# WOMEN LEADERS of the OCCULT

OW-A-DAYS, when women have lived down the comparatively low opinion in which they were held in Victorian times, we are no longer surprised to read of their achievements in matters far removed from their once domestic sphere.

But it was not always so. The woman "record-breaker" is an entirely new phenomenon. It is only a few years since it was thought that a woman's place was the home, and it was unseemly for her to cherish any ambitions which had their basis outside it.

Always Lead in the Occult World

But in the Occult world, they have always been leaders. In earliest days they were noted as seers—the famous Delphic Oracles are an example.

In more recent times women have held the most conspicuous places in movements devoted to Occult thought-Madame Blavatsky and Mrs. Annie Besant, for example, in Theosophy; Mrs. Hardinge Britten and Mrs. Tappan-Richmond in Spiritualism; Mrs. Piper in Psychical Research.

Leonore E. Piper . . . . To this woman some of the world's most eminent minds have owed their conviction of survival. Sir Oliver Lodge, Dr. Richard Hodgson, William James, Dr. Hyslop . . . one could cite many such from among the persons who sat with her, and talked, as they believed, across the threshold of

life and death.

Mrs. Piper was in her time the world's greatest medium because she submitted her gifts to every form of inquiry and test. She thus ruled out all possibility of deception and error, on her own part, and mal-observation on the part of her experimenters.

Now to-day, fresh from her examination in the psychological departments of Universities in America, comes to England a very remarkable medium in the person of Mrs.

Eileen Garrett.

Mrs. Eileen Garrett

She is in direct descent of the order laid down by the thorough-going Mrs. Piper. She has no "pet" theories. She began her psychic quest, and has remained throughout it, quite unprejudiced. Although she is a medium, she is not a Spiritualist because, she believes, there is so much unexplained-so many phenomena which need further investigation, so many mysteries that have never been solved. And in this position she feels that it is essential to maintain an open mind.

Mrs. Garrett is a trance medium. (The genuineness of her trance has been established by many tests.) In the trance state, she assumes, or is made to assume, personalities

entirely foreign to her own normal self. This, too, has been established, at least as a reasonable supposition, since blood tests, psycho-analysis and all manner of physiological experiments have brought forth entirely different reactions from these three personalities.

By submitting her powers to such close examination, prosecuted always by experts in the inquiry in hand, she has lifted mediumship far above the level of speculation. For no new movement in science can become possible till the facts which it forms have been verified again and again by penetrating inquiry. And, unfortunately, not many mediums are prepared to face this racking ordeal.

Human observation is notoriously fallible. The progress of science has, however, brought us many new instruments and methods of checking supernormal phenomena, so that in the face of such mechanical experiments as those conducted with Mrs. Garrett, the critic can no longer say "The investigators were deceived." The graphs, tracings and records remain to confound all sceptics.

But why must it be left to the American universities to rediscover, and scientifically confirm, the facts of the Occult sciences? Chairs of Psychical Research have been established at foreign universities. Why not here?

Such a provision is long overdue. We know far too little about the human personality, and its significance from

an Occult point of view has only yet been hinted at.

As Occult Investigators?

Next month we will present the first of a series of lectures on the Occult which were delivered recently at the London University. This is a

beginning, for sooner or later the phenomena of Mrs. Garrett and other women seers must be examined by our own scientists in their own laboratories.

Who knows but that, given the opportunity, our women scientists will not shine as Occult investigators?

HEN you speak to people about fairies in any part of the world, except perhaps Ireland, they invariably ask: "Do fairies really exist?"

They do!

The scientific proofs of their existence are two. First when they are seen by the human eye, which may be clairvoyant or may be not. Secondly, when they are photographed by the camera.

I will take the last first.

I have seen several fairy photographs, notably those of the Cottingley Wood fairies, in which the late Conan Doyle took so deep an interest, and who, as I had confirmed by letter, believed in their genuineness.

I remember two of these photos which I saw some little time ago. They showed the two girls who photographed them, each with a fairy. The little creatures were clothed in some filmy stuff, had pointed "butterfly" wings, no shoes or stockings, and perfectly exquisite forms, as they "pointed" like midget dancers before their little earth friends. [See illustrations on next two pages—ED.].

Researches at Dungeness

The Faery Investigation Society, founded by Capt. Quentin C. A. Craufurd, R.N., and the president of which was the Viscountess Molesworth, held its first meeting some years ago in Kensington.

I remember the extraordinarily interesting conversation I had with the founder when I dined with him, as he told me of his investigations—and he certainly had no doubt

of the existence of the little things. The researches made at Dungeness amongst the marsh fairies there, were also of a fascinating nature.

I have before me a letter from the Secretary of the Society, who writes: "I have got some very interesting results with my camera, which prove undoubtedly the existence of the fairy folk." One snapshot I saw was taken "quite by accident" by a lady in a garden near London, who was, I think, only taking a snap of her garden, when upon the developed film, she found a tiny fairy exactly like those of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle.

Scientists Puzzled

How well I remember the puzzled faces of the scientists and others to whom I lectured four years ago at the head-quarters in New York of the American Society for Psychical Research upon "The Fairy as Fact," as I proceeded to pile up point on point, and all upon strictly scientific lines! I know that I left them slightly dumb at the finish as I challenged them to refute!

The fairy can be seen either clairvoyantly or sometimes by the naked eye. But the camera will reveal many things which the normal eye cannot record, as we also know in

ghostly materialisations.

I do not regard myself as clairvoyant, but I have seen in broad daylight in a London open space an elemental form which dissolved as I approached it. This was also seen by another person.

My grandmother, a remarkably truthful woman, at the age of 18 in Dublin, together with the cook, as her father

lay dying, watched for a long time a banshee, as she said, "stripped almost naked, sitting on the roof of an outhouse and combing her long hair."

Of the existence of the banshee, or elemental-fairy, I have many records from eye-witnesses, some of them men and women of high standing. "A," the Irish writer, told me how he himself at times, "painted his elementals from life."

I have seen many of these paintings, including an exquisite undine or water-fairy. I have a letter before me

from a cultured woman living in a famous house in the Co. Cork, who writes to tell me that a banshee haunted her house. The banshee, or fairy-woman, is supposed only to send out her eerie howl or cry on the approach of death of some humar. I myself, as a child with several others, in broad sunlight, listened to this terrible cry which seemed to come out of the very air about us. There was no illusion possible and we were all terror-stricken.

But in an old Swedish castle where my wife and I were on a visit, the banshee was a pretty regular visitant, we were informed.

### More Evidence

Dr. John Lamond, at the British College of Psychic Science, in November, 1926, after a lecture by Mr. Tom Charman upon his New Forest researches into fairies, said "I am absolutely astounded at this revelation of the reality of fairy life and work." Another speaker

testified to the power of his two girls to see "the little people," as we Irish call them.

But what are fairies?

The Irish legends have it that the fairies were originally the rebellious angels who followed Lucifer when they were all thrown out of paradise. Some of them fell on Ireland, and so we got the leprechaun

and the cluricaun and "the good people" as we call them, because we are afraid to call them "bad."

They are always playing tricks, and as Dan Sullivan, the cowman at Blarney where my aunt had her place, told me: "They'd be plaiting the tails of the cows together and throwing over the milk pails!" -facts confirmed by others. They are, in a word, distinctly poltergeistish!

There are several other theories, but the fact, as opposed to the fiction, is that the fairy is not human—but a sort of sub-human or elemental. He has evolved along a different line of growth from us mortals. He is said to live a thousand

years, and as my leprechaun, Macdhuv, laments in "Tales of the Little Sisters of Saint Francis" as he sighs for a human soul:

He hopped,

Then stopped,
With his bumbledy - umbledy - doo -

dab-day.
From the small mouth fell many
"Oh dears!"

The small green eyes wept green, green tears

For a thought had stilled his heart


with fears . . .

"A leprechaun lives but a thousand

With his bumbledy - umbledy - doo dah-day.

His is an etheric body. He can see us mortals, but we can't always see him, for he can lower or heighten his vibration at will as I imagine. Yet he is not what we call "a ghost."

He can communicate with us by speech, as I think Yeats himself has said. If he is an Irishman, he speaks Irish, but he can sometimes speak

English, and the fairies of different countries look different. My friend Ella Young, the Irish poetess, told me how "the little people "when she was living in a lonely cottage outside Dublin, "would call for her in the afternoon and lead her up the garden outside to look at the hills with them." 

Leave the depths of space for a while, and return to our home, the earth. Here we are, living and moving and having our being on a tiny pellet some eight thousand miles in diameter. Looking around us with the eye of vision, we find that the earth is one of a number of globes which travel in almost circular paths (called orbits) round a large central

of, and speak of, the Heavens

sphere—the Sun.

