

PUBLIC OPINION ON SURVIVAL

HAT does the man-in-the-street really think about the Occult? Is he baffled? Or sceptical? Or convinced? Or just "not impressed"?

Modern research is supplying us with the answers to these questions, and, for the first time, the answers are reliable. Public opinion can now be measured so accurately that the margin of error is rarely more than three per cent.

That, in fact, is the figure quoted by the British Institute of Public Opinion, which regularly takes samples of "what Britain thinks" on vital issues of the moment.

A Survey on Survival

A little while ago we published figures showing the extent of public interest in Astrology. There is, however, no more widely representative subject, on which to check popular reactions to the Occult, than the question of life after death.

Until now it has not been possible to say with confidence where the average man takes his stand with regard to this problem. He has been classed both believer and agnostic

But this month we are able to reproduce statistics which

take the matter beyond further speculation.

Proceeding on a strictly scientific formula, the British Institute of Public Opinion set the question "Do you believe in life after death?"

49 per cent.....answered.....Yes

33 per cent.....answered.....No
18 per cent.....answered.....No opinion.

These results of a recent test of public opinion are published by courtesy of the British Institute of Public Opinion, and the *News Chronicle* newspaper.

These figures reveal a deep cleavage of conviction. Roughly speaking, one out of every two persons is a believer in human survival.

The non-believer may be either a thorough-going agnostic or he may be merely a doubting Thomas (i.e., have found it impossible to make up his mind one way or the other).

That half the population of Great Britain is fully convinced of life beyond death is, we believe, a discovery of the utmost significance. It testifies to a growing awareness of spiritual realities.

A Change of Heart

Unfortunately there was no instrument for scientifically weighing public opinion in the days of Huxley and Tyndall. But it is reasonably certain that if a census had then been taken, it would have disclosed a vastly different result. Then materialism was rampant. Matter was the great

Then materialism was rampant. Matter was the great reality, and science framed a popular picture of life without spirit. To-day there is less scepticism; and those who believe in life beyond death are no longer a minority.

In a word, this scientific test of public opinion is one more proof of the collapse and decline of the old, cocksure agnosticism. It still exists, but it is not the power it used to be.

CONTRASTS IN

THE SEXES

T was only to be expected that women should outnumber men in admitting to a belief in survival.

Woman has always shown a greater sensitiveness to the Unseen. Her intuition and her devotional nature are more pronounced than in the case of the male sex.

What is surprising, however, is that the percentage of men believers should be so high. Only ten per cent. more men than women answered the question with a "No."

Ministers of religion have repeatedly deplored the so-called materialism of the male sex; for Church congregations are composed mainly of women.

A Fallacy Dispelled

However, this survey of public opinion exposes a fallacy. The average man is not without his mystical moods, though he may be indifferent to creed and ceremony. The exigencies and stress of commercial life may shape his mind in a materialistic mould, but he is not wholly blind to unseen realities.

In fact, the difference between the two sexes is almost levelled-up when we examine the two groups of "No opinion" percentages. Men are inclined to boast that their outlook is more detached, more impartial than women's. But only two per cent. more men than women hold judgment in abeyance on the question of survival.

Message

THE APATHY OF YOUTH

7 HEN the results of the British Institute's canvass are broken down into age- and wage-groups, the figures become even more illuminating.

The number of persons who believe in survival increases considerably with advancing years. In the youngest group, aged from 21 to 29, only 42 per cent. believe. With middle age, the proportion expands to 47 per cent. And among those aged 50 and over, belief rises to 53 per

What does this mean? We suspect that the explanation of the scepticism of youth is nothing more than apathy. But as life moves on to its final and inevitable stages, there is a growing interest in the possibility of survival.

The Will to Believe

Whether this change is due to anything more than wishful thinking, is a point upon which the survey throws no light. Still, it seems a reasonable assumption that alongside the increasing desire for survival, there is developing an ever more intense search for knowledge and conviction.

Wishful thinking inspires an interest in something which, during earlier years, was given little or no attention.

But whence comes the increased conviction? We believe that the fruits of Spiritualism and Psychical Research play no small part in explaining the ascending belief in life beyond the tomb.

Young people do not read psychic literature. To them the name of Sir Oliver Lodge conveys no thought of demonstrating survival. It is the name of a man who pioneered wireless.

And that is as good an illustration as any other of the way the mind of youth works.

SPREAD THE PROOF!

figures which illustrate INALLY there are how belief is distributed among the main groups into which society is divided.

The lower economic class yields only 45% of belief; the middle economic level registers 53%; and the so-called

upper" class rises to 54%.
Thus, an examination of the percentages shows that belief in survival declines with income.

It reaches its apex among the rich; not only does conviction there soar to 54 per cent., but the percentage of agnosticism drops to 21 per cent.—the lowest in any group. Furthermore, the proportion of those who have reached the half-way house of reserved judgment is higher in this class than in any other.

The Basis of Belief

Let us examine this. Considered part from the evidence of Spiritualism and Psychical Research, belief in a life beyond death is almost wholly dependent upon belief in the bounty of God.

This is clearly confirmed by the fact that survival constitutes the preamble of all religions. Without it, there would be no religion; for who could summon a faith in the goodness and mercy of a Divine Creator whose nature was expressed in all the harsh brutalities and crass injustices of this world?

Of course the rich find it easier to believe in a loving Father than do the unemployed and down-trodden! The world of the one is comfortable and fair; the world of the other is sordid and oppressive.

Lesson for Occultists

There is here an object lesson for Occultists. 33 per cent. of the public of Great Britain disbelieve in survival. That scepticism is possible only because a third of the people of this country are ignorant of the fact that there is evidence for survival. To them it is still a religious speculation. Personal temperament—not facts—dictates what view they will hold.

The British Institute's census proves, therefore, that while believers outnumber dis-believers, there is still plenty of work to be done by those who possess positive proof of survival. And it is supremely important work.

WHY BELIEF IS IMPORTANT

ONSIDER how much turns upon a man's reactions to the question of life after death. Disbelief tempts him to mal-treat his fellows, for (he reasons) "if to-morrow I die, who is to blame me for selfishly exploiting my every opportunity while the breath of life lasts?"

