GENERAL FORECAST

1904.

The year 1904, like the previous year, opens up under the magnetic-currents of the planet Neptune, which gives promise of a broad and far-reaching influence that will extend and enhance the relations existing between nations and peoples far away and apart. This applies to the relations and interests of people distant from each other within our own borders as well. It is especially influential in connection with railroads and shipping interests generally. Its chief and most important effect will be upon the affairs of state—the machinery of government—and a general reconstruction and reorganization of many branches of the government will take place before the year is over.

The tendency will be toward the concentration of the money power and a general tightening of the circulating medium. Money and the power of money will be felt more keenly than for many years. This will increase as the year progresses and produce something of a stagnation toward the time of the Presidential election in November. After this and the usual effects attendant upon such possible changes as may occur, the year ends up under a much better and easier vibration from a financial standpoint.

Great expansion of trade beyond that which has been experienced the past few years can not be expected. That the general commercial welfare of the country will not be greatly impaired may be depended upon. Money will be the governor and the mind of man will be under a healthy, and, we may say, a magnanimous, wave of power which will enlarge and enhance the feeling and confidence of human kind.

MANUFACTURING.

Manufacturing interests may not have quite the promise and prestige of former years, as money will not be so readily drawn into such operations. People will be careful and slow about taking chances. They will not be so venturesome. The spirit of caution will be over them. All of which will have a tendency to draw in the lines of investment and cut short the general result. This will react upon raw materials more or less and thus bring prices to a little lower

level. However, this is possible without giving cause for alarm, as prices have been inflated in nearly every direction, and the time is now at hand for the reaction to begin. Serious calamity will not come this year, however, and the country is safe. The general welfare of the people is under good rather than evil influences.

LABOR CIRCLES.

As a very great change in the conditions affecting labor is brought about the middle of January, it will be found that a new era is on this year relative to the interests of that class of laboring people who have banded themselves together for the purpose of controlling their interests and forcing the money power to come to their terms. They have held the balance of power in this respect to quite a marked degree for some time, having had the planet of finance under their feet, as it were, and they have profited much thereby. This period is, or will be, passed the first month of the new year, and they will be obliged to pursue entirely different methods to further their interests in the future. In other words, they will meet with an entirely different attitude in the investor and manufacturer. Laws will be enacted such as will settle many of the existing disputes and contentions that have heretofore characterized the relations between labor and capital.

It is a fact that cannot be disputed that money rules the affairs of man. It always has and always will. It is the one great centralizer of power. Its base is gold, the heaviest and most valuable product of the earth. With this a fact in the very warp and woof of the commercial world, it is merely a matter of the polarization of the magnetic forces of our solar system, as to what particular class of individuals are to play the strongest cards in the affairs of a nation. The favors are shifting toward the side of the money power and will land on that side early in the new year. Make a note of this, and watch the legislative movements and see to it that legislation in this respect is based upon just and equitable principles.

Labor circles will, therefore, be under some affliction under this important change in the vibrant aspects. Many of their rules of procedure will have to be changed to meet the new legislation and conform to the law of the land. On the other hand, capitalists will have their worries over the situation, and they, too, will be forced to come to such terms as will give a more just and equitable relation between them

and labor. The point we wish to present here is that the money power will have a large share of the favors in this readjustment.

POLITICAL.

The political situation is one which will absorb the attention of the people as never before. At this writing, September, 1903, there are no candidates named for the Presidency; therefore we can make no prediction relative to the election. We will say that the party in power will need a strong man to win out in this campaign. He must not only be strong, but in luck as well, with his star of destiny high in the heavens. The element of change is quite clearly defined in the planetary currents, and a new administration with a change of parties is quite in keeping with the times. Therefore we say the coming struggle will be one of unusual happenings. Whichever party takes the prize, it will find it has something on its hands which will need the genius of the nation to cope with before the term expires; for at the end there will be a new birth in the sphere of government which will be destined for a long and successful career.

TRUSTS.

In the matter of trusts, there is every indication that the tendency toward centralization of power will continue and that the trust problem will continue to absorb the attention of those who become excited easily over such matters. In considering the subject of trusts, it should be borne in mind that the general welfare of the people does not hinge upon any such insignificant influence or power as a trust. Speculative or criminal trusts are like soap-bubbles on a blow-pipe; they represent inflation—air and water—and while they are inflated they attract a great deal of attention, and as the soap-bubble retains its inflation according to the amount of resin in the soap from which it is made, so does the trust hold out according to the nerve force of its promoters. The supply and demand, the fluctuations of values, the schemes of all traders, great and small, go steadily on and on as they have for thousands of years.