The Solar System—for so we call the Sun and his attendant planets-may be pictured as floating in the centre of the Celestial Sphere, very much as a minute group of tiny balloons might float in the middle of the Albert Hall dome. The bodies in the Solar System form as it were a little island floating in the middle of the Celestial Sphere. The distance to the nearest fixed star, even if it be measured from the very outermost planet of the system, is so vast as to be almost unbelievable.

The Celestial Sphere

OOKING up at the sky at night, it appears to the human eye as the inside of a vast hollow bowl or hemisphere. The surface of this bowl or hemisphere is apparently studded with stars; some of these stars twinkle, a few do not. Those which appear to twinkle are called "The Fixed Stars," they are at unthinkably vast distances from us. Those which do not twinkle are called "Planets"—they are much nearer to us and shine with a clear steady light.

If you have not before noticed celestial phenomena, make a point of noting just where the Sun rises in the morning, follow its motion during the day, and make a mental picture of the track it followed. If the following night you look for the planets you will find they are all near this track, which we shall later learn roughly corresponds to the Zodiac. Again, if you watch the heavens on successive nights you will notice that, whereas the fixed stars all appear to keep the same relative position to each other, the planets appear to move among the stars.

Though the Earth on which we stand is a ball, it is so large that its surface seems quite flat, and not curved. Beneath our feet and hidden by this apparently flat surface of the earth, is another similar hemisphere. Linking up the two halves, therefore, we can picture the heavens as a vast hollow sphere—known to us henceforward as "The Celestial Sphere."

Of course, there is no such sphere! The fixed stars are not points of light studded upon a fixed background, they are immense Suns at infinitely vast and varied distances. Names and Symbols of the Planets

The nearest fixed star is infinitely further away from the Solar orb-so far away indeed that its distance can only be expressed in terms of analogy. Light travels at the enormous velocity of 186,000 miles per second, yet the light of the nearest fixed star takes a man's lifetime to reach us.

The Sun and Moon, strictly speaking, are not planets. The Sun is the central parent orb, and the Moon is a secondary body (or "Satellite") which revolves round the Sun in a similar manner to the revolution of the earth round

the Sun. But it is convenient to speak of the two Luminaries as "planets" for Astrological purposes.

The planets move in almost circular paths—ellipses—round the Sun. The relative distances from the Sun are in the order given on the preceding page. Mercury is the nearest to the Sun, Pluto the farthest away. The level or "plane" of their orbits is about the same. For this reason, when seen from the Sun or any one planet, they always appear to move along a certain belt or track of the sky, this belt or track being known as the Zodiac. The

Zodiac is divided into twelve


equal sections or areas called

"The Signs of the Zodiac." Now as Astrologers, we are concerned only with ourselves and our fellow-inhabitants of the earth, and happenings upon the earth. We are The place of birth of the individual whose horoscope we are casting is obviously a most vital factor. pared to the height of a human being, the earth's diameter is so huge, and the sweep of its curved surface is so huge, that it appears flat to the eye. The great circle around one on an open plain, where on every hand the surface of the sky appears to meet the surface of the earth or sea, is called the Horizon. Now the horizon has vast importance in Astrology. Obviously, no two places can have the same

EARTH

An observer standing on the earth at A would have as the plane of his horizon HW-HE. A star placed in the sky at Xc would appear to him to be hung towards the eastern side of the horizon HE. But another observer, standing farther east at B would have as the plane of his horizon hw-he. To him, at the same moment of time, the star Xc would appear to be poised above the western horizon, hw.

As the first essential of practical Astrology is accurately to ascertain where the planets and zodiacal signs are actually placed at a stated time, the first Astrologers would no doubt work from actual observa-Hence the "high tower"

beloved by romantic novelists. Later, we know from inscribed tablets and papyri found, that the ancients supplemented their observations by calculations based on Tables of planetary motion. To-day, we make our calculations from "ready-made" data given in "Ephemerides" or Almanacs, which tabulate the planetary and zodiacal positions for us day by day and year by year.

For purposes of reference and judgment, the planetary and zodiacal data we require concerning a person's birth is noted down in a graph or chart popularly called "The Horoscope." Almost everybody interested in the Occult is familiar with the type of figure illustrated on the previous page though it is sometimes varied slightly in form.


Construction of the Horoscope

In earlier times the round form of horoscope was not used, a square chart being made to serve. But the round form above, first, I think, introduced by Tycho Brahe, is now almost universally used. This round form is constructed on the following ideas:—

First we get something to represent the horizon of the place of birth—to stand for the *plane* of the horizon (the horizon as seen edgewise, if you like), the level of the great circle formed by the meeting of the sky and the earth or sea. This may be conveniently represented by a double line:




On the left is the East point of the horizon (the side where the Sun rises in the morning) and on the right is the West—the side where the Sun sets. We are therefore supposed to be looking southward. A semi-circle is now superimposed upon the double line. This semi-circle represents and stands for a sectional view of the visible heavens. It pictures as it were the visible heavens cut open for inspection:—





To follow out the idea and complete it we then put in the remaining half of the celestial sphere:—



Thus we have a section of the complete heavens, both visible and invisible, divided centrally by the horizon. Be it noted here that the planets hidden by the earth's surface are just as important as those which are above the earth in the visible celestial hemisphere.

In practical Astrology, however, we are not content to divide the heavens into two sections, we make *twelve* equal parts or sections called *Houses*. The dividing lines between the Houses are called "House Cusps," shown below.



The double line at right angles to the horizon is called the *Meridian*: the part above the horizon being called the *upper* meridian, the part below, the *lower* meridian. (If one cuts an orange in half, the cut being at right angles to the core, we get a very fair parallel to what happens when we divide the heavens into Houses. The fibre partitions between the sections of fruit correspond to the House Cusps).

The earth rotates—turns round on its axis—once a day. This of course causes the whole heavens to appear to rotate daily. The heavens therefore pass over each and every House every twenty-four hours.


We may now add a small circle in the middle of the above diagram (to represent the earth). Then we add a *large* circle, leaving us space for our symbols, and thus get the conventional "blank" horoscope," shown on the previous page.

Following a remarkable series of incidents, the famous bone which was brought to Edinburgh was found smashed to bits on the floor of the drawing-room of Sir A. Seton's bouse. This picture shows the corner of the drawing-room with the smashed case and bone.

# EGYPTIAN RELIC

The Press has published many versions of the 'curse' overshadowing the home of Sir Alexander Seton since his wife brought to Edinburgh a bone taken from a newly discovered Egyptian tomb. Here—exclusive to PREDICTION —is the full, authenticated story of the strange experiences which befell the Seton family.

ANY are the accounts of supernormal happenings and strange manifestations that have been related in these pages and elsewhere, but surely the greatest of all modern mysteries came to its dramatic climax in Edinburgh this year, before many had finished enjoying their June number of Prediction.

A bone, at least 5,000 years old, and taken from an ancient Egyptian tomb last year, smashed itself to fragments yesterday (as I write), in a Baronet's residence in the Scottish Capital.

To visualise the beginning of the drama, one must take one's mind out to Egypt, where, last year, Sir Alexander and Lady Seton were travelling. On being invited to accompany an official party to the opening of a newly found tomb, near to those of the Pharaohs at Gizeh, and unentered since 3,000 B.C., they readily assented, and the opening was duly performed.

Quite naturally, Lady Seton desired a memento to commemorate such an occasion, but an official entreated her not to take away anything, as such an act was forbidden. Ultimately an Arab offered Lady Seton a bone from the tomb—a bone that has brought nothing but havoc and disaster in its train.

The first indication of trouble seems to have taken place

on board ship coming home, when there was an outbreak of Typhus fever and one of Lady Seton's companions was stricken By F. G. TWEEDALE

with an unknown malady. I am glad to learn that she has now recovered.

This, however, was only the forerunner of mystery. During the last year Lady Seton has had two serious illnesses, and Sir Alexander, whose brother is Mr. Bruce Seton the actor husband of Tamara Desni, has been ill twice and has undergone a minor operation.

Two fires have broken out in their house in Learmonth

So much for the "negative" occurrences; now for some of a "positive" nature.

Towards the end of last year, a lady and a boy nine years of age were staying at the Seton home. During the night a scream was heard, and the young lad was found, terrified, under the bedclothes. He said that as he was on his way to the bathroom, he had seen a weird, unearthly figure going towards the drawing room, where the bone was kept in a glass case. On investigation there was no one there.

Again, this figure was seen by Lady Seton's guest and, thinking that it was Lady Seton herself, her friend went into the room and saw a form standing by the case. When she turned on the light, it vanished. Neither of these people knew of the bone's existence.

The lady could not see its face, but she said it was certainly a person of short stature; interesting, in view of the

fact that a surgeon to whom Sir Alexander had previously shown the bone, pronounced it to have been that of a small human being.