Only a firm belief in a spiritual world, where this life's injustices may be redressed, can encourage mankind towards a higher life. There are, indeed, some forthright souls who, holding a materialistic belief, are yet ready to sacrifice their own ends out of love for their fellows. But they are remarkably few in number.

Why War is Possible

Materialism, for the masses, means each for himself, and an end to love and brotherhood. It influences not only the small but the largest issues in life. Take only one instance of this. If there were not still so much materialism in the world, we would not live under the constant threat of international conflict. No Dictator, who really believed in survival, could contemplate for one moment the responsibility of a world war.

The British Institute of Public Opinion has shown us where belief and materialism stand in this country. Its analysis of public opinion on survival after death tells the Occultist just how much work he has yet before him. There is reason for satisfaction that so many are believers; reason for renewed efforts, because so many are still

without hope.

OUR PEACE PROPHECIES



The DOOM

HE anxious times in which we are now living caused me recently to solicit an expression of opinion from my Guide on the political situation with which we are at present faced.

This has resulted in a message of great interest and importance which was transmitted to me on April 12th through my faithful friend and fellow-worker "Melchior".

As stated in my book Spiritual Forces, my Guide was, in his last incarnation, the spiritual ruler of Tibet; that is to say, the Tashi or Grand Lama. He was born in 1738 and died in 1780. The name with which he signs himself is that by which he is historically known.

Many Accurate Prophecies

A year ago, in writing my book, I gave various instances of the accuracy of prophecies made to me from time to time from the Other Side. Since then, we have had to face a succession of alarms and crises.

On August 3rd I was assured that the Czecho-Slovakian trouble, then causing much anxiety, would not lead to war. The same assurance was repeated to me on the eve of the crisis; that is to say, on September 8th.

The people of Germany and Italy are full of discontent, and this fact will gradually undermine the power of the two Dictators.


What is of greater importance is the lesson that it conveys to you. You, as a nation, were getting too much pleasure-loving and lazy in your acting and thinking: too selfish in your outlook. These conditions have arisen as the result of your bad method of shelving your responsibilities. It (the lesson) is to make you more united and energetic to uphold those principles of freedom which are so necessary to democracy.

The Future Lies with Democracy

Democracy is the future of nations. True democracy is individuality in unity—that is, when the individual fully realises his responsibilities to the State, as he is the State.

So line yourselves up side by side in strength, ready to give yourselves for those principles of freedom; and, above all, be just, knowing that each nation has a right to its place in the sun, and the right to express itself more fully and truly.

BLIND SEER FORETELLS

YRIL HOLMES, the blind seer of County Rutland, is "absolutely certain there will be no war."
When Lady Barbara Seymour addressed a National Service meeting at Rutland, she was astounded by the apathy of the village people. One speaker after another told her that war talk was futile, and when she inquired the reason for their optimism, it was explained that "Cyril Holmes had said so."

Who is this Cyril Holmes?

He is a young man of twenty-four years, who lost his sight when an infant. At an early age he began to see visions and hear voices, and in course of time he has acquired for himself a considerable reputation as a prophet.

He advises local farmers on their cattle and crops and every day sees him busily employed giving interviews to people who travel miles to receive his friendly counsel.

Cyril's Peace Prophecies reached the outside world when Lady Barbara Seymour told reporters of her experience at Rutland.

Then an astonishing story came to light. Cases were described where the blind boy's amazing clairvoyance had been proved beyond doubt. For example, he foretold that a young woman missing from her home would be found dead "within the next twenty-four hours, and within two miles of her home." He described the people who would find her and declared that she was actually living at the moment of the interview.

Events like these, happening exactly as foreseen, soon spread abroad the news of Cyril's clairvoyance. It was to ascertain his psychic impressions on future developments in world affairs that I sought an interview with him.

Peace: Another Crisis: Cabinet Reshuffle.

I found him extremely well versed on political issues, and when I spoke of Lady Seymour's statement, he was immediately careful to point out that there had been a

certain amount of misapprehension.

"While I am confident that peace will be preserved," he said, "no effort must be spared to fortify the forces that guarantee it. This country must fearlessly pursue her policy of making good every defect in her defence system. People who do not volunteer National Service merely because they have been persuaded that war is not imminent, are therefore making no contribution to the cause of Peace."

I asked Mr. Holmes what his feelings were about Germany and her Fuehrer.

"Hitler's ambitions are not yet satisfied," he replied. "On the other hand, his position is becoming more and more difficult. I predict that there will soon be some drastic changes in the personnel of the Reich leaders. This will not so much involve the introduction of new officers, but it will mean that there will be changes and transferences from the present appointments.

Crisis at Year's End

"Hitler has also got to reckon with the growing pressure now being brought to bear upon the Axis Powers. I foresee that his progress will be checked by a very important move, which will be made jointly by Great Britain and France, and later with the association of America.

"However, the real testing point will not come until towards the end of this year. I am sure that we have yet to face another crisis and I am sorry to say that I believe it will be of very great magnitude. It will come either at the end of the present year or very early in 1940."

I questioned Mr. Holmes on the nature of this crisis,

and what course it was likely to take.

"It will be precipitated mainly by Hitler," he said, "but with the support of Muscolini. It will refer to the status


with the support of Mussolini. It will refer to the status of central Europe. Hitler will present a two-fold demand, for colonial claims will also be ventilated. The war panic will be almost as great as last September. But the crisis will be resolved by negotiation.

"The threat will break with dramatic suddenness. There will be an ultimatum, but in spite of all fears, Peace

will be saved."

I next interrogated Mr. Holmes on the Russian riddle. What part was the Soviet destined to play in securing Peace for Europe? (Continued on page 228, col. 2)

I am sensitive enough to the different atmospheres, but I make contact much less easily than my wife does.

She warns me of the unseen presence long before I sense the presence of anything beyond a vague depression.

But on the only two occasions when I have gone beyond the vague into the concrete, she also shared the experience.

For the first we were prepared: for the second we were unprepared. (I am wrong, I have just experienced a third. Human, happy voices on the Roman Way of Stane Street on Bignor Hill).

Furthermore, they were both in broad daylight. The first occurred at Sutton Delaval, near the coal pits of Ashington in Northumberland. I was walking past the now abandoned mansion of Lord Hastings when I looked up and saw, standing at an upper window, a woman with a white coif, her arms outstretched, and eyes fixed on the distance. My host told me that she was there. He told me that he had often been in the room when she appeared, and that there was nothing in the glass or furniture to warrant the assumption of an optical illusion.