It is the system of taxation, the Government, that is faulty. Trusts, or combinations for the extension of industry, keep up the excitement of the business world, and prompt people to get a move on themselves. They promote industry and expand every branch of business. That they are abused goes without saying. All privileges are abused more or less. A man that is allowed to open a dry goods store in any com-

munity uses every means in his power to do up the other merchants in the same vicinity, and incidentally takes advantage of every opportunity to get all he can out of the people who trade with him.

Trusts usually fix prices at which goods shall be sold, while the old method of trading was to charge any price, and "jew" with the customer and beat him to the limit. The burden of this system of trading fell upon the poor and ignorant. The trust system has developed the mind and intelligence of man as nothing else ever did. It is said that the trusts control the Government. Money is and ever has been the power behind the throne. Before trusts were thought of, the men of wealth controlled the government. It is merely the money power in a different form.

Man is naturally a gambler—a speculator. There are a thousand poor men who gamble to every rich man. The laboring people have profited more from the trusts than the trust makers themselves, as they can use and enjoy but a limited amount of what they get. But for the trusts the laborer would be to-day where he was thirty or forty years ago. His wages would be much less than they are to-day. Does the poor man or the average wage-earner patronize the small trader or a trust? Watch a department store for a brief period and see whether or not great combinations of capital are considered worthy of a poor man's attention and patronage. It is the small trader, the specialist, that is patronized by the rich and supported almost entirely by them. Does the small trader of the present sell at a less margin than the larger establishment controlled by vast wealth? Step into one of the small establishments and test the matter for yourself.

The poor man or the laborer seeks to obtain the most he can possibly get for his services and then trades where he can get the best bargains. The capitalist buys in the cheapest market and offers the poor man every inducement to trade with him. The capitalist manufacturer employs the laborer as he employs his genius in buying cheap, and gets the best service for his money he can find. The laborer combines his forces and demands the highest price for his services consistent with the times. Both the capitalist and the laborer is a trust magnate. Their interests are pitted one against the other. Between the two wages have been advanced a hundred per cent, and living was never so cheap as at the present time, generally speaking. With the growth of wages

the luxuries of living have been indulged in to a greater extent than formerly. The actual necessities of life—food and clothing—are so cheap that the expense of living may be reduced to a mere pittance if the occasion demands it.

Therefore we say the general welfare of the people was never better than at the present time, and this regardless of the evil influences of criminal combines in the form of trusts—evils which are ever a part of every combination of interests, whether of labor or capital.

Taxation alone may remedy the differences which exist between capital and labor. The power is with the masses, not with the few, if indeed the majority may be considered a power in legislative procedure.

The commercial world may be likened to an army in battle. The great majority represent the soldiers while the few play the roles of officers and generals. The former do the real work—the fighting—while the latter get the glory and the money. And when the battle is over the whole bunch turns and worships the general. The same performance is being enacted in the commercial world. The great financiers are the generals and every man beneath them is seeking to get as close to them as possible, with the view to becoming like him, should luck favor his efforts.

The trust may come and the trust may go. It is merely incidental in the great scheme of existence. The world of business will move steadily on and on, regardless.

The trusts of the present are mere angle worms beside an elephant compared with some of the trusts of ancient times. Therefore we need have no fear for the future of our country, for the printing press is in the hands of the people, and the stars and stripes, the Emblem of Liberty, floats over the land.

WAR AND REBELLION.

The rebellious nature of man will not be so rampant as to cause any great outbreak among the nations during the year 1904. Peace measures will become more fashionable than ever, and this will mitigate against the political possibilities and glories which many attain thru war. This power for peace will be too great a thing to be thrust aside by those who profit by war. Therefore, we say that a generally peaceable year is before us.

Along in October and November we may experience some difficulties and other nations as well will no doubt become involved to some extent, but the striking and warring fac-

tions will be in the minority and not sufficiently powerful to cause any great rebellion.

Legislation affecting international relations will be pursued with vigor during the year, which will also have a tendency to check any outbreaks that may occur under the disturbing vibrations which make their periodic visitations during the twelve months before us.

RELIGION.

There will be quite a religious awakening, or, we may say, quite a religious movement (Religion does not awaken people, it merely moves them) toward Centralization and union of interests. This will bring together different sects and amalgamate them into one corporate body. It is an especially favorable time for such a movement. The control of many factions by one board of directors is a possibility of the near future. This will be manifested among Protestants more than any other class of religionists, and with the numerous sects which abound among them, it will be an easy matter to form a powerful combination for a renewal of religious propaganda thruout the world.

The Liberal and Independent portion of the human family will continue to grow in numbers rapidly, and we may look for some new developments in this direction leading to the organization of a vast body of progressive thinkers and worshippers who will play an important role in the law-making force of the land.