Indescribably weird noises have been heard in the room to the accompaniment of the smashing of vases, and only last Sunday, May 16th, a dinner party of Sir Alexander's was somewhat alarmingly interrupted when the bone and its case were carried by an unseen power into the middle of the room and overturned.

The case was then put on top of a marble topped chest, and there it remained till the end.

By this time, maids had started leaving the house, and this can well be imagined when one learns that glasses and ornaments, put away at night, were found unaccountably smashed in the morning.

The sacrum has been out of Sir Alexander Seton's possession for short periods since his return from the fateful trip to Gizeh.

### The Climax

On one occasion he loaned it to a famous surgeon who promptly returned it the following day. His maid had seen a robed figure, fallen down stairs and broken her leg.

A *Daily Express* reporter took it over for some 48 hours, and kept it in his bedroom, but apart from experiencing an eerie feeling and losing some sleep, he was apparently unaffected. Later, however, he became ill.

unaffected. Later, however, he became ill.

The "smashing" climax arrived on 19th May, shortly after 5 a.m. A terrific crash was heard by the household, and on investigating the cause, Sir Alexander found the bone, now crumpled and broken, lying beside its smashed case on the carpet.

Now, one must bear in mind that the case, which measured about 2 ft. long by 9 inches broad, contained fairly

The chest on which the case containing the relic usually stood. After a number of unexplainable happenings the bone was found smashed to pieces.

thick glass panels, in addition to being bound by copper bands so stout that a man would require to exert a good measure of strength even to bend them.

The sacrum was as light as a feather.

In spite of these facts, two of the bands were found completely twisted and the glass in fragments.

When the accompanying photographs were about to be taken, the camera-man adjusted his tripods and turned round to attend to the connection of a switch. When he looked at his camera after a lapse of a second or two, it was found to have entirely changed its position, one of the legs having been drawn away from under it, leaving a visible mark on the thick pile of the carpet. Definitely no one was near enough to touch the apparatus at the

time.

"Unless that bone is got away within six weeks, blindness will come upon those who touch it." So said Mrs. Bateman, a London medium, after Sir Alexander Seton had recounted part of the story to the Edinburgh Psychic College on April 9th. It would seem, therefore, by comparing the dates, that all

should now be well.

Anyway, Sir Alexander intends to give the remains a decent burial.

### The Solution?

Previous to the final vigorous manifestations of the bone, which incidentally was said to be cursed, Sir Alexander was frankly sceptical of anything savouring of the Occult. Before the final act, however, he had accepted a challenge from Mr. James Clarke, Secretary of the Edinburgh Branch of the Modern Education Thought Movement, to prove the authenticity of the bone's alleged supernatural powers, at a public debate in Edinburgh in aid of charity. I await with interest the Edinburgh Branch of the Modern Education Thought Movement's arguments, as the onus is on them to prove that those happenings are natural, not for Sir Alexander, who was looking very fit and well when I spoke to him, to prove them supernatural.

And the explanation?

Personally I have sought a solution along channels embracing most lines of thought including Reincarnation and Astrology. It is known, of course, that thought-power, instilled into objects animate or inanimate, remains effective, and the thoughts of Egyptians at the time of their burials might well have been that the tomb should not be descrated by disturbance. The natural sequence of disturbance would be destruction.

The bone, moreover, belonged to an Egyptian lady of high rank, and presumably therefore of high mentality, judging by the close proximity of her tomb to those of the Pharaohs.

# How To READ THE TAROT CARDS

The Tarot Cards are the oldest set of cards used for divination purposes. They are still widely employed by gipsies throughout the world, and the remarkable accuracy of the readings obtained has been vouched for innumerable times.

IVINATION by cards has been practised from ancient times in many different nations, the oldest pack used for this purpose being that called the Tarot, a set of twenty-two major and fifty-six minor pictorial designs.

Our present day playing cards were derived from this Tarot pack, and the game of chess as played to-day has connections with the Tarot, for King, Queen, Knight, Castle, Bishop are all pictured in the twenty-two major Arcanes. The fifty-six minor Arcanes (like our playing cards) are divided into four suits, each containing the numerals from one to ten, with King, Queen and Knave court

cards and an additional court card called the Knight.

These four suits of the minor Tarot Cards are called Wands, Cups, Swords and Pentacles, which are equivalent to clubs, hearts, spades and diamonds respectively in our playing cards.

Some Hints for Success

For success in reading the cards, it is better to keep a pack untouched by any other person than the owner, who should handle the cards as much as possible in order that they become imbued with his, or her, own personal magnetism. They should be wrapped up in a piece of silk and kept in a wooden box so as not to come into contact with other articles. Keep a special table upon which to lay out the cards—a new unvarnished table made of pine wood is the most conducive to success.

The Tarot reader should sit on the south side of the

table and the person to whom the reading is to be given, on the north side.

The mental attitude of both should be a firm and determined resolve to obtain the truth, whether pleasant or unpleasant. If the mood of either is negative or there is a strong desire for a particular result, the spreads are likely to picture that mental attitude rather than a correct answer to the problem.

### The Method

The cards should be shuffled by the person desiring the reading, reversing the ends of some exactly as he feels impressed. He should then cut the cards into three separate piles, repeat-

ing the shuffling and cutting process twice more, before handing to the reader.

There are many different types of spread, and the reader should decide upon the most appropriate one for the present purpose. For instance to obtain the answer yes or no to a definite question, five cards may be dealt in a single row from left to right; the majority of the cards right way up give an answer in the affirmative, but if most of the cards are reversed then the reply is in the negative. The reader can, however, give detailed advice concerning his client's problem, remembering the diviniatory meanings of the cards; for the matter itself is described by the centre card, the events leading up to it by the right hand cards, and the result or future influences by those cards on the left.

What the Minor Arcanes Mean

Though the short diviniatory meanings can be amplified considerably after practice with the cards, the following (Continued on next page)

hints should be found valuable by the beginner.

The suit of Pentacles (like diamonds in our playing cards) represent money and possessions, trade and all things of value. Sceptres (clubs in our playing cards) represent enterprise, initiative and regality. Cups (hearts in our cards) represent love, friendship, marriage and happiness, and the Sword (equivalent to the spade) represents struggle, law suits and opponents. Sceptres and swords represent dark persons, cups and pentacles fair individuals. The King of each suit represents a man of mature age, the Queen indicates the influence of a woman, the Knight symbolises a young person and the Knave a child. Sceptres and cups indicate beneficial influences, whereas swords and pentacles represent detrimental forces or persons.

Some Examples

To take some random examples: if the Queen of sceptres was a dominating card in a spread, the beneficial influence of a dark woman would be indicated, whereas if the

Knight of pentacles occupied a prominent position the reader would warn his client against the detrimental influence of a fair young man.

Other Interpretations

The above mentioned cards can of course be interpreted in other categories. For instance the King, Queen, Knight and Knave may represent the end, maturity, development or start of an event or enterprise, or again as age maturity, youth and childhood.

When right way up the court cards retain the sex indicated, but if reversed the sex is reversed. For instance the Knight of sceptres reversed represents a dark woman, though the right way up it indicates a dark man. The Knaves represent the thoughts and desires of other people. If these cards appear right way up, the thoughts and plans of the persons indicated are shown to be beneficial, but if reversed they are inimical.

To designate the influences upon the life of a person

indicated by a court card, consider the card which appears just before it in the spread. To determine the correct steps to be taken, judgment should be made according to the meaning of the card which follows it.

The diviniatory meaning of the ten numbered cards in each suit are as follows:

Ace. Means news of business opportunity. Two. Business depending upon scientific method. Three. Partnership or co-operation. Four. Benefits from a will. Five. General good fortune in business. Six. Benefit from music, art, drama. Seven. Success in teaching, writing, publishing, short journeys. Eight. Benefit by exercise of tact, or a political appointment. Nine. Profitable friendship which



A numbered card reversed indicates a less fortunate influence, making the Swords and Pentacles more inimical and the Sceptres and Cups somewhat less beneficial. A card the right way up increases the promise of the benevo-

A fuller description and illustrations of the Major Tarots, with directions for making other spreads for specific purposes must be left for a later article, but in all instances it should be remembered that the personal intuition of the delineator should augment the interpretations suggested by the cards.

# The HOW and WHY



of HYPNOTISM

This is the first of a New Series telling what Hypnotism is and what Experiments in this subject the amateur can make.

N dealing with the subject of Hypnotism, I feel there will be many facts disclosed which the average reader will find difficult to credit. I therefore propose to point out that, although looked upon with a great deal of misunderstanding, it is a science with far greater uses than is generally realised.

The attitude of the general public towards the Hypnotist is, in many cases, one of fear. It is a point of view which is, of course, absurd. Many people think that a Hypnotist is a man possessing 'supernatural' powers. This is equally absurd, because, although many readers will no doubt shun the idea, every living person has the power to hypnotise. That power is quite dormant since it has never been cultivated, but, nevertheless, it is there.