She is supposed to represent the nurse of the infant heir of the Hastings, who allowed her charge to catch fire and be burnt to death. I imagine that every person who has ever been to Sutton Delaval has seen her.

Mysterious Music

My second experience was far more interesting. It came on me quite without warning in the island of Lewis. I was on a lonely cart-track on the Atlantic sea-board many miles from human habitation or any sound.

Quite suddenly I heard unmistakable notes of music, low but clear, like the music of a harp being played quite close to my elbow. Perhaps twelve notes were struck, and then came silence. They were not repeated. I immediately went to the boulder whence I thought the music

came, but there was no movement of any living thing anywhere.

I ran in every direction, right down to the shore, over the heather and boulders, to run to

ground the hidden musician. There was no one. Of that

I am quite certain.

I had, of course, heard of fairy music, but I was not thinking of it at that time. In point of fact, I was looking out to sea to find whether St. Kilda was visible from the outer Hebrides. I had already mistaken the Flannen Islands for an iceberg. But I made no mistake over this music, for, months afterwards, when I was staying in Essex with Doctor Wood, and told him of my experience, he went over to his piano and played a few notes. "Was that it?" he asked.

I nodded, too excited to speak.
"I thought so," he said. "I heard it on Dartmoor.
It's a happy, tuneful noise, isn't it?"

I thought of the letter I had read in the Times on

the presence of fairies in Ireland—a happy, companionable, frolicsome people. And surely if one can hear their song, it is no great step on, to see them dance. Our grandfathers in Devon and Cornwall seem to have

seen them often enough to have sought to propitiate their

UNHAPPY **JHOSTS**

Y good friend, Doctor Thomas Wood, who is one of the bravest and sunniest-tempered men I have ever met, lives in a house frequented by happy ghosts. That strikes me as apt and reasonable.

The general feeling that associates spiritual visitations with gloom, though understandable, is illogical.

Over and over again, when I have come to some place that has given me overwhelming happiness, I have said to myself: "When I am dead, my spirit will escape here." I fully intend that my spirit shall repair as often as possible to Woolacombe sands, because it is there that I have been most happy in the company of those whom I have most dearly loved.

It may well be that this intense feeling that I have about the happiness of ghosts has made me less sensitive than most other people to the presence of unhappy ghosts.

My wife has an immediate reaction on entering any house that is haunted, and as we are for ever travelling up and down the country, staying in old country houses, I get a very good idea of the ghostly atmo-

sphere that prevails.

offerings of milk, as certain natives of the Channel Islands still seem to propitiate other unseen powers by pouring libations of wine on the heads of stone-graven images.

But no Devonian shrinks from the idea of seeing pixies, as many people shrink from seeing ghosts, which may be taken as proof that in nine cases out of ten, ghosts are restless through unhappiness.

Haunted houses are commonly damp, gaunt, grey, bleak, dark and ugly, and hidden among trees, and (as is only to be expected) are mainly to be found in areas where old feuds were most bitterly fought, as on the Scots and Welsh borders.

Sussex, which is a sunny county with an atmosphere of contentment and serenity everywhere, has few haunted houses, and I have walked from end to end of it without a single ghostly reminder, except those voices in Stane Street.

In Glen Lyon I feel the ghostly presences at my elbow all the time, though I see and hear nothing. In all the pele castles of Northumbria, and in all the Edwardian castles of the Welsh Marshes, I feel the presence, not of one or two, but of a whole host of unseen men and women, most of all in Stokesay, where I am assured the ghost of that young girl no longer walks.

Ghosts of young girls, in particular, should be, to my

mind, happy ghosts.

I am fully prepared to admit that in our age, at any rate, life administers such rude shocks as are likely to make misery predominate, but I am not prepared to admit that it was always so, and in a more Arcadian England, people died happy, and were so reluctant to leave the scenes of happiness that they were strong enough to come back, for after all what accounts for ghostly presences except the strength of will that determines them to come back. there is just as much strength of joy as of despair.

It is only those who are incapable of deep feeling who vanish completely. So happy lovers may well return and permeate with their strong joy the house in which they found and spread happiness. And it is this that prompts me so often to echo the sentiments of the poet of old:

'I long to meet with some old lover's ghost Who died before the God of Love was born." Indeed, I would go further. I am content to meet the ghosts of lovers of whatever generation.

Our own supply of happiness badly needs this supplementary channel of supply from those of our ancestors who lived in more halcyon days.

"Russia is naturally anxious to protect herself," Mr. Holmes declared, "but I feel she is sincerely seeking to gain a better understanding with her neighbours. She will actually take part in a very big conference—but that is not yet. Those who think a world Peace conference should be held at the present time are, I am sure, sadly mistaken. It would be a colossal failure.

"But this mood will soon pass, and Russia will become an important actor. You must not be dismayed if there is difficulty in the present negotiations, because the Soviet will eventually come into a Peace Front. She will at first make counter-proposals that Britain will not accept, but her destiny is not isolation. Neither is it, as some have

suspected, a secret alliance with Germany."

We discussed the possible trend of the next six months in home affairs. Mr. Holmes predicted that there would be a reshuffle in the British Cabinet—not long after the Whitsun recess, he thought. In that reshuffle Mr. Winston Churchill would again assume office.

Further Conscription Unlikely

On conscription Mr. Holmes was by no means sanguine. He thought an attempt would be made to extend it, but that it would meet with very limited success. He does not foresee the manhood of this country being drilled and marshalled on the continental pattern.

What about the world slump which so many economic

experts had foreseen for 1939?

Again Mr. Holmes was sceptical. He foresaw fitful economic fluctuations but no world depression would materialize. However, an economic crisis would gradually dawn when the nations decided afresh on realistic Disarmament—for disarmament was also part of the future as visualized by this blind seer. The new disarmament would (he said) be at first on restrained lines. It would be an international policy proceeding by much slower stages than on the previous occasion, though eventually leading to a regain of world confidence.

Mussolini's Despair


Finally, we turned to the fate of the Dictators.