SOCIALISM.

Socialism, which is growing apace, will reach its climatrix in the not distant future, owing to the fact that its principles are not in harmony with Universal Law and the primal and specific nature of man. Its motto, "Every one according to his deeds," is a sublime declaration, but every experience in life causes one to doubt the possibility of such a result among human kind. Socialism declares that men should work for what they get and should get what they earn, which is another grand idea, but we all know that this is not the nature of the results of long years of struggle toward that end.

THE LAW OF NATURE.

The Law of Nature says that each man will work according to his genius and talent, and get what he can as a result of his labor. The Socialistic proposition is purely theoretical, while the latter is a fact—a truth.

All men who make money work for it in some way. All men who work for what they get are, therefore, entitled to

their earnings. The diversity of genius and talent makes up the panorama of being.

The laws of the land regulating the taxation of property for the support of government alone may correct any and all evils that afflict the race.

SINGLE TAX.

The single tax agitation is a means to an end which will bring about a system of legislation that will make it possible to give to each man that which rightfully belongs to him. Not that single tax alone will or can do this, but that it is a move in the right direction and should receive the support of all who take an interest in shaping the future policy of the Government.

MUNICIPAL OWNERSHIP.

Municipal ownership is unquestionably a good thing for the people at large. It may not be quite so promising to a few men who count their wealth by the millions, but for the great masses, the 99 per cent of the race, it is surely a promise of great good. In a Government of the people, by the people and for the people, all public utilities should be under the control of the Government. Under such control it would be much easier for the masses to hold an interest in the various enterprises and thus become participants in the earnings, at the same time receive an added blessing in the way of reduced rates in their daily expenditures.

REAL ESTATE.

The general conditions affecting real estate are not quite as promising as they might be, tho the mineral and other wealth of the earth, especially Gold, Copper, and the heavier varieties of minerals, will be in demand and bring good returns for time and labor. Gold will be found in greater abundance than for many years. It will be found in localities where such treasure is not supposed to take form and evolve. Such resources, therefore, will make realty yielding mineral wealth valuable, while the general realty proposition will be a little tame and uneventful. The reason for this will be found largely in the gradual shrinking of prices for farm products. The demand will not be quite up to former years, tho no serious result will follow.

The conversion of supposedly valueless waste material into "Polonium" (the name should be Polarium) will bring in a new commercial product, and with "Radium," "Liquid Air," and another Astro-magnetum, which will be found to contain the most powerful energies yet found by man, we may look for some wonderful developments in the utiliza-

tion of the *Finer Forces* of Nature. Verily the scientist is creeping along close to the Magnetic Ray that links the soul of man with the Infinite. He will find the secret when he splits and radiates a vibration from the planet Mercury.

NOTE.—We say *Mercury*.

SEISMIC CONVULSIONS.

The old earth is in danger of some severe upheavals before the year is over. It appears comparatively calm and safe up to the last two months, when Earthquakes out of the ordinary are due. The 23d of December appears to be quite a critical time in this respect. Several days around this date it looks very bad, and Volcanic eruptions will no doubt show up with the other seismic disturbances of the same period. The month of July shows some striking conditions bearing upon the phenomena of Earthquakes and Volcanoes also, but they are not so marked as those of the latter date.

THE SOCIAL WORLD.

The social world will be under a favorable vibration conducive to organization, the promotion of clubs, pleasure and benefits such as will add glory and gratitude to all who mix and mingle for the common comfort of all. This means that the year will be favorable to entertainments, including the theater as well as the social side of church life. People will have a great amount of consideration for others, and the desire for companionship and sociability will be more marked than usual. It is a time for the reconstruction of society generally. A new cycle in the social world begins about the middle of January.

CONCLUSION.

The year as a whole may be put down as one which is safe and well fortified against severe calamity, tho considerable suffering will result from the general tendency toward a stringency in the circulating medium. This is really the worst thing we have to look forward to. With a little careful study of the weekly forecasts which follow in this work one may readily locate the severest periods of the year and govern himself accordingly. A little foreknowledge will enable one to prepare himself in advance of the time and thus meet the unfavorable wave or storm periods as they show up.

Let not the pessimist discourage thee. The year is all right.