Another very common mistake is that the eyes play a very big part in Hypnotism. It is not the eyes but the *voice* which plays the leading part when giving suggestions to the sub-conscious mind of the subject.

Sleep introduced by artificial means (once called Mesmerism, after Mesmer) is all that Hypnotism really is.

A Hypnotist cannot, as is generally assumed, hypnotise any person against their will. To bring about the state of Hypnosis, the Hypnotist must have the consent of the person in whom he is desirous of inducing sleep.

The methods employed in inducing this state of Hypnosis are far too numerous to outline in full, but I will endeavvour to describe one which
I have utilised with some

By F. P

first sitting, and it is quite usual to make several attempts before successfully bringing about the Hypnotic sleep.

To obtain maximum satisfaction from the first sleep-producing test, seat the subject in a comfortable chair and instruct him to look intently into your eyes, relaxing his

muscles. When, and not until, his body is in a state of complete relaxation, convince him that he is going to sleep. His eyes must be concentrated on the Hypnotist, during which time the operator spreads the first, second and third fingers of the left hand on the top of the head of the subject and the thumb on the root of his nose, exerting slight pressure on the thumb.

The Suggestion

Gaze intently at your thumb-nail and give the suggestion on the following lines: "The longer you look at me, the drowsier you are becoming. You are getting drowsy—you are feeling very tired—and sleepy. Everything is getting dark—you can think of nothing but sleep—sleep sleep."

These suggestions should be repeated several times to the subject. Then tell him to close his eyes and think of nothing but one thing—sleep.

We will suppose that our subject has responded quickly to the suggestion, and has fallen asleep. Now make what

is known as a 'post-hypnotic suggestion.' Although the subject is in a deep sleep there is, however, one faculty awake— the Subconscious

How to Begin

First ascertain that the subject is in a serious frame of mind,

and then commence to bring about the sleep.

mind—and it is to this that the following suggestions are addressed:

"You are quite soundly asleep and no matter who calls you, you will not hear them. Mine is the only voice you can hear and only when I call, will you awake."

Then the post-hypnotic suggestion can be made in this manner:

"When I call you by your name, in a moment, you will waken, but remember nothing of what I have said. You will feel you have had a most enjoyable sleep.

"Exactly one hour after you wake, you will again fall asleep."

Then call the subject and he will immediately awake.

FASTENING THE

Unable to prevent himself, in an hour's time he will again fall asleep. Wake him once more and he will be unable to explain why he fell asleep. This proves that suggestion given during hypnosis will operate even after the subject has awakened. The value of such suggestion, in relieving nervous and other ailments, will be obvious.

The Lighter Side

of Hypnotism

I once had a rather amusing experience with a subject of mine to whom I suggested, while he was in a hypnotic sleep, that at mid-day on the morrow, he should purchase a cigar and present it to me.

Soon after twelve on the following day my friend knocked at my door and presented me with the cigar. I asked him what had induced him to buy it, since he knew I was a non-smoker. He could not explain why it was, but confessed that he was

'urged' to do so while passing a tobacconist.

It was a very simple experiment, but it is only by such experiments that one can realise the possibilities of Hypnotism.

I will now quote another experiment of a lighter nature. I once accepted an invitation to a house party, and during the evening the entire company were surprised to find a member of the party—a young lady—had fallen asleep.

Her condition was due to a post-hypnotic suggestion I had made to her some time previously. She was a subject of mine, and while in the state of hypnosis, I had suggested to her that whenever she saw me clasp my hands behind my head, she would immediately fall asleep.

It so happened that during the evening she sat opposite

me and could not fail to notice me clasp my hands behind my head, upon which she had immediately fallen asleep, and could not have been wakened by anybody other than myself

The most familiar word associated with the Hypnotist is Hypnotism—a word which should never have been used. The word should have been Suggestion as it is this which covers the entire field of this fascinating science, whereas Hypnotism covers only one of the numerous branches—the sleepy condition produced by suggestion.

Power of Suggestion

HANDS TOGETHER

Tell the subject to fasten his hands together as

tightly and firmly as possible. See that he puts all his strength into it, with the arms pressed tightly to his sides. Tell him to look intently into your eyes and concentrate his mind upon the thought that he

cannot pull his hands apart.

Then make passes with both your hands over the

subject's forearms and hands. These passes should be made quickly. At the same time look intently into the subject's eyes and make the following sug-

gestions:
"Your-hands-are-stuck-tight-together-and-you-cannot-get-them-apart."

Keep repeating these suggestions over determinedly, looking intently at the spot on the subject's forehead between the eyebrows. The first time do not let him

pull more than a moment. Then clap your hands together and suggest: "All right—wide awake. Now you can release your hands." If you let the subject

pull long enough, he will finally get them apart unless

he is an exceptionally fine subject, and if you let him

pull them apart once, you will find it harder to control him the next time, but on the contrary, if you only

tighten them for a moment, the first time, it will give

longer, and so on until you finally get him so that he can-

not pull them apart—no matter how hard he may try.

Then, next time you try it, you can hold him a little

him confidence in your ability to fasten his hands

As it is understood by the Hypnotist, Suggestion is the art or science of conveying a mental image to the mind of the subject, either consciously or unconsciously. If the suggestion is made in the correct manner the subject carries it out without the slightest hesitation.

Unless thoroughly conversant with the laws and principles of the many methods of conveying a Suggestion, it is impossible to realise their value.

In the method of Personal Magnetism, a suggestion is conveyed to the subject's mind with the aid of persuasion

or argument when in a normal

For example, one may have fixed ideas about something which are instantly swayed after hearing an orator arguing against the principles which we firmly believed in. So forcible are his arguments that we are compelled to change our opinions. This is the result of suggestion received through Personal Mag-

Suggestion is experienced in everyday life. It is almost impossible for two persons to meet without one or the other making some sort of suggestion which will influence the other.

A Mistaken Idea

Many actions are made by persons who should not be held responsible as the suggestion has been conveyed by someone else.

An individual who is familiar with the power of suggestion has the advantage of being able

to follow only those suggestions which are to his or her good.

Those who understand suggestion develop a personality and force of character which cannot be obtained from any other source.

Many people have an entirely erroneous idea of the powers of Hypnotism. At the mere mention of the word, they are inclined to scoff and describe it as 'bunk.'

Regardless of these combatants, Hypnotism is now being recognised as a reputable science and its service is being sought throughout the world—in elaborately equipped hospitals, nursing homes and wherever there is the need of medical attention.

### DEFINITION OF THE CRANIAL LANDMARKS

Central Point. The point where a vertical line from the pre-auricular point meets the circumferential line.

Frontal Eminences. The most prominent convexity on each side of the forehead. Glabella. The smooth surface immediately above the root of the nose.

Inion. The prominence low down on the back of the head.

Occipital Point. The point farthest back, on the profile view.

Ophyron. The centre point of a line drawn from the ridges immediately above the eyebrows.

Parietal Eminences. The rounded prominences at the upper part of the sides of the head, slightly towards the back.

Pre-auricular Point. The slight hollow immediately in front of the ears.

Temporal Crest. The long ridge at the front sides of the head.

# **MEASURE**

This problem confronted me when the British Phrenological Society promoted its Golden Jubilee Congress in London last July and I was invited to contribute an item to the Exhibition.

The result, the "Craniograph," proved to be one of the "high spots," arousing much comment.

The development of the scientific aspect of phrenology is one of the leading aims of the Society, and it is in this direction that the Craniograph can be of distinct value, because it conveys a definite picture of the shape of the cranium and indicates regional pro-

portions.


Such a graph as those which are reproduced here has little significance unless it bears some relationship to an average. Fortunately, a considerable number of accurate measurements have been recorded, representing many types of people and this gives a reasonable basis for at least a tentative chart of average measurements.


Dr. Withinshaw's System of Measuring

Thirty years ago Dr. Charles Wesley Withinshaw, L.R.C.P., L.R.C.S., L.M., Demonstrator of Anatomy at the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh, promoted a

scheme by -which the whole of the 10" cranium could be measured, region by region, and the relative capacities of the various areas could be compared. This has been accepted as a scientific method of assessment far more reliable, so far as precision goes, than the judgment by eye by outspread fingers.



paper. Taking the circumferential measurement as the starting point (because this is the first and most essential measurement of cranial size), note the variations of the remaining twelve factors from the averages for the particular circumference. Then mark their positions to right or left of the vertical "average" line, according to whether they are over (right) or under (left) the average, using one square per one-tenth inch variation.

In all the many Craniographs I have prepared I have never yet found two alike, nor do I think I am likely to

Prediction has published a brilliant series of articles, by Mr. C. E. Sewell, F.B.P.S., in which these aspects of phrenology have been dealt with, and the significance of the regions and their individual organs clearly demonstrated.