Here Mr. Holmes confirmed the impressions of other prophets. He thought the downfall of Hitler was not long distant, and that it would be brought about by dissension within the Nazi party.

He professed to "read the mind" of Mussolini, and his verdict was that the Duce was at the present time a very unhappy and disillusioned man, encompassed about with troubles and disappointments, his hour at hand and his

ambitions in the dust.

"Do not let us be worried by the turn which recent events have taken," were Mr. Holmes' parting words. "The future is for Peace. Though there remains one more great crisis, war will be averted and the outcome will be a new and truer devotion to Peace on the part of all nations -and that includes the people joined together by the Axis Powers."

ignore them, for there was something startling, even awe-inspiring, in their close fidelity to his wife's description of the men she had seen in her dream.

She could never have seen them before, and yet she had described their clothes, their physical attributes and their demeanour as faithfully as though they had been regular customers of the house for years.

A Careful Watch

It is not to be wondered at that, in spite of the crowded condition of the bar, he should watch them carefully as long as they remained. No one else appeared to notice them but Rogers was so determined to get a clue to the startling coincidence that he kept close enough to hear most of what passed between them. Before they left, he knew that the tall, grave and dignified-looking man was Frederick Caulfield and his companion Jack Hickey, that they had both recently arrived from America—had, in fact, struck up an acquaintance on board ship—and that Hickey had on him a large sum of money representing the profits of a fishery in Newfoundland.

There is nothing, however, that fades quicker than the impression made by, or the memory of, a dream, and before the last customer left the public-house that night Had it not been that he knew them to be of good character and standing, he would have dismissed them with a warning not to waste his time again, but when they had left and he had read over Mrs. Rogers' signed statement, he decided to test it. It would not do, of course, for a man in his position to make a fool of himself by spending public money on testing a mere dream, but Mrs. Rogers' description of the murder was so circumstantial that it would be very easy to prove or disprove it. The Landlord's Evidence

It was in Rogers' favour that he had withstood successfully the magistrate's shrewd examination and that he had had an adequate and satisfactory answer to every question. It had been evident that he would have preferred to keep out of the affair altogether, but in the essential facts he had confirmed his wife's statements. When the magistrate had inquired how it was possible for a landlord to describe so closely two men he had never seen before and had not seen since, he had replied to the effect that, when his wife had pointed out the living prototypes of the two men she had described so accurately hours earlier, he had been so

Rogers had found more interesting subjects to occupy his mind. It was pleasant to know that the day's takings constituted a record, and that there had been no disturbances in spite of the influx of cattle dealers and their hangerson. For her part, Mrs. Rogers was only too willing to forget the scare she had had, but within a couple of months the subject was revived by the news that the disappearance of a man of the name of Hickey was causing his friends and relations concern and distress.

The Sequel

Rogers and his wife were as frightened and dismayed as if they were the murderers of the vanished Hickey, and for several days they were so overawed by the sinister possibilities of the unexpected sequel to the dream, that they did not breathe a word of it to outsiders. The landlord, who had all an Irishman's sensitiveness to ridicule, was strongly opposed to what he called "interfering," and he cited many instances of similar problems which had been solved by the reappearance of the missing person, safe and sound. But Mrs. Rogers was not to be convinced. It was her dream and not her husband's, and therefore she felt that her superior knowledge imposed on her the duty of assisting the authorities. Husband and wife wrangled about it daily until Mrs. Rogers insisted on his accompanying her to a local magistrate.

The woman, however, related her dream so nervously and apologetically that the magistrate got the impression she was a highly-strung person suffering from suppressed hysteria, and the impression was confirmed by Rogers' hang-dog, furtive manner and obvious disinclination to discuss the subject.

impressed that he had kept them under the closest observation until their departure.

The result of the magistrate's deliberation was that he took an official with him to the spot on the road to Carrick-on-Suir mentioned by Mrs. Rogers, and there, protected by the loneliness and the fading light, watched him dig the loose ground. When at a depth of a few inches the spade struck a human leg, the two men uttered cries of astonishment, but their astonishment was far greater when they saw that the body was that of Jack Hickey—the man who had disappeared mysteriously with a large sum of money on his person. But only one of them knew that the marks on the dead man's throat confirmed the account of the murder given by Mrs. Rogers.

The Arrest

No longer was there any disposition to ridicule her dream. Frederick Caulfield might have a reputation that made a charge of murder seem ridiculous, but there was the evidence of the woman's sworn statement, and Caulfield was arrested and charged with the murder of Hickey.

Never was a prisoner more taken aback when he learnt that his crime had been detected and exposed. He had planned it all so carefully that he never thought that his crime could ever be suspected, and in his confidence had made no attempt to leave the country. He knew that common gossip had solved the mystery of the disappearance by declaring that Hickey had returned to America to make more money or had gone to England to spend what he had. There was no reason why he should not have done any one of a dozen acts which would have accounted for his absence from Cork, and there is no doubt that had it not been for

Mrs. Rogers' dream, the exact circumstances of the death of Hickey might never have become known.

Amongst a peasantry prone to believe in dreams and signs and portents, the arrest of Frederick Caulfield created a profound sensation. There were a few sceptics who hinted that the dream was an invention of Mrs. Rogers artfully promulgated after the body had been found, and there were even more sinister suggestions in circulation when the trial opened at the Waterford assizes; but the majority agreed with the judge's comment that Providence had indeed intervened, and in the strangest manner.

Circumstantial Evidence

As the case against the prisoner was wholly circumstantial—and no more circumstantial than the figment of a dream—the principal witnesses for the prosecution were the landlord and his wife. Counsel for the defence naturally enough did his best to laugh the dream out of court after he had subjected Mrs. Rogers to a very severe cross-examination.

Exactly when did she tell her husband of the dream? Was it before or after the discovery of the body? Was the real explanation of the alleged phenomenon that they themselves were concerned in the murder of an unusually wealthy customer, and that they had concocted this story

to put the blame on an innocent man? If that was not so, how was it that they had not only described the exact spot where Hickey had been buried, but had given a complete description of the murder itself, a description fully borne out by the medical evidence?

