Occasionally we find a most sensitive, highly developed Virgo, and such an one is a rare and beautiful soul to know: but I am convinced that the strictly "of the earth earthy" species is by far the most numerous. In marriage or business these people should choose either Capricornus (Dec. 21-Jan. 20) or Taurus (April 19-May 20) provided they desire worldly success and worldly happiness, and this is usually as high as most Virgo people aim. If, however, extreme discipline and training for a spiritual life is desired, then an associate born in a water sign would doubtless provide a foeman worthy of their steel!! Virgo people possess bright, inquiring minds and are very interesting and agreeable to meet. They are quite strongly centralized in thinking of self, and animal comforts; delight in colors and harmonious surroundings. They possess great literary and reformatory ideas, but are too often over-shadowed by the physical nature to allow these higher attributes full scope. Upon the morning of Monday Sept. 19th the planet Jupiter and the first magnitude star Regulus (of Leo) will be nearly in conjunction. The actual conjunction takes place at 11 a.m. The student of astronomy will be intensely interested to note the position of these bodies and if he rises an hour or so before the sun and directs his gaze about ten degrees north of the point where the sun peeps above the eastern horizon he will be amply repaid for his pains; provided, of course, the morning is clear. Jupiter will be seen one third of a degree north of Regulus. Sept. 24th Mars and Neptune will be in conjunction (at one a. m.) and upon the same day (at two p.

m.) Mercury and Venus. At the conjunction of Mars and Neptune the former planet will be a little less than one degree north of Neptune. These planets are now midway between the Pleaides and the Hyades and may be viewed to fine advantage at three to four a. m., during September and October. At this hour the Pleaides will be seen nearly overhead (slightly south) while Mars will be easily found a few degrees toward the east. As Neptune is a telescopic planet his position is rarely known to the average star gazer, hence the above plain directions to locate him.

—Upon the evening of Saturday July 11th (9.45) I noted a very bright path of light, which seemed to spring from the centre of the constellation of Aquarius and, passing about mid-way between Delphinus and Aquilla, shoot across the Milky Way, in the direction of Corona Borealis. It was scarcely visible west of the Milky Way, however. It was about two an 1 a half degrees in width and was plainly visible for five minutes. It was a phenomenon entirely new to me, as I do not remember ever having seen such a brilliant flash of light coming up from the east. Upon this evening the Aurora Borealis presented a most magnificent spectacle, also; the entire northern section of the heavens being beautifully illuminated.

—If these were the days of chivalry; if the prize we seek were to be had through the successful combat with physical or animal enemies; if, through the subjugation of men or beasts we could attain the ends we covet, how assiduously and bravely would we enter the arena, and how unwearingly fight from early morn till night! But the age has passed in which objective foes were offered for combat; our era is given a much harder task; a task commensurate with the greater prize. Our foes are invisible. The objective world has been well conquered, and now we must, up to a certain line, struggle in the dark, with no guide save Faith. Yet faith is all sufficient and will never lead us off the safe path.

⁻In all temptations to commit wrong there is always a golden

moment when the higher nature is fully competent to decide to its own credit. If there is the slightest hesitation, however, then the victory almost invariably goes to the demon of sensualism. Study this law carefully and note the almost imperceptible thread of division between the higher and the lower. One divine resolve of "get thee behind me" expressed just at that decisive moment will waft you upward; one little moment of hesitation and the Beast gains his ends.

common. Yet the domain of politics with its wrangles and its worship of the money power is a necessary stage for our country to pass through. But it is not for the student of occultism to actively and personally take part. The greatest service we can do is to hold pure ideals of that regenerate nation of which the present is merely a prophesy.

-The star-gazer will find some very interesting groups to study during Sept. While the heavens lack that extreme brilliancy which winter gives the stars, yet we think the soft, mellow twinkling of the late summer stars is a happy variation which comparitively few students duly appreciate. The most brilliant constellation to be seen in the early evening hours of Sept. is Scorpio, now occupying a central section of the southwestern heavens. Immediately west of this group we find the two principle stars of Libra, with the red planet Saturn between. Then, in order, following up to the zenith we shall discover the Serpent, Bootes, Hercules, Lyra, Draco, and (passing slightly north of the zenith point) Ursa Minor and Polaris. Leo and Virgo are hastening out of view in the west, while Sagittarius, Capricornus and Aquarius are rising to prominence in the east. Cygnus, the Dolphin and the great square of Pegagus are now in fine position in the eastern heavens, while Cassiopeia and Andromeda are seen near the Milky Way in the north-east. Let the student remember that through the study of the stars he may receive that inspiration and broadening of spiritual powers which no other line of research can give. We offer every encouragement and tender every point of assistance to those who really desire to pursue this grand line of study.