I do not claim for the Craniograph that its scope includes the influence of qualifying factors, but simply that, other things being normal, it is quite possible to gain a vivid mental image of the head-shape and regional capacity from the pattern of the Craniograph, and that it offers a definite and scientific foundation for the philosophy and art which are concerned with the presentation of a phrenological delineation.

Try it for yourself! Get a patient friend to sit in front of you, place the chart before you and take the measurements as indicated. From these measurements prepare a Craniograph, referring to the table of averages for this purpose. Considerable variations to left or right of the

Here are the measurements and their significance, using the diagram on the previous page as a basis:

1. CIRCUMFERENCE. Round B and G. Showing the total length round the base of the cranium, this provides a general first impression of size and capacity.

PARIETO-OCCIPITAL PROJECTION. The circumferential measurement behind H. Shows length behind the ears, the social region, excess indicating domestic, social interests, love for people, children, home, animals, etc.

3. LOWER FRONTAL PROJECTION. Deduct 2 from 1. Length in front of the ears. The region of perception. Excess indicates primarily

a large intellectual region.

UPPER FRONTAL PROJECTION. From F. to F, over C. This

measurement covers the reflective and the constructive regions of the brain, indicating the philosophical and "problem loving" power.

5. FRONTAL BREADTH. The width at the lower and outer angle of the forehead (the outer edge of D). Taken by callipers. A high figure indicates great powers of perception, recognition and apprecia-

tion of colour, figures, shapes, weights, balance, orderly arrangements.

6. FRONTAL ARCH. From H to H, over a point midway between the Vertical Arch and B. Excess in this measurement indicates a

sense of vision, high tone and refinement generally.
7. VERTICAL ARCH. From H. to H, vertically over the head.
This covers the ethical and moral region of the brain, giving an idea of the moral control, appreciation of really good things, the high aims of the world.

8. Parietal Arch. From H to H, over E. A large figure is a clear indication of self-control, caution, the natural inclination to

think first before acting.

PARIETAL BREADTH (by callipers). Width between E and E. This is read in conjunction with No. 8.

TEMPORAL BREADTH (by callipers). Width at a point immediately above the attachment of the outer ear (the pinna). Great width at the base of the brain is a sure sign of physical energy. It is almost always found in persons who use the body more than the brain, and in great excess is found in the lower types, in conjunction

brain, and in great excess is found in the lower types, in conjunction with a minus quality of the moral and self-perfecting regions.

11. TEMPORAL DEPTH. The distance from F to H. Great depth at the base of the brain indicates power of endurance and is often found with great width (No. 10). The two factors together give a very clear idea of the "physical" side of the character.

12. LENGTH (by callipers). From B to G. When the length of the head from front to back is very great, this usually signifies quickness.

FTER reading a letter of mine in "The Inquirer" advocating cooperation between Spiritualists and Unitarians, the Editor invited me to write an article for *Prediction* on the relation between psychical research and

religion. But at the outset I must disclaim all intention of defending the traditions and creeds of " orthodox " Christendom-Catholic or Protestant. They have shackled the intellect of Man more than long enough; not infrequently they have corrupted ethics; and long since they have provoked the inevitable reaction to hostility or indifference. And one the things about Spiritualism which ought to delight every Unitarian is that it has, roughly speaking, the

that Unitarianism has—the same passion to get back to the purer theism of Jesus himself. Without any aid from us, Spiritualists seem to have discovered a simplified theology very much like that we have been preaching for some two centuries.

A Unitarian First

But again I admit that I am Unitarian or Theist first and Spiritualist afterwards. Quite apart from any occult or esoteric claims, quite apart from the most empirical Spiritualism or psychical research, I believe in God. In fact, belief is an inadequate word. I am sure of God. He can be met immediately—met in the beauty of nature and of art—in the mountain glen—in the "polyphony" of Bach and the melody of Bellini—in intimate love—in

courageous service to an unpopular cause.

All these experiences are far more spiritual in their essence than the most convincing "direct voice" or "materialisation," and would appear so instantly to one with a true sense of relative values.

There is no need to demonstrate survival in order to find God; and if you have not found him in everyday life there is no guarantee that you will find him in the voice of your dead friend or in the realms beyond. "If we cannot feel Him near us in this world, we could approach Him, it is greatly to be feared, in no other," says Martineau. And again, "he who is not with God already can by no path of space find the least approach; in vain would you lend him the wings of an angel or the speed of light; in vain plant himon this side of death or that . . . But ceasing all travels and remaining with his foot upon this weary earth, let him subside into the depths of . . . wonder and love . . . and he is yet in the very house of God and at the gate of Heaven."

The Old Props Gone

That is what Unitarianism has to teach Spiritualism—the possibility of a rich faith apart from any special revelation or any thought of the after-life.

But special times have special needs. And this pure theistic faith is too hard and high for

most in this mechanical and hectic age. The old props—the infallible Bible —the resurrection of the physical body—these have

toppled over as far as most thoughtful folk are concerned. But since pure theism is not yet enough for most, they look elsewhere for subsidiary props—they are taking to their hearts other "overbeliefs"—reincarnation by karma—the unconditional power of mind over body—the demonstration of survival by psychical research.

Survival Ends Materialism

Of these the last is the only one that need concern us at the moment. It fits the special need of the day because it makes an end of materialism. For the chief reason why the "plain man" finds plain theism insufficient to-day is that materialistic pseudoscience has vitiated his outlook. He knows a little

about the relation between mind and brain that a diseased brain means an impaired memory as a tired brain means sleep. He knows just enough to be convinced by the theory that memory is a record on brain tissue and therefore

evidence of survival? In a previous article, the Rev. G. Maurice Elliott gave his reasons for desiring such a step on the part of the orthodox Churches. In this challenging article, the Rev. Basil Viney—a well-known minister of the Unitarian Church—states why he believes a union between Modern Spiritualism and Liberal Christianity is desirable.

to conclude that the destruction of that tissue means the end of memory and so of personality.

He does not know that modern science can be as dogmatic as medieval theology; nor yet that, in the name of science, Bergson has challenged and disproved the brain-record theory of memory. He could not make much of *Matter and Memory*, anyhow, if he did read it.

But anyone can understand the story about Swedenborg imparting to a widow a useful fact which only her "dead" husband knew and which was afterwards verified. The plain man understands that and draws his own conclusions. So, too, with some of the evidential cases put on record by Mr. F. W. H. Myers; and above all, with cross-correspondence.

### A Challenge

Only facts like these can save the simple sceptic from the nightmare of materialism and annihilation, and so clear the way of faith for him. And facts like these are sufficient. There is no need to add to them speculations or "esoteric revelations" about reincarnation and Atlantis and all the rest of it. There is no need to undermine his sense of free will and responsibility by suggesting that his fate is already written in his hand. There is no need to add the weight of the stars to the already too heavy weight of biological inheritance.

Why rescue him from one set of superstitions—the traditional "Christian" superstitions of blood atonement and trinity—if you are going to deliver him over to another set? Between the dogmatic authoritarianism of Rome or of Calvin and the esoteric claims, implicit or explicit, of certain modern cults, there is not much to choose. All alike impede free thought—if not openly and crudely, then subtly and maybe unwittingly. Fortunately, however, these cults cancel out. Madame Blavatsky is positive of reincarnation, Mrs. Eddy knows nothing about it, Swedenborg flatly denies it. (I apologise to Swedenborgians for mentioning their founder in the same sentence as the others—they will forgive me).

### Spiritualism and Unitarianism

Don't misunderstand me. I am not implying that the 'controls' are spurious—only that even advanced spirits are not always right, and that authoritarian dogma and esotericism have evidently no more place in the next world than in this.

Now, if Spiritualism and Unitarianism blended, the world might be saved for a reasonable and free faith. Spiritualistic evidence would give to pure theism that wedge of conviction which alone would force an entry into the modern mind. Whilst the pure theistic outlook would save the Spiritualists from some of their friends, greatly to their advantage.

Were I to speak to my readers of "the great god fairies," who stand seven feet high, with their triple-plumes of flame pouring out of their magnificent heads as both George Russell and Ella Young have described them, I believe they would admit them to be worth cultivating, if only for their beautiful strangeness. (This is the triple flame-plume which, in the case of great pianists, has been seen by the clairvoyant).

I know a lady who met one of these god-like creatures, sexless and "with eyes like the flame of blue swords," in broad daylight opposite the Mansion House in Dublin. Ella Young herself told me almost exactly what the other woman told me, that "it was nearly impossible to look into their eyes, they were so piercing." To see them, however, you must have "the sight," for I have never heard of them appearing to other than clairvoyants, though I am not prepared to say they do not.

### Link Between Two Worlds

They are, in a peculiar way, the connecting link between the worlds visible and invisible. They have formed for centuries the tangible proof that the worlds invisible do exist, and for many who would sneer at a ghost, they are more real than mortals.

