual hypercuity, implanted such an image upon the patient's mind. If such exteriorized sensations as these be repeated, they gradually become a permanent obsession, even in the waking state.

Efforts are being exerted to establish a marked distinction between hypnotism and natural sleep. I do not believe, however, that this will be possible, since very distinct demarcations do not really exist. Crazy persons often exteriorize their hallucinations

sign memories as one knows words and signs. Memories in words come from the letters that make up the words, and memories in signs from the concrete forms of signs. These forms ultimately come from objects, and all objects, according to science, are resolved into electrons which are positive and negative in types.

One has as many memories of letters as there are in the alphabet he knows; one has as many memories of individual letters as they have individual sounds. For instance, the letter a has five sounds, namely, a as in arm, a as in ask, a as in man, a as in air, and a as in fate. Thus it is obvious that wordcode memories all come from the sounds of the different letters of alphabets. But whence come memories up through the sounds of letters? Science has proven that sounds audible and inaudible come from vibratory motion, and vibratory motion is known under the guise of wave-lengths and the number of the times the waves are formed per second. For instance, basic red has 33,000 waves to the inch, faint red has 36,750 waves to the inch, with 434 trillions times formed per second. memory of basic violet comes from 64,-000 waves to the inch, and faint violet has 61,000 waves per inch, with 740 trillions times formed per second. The

same principle holds good for all sounds and all sensations.

Memory in wave-lengths comes from the things of which waves are composed; these are negative and positive electrons. A synonym for the negative electron is ion, and for the positive electron proton. These latter would be, of course, memories of the same thing. Memory in the negative electron resides in its diameter which is supposed to be six trillionths of an inch; here there are two memories, its diameter as a form, and the figure as given above. Memory in the positive electron resides in its diameter and the form if one can grasp it. Its diameter, according to Millikin, in "The Electron," is as much smaller than the negative electron (which is six trillionths of an inch) as a fractional divisor of 2/8000 will reduce it

But whence comes the memory which resides in this almost infinitely small thing? No man knows the answer except to say that it comes from and resides in the Infinite.

When the memory of signs is traced it leads to forms, as previously stated, and science has proven that all forms are made up of electrons, thus the ultimate source of sign-memory is the same as given above for word-memory.

fies the circulation of money from a chief bank, the branches "N" splitting up, but carrying on the process for-Circulation of money is the ward. heart's blood of a country. The medium is the same throughout, although it may change into various equivalents.

The process of circulating printed matter from a newspaper office or publishing house through wholesalers -or branches, newsstands, down to the newsboy, is a similar process. Again, it approximately describes a large circulating library whose volumes go through various channels down to the individual reader.

In each case, a certain amount of the "medium" in circulation is withdrawn or returned as an equivalent to headquarters, and fresh supplies are sent out, renewals being made as required.

The "sign" has another "significance," for, as a person's heart is the index to his constitution, so this symbol represents a "temperament," or a person's peculiar physical and mental constitution.

Psychologically, it stands for "optimism" and "pessimism." If in "good

form," it is a whole orb, a clear eye, and produces a bright outlook, but if there is poor circulation the reverse is the case.

THE ANALYST

"APITAL letter P is the "symbol" of a net, sifter, sieve, strainer, filter, or other kind of instrument that catches one kind of object or matter, whilst passing others. It typifies the analyzing or examining by mechanical processes, with a refining import. It represents a process of purifying by separating and retaining what is serviceable, whilst disposing of the remainder. To do so it divides matter into infinitesimal parts, and alters its composition. It is a "sign" of sublimation by chemical action.

Psychologically, it symbolizes the power to obtain net results-to sift, analyze, examine, and criticize the problems brought before the mind. It is the "emblem" of "simplification." It makes clear. It is the capacity to apply an "acid test" to the things of "mind." It discards extraneous ideas, and purifies thought by the exclusion of wrong conceptions. It condenses, and it conserves.

Mechanically, it represents the functioning of an economizer, or condensor. It conserves energy or steam so that the very best is got out of a particular amount. It relieves the boiler of much work and it assists the engine by assuring first class power.

Anatomically, it appears to "stand for" the liver. It is nearly a gland in shape. It comes between, is an intermediary 'twixt boiler and engine, that is, between "Q" and "O," in either direction. It receives the blood stream adulterated, but purifies, condenses, and vitalizes it, then passes it forward for use. Its cells or tubes set up a mechanical and chemical action within themselves. They split up the liquids and gases into minute parts. Ultimately the solids are sublimated.

The diagram P is like the top part of B or the two eyes. It is therefore looking at or into things with a single eye and that raised in stratum. It is as if a physical or material discriminator were raised to the higher order of an intellectual discernment.

The above is the normal functioning of each. The opposite to this order, classification, and arrangement, in a psychological sense, is disorder, muddle, and chaos. This is the state of "mind" of a person whose liver is out of order, generally termed "liverish." The alcoholic indulger of overnight is usually the muddleheaded sufferer of the morning after. To such, if a business man, the small details of office routine become of unprecedented importance, whilst really pressing matters are shelved.

The process compares with the work of the news editor receiving matter of various kinds from his reporters. He sifts, analyzes, cuts out, passes some for print, puts a "bite" or "acid" into what might go flat, and returns other portions to be "boiled down," or to the waste paper basket. In actual printing, the "composition" is sent to be "boiled down" after an "impression."

It illustrates the work of the analytical chemist who, with some known facts about a substance, wishes to make sure of a specific constituent-or "O"—and can only separate it by chemical action. He heats it, passes it through test tubes, possibly adds an alkali to disintegrate the whole, depositing the matter he seeks to isolate.

It is like a refinery where crude materail is received in bulk, but whose business is to clear the whole of anything foreign to the substance at issue. It reduces to purity, nicety, and simplicity the composition of the elements as first received, into others of a more useful or more profitable character. It may even add a preservative to safeguard the resulting matter from turning sour before it can be used.



The question of Twin and multiple births will be dealt with from the point of view of Rectification, but all the other subjects dealt with in the original edition will be omitted, in order that they may be elaborated in a later volume, from a new standpoint, and in accordance with later discoveries connected with the Epochal Thesis. The Appendix, giving some Astromathematical Rules, and the Tables of Ascendants are printed at the end of the book, in order to facilitate the work of the student in making the necessary calculations.