An Exact Resemblance

Mrs. Rogers persisted that she had told her dream at least three hours before she saw for the first time Frederick Caulfield and Jack Hickey. Had it not been for their exact resemblance to the principals in that dream, she and her husband would never have taken any notice of them; but as it was, they had scarcely ever taken their eyes off them. As to the very important question of time, there was the evidence of the magistrate before whom they had made, signed and sworn a statement when the mystery of Jack Hickey's disappearance was still unsolved. It was incontrovertible.

The Defence

Counsel for the defence wisely left the magistrate alone and sought salvation for his client by trying to damage the characters of the principal witnesses for the prosecution. Was Mrs. Rogers an habitual dreamer? Was she in the habit of making money out of the superstitions of the peasantry? Had she ever got out of an awkward corner by a timely dream?

Witnesses Not Shaken

He asked these and many other questions; but all were answered to the satisfaction of the court, and they had the

judge and jury with them when they said in their simple way that they would have forgotten the dream had it not been for the astonishing confirmation of it by the entry of Caulfield and Hickey. Everybody agreed that this incident would have been sufficient to have stamped the incident on the most evanescent of memories, and when counsel for the defence sat down after a very lengthy cross-examination, he must have been conscious that he had lost.

A Full Confession

The verdict of the jury loosened the prisoner's tongue and he made a full confession which was only interesting because it confirmed in every detail Mrs. Rogers' dream—the dream which she had related at least ten hours before Frederick Caulfield, excited by greed, cut the throat of his companion on the lonely road to Carrick-on-Suir and buried him behind the hedge so familiar to the dreamer.

ACH branch of Yoga is but a path leading toward the one end—unfoldment, development and growth. He for she who wishes first to develop, control and strengthen the physical body so as to render it a fit instrument of the Higher Self, follows the path of Hatha Yoga, which I have explained in my previous articles.

The student who desires to develop his or her willpower and mental faculties, unfolding the inner senses and latent powers, follows the path of Raja Yoga. He who aims to develop by knowledge through studying the fundamental principles and the wonderful truths underlying life, follows the path of Gnani Yoga. And those who desire to grow into a union with the One Life by the influence of love, follow the path of Bhakti Yoga.

The majority of students prefer to gain an all round knowledge of the various branches of Yoga, learning something of each and giving preference to those branches which appeal to them more strongly. This attraction is the indication of need, or requirement; and, therefore, is the finger pointing out the path.

The first of the eight paths into which Raja Yoga is divided is known as Yama-meaning non-killing, truthfulness, non-stealing, continence, and non-

acceptance of gifts. The second step or path is called Niyama—cleanliness, contentment, mortification, study and self-surrender to God. The others are:

3. Asana, or posture.

Pranayama, or the controlling of the vital forces of the body through certain breathing exercises.

Pratyahara, or making the mind introspective. 5.

Dharana, or concentration.

Dhyana, or meditation.

Samadhi, or super consciousness.

The First Steps to Success

No student will succeed without first conquering the moral trainings and teachings of Yama and Niyama. These first and second steps are the basic principles of Raja Yoga. Only when the student has mastered these principles will he become an established Raja Yogi and realise the value of these teachings.

Another essential point which the student must bear in mind is that he must not think of injuring anyone, through thought, word or deed and this applies not only to man, woman and child, but to all animals and other creatures of this world. As Swami Vivekananda puts it, "Mercy shall not be for men alone, but shall go beyond and embrace

the whole world."

If man would think like that, there would be no cause at the present time for any of the unrest, or war scare from which we are suffering. There is in this world a great ferment of hate and fear. This hate and fear can be the cause of a greater catastrophe than we have yet experienced.

War is seldom planned in advance. It usually occurs suddenly, either from an explosion or collapse of

economic conditions due to wrong thinking. If the world and its people could only think rightly it would disperse the fear and hate which is now prevailing.

We now come to the path in Raja Yoga called Asana (posture). Asanas are a series of exercises, physical and mental, which have to be performed every day until the higher states are reached. Therefore it is essential that the student should find a posture in which he can remain a long time. The postures I would suggest for the student of the West, and which are the easiest, are:

1. The posture of sitting cross-legged, tailor fashion, on a blanket or small cushion. I suggest this in preference to the difficult Lotus posture.

2. A good posture for meditation is to select a room

where you can be alone and undisturbed; sit erect, comfortably, but do not lounge; let your thoughts roam where they will, but be perfectly still for from fifteen to thirty minutes; continue this for a month until you have secured full control of yourself, physically and mentally.

The reason why one must sit erect, whether on a chair or squat tailor fashioned upon the floor, is because it is necessary in this posture to hold the spinal column free, sitting erect, keeping

the neck, chest and head in a straight line and letting the whole weight of the body be supported by the ribs.

This part of the system is similar to Hatha Yoga, which deals entirely with the physical body, the aim of which is to make the body very strong through a series of difficult breathing exercises. These I would not advise the student to carry out, unless under the strict supervision of a Guru (teacher).


Perfect Control of Muscles

Yogis will tell you that there is not a muscle in your body over which you cannot establish perfect control. The heart can be made to stop or go on at will, and in the same way any part of the human organism can be made to function as you will. This control would help you to live a healthier and longer life if you could master it. Perfect health is one of the chief ideas and the main goal of the

Here is a good method for curing headaches and also to safeguard yourself from catching colds. It is a good thing to inhale water through your nose as soon as you get up in the morning. It will keep your brain fresh and cool all day and you will never catch a cold. One seldom hears of a Yogi with a cold. Put your nose under a tap of running water, or in a basin of water, and breathe in. You do this by making a pump action in the throat.

After the student has learned to sit quietly and in a firm erect seat, he then practises certain exercises for purifying the nerves. (See previous article in the February issue). When the nerves are purified, then comes the power to

practise Pranayama. Pranayama, the student stops the right nostril with the thumb and breathes through

In Fig. 1 you see naturally thin writing, with a forward slant, a slight up-slope, the Greek "e's" and a much too high capital "I," with a long un-ending tail to the "y" and oval vowels. The bar to the letter "t" is long and thin, before and after the stem, while the alignment is variable.

Here, then, is intellectual writing, with originality of idea, ambition, carelessness in spending, an optimistic will-power with reflection before action, and imagination.

The spidery style alone would tell you of imagination, but the other signs emphasise it.

Discretion

Note the discretion in the closed vowels. Note also the way in which the second "e" of "were" is attached to the previous letter, denoting artistic ability.