Some day I shall hope to get my own International Institute for Psychical Research to take up their investigation upon scientific lines. When we have done so, we shall probably issue a report which may or may not confirm their objective existence. Yet they exist!

For those who are still sceptical, may I point out gently that only a few short years ago the "ghost" was the Cinderella of science, and that no scientist was so little that he could not poke fun at the idea of human survival of death. The power of telekinesis was denied by the physicists. And, until Dunne came along with his reasoned "Serialism," any man who was so rash as to dare affirm that it was possible to predict coming events, was regarded as fit candidate for the lunatic asylum.

Yet all these things are now admitted by either some distinguished scientists or laymen. Some day, the scientist may be compelled, strictly on the evidence, to admit the existence of the fairy!



Your HAND

What do the lines of YOUR hand betray? This fascinating article will tell you.

is he without cold reason. His hands are broad, indicating breadth of vision. The fingers are short, betraying mental quickness plus intelligence, and with that firm thumb there is given a strong will-power.

Readers will be better able to follow Mr. Jaquin's article by referring to the lines on their hands as illustrated here. Key:
A, Fate line;

B, Life line; C, Head line; D, Apollo line; E, Heart line;

T is the desire of every normal human being to make the most of their lives; everyone wants to become efficient and to do their best in their particular and individual sphere. A chimney sweep, if he has ambition, desires to be able to sweep chimneys efficiently; the bank clerk hopes to become such an efficient clerk that one day he will be made manager. Ambition in such proportion is right and proper. It is a very healthy sign when people desire to 'better themselves' on their own merits and not at the expense of others.

The very first step towards individual improvement is to know something of Self. If you desire to get the best out of a motor car, a ship, a factory or a human being, you begin by learning how they work and function. The road to efficiency is Self-Knowledge. There is one danger; you must avoid becoming introspective in your habitual thought processes. And, as in all serious matters, you must be exact. The very essence of efficiency is exactitude, and an honest exactitude at that.

What is Temperament?

In considering this matter of 'temperament' there are many statements made that are not, in the light of modern scientific knowledge, exact. It has been said that if we understand our 'temperament' we shall then understand ourselves.

Temperament is Subject to Variation

It has been found that glands govern thought and emotional responses as well as health, to a very marked extent. The more accurate and scientific designation of such a man is an 'anterior-pituitary dominant.' Look at Fig. 1, and note the short, thick, but slightly waisted fingers. These betray quickness as well as thought; intuition is blended with calculation. All the lines of the hand are fine; this indicates a 'nervy' sensitivity. The actual Head line is fretted with fine upright lines which show a mental sensitivity and an easily disturbed mind. This,

with the well-shaped thumb indicates marked activity of the adrenal glands. I have found that the type of finger print pattern does betray the gland domination.

If you have loop type finger patterns, that is, if the cores of the patterns run sloping left right or right left, there is marked adrenal activity. One whorl type of finger pattern, as is found in this hand, on the third finger, indicates that the thyroid gland is working well. This makes you quick and gives a marked independence of thought and action.

This hand betrays every indication of quickness and impatience. The subject would be dubbed a 'choleric' by our would-be-scientists. But actually he is an adrenal dominant; by that we know exactly what he would do under any given circumstances. The description is exact and accurate and gives a full information of basic gland activities.


Fig. 2. Impulsive and an excessive imagination is shown in this band. A thymus thyroid dominant.

Fig. 2 shows an entirely different type of hand and person. The fingers are long and pointed, betraying a thoughtful tendency of mind but with the pointed tips there is given a blending of idealism. The thumb is supple, indicating impulsiveness. There is a space between the beginnings of the Head and Life lines, which accentuates the degree

of impetuosity shown by the thumb. The actual Head line bends down rather too far indicating an exaggeration of imagination.

On a close examination of the finger patterns we find that the index finger bears a whorl type of pattern as does also the third.

A whorl type on both of these fingers betrays thymus and thyroid activity. The second and fourth fingers bear the loop type of pattern, indicating adrenal activity. A thymus thyroid dominant.

In Fig. 3, we find a confusion of lines. All the lines of the hand are fine. From the 'temperament' point of view it is, in this case, only necess-




ary to examine the actual lines of the palmar surface. Note that the Head line is fretted with fine drooping lines, indicating an over-active mind; the type of mind that worries. The space between the Head line and the short 'physical' type of Heart line, is narrow; this betrays a selfish type of mind. Such people find it almost impossible to take an 'impersonal' view of anything. They persistently think from the personal angle. The space between the Heart line and the base of the fingers is marked with a well-defined Girdle of Venus. This also indicates emotional sensitivity; these people are always very emotionally responsive to their environments. This combination of markings betrays an over-activity of the thymus gland, and produces what is known as the thymocentric type; the irresponsible and seemingly childlike type.

A Matter of Gland Action

These studies of the human hand betray the fact that 'temperament' is a matter of gland action. Modern scientific research is finding that gland action can be influenced by food, by drink and by drugs. Therefore if you alter your diet you must alter your 'temperament' because you must affect a change in the chemical balance of the body.

Rudolf Steiner is stated to have said, "A living understanding of the nature of the four temperaments is indispensable in all true wisdom of life." Steiner was a philosopher not a scientist, and, like most philosophers,

leave these questions. I am only a reporter. I testify to and relate only of what I saw. I frankly admit I am no match for conjurers, if such work it was. A conjurer, I have no doubt, could take me in easily as I have had no training in the art of deception. And so perhaps I am not really a competent judge on the reality or otherwise of what occurred. I am simply an ordinary intelligent observer, blessed (I hope) with a commonsense attitude. But let me here say in the medium's interests that he is not a conjurer by training or profession. He has never been trained in the art of deception. He is an ordinary working man. That I know.

The seance I write of took place in an empty flat loaned for the purpose. We used a room containing only chairs, a small bamboo table, tea tray, harp and a couple of small hand-bells. The room was thoroughly searched and contained no articles except those already mentioned. In one corner a cabinet was rigged up with the

N a small Northumbrian seaside resort some twenty miles from Newcastle-on-Tyne there resides a man with strange powers. In his presence all kinds of articles such as safety-pins, beads, rings and fishing hooks appear out of the air as if from nowhere. In a room carefully searched and in which there appear to be none of these miscellaneous articles, they will be mysteriously 'apported' or materialised.

This remarkable man, who has baffled conjurers and scientific investigators, is what Spiritualists call an 'apport-medium.' That is to say, they claim that the 'spirits' dematerialise these articles, cause them to be brought a distance into the seance room, and through 'heightening their vibrations' to re-appear as they are through the mediumship of

the man who is credited with such strange powers.

All manner of things happen in the presence of this noted northern medium. Harps and drums will play with no hand near as can be visibly observed, tables will move all ways of their own accord, and 'apported' articles will be seen suspended in mid-air! All this sounds like romancing. But I do not write from hearsay or second-hand information. I write from personal experience. And so let me here relate exclusively for the first time my experience with this remarkable medium.

A Thrilling Seance

It was a seance I attended some time ago that stands out most in my mind. I was puzzled, baffled and to say the least, impressed. The details of what happened I remember clearly. But in such experiences the need is for accurate observation at the time. Accordingly, I noted then what occurred. The experience was thrilling and vivid. Was I the victim of fraud, delusion and deception? Or did things really happen beyond human agency? I

aid of a brass rod and a pair of curtains. The sitters numbered about twenty. The meeting deputed me to search the medium and as far as I could see he had nothing concealed on his person. I examined each item of his clothing very carefully and saw him entirely stripped. His clothing consisted only of trousers, singlet, socks and slippers, and I examined all parts of his body accessible to ordinary observation where small articles might possibly be concealed. I could detect nothing.

Immediately after the search I accompanied the medium into the seance room and there placed him in a large black bag, previously examined all ways. I tied the bag round the medium's neck leaving just sufficient laxity to allow of proper breathing and then sealed the knot I had made

with sealing-wax. The bag completely encased him and as far as one could judge the medium's movements were very restricted, his arms could not work outside the bag and there appeared no flaw in the test. The medium was placed in a chair in the cabinet, the curtains drawn at the top allowing space in the centre in which to stand the bamboo table. A red light illuminated the room and everything was plainly visible; I could even tell the time by my watch. Everything was now ready for the performance, if I might use that term in a reverent way.

### Usual Preliminaries

The proceedings began with the usual religious preliminaries: that is, we sang a hymn, and the 'guide' of the medium,

an Irishman calling himself 'Patrick,' who was the 'control,' called us in the name of "Our Father" to join him in prayer. Next, the 'guide' asked for the harp to be placed on the table in front of us. The harp, I should say, was rather dilapidated, as two or three strings were broken, and almost useless for ordinary playing. As we listened, sweet, melodious music could be heard. I asked permission to come right up to the cabinet and inspect closer and believe me I could distinctly see the

movements of the harp-strings and hear them throb, and no finger was in contact! I passed my hands under, over and all around the table and harp and contacted nothing solid or visible. Yet this music was issuing forth!