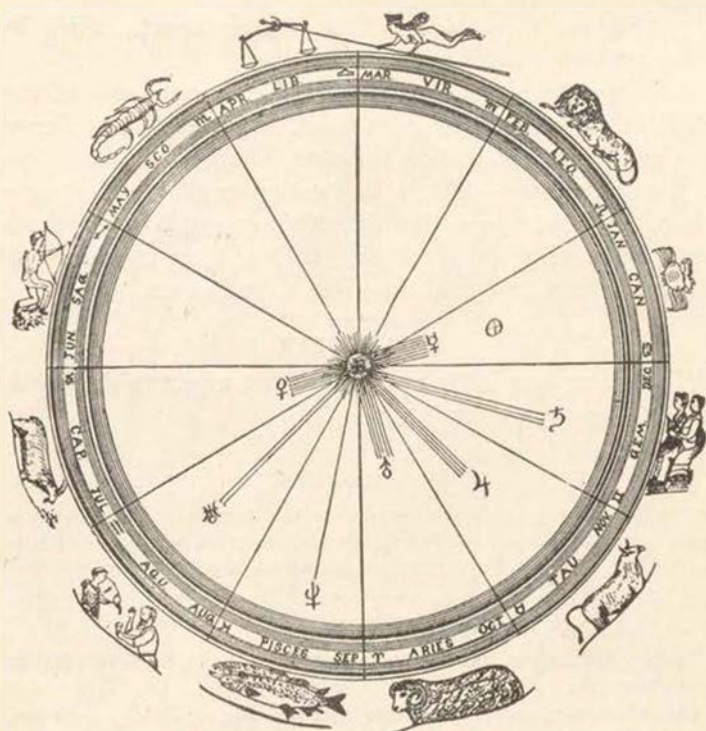


ORIGINAL BASIS OF THE SIGNS.

The signs of the planets as made in type form are not just in harmony with the original types, which were made up by combining the circle, the cross and the crescent. This particular cross was taken from the Equinoxes and the lines of the Summer and Winter solstices. The crescent, of course, was copied from the moon and the circle from the orbital circle, or from the globular or round appearance of full moon or sun. It is well in making these signs to follow the original designs, as they each have a meaning

TO DISTINGUISH PLANETS IN THE WEEKLY DIAGRAMS.

Those not familiar with the weekly figures or horoscopes as given in this work may readily distinguish them by observing that they are placed according to their relative distances from the sun. Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune, in regular order. The orbits of the first five are shown by the fine lines or circles, while Saturn is indicated by 8 moons and 2 points from the main body to represent the rings, Uranus by 4 moons and Neptune by 1 moon. With very little study one may become familiar with them, when there will be no difficulty in calling them on sight. The reason they are not made according to the original design is because of the difficulty in carving so many, a task which it is necessary to perform by hand.



ASPECTS.

The above illustration shows the Helio-centric aspects of influence which form the basis for all scientific Astrological predictions.

There are seven planets which influence the Earth, and also seven aspects of the same. The accompanying diagram will illustrate the comparative magnetic strength of these aspects, and explain their relative polarities. They are called:

1. Trine, four signs or 120 degrees apart. This aspect to the Earth, which is in Cancer, is represented by Neptune in Pisces (see diagram). It is the weakest in magnetic effect. We designate it as number 1.
2. Pentangle, five signs or 150 degrees apart. Represented by Uranus in Aquarius. This is second in magnetic influence.
3. Juxtaposition, one sign or 30 degrees apart. Represented by Saturn in Gemini, which is third in power.
4. Sextile, two signs or 60 degrees apart. Fourth in magnetic force. (See Jupiter in Taurus.)

5. Square, three signs, or 90 degrees apart. Fifth in force and represented by Mars in Aries.

6. Opposition, which means on the opposite side of the Sun, six signs or 180 degrees apart. Represented by Venus in Capricornus. It is sixth in power.

7. Conjunction—that is, in the sign or division. Represented by Mercury in Cancer. This aspect is seven times more magnetic and influential than No. 1, as opposition is six times more powerful than No. 1, and so on.

RULING STAR.

The ruling star is the one in strongest aspect to the Earth at birth, or at any given time.

THE ASPECTS.

The Aspects as given apply to both the Geo-centric and Helio-centric systems, but an opposition Geo-centrally is not an opposition Helio-centrally, therefore the following explanation is given:

GEO-CENTRICALLY.

Conjunction means that two planets appear to be in the same position in the heavens.

Opposition means that one planet is on one side, or in one direction, and another is on the opposite side of the earth.

Square means when two bodies are apparently 90 degrees apart.

Sextile means 60 degrees apart.

Trine means 120 degrees apart.

HELIO-CENTRICALLY.

Conjunction means two planets in the same sign. (See illustrations in this work).

Opposition means when planets are on opposite sides of the sun.

Square means three signs apart.

