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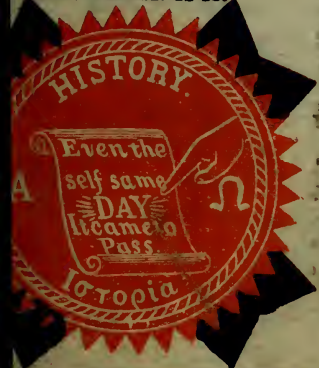

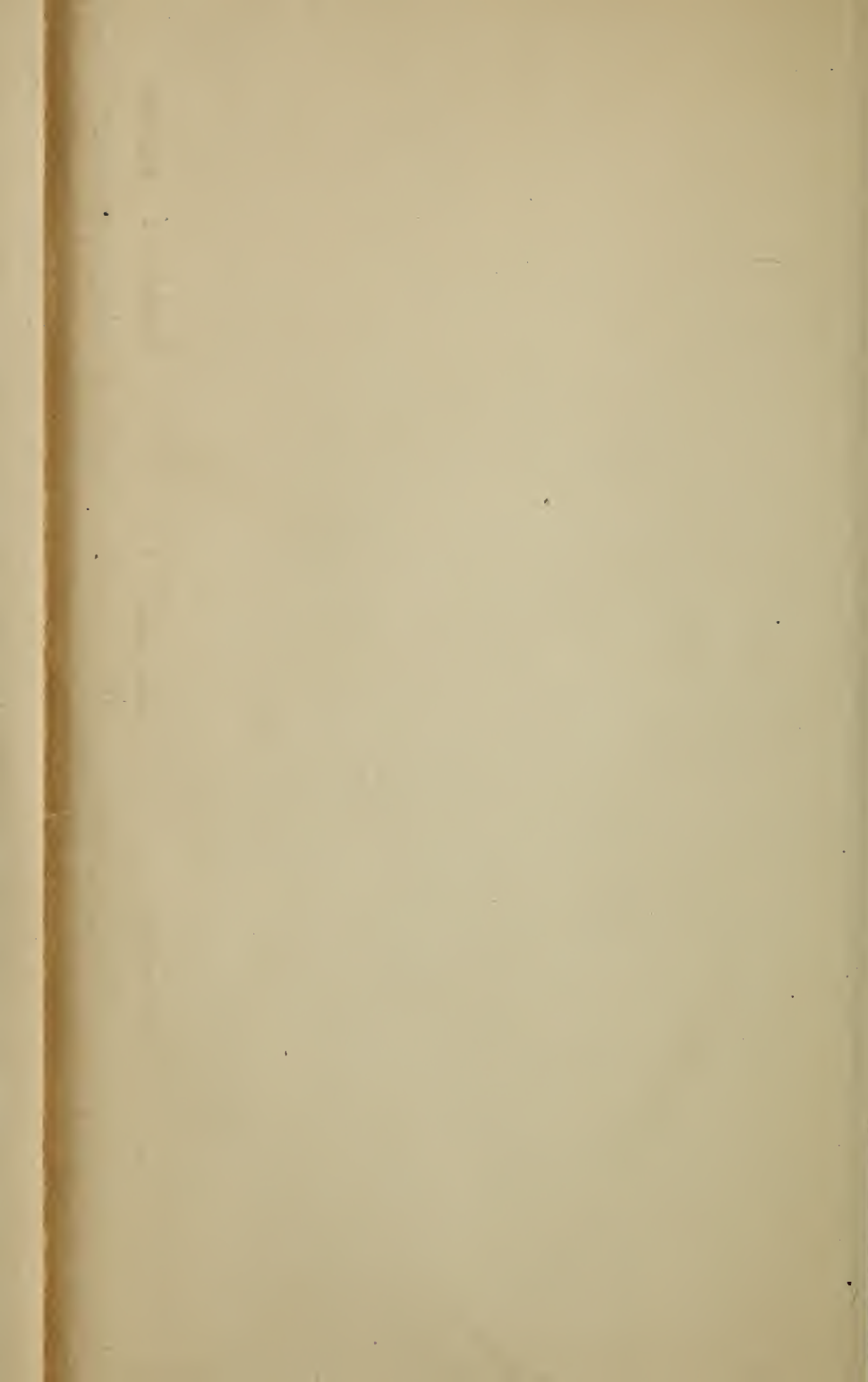




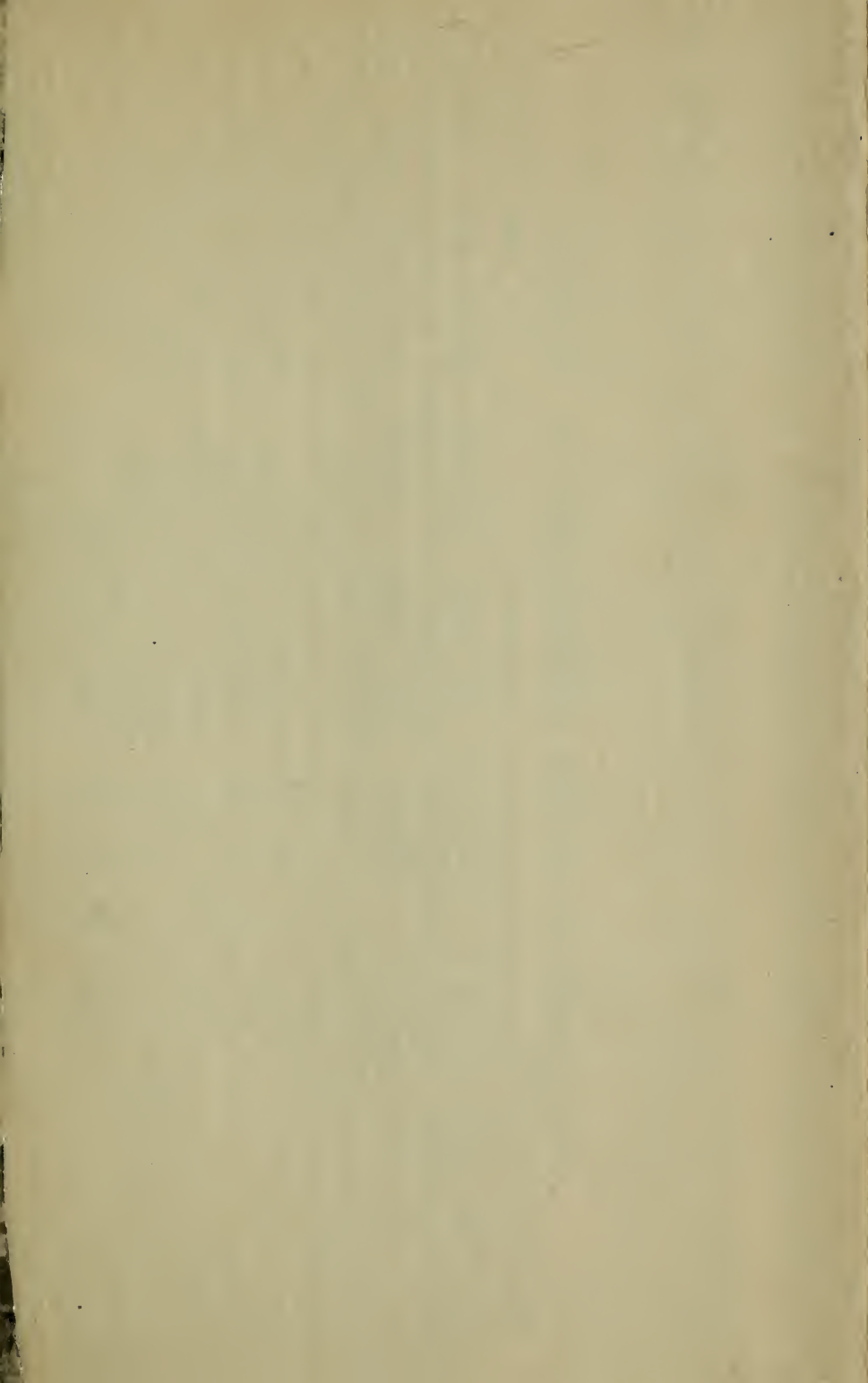

## PART III. PTOLEMY'S CANON CONCEDED.

The second part of Ptolemy's Canon begins a new count with Philip because it was the 1000th year of the Cincular. It is from this year in diuise that the Philadelphian Era of Egypt is reckoned. The consolidated count runs on without break.

Deceased Oct. 14, 1066. Thus from 907 Sab. where Ptolemy left off his reckoning to William the Conqueror, a sum of Thoths (597 - 610 - 907) exactly equal to the measure of his own Canon. In other words Ptolemy bisects 907 the measure (1814) from Nabonassar to William the Conqueror.

### COMPLIMENTS TO THE CHRONOLOGICAL READER

This end of the Canon is your position, supposed to be at May 18th, 1890 A. D. N. S., or May 6th, 1890 A. D. O. S. Glance up the scroll and then read it down carefully, section by section. The explanation of the Canon is to be found in the accompanying Study. The scroll gives the measure in days, weeks, months, years and reigns, back into Past Time for 3219 Vague years at 365 days each, nearly 3217 Julian years at 365 25 days each, eventually running into Gregorian years at 365 24225 days each after 1752 A. D. In fact it is a perfect Canon of History, three and a half times as long as Ptolemy's, and "picks up" Ptolemy's in its proper place as it progresses backwards to it, and beyond to Monophres, whose position is the only "fixed" one in Ancient Egyptian History, being established by "Theon's Rule," and by Cosmorus in *de die Natali*. Finally, had we punctuated the Canon "day by day" 1,174,945, instead of by "reigns" (184), its compass would have required a strip of paper nearly five miles long.