A 'Spirit' Drummer Then we were asked to place the tea-tray on the table instead of the harp and the 'spirit' of a drummer-boy purported to speak, and said he would exhibit his skill on the tray. A loud rat-tat followed which could be heard a long way off. Again I went right close up to the tray and table, passing my hands in all directions. I placed my head right over the tray and if anyone had been trying to tap the tray they would have come into conflict with my wooden-block,' and yet the

splendid drumming continued unabated.

Then came the speciality of the evening—the bringing of 'apports.' Each sitter was asked to walk up to the table and receive a gift. My 'apport' was a safety-pin. The 'control' set out to describe how these articles were 'apported.' The articles, we were told, were enclosed in an 'ectoplasmic bag' and held over the table. This bag was then dissolved and the articles lodged on the table. Here I may interject that what puzzles me is where these

these 'apports' were stolen! It's a problem! And these 'apports' could be clearly seen suspended over the table and surrounded by a hazy light. After receiving our apports' we were asked to hang up the bells. Then the 'spirits' played tricks with these bells, as, for instance, holding one hanging bell rigid and making the other sweep round in a circle. The sitters were asked to shout out any number, which was repeated by the knocking of the bells. One lady asked for the number four and a half. Immediately came four good knocks and one very slight one, I suppose to represent the half.

Now we come to the 'tit-bit' of the evening and perhaps the most interesting item. The curtains were drawn aside and the medium was revealed sitting in a 'trance.' The guide' informed us that now he would show us all how objects were moved about. After some little time a dull grey stuff could be seen issuing from the medium's solar plexus. This stuff continued to extend in length until reaching the table, and at the end nearest me I saw an opening appear which, for want of better description,

seemed like a 'mouth' materialising.

Table Moved by Psychic "Arm"

At any rate, the appearance had some grip as this 'mouth' moved each curtain separately well to the side and then wedged itself under the small table and lo! the table began moving up and down just as though some arm was acting as a lever. This dull grey stuff which issued from the medium like steam out of a kettle, was called an 'ectoplasmic' rod. And the mysterious elongation had weight, as when placed on the table it assumed a natural flat state -that is, flattened by its own pressure.

For some little time we were shown how this 'ectoplasmic' arm suspended articles over the table, moved objects and tapped on the tray. The end nearest me very much resembled a grey mouse moving rapidly about over the table! Description is not easy as the appearance was.

puzzling.

I have heard the late Dr. Fraser-Harris relate similar experiences with the famous medium Rudi Schneider. The doctor once described minutely the appearance of 'ectoplasmic' rods or arms which he carefully observed in good conditions. Dr. Fraser-Harris was convinced of the supernormal character of these mysterious exhibitions.

—The Medium Still Bound

And now I have described the main events of the seance, and can only add that after the proceedings had finished I found the medium in the exact state I had left him, with the sealed knot tape round his neck intact. To all appearances he remained encased in his bag the whole time and seemed exhausted by the exhibition.


What can we make of it all? This medium has given exhibitions to many Psychical Research bodies and a series of test-sittings to the British College of Psychic Science, London. I have examined photos, taken at these College

sittings and the camera clearly shows suspended articles and tables. The medium is shown sitting in his seat and the 'ectoplasmic' rod issuing from his solar plexus, and 'apports' suspended in front with no apparent visible support. The camera backs up the impressions of our human and fallible senses! It is all very mysterious. Then there remains the problem of how these 'apports'

The ready and usual explanations of 'guides' are hardly scientific or really helpful. Explanations involve some reasoning about physics and the constitution of matter. Into these subjects, we will not enter. I make no pretence to understanding things that involve physics. This talk of 'matter-through-matter' is all vague to me and, I confess, somewhat incredible. Yet I have not a closed mind. The nature of matter as revealed by modern physicists and thinkers makes these astounding claims not quite so incredible. I do not care to use the word 'impossible.' There are some striking cases of 'apport' phenomena on record such as the experiences of Professor Zollner and Sir William Crookes, and it is difficult to know what is truth. But there I must leave the matter. I am only a reporter.

# OUT-OF-THE-BODY ADVENTURES

What do we mean by "out-of-the-body?" How is it possible for anyone to be out of the body without being dead? If it be possible, what is it that is out of the body?

HESE are not exactly easy questions to answer, but the fact remains that the actual experience of being out of the body is testified to by a large number of people under varying circumstances.

Take one incident which concerned a brother of mine. Some years ago his wife contracted typhoid fever and was taken to the isolation hospital at Flaybrick Hill, Birkenhead. The two were very much wrapped up in one another and while she

was in hospital he remained at home in his flat some two or three miles distant. One night the nurse on night duty complained to the matron that she had seen a man hanging round in the vicinity of the hospital and the matter was duly reported to the medical officer.

When next my brother went to see his wife he was promptly identified by the night nurse as the man she

had seen. The consequences were, to say the least of it, difficult, and though my brother stoutly declared that he had never been anywhere near the hospital except on his normal visits, he was politely disbelieved. To ensure that there was no possibility of his leaving his flat at night time, he then persuaded a clerical friend to sleep on the premises and his apparition was not seen again.

Now I am satisfied that my brother, a sceptical and level-headed individual, was not prowling round at night; but it is equally clear that the nurse saw someone whom she identified as himself. How are we to explain it?

Before trying to elucidate the matter, let us consider a few more cases. A doctor friend of mine in Liverpool experimented one evening after his day's work, trying to project himself, in thought and without notice, to one of his patients, then in the North of Ireland. He actually fell asleep in front of his fire during the experiment and therefore knew nothing as to whether he succeeded in his intention or not.

Mr. Hunt has an international reputation as a lecturer and writer on many Occult subjects. But corroboration came from the patient in Ireland who said that on that evening the doctor's phantom, ghost, or whatever we may care to term it, opened the door of the room where she was and entered.

She particularly noted that he was not in the usual professional garb in which she was accustomed to see him, but was in the negligee which he was in fact actually wearing at the time. We must, therefore, conclude that the doctor's experiment was successful and that in some way his 'double' manifested in Ireland while his body beyond any question was in Liverpool.

### Another Interesting Case

Another doctor, the late George Wyld, M.D., of Wimbledon, has also left on record a curious incident which occurred to a friend of his. This lady, one winter's day, had gone shopping leaving her two domestics to look after the house. They were in the kitchen doing their ordinary work when they both saw their mistress enter the kitchen and go over to the range as if to warm herself—a perfectly natural occurrence, as they

thought. They both particularly noticed one detail which was unusual, and that was that their mistress had on a pair of green kid gloves which they had never seen before. However, no remark was made until the mistress suddenly disappeared and then for the first time they realised that there was something uncanny about the experience and

began to be thoroughly scared.

Not long after the mistress did return, this time in person, and what is more remarkable, she was wearing the green kid gloves which she had only purchased during her afternoon's shopping. The explanation seems to be that on her expedition she felt very cold and expressed to herself a strong wish that she were at home and warming herself by the kitchen fire, as she had appeared to the domestics

In each of these cases we have the element of some wish, desire or intention on the part of the individual to be somewhere else; in my brother's case it seems to have been the extreme anxiety which he was feeling on account of his wife's serious condition. Following upon this desire-energy there seems to have been some sort of manifestation at a distance, which we are terming an out-of-the-body experience. These cases may be taken as typical of their kind, and many people have given me the records

of like happenings which have occurred to them.

One lady living in Linden Gardens, Notting Hill Gate, once had a dressmaker in to make her a gown; having duly supplied the material, she installed the dressmaker in the basement to be getting on with the work. During the afternoon some unexpected visitors turned up and as she was entertaining them the thought flashed through her mind—"I hope that woman won't cut the material up wrong: I wish I had told her about it." But as the visitors demanded her attention, nothing could be done until they had departed. As soon as they had gone this lady went downstairs to the workroom only to find, as she had anticipated, that the cutting out was wrong and the dress spoiled.

Upon expostulating with the culprit the lady was astonished when the dressmaker said to her, "But why didn't you tell me about it when you came down before?' As a fact she had not been down at all, but she had wished to do so; and again this seems to have had the effect of projecting some phantom of herself, visible to the dressmaker.

### "Double" Released During Operation

Still more strange things happen when people are under the influence of anaesthetics and supposedly unconscious, for the purpose of some surgical operation. Even gas at the dentist's seem to produce the same effect, for one of my youngsters in class once was telling the others that he had seen the dentist pulling out five of his teeth. "Nonsense," we said to him, "you had gas, hadn't you?"

"Oh, yes sir."

"Well, where were you that you could see the dentist?" And the youngster pointed up as if to the top of the blackboard and said, "Up there, sir!"