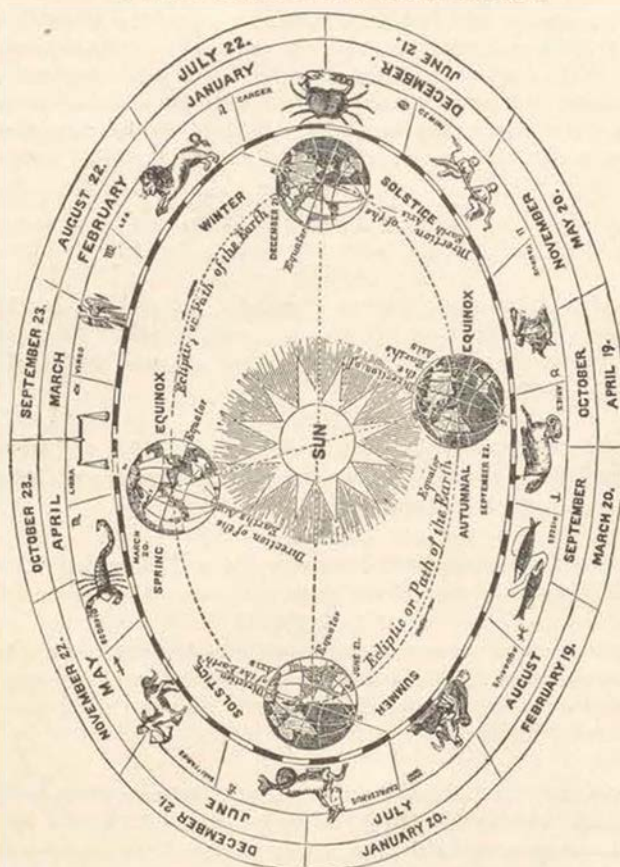
Sextile means two signs apart.

Trine means four signs apart.

THE SOLAR CIRCLE.



The Constellations, Seasons, Equinoxes, &c.

The above diagram illustrates the earth at the four cardinal points beginning the four seasons, Spring, Summer, Autumn, and Winter. The months are given both geo-centrally and helio-centrally. The inside circle shows where the Earth is each month, and the outside circle shows the corresponding position of the Sun.

The first day of Winter is the shortest day of the year, the first day of Summer the longest. The Spring and Autumn Equinoxes show the only days of the year having equal day and night.

This diagram will explain to many who are mixed up relative to the signs of one's birth, how it is that some authors give the wrong sign instead of the right one.

From December 22d to January 21st the Earth is in Cancer, and all people born during this interval of time are born in the Sign of Cancer and partake of the characteristics of this sign.

It will be seen that the Sun appears to be in Capricornus during this period, and some works of the theoretical stamp have it that a person is born in Capricornus during this time. This is a very great mistake, and it throws many people entirely out of harmony with the true basis of planetary science.

People are born where the Earth is, for they are upon it, not out

in space on the opposite side of the Sun, where there is nothing but the blue expanse of ether. Therefore, we may give herewith the truth relative to birth signs, that all who read may understand it. LATITUDINAL CHANGES OF THE PLANETS FOR 1904.