Untidy writing, if it is an educated hand, is usually full of imagination and may be depended upon to come up to

T is important that everyone should have at least a little imagination because a person without any becomes automatically a materialist, and sees only what he can see, hear, touch, taste or smell!

The imaginative type is easier to live with than the unimaginative type, because there is more adaptability attached to a volatile imagination.

Happily, there are only a few to-day who have no trace of imaginatory power.

Imagination in handwriting is shown by loosely formed and high capitals and stemmed

letters, long and looped tailed letters, and a general airy appearance of the placement on the paper. But these are not all to be found in the same writing. Sometimes you find one sign and sometimes another, or even a group of several of the signs.

Good Mental Powers

Thin, fine writing formation, which shows a good mental equipment, lends itself most easily to imagination signs. The type of mind is usually imaginative, too.

scratch in any crisis. Imagination is a strength not a weakness. In looking for imagination, however, you will have to be careful not to mix up ill-health and strained nerves with the signs of mental flights.

In Fig. 2 you find untidy writing, with high capital, and stems, but the formation is compressed, and the alignment not only variable but too jumpy.

Vivid Emotions

In this second example, the writer has imagination, but it is of little use, as the nerves are out of order owing to the strain of circumstances or over-work. The ideals are too high—see skied "i" dot, while the amount of ink in the dark colouring shows vivid emotions which rule the life. Here the imagination is definitely not helpful, and is a

hindrance rather than an asset to everyday life. Most of the untidiness in this writing is due to nerve-strain.

In Fig. 3, which is small dark-coloured writing, you might think that there is very little imagination because of the consistent, round and precise formation, but in the placement of the bar of the letter "t" you find at once "veneration," which is a form of imagination.

The elaborate and curled-in style of the letter "I," with the curved hook before the letter "y" in "you," all tell of the sensitive-to-other-people type of mind. The continual curling-in of the strokes denotes the introspective personality, although in this specimen it is not too bad.

In this writing you will find that the letters slant backwards in some parts, indicating shyness of heart, which is in keeping with the self-engrossment of the curves. Excess of curves in any style or size of writing indicates over-sensitiveness.

There is another type of imaginative mind, which, although susceptible to the words of other people, yet has no introspection. This sort of writer usually has a forward-slanting style of writing, and often has a good amount of will-power, which does not seem to be very effective owing to the excess of dreaminess caused by the over-working of the mental focus.

Sensitive Writing

Fig. 4 illustrates this fine writing, with a forward slant and long indefinite bars to the letter "t." The mind is so dreamy that the lettering almost fades away in places. In this specimen the most important trait lies in the "n" of the word "again" and in the tail of that letter. It is long-drawn-out and thicker than the rest of the word. This long end, with the darker shade of ink in it, tells of a most kind and warm emotion towards the rest of the world, and much sensitiveness also.

Imagination in adaptable writing is very good, for it keeps its owner from being too easily imposed upon or swayed by other opinions or environments.

In Fig. 5 you see writing which has all sorts and sizes of letters, jumbled together correctly, and with varying alignment and mixed colourings.

blowow of Some

The forward-slanting style, with a linked placement, tells of a progressive mind and the power of construction. As the vowels are narrowed and closed, the power of expression will be in writing rather than speech.

The long bars of the letter "t" flying out to the right of the stem, indicate speedy thoughts and actions. The large stems and the original type of "k" denote originality and imagination, while the varying sizes betray adaptability. HERE is an authentic account of the Occult beliefs and practices of the Malay people. The author writes from personal experience, having attended Malay seances and examined the feats of their Adepts and Mediums. Some of the phenomena he observed—such as trance—are familiar to Western students of Psychical Research; and others, like fire-walking, are rarely demonstrated here. The average Malay, says Mr. Wong, is a firm believer in the Occult.

T was dusk. Miasmal mists from the rice fields floated into the interior of the house of a Malay friend, when I arrived there to attend a seance.

I climbed the short bamboo ladder and entered the hall. In a corner, the son of my host reclined on a mattress and groaned.

On a mat in the centre of the room the pawang or medium sat Buddha-fashion, staring at the burning incense in a censer before him. Above him a kerosene lamp flickered. As a thick volume of smoke swirled towards the rafters, he thrust his palms into the smoke and started chanting.

After a while he began to sway from side to side. As this swaying became more animated his chanting, too, rose to an excited pitch. Then suddenly the shrill voice

of a woman broke into the tense atmosphere of the room. The face of my friend, Ariff, went white. The voice was that of his dead grandmother.

"Tell her why you sent for her," whispered an old woman.

Ariff beseeched her to prescribe a remedy for his son who was seriously ill.

The pawang swayed violently as the voice again filled the room. Ariff listened intently to the directions. Then the voice trailed off and stopped. At that instant the pawang fell backwards in a faint, and the seance came to an end.

Help from Mediums

Now, the average Malay is a great believer in the Occult. In sickness or trouble he seeks the aid of the pawang, who can be found in every village and town in Malaya.

When a child becomes ill, the mother consults a female pawang. The latter places a bowl of water before her and fixes a lighted white candle on to the edge of the bowl. On a wooden platter she places a bunch of betel-leaves, pieces of betel-nut, white lime, and some slices of lemon.

She gazes at the flame of the candle and repeats a magic formula. While her lips move with slight hiss, she makes passes with her right hand over the bowl of water. Now

and then she stops repeating the formula to ripple the water with a puff from her mouth.

Then she dips the betel-leaves into the bowl and returns them to the platter. The mother is instructed to chew the leaves and to rub the paste over the child's temple and navel. The charmed water is to be given to the child to drink.

The Art of a Pawang

When a Malay experiences a series of setbacks he invariably seeks the advice of a pawang. To expel the aura of evil that hangs over his client, the pawang asks the latter to squat in the centre of a small square mat.

Standing over the subject, the sorcerer breaks forth into incantations. He passes his hand seven times over the body of his client in an outward sweeping motion. The rite ends when the pawang blows chewed betel paste over the subject's head.