Now he is not the only one by any means who has used the very same words to describe the experience of thus being "out-of-the-body"; "up there" is indeed quite the usual expression. Dr. George Wyld, whom we have already quoted, describes his experience in much the same way when he gave himself a whiff of chloroform in his own consulting room. He was immediately out of his body, "up there" and looking down upon his deserted physical body. But he was not disembodied; he had a body, a double of his physical body, through which he could carry on all his normal mental activities even better than he could in the waking state. By all the rules he ought to have been unconscious, but here he was actually more sensitive and conscious than usual.

So it is evident that to be out-of-the-body does not necessarily mean to be either unconscious or disembodied, but rather that there may be a sort of superior consciousness working in a normal-pattern body composed of matter

of some super-physical type.

One of the most curious cases I know was told to me recently by a lady who now lives in St. John's Wood. She was operated upon in St. George's Hospital, Hyde Park, and was duly given an anaesthetic in the ward. When she was supposedly unconscious she saw her body

being wheeled on the trolley into the operating theatre, which she had never seen. For the first time she now saw it, with its tiers of students studying the operation; and apparently she was herself standing somewhere by the side of her own body. Naturally she was interested in the operation and tells me that she noted "which end they began," and when they finished she saw that they put in "fourteen clips and no stitches."

She also saw a red-headed student, to whom she felt a very sound dislike (although she was presumably 'completely unconscious ') beckoned out by the surgeon specially to study the case; she also gave me further details of the operation which I will spare my readers.

Subsequently she narrated what she had "seen," under these circumstances, to the operating surgeon, whose name I have, and all he replied to her was, "Oh, you're psychic!"

### Phenomena of Tremendous Import

To take a further type of experience, I have the record from another doctor given me by himself. Dr. Overend Rose, of Cheltenham, when abroad, met with a severe accident when out riding. As a consequence he was very heavily thrown and his horse fell upon him, dangerously crushing him. Immediately, he tells us, he found himself out of his body, intensely conscious, but feeling no pain. He saw his physical body being picked up by three men and carried into a neighbouring house, where two doctors were called to examine him.

They pronounced his recovery impossible; so much so that they would not even bandage his body as being likely to cause useless pain. He, however, in some way felt assured and knew that he would recover; and as he was still alive some twelve hours later the necessary bandaging was done. On recovering consciousness he assured the doctors that he would get well and they just as surely told him that he would not. The point is that he is now still alive and well in spite of the doctors' assurance.

Space forbids the mention of many like cases, including the experiences of individuals who have been apparently drowned and have been resuscitated, but the overwhelming import of them all is that they prove it possible for the manifestations of life to be shown when the physical body is temporarily out of action. They therefore provide solid grounds for the logical assumption that the life of a man can survive the permanent loss of his material body, in place of which he finds himself provided with a body of another order and capacity.

By perfectly natural steps we are thus led up to the acceptance of the idea put forward by St. Paul that "there is a natural body and there is a spiritual body"; and thus we gain a natural basis for the Spiritualistic belief in personal survival which is not in any way founded upon the phenomena of mediumship.

To Tell Your Lucky Days

George Bratley illustrates in the February number of PREDICTION how one may tell the likely events that will occur in the various years of life, by name and number. How can one find the month and day of such vents? Is it possible to discover one's lucky months and days by means of name and number ?-G.H.A., Staffs.

There is a method of arriving at some idea as to when an event will occur. This is to take the unit value of the two names. For instance, if the names give the numbers 2, 5; these equal 7; you now need to find the dates and months, with the year, which when added reduce to this number 7. As an illustration, you will find one of these times will be October 4th, 1937; this set down as 4, 10, 1937=25=7; then find all other dates giving the same number, and take these as being likely times for the events indicated by the year of age to occur.

The usual method of finding the lucky dates and months is to take the date of birth; if this is the 14th of any month, then take this as 5, and the 5th of any month will be the lucky date, and the 5th month, May, the lucky month, or any other dates making 5; such as the 14th, 23rd of any month. Where your birth date is the 2nd, then you have the 2nd, 11th, 20th and 29th as lucky dates; for

> lucky months the 2nd and 5th. If the birth date is 1st or 3rd, you have the dates giving these numbers; with the 1st January and October as the months; with the 3rd, the months are March and December.

Almost any clear liquid, even water, will do. You could also employ a disc of bright metal, a black spot on a white background, or the night-light flame, which has helped to send so many children to sleep. The objection to these methods is that they are likely to produce a mild state of trance instead of normal sleep.

Relaxation of the muscles, with deep breathing, is the surest and safest way of curing insomnia. warm bed, sitting for some moments in a dressing-gown, and then getting back between the sheets may do the trick, owing to the change of temperature. # Your PAST, PRESENT And FUTURE From Your Name

N previous articles we have seen how each number has its own particular vibration; this month we are taking the vibrations of the letters of the Alphabet, and showing how they may be used in reading the likely events as to the past, present and future. In this method of name analysation, the vibrations of a letter cover one year of life; that is from one birthday to another. For instance if born March 25th, 1907, you will now be in your 31st year of age until your birthday in 1938.

In this method the numerological value of the letters need not be given as it is the letters only with which we are dealing. These are counted, one for each year, and the number of letters in a name should be set down after the name to save recounting.

Warning against Accidents

We will take a few examples to illustrate this method. The first will be the late Lord Snowden.

PHILIP SNOWDEN (13 letters). Born 18/7/1864. At the age of 29, Philip Snowden met with the accident which crippled him for life. Counting the letters in the name, one for each year, the 29th letter is "i," and referring to the likely events for this letter at the end of the article, it will be seen it warns against accidents. He fought two unsuccessful elections, then won the Tory seat of Blackburn when 42 and while under the same letter vibration as for the accident, and in reading again for the letter "i" we find it also gives: "the mind ambitious and enterprising; more inclined to overcome obstacles and battle with difficulties."

Under the Influence of "N"

He became Labour's first Chancellor of the Exchequer in 1924 at the age of 60, and under the vibration of the letter "n." Five years later at 65 he was again vibrating to "n" and became Chancellor of the Exchequer. Lord

Snowden died in his 73rd year under the influence of "n." For this letter we also read: "The health should not be neglected during this period."

Our next example is Gracie Fields.

letters in his name, he was born on the 19th, married on the 19th and at the age of 19, met with the accident on the 19th of the month, and the letter value of his last name is 19.



has made some very unscientific statements. Had he said that "A knowledge of endocrinology would give an understanding of life," he would have been nearer the truth.

Cobb has said in his book, "The Glands of Destiny,"
"It seems clear that temperament, even more important than pure intellect in achieving success, is largely an affair of the balance of the various glands of internal secretion—thyroid, pituitary, and the rest."

### The Girdle of Venus

And these studies prove that it is much more important that you know which is the predominating gland in your chemical make-up than to know if you are 'phlegmatic' or 'choleric.' 

It is therefore necessary to point out that the sector of the Zodiac known to the Ancients as Cancer, "The Crab" has no Astrological association whatever with the disease of the same name. In the Sun-Cancer period have been born a wide assortment of famous people ranging from Sir Beerbohm Tree (2nd) and P. T. Barnum (5th) to Jane Austen (18th) and Isaac Watts (17th). When Pure Cancer Type is Born



### GENIUS LINKED with BIRTH DATE

AMERICAN SCIENTIST'S RESEARCHES

By WILLIAM L. LAURENCE

TATISTICAL evidence garnered from "Who's Who" and similar publications was presented before the American National Academy of Science recently to show that the time of the year in which a child is conceived so influences the human embryo that on it depends whether the future adult is to become a genius, a dementia præcox type of lunatic, or a dangerous criminal.

The data were presented by Dr. William F. Petersen of the Department of Pathology and Bacteriology of the University of Illinois College of Medi-

25,000 Cases Studied

Dr. Petersen had compiled statistics on the month of conception of large groups of individuals listed in the "Encyclopædia of American Biography,"
"Who's Who," "Wer Ist's" and "American Men of Science," as well as inmates in criminal institutions and insane asylums. The survey covered 25,000 persons.

The statistics tend to indicate, he said, that those individuals conceived during the first half of the year are likely to be more exceptional mentally and to have physical characteristics different from those conceived in the

last half of the year.

Peak Months for Presidents

First among these he examined the conception months of the Presidents of the United States. Of thirty-one, twenty-six were conceived during the first seven months of the year.

Not a single President was conceived during August and September. And only five, including all except one of the recent Republican Presidents, Taft, Coolidge and Hoover, were conceived during the "stable months," October, November and December.

Studies of weight and length ratios of normal students at various universities, Dr. Petersen reported, gave some evidence that the June conceptions produced more normal types, that February conceptions trended toward slender types, and September, October and November conceptions trended toward broad types.—New York Times.

### Prediction's Policy