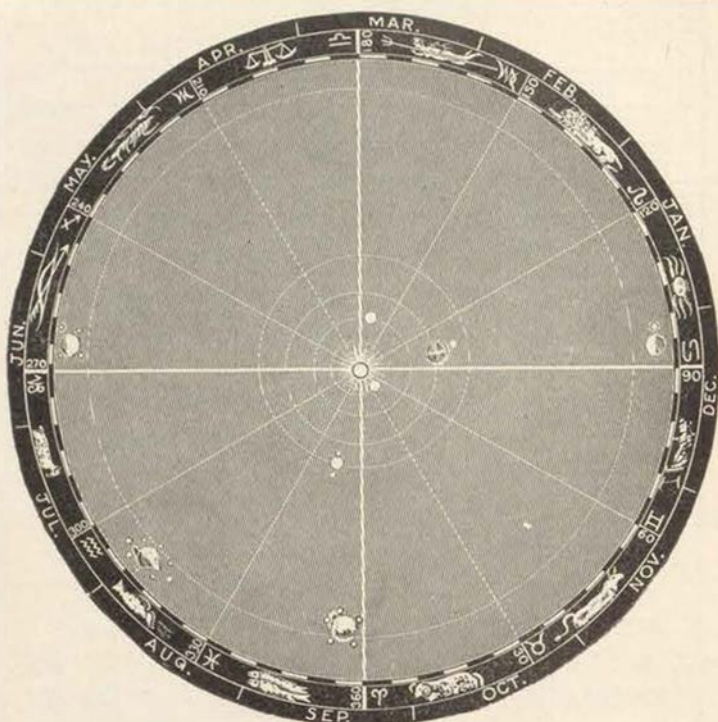

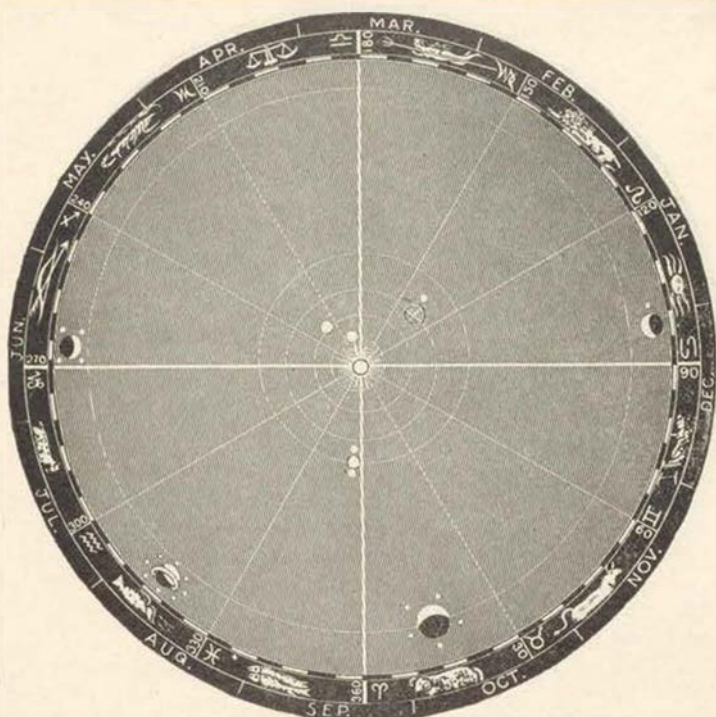
SEEDING.

Melons, Squash and all products of the vines are favored the 21st to the 24th, and the 28th, 29th and 30th.

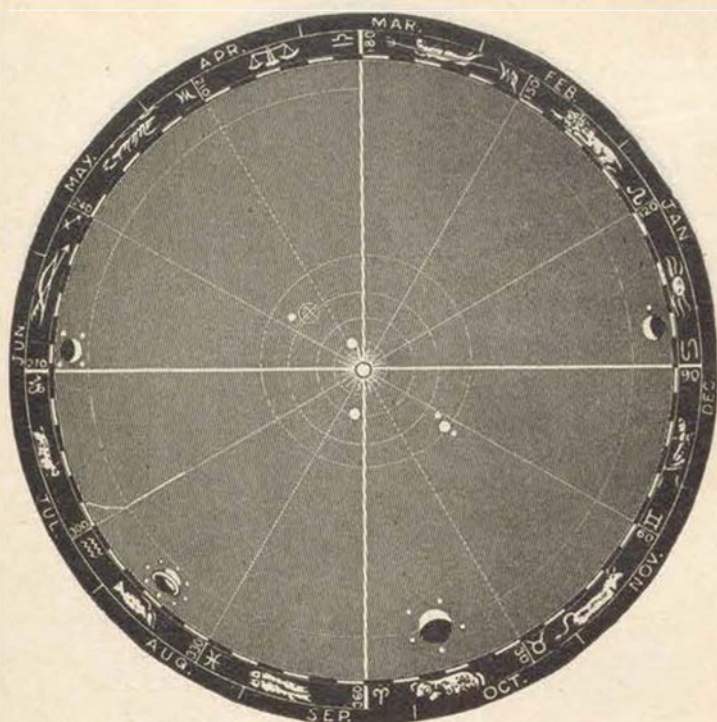

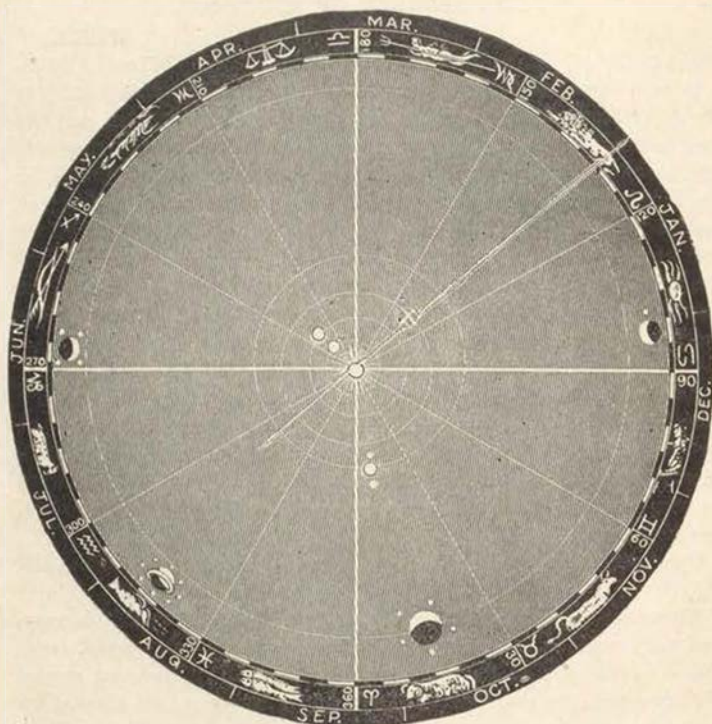

MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

How to Find Them.