The client is given an amulet in the form of a yellow thread to wear round his neck or wrist. Sometimes the amulet consists of a piece of rice paper on which magic characters are scrawled. This paper is encased in a small silver tube. This tube is attached to a yellow string which is tied round the waist like a belt.

in MALAYA

In a country like Malaya, where can be found almost all the races east of Suez, those in search of Occult lore have unrivalled opportunities to thrill to new experiences and to add variety to their store of Occult knowledge.

In Chinese temples throughout Malaya seances are held often. By paying a small fee, a worshipper can obtain the service of a medium, subject to the chief priest's consent.

Before the altar of the principal god of the temple the medium sits on a stool. Lighted joss-sticks fill the room with incense and huge tapers send forth

With bowed head he says his prayers. leaping flames.

Then a voice escapes from his lips. The voice calls out the name of the worshipper and asks her if she knows who is speaking. The attendant priest prompts her to put her questions quickly when she recognises the voice as belonging to some dear departed.

When the voice ceases the medium recovers consciousness, and he is usually so weak that he has to be assisted to his quarters. The temple medium does not hold more than two seances a day.

Fire-walking is a rite always associated with Indians. Certain Chinese religious sects observe their fire-walking rites once a year.

Some time ago I went for a hiking trip in Johore. I came to a hill stream and rested in the cool shade of forest giants. From somewhere the beating of gongs and cymbals echoed into the brooding solitude of the jungle.

I followed the sound and came into a clearing on which stood a palm-thatched hut. A carpet of

burning coals was spread in the centre of the clearing. I could feel the scorching heat of the fire as I edged towards the hut.

On a stove in a corner of the square stood a

cauldron bubbling with boiling oil.

With a loud clash of cymbals the priest came out of the small temple followed by a dozen barefooted Chinese men and women, each holding a burning incense-stick. At the edge of the fire the priest halted.

In each hand he held a cymbal. Swinging his arms overhead he brought the cymbals together in a deafening crash. He lifted his bare feet on to the carpet of burning coals and walked across it with an easy gait. The twelve disciples followed him across the fire without flinching and emerged from the ordeal unscathed.

Getting his company into line again, the priest marched straight to the cauldron. Nonchalantly he thrust his hands into the boiling oil and sprayed the band of believers with it.

None of them was scalded or in any way hurt!

THEN Upton Sinclair stumbled upon the existence of Telepathy, he said he could not explain it, but the fact remained that it worked.

To some extent, this expresses my own feelings about Numerology. No one has ever explained quite satisfactorily why there should be an association between significant numbers and significant events.

he ignores the fact that the evidence is cumulative-and he completely evades the question why, for certain people, certain numbers should be so constantly occurring.

a predisposition for some chest weakness. The typical filbert nail is shown in Fig. 1. These people, if all the nails are of this type, should be very careful to guard against bad chest colds or any depleting conditions that might result in any chest infection.

In Fig. 2 is the typical cardiac type of nail. These round nails betray a predisposition for some weakness of the heart, not necessarily heart disease. You will often find this type of nail on the fingers of those who are very highly strung and nervy. Thus it points to a nervy condition of the heart.

Throat Weakness

People who have small nails shaped as in Fig. 3 must always guard against throat weakness. This type of nail is similar to the cardiac type but there is a marked tendency for a V formation of the base of the nail.

Where you find a nail with a definite V formation, as shown in Fig. 4, it indicates a marked predisposition for

You are all familiar with the white flecks so often found in the finger nails. I have heard many curious explanations of their cause, from damage by nail varnish and paint to bruises caused by careless manicure. Their actual cause is a chemical deficiency produced by nervous depletion. These white flecks are the warning signs of nervous exhaustion. The more numerous these white spots, the greater the danger of nerve trouble due to depletion of the vital nervous energy of the body.

Always advise people with these marks in their nails to

THE most important aspect of hand reading is the health aspect. And while it may not be possible to examine this aspect in all its vast detail, it is possible to give the student enough knowledge to enable him to form an accurate idea of the actual health condition of the person whose hand he is examining.

Medical science has discovered that health conditions are more dependent on the chemical conditions of the body than on any other factor.

Vitally Important

I want the student to remember that these chemical conditions are of vital importance. The hand betrays those vital 'predispositions'; that is, those tendencies that are either inherited or which may be due to faulty feeding, thinking or living.

Knowing that there does exist a definite predisposition for some particular and special form of disease, means that we are armed with a knowledge that should enable us to

avoid any such development.

The first point in the human hand for our diagnostic attention are the finger nails. The actual shape or any markings in the nail are not definite signs of any particular condition of disease. But they are the warning signs of existing predispositions. Filbert finger nails always indicate

take more rest, avoid alcohol and to increase the consumption of natural foods. Where you find a horizontal groove in the nail, it is an indication of a period of ill-health recently experienced. This ridge is a record of a past constitutional weakness, the depletion of certain chemicals in the body having interfered with the nail growth at the time.

Vertical grooves in the nail indicate a definite acidulous tendency; this may not be any indication of gout, but where you find such ridges in the nails you should advise your subject to pay a selective attention to diet and to avoid all those foods which are inclined to produce any acidity.

It is, of course, not possible to notice the temperature, etc., of the skin when you have only an imprint to deal with.






Fig. 5. (Continued from previous page)

But where you make an imprint of any hand, you should make a note at the time of such things as these.

A very dry scaly skin, particularly when coarse and cold, indicates nervous energy but lack of an active and vigorous vitality. These people are often emotionally repressive, there exists a predisposition for congestive conditions of the body; the undue formation of fat, the production

of catarrhal conditions due to faulty feeding.

Where you find the skin of the hand soft, warm and slightly moist, it is an indication of a highly strung and sensitive nervous system.

Nervous Vitality

Where the skin is fine with normal temperature, the actual consistency of the flesh firm, it indicates a high degree of nervous vitality. Where the skin is soft and possesses a consistency that can only be described as "flabby," it is an indication of some faulty blood condition and does betray a marked predisposition for some actual bacterial infection.

Skin that is reddish indicates a predisposition for blood pressure or some similar condition.

You have all heard a great deal about the Health line; this line runs from the Mount of Mercury, just below the little finger, down in towards the Life line near the wrist. The existence of this line is not of itself an indication of disease. But where you find that it is, as in Fig. 5, A, broken into many fine pieces, it then shows some digestive weakness due to nervous sensitivity. The common form is a mild nervous dyspepsia.