The above diagram illustrates how one may locate the morning and evening stars for this or any other year by reference to the weekly figures given in this work.

The earth starts the year at 10 degrees of Cancer and moves toward Leo and on around the circle. Place a line from the sun across the earth as shown for any given week, and it will be seen that the morning stars are on the side of the line toward which the earth is moving, and the evening stars on the side following the earth.

By looking in the direction of the setting sun at 6 to 7 p. m. all stars from the western to the eastern horizon are evening stars, while all those in the other half of the circle are morning stars.

The morning stars may begin to appear in the east, at times, shortly after 6 o'clock, and are often considered evening stars on that account. The stars all rise in the east during each twenty-four hours. Evening means sunset or the first hour of the night. The night relates to the period from sunset to sunrise. Evening is the beginning and sunrise or morning the ending of the night time. In this way the line from the sun through the earth and out to the planets divides the evening from the morning stars.

When the stars are located their names may be learned from the orbits given in the figures for each week.

Mercury is nearest to the sun, Venus next, then the Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune in regular order.

ECLIPSES.

There will be two eclipses, both of the Sun, during the year.

The first is the annular eclipse of the Sun March 16. Visible at Borneo, Philippine Islands, southern coast of Asia, covering portions of China, Japan, the eastern coast of Africa, and touching the northern coast of Australia.

TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN.

There will be a total eclipse of the Sun September 8th. Visible over the western half of South America, extending over a large area of the Pacific Ocean, reaching nearly to Australia, including the Sandwich, Samoan, and Fiji Islands.

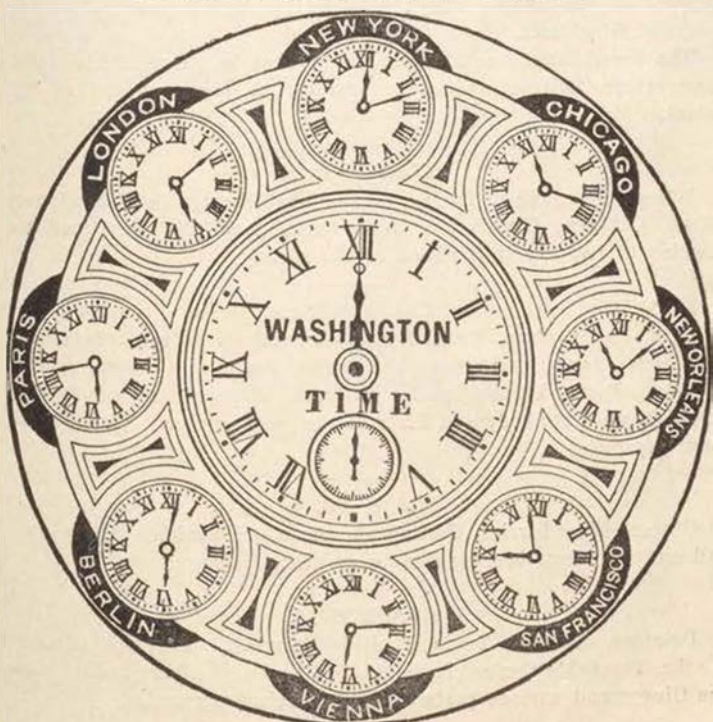

FARMERS' GUIDE

Seeding, Surgery, Etc.

FARMERS' SEEDING LIST.

The classification of the produce of the soil which is an important matter for farmers to understand is given herewith, and by reference to the weekly magnetic conditions affecting the growth and fruition of the same, may readily understand the time best adapted to the planting and sowing of each.

The idea is to start the germination under a powerful current from the planets and moon, that the stimulus given them may be of the right polarity. This insures the most prolific growth, as well as the best quality possible to produce at any given period.

The products are divided into four classes. The first includes all cereals and products that come to fruition at the head or top end of the stalk, bush, or tree. This class relates to such products as grow upright; that is, in line with the currents of the earth from the center outward.

The second class relates to upright growths also, but to such as bear their fruit upon the body of the stalk or limbs and branches thereof.

The third class includes all vines and creepers which parallel the surface of the earth. They represent the square currents to the perpendicular lines.

The fourth class includes all roots; that is, all products which have their fruitage under the surface, at the root end of the plant.

CLASS NO. 1.

Wheat, Rice, Rye, Barley, Oats, Buckwheat, Flax, Sunflower, Kern, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Top Onions, and all other products coming to fruition at the head of the stalk.

CLASS NO. 2.

Corn, Sugar Cane, Peas, Beans, Asparagus, Lettuce, Tomatoes, Rhubarb, Celery, and among the fruits, Bananas, Oranges, Apples, Lemons, Pears, Plums, Berries on bush, Cherries, and all bearing fruitage upon the body and limbs of the plant or tree. All nut bearing trees.

CLASS NO. 3.

Grapes, Strawberries, Cucumbers, Squash, Pumpkin, Melons, and all creeping vines bearing flowers or other fruitage.

CLASS NO. 4.

Potatoes, Turnips, Beets, Radishes, Carrots, Parsnips, Onions, Leeks, Vegetable Oyster, Horse Radish, and any other product such as Ginger and various roots having medicinal properties.

GESTATION.

The propagation of all life results from the copulation of the sexes. The gestatory periods vary in different species according to the vibrations and angularities of the forces which polarize and cut off to become acting centers until driven apart by dynamic interference. The latter is the reverse action of forces or of opposing poles becoming strong enough to change the poles of the vibrating atoms thus centered, when disintegration must of necessity set in.

There are some animal species which are very much in harmony with the human. For example: The cow, whose period is 280 days, the same as the human, and for this reason cow's milk for infants is a food having a harmonious magnetic similarity to that of the mother.

The period of a mare being 336 days, although much the cleaner animal, does not have the same, or even similar condition.

The goat, 147 days, although considered by many as giving richer and better milk, does not co-ordinate with the human, hence is undesirable animal product for the human economy.

Swine are less related, magnetically, to man, the period being 112 days, and while the milk of swine is not used as food, the same rule applies to the meat product as well. Beef, therefore, is by far the best meat possible to obtain for the human family.

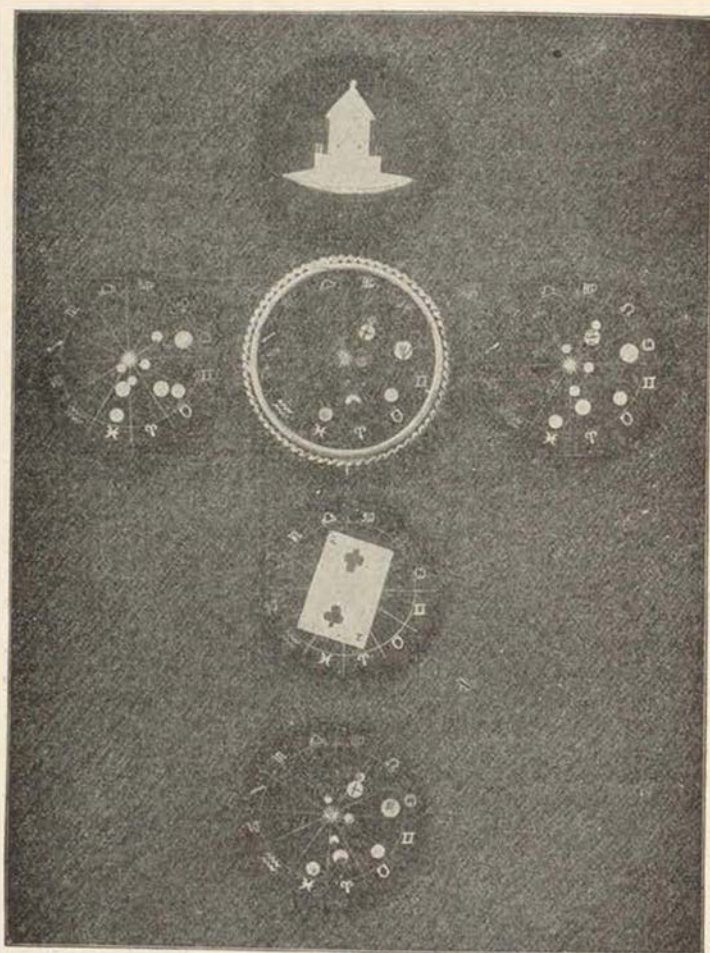
Sheep, swine, geese, ducks, and fowls generally are not the kind of meats that tend to elevate and upbuild the race. Animal food of every name is antagonistic to the higher aspirations of the soul, and must be dispensed with altogether if one wishes to reach the desired goal.