When you find such fine lines as these in this position on the hand make a careful examination of the actual formation of the Head line. If you find that this is full of minute dots, giving it the appearance of being "fluffy," then the basic cause of this digestive weakness is psychological. The subject possesses an "anxiety complex." He is apt to live too far and too habitually ahead of This nervous apprehension has, in these cases, a very definite and adverse effect on the digestive processes.

The Heart line does betray the actual condition of that organ. If you find a number of very fine lines dropping from the actual main line, they indicate a marked tendency

for some nervy action of the heart.

Where the actual ridges of the skin appear to travel from the lower edge of the actual heart line but are blurred and

very indistinct, it indicates a flabby condition of the heart. Where you find a clear islanded formation in the actual Heart line under the third finger, the Apollo finger, it is an indication of a definite predisposition for some eye weakness. These people must always be careful to guard against







SPIRITUALISM

SERIES of rappings heard in a humble cottage at Hydesville (Nr. Rochester, U.S.A.) in the year 1848, gave birth to a new religious crusade. The knockings were attributed to the spirit of a deceased pedlar who had returned to earth to tell the story of how he had been wilfully murdered. Then more messages were received from other spirits and so, in a remarkably short space of time, table rapping (as it was then called) became a craze in America. Soon the movement began to attract the interest of distinguished scientists. Societies for Psychical Research were formed as, in the meanwhile, efforts were also being made to give the Spiritualist movement a religious background. Now thousands of Spiritualist churches encircle the globe. Hundreds of thousands of people attend Spiritualist services, and communication between the two worlds is thought to be more common than ever it was before in history.

PSYCHOMETRY of letters is often a feature of seances but few amateur seers seem to develop the gift to help their friends and themselves, and yet most people have every opportunity of doing so.

A great many mistakes can be avoided if the aspiring sensitive will only obtain the co-operation of a few friends before seeking to psychometrise letters from complete

strangers.

It is sometimes difficult for the developing psychometrist to obtain articles with which to practise his art, and a great many promising mediums give up because they find they make slips and therefore lose confidence. Here is an easy method which can be adopted by even the most hesitant person.

The postman knocks in the morning and two or three letters drop into the box. Pick up the mail before another

member of the household handles the letters.

Psychometrise each letter in the ordinary way but make a note of what you think the contents of the letters will be—the health or mental state of the writers, and the times the letters were written. This is quite enough for the first few weeks and it is best to scribble your impressions on the envelope and check up as you read the letters.

It is not always easy to visualise the contents of a letter, especially if it arrives unexpectedly, but sometimes telepathy

on the part of the writer will give a premonition. The contents of the letter will usually describe the health of the writer—happy, excited, "headachy," worried, or fatigued—according to the remarks passed in the letter such as "I feel too tired to write all about it but will send you more details later."

The time of posting letters is not always the time they were

written, but if you can ask a few correspondents to put the time as well as date, it will greatly help you when checking up your notes. As you progress, find a few friends interested in this hobby who will undertake to write to you periodically and ask them to put down their exact feelings as they write, the time and the place or room. Wherever possible ask them to record this information on a separate slip so that if you have to open the envelope you can psychometrise and read the letter and immediately check up with the slip.

Hidden Thoughts

The note about the room is often a great help and a link as it is sometimes possible to be so in tune with the friend that the room-surroundings can be "sensed" too. Do not forget the psychometrising of letters may cause you to discover strange thoughts on the part of the writers and also to know whether they are as sincere as they pretend to be.

Psychometrising letters from regular correspondents will help you to assist them when they need urgent advice.

It is possible to develop the art of psychometrising correspondence by using business letters but unless you know a great deal about the writers and the firms concerned



BECOME a PSYCHOMETRIST

it may only cause confusion. Typewritten letters are often mis-leading especially if several typists use the same machine.

Love is another matter which causes problems and the psychometrist must be careful to give his or her impressions before perusing the contents of the letter. Always ask the recipient to fold the letter so that the contents cannot be accidentally seen but warn them that you may wish to read the letter later.

Sometimes the thoughts of the writer, as outlined by the psychometrist, are diametrically opposite to the opinions expressed in the letter so the medium should be prepared for such contrasts and after psychometrising the folded letter should be allowed to read the actual message.

letter should be allowed to read the actual message.

A friend of mine discovered a "forged" letter amongst his personal correspondence—it was from an acquaintance who was extremely careful to portray unselfish thoughts in connection with an invitation, but the psychometrist was convinced the writer was more concerned with his own affairs than the welfare of other people. The recipient of the letter would have accepted the communication at its face value if he had not psychometrised, for although his friend had actually written it, the letter was a "forgery of the mind."

What Is Happening Abroad—I

SHE HAS A LUMINOUS HEART

TALY'S leading medical men—in fact, doctors the world over—have found themselves facing a problem that opens up incalculable possibilities in the person of Anna Morano, the wife of a fisherman in the small town of Pirano, near Trieste.

Anna Morano, a simple woman of scant education, the mother of sixteen children, has been repeatedly treated at the Pirano hospital for asthmatic ailments. On the last visit her nurse first observed the inexplicable—one might well say miraculous-phenomenon which has since greatly puzzled the scientific world.

One evening when the lights were turned out in the hospital wards and only the tiny crimson night-lights glimmered in one corner of each ward, the inspecting nurse made her rounds. As she approached the bed of Anna Morano, she noticed that the patient's face was lit up by a strange, white, phosphorescent light.

The nurse could not ascertain from what source the light came. She inspected the bed, turned up the coverlet, and perceived that a strong, greenish blue light emanated from the left side of the patient's breast. The light was so strong that it passed through the heavy linen of the hospital nightdress and the coverlet.

Doctors keep Watch

The nurse immediately sent for the doctor in charge. The strange light had grown fainter by the time he arrived, but it was still perceptible. Together they questioned the patient. Anna Morano, in tears, confessed that this emanation of light from her breast had often occurred before, but she didn't like to talk about it. She besought the doctor and the nurse not to tell anyone that she had a luminous heart—for that is what she took it to be.

The three doctors of the hospital—Sambo, Contento and Parenzan—did everything scientifically possible to control the phenomena and to exclude all possibility of delusion, whether intentional or accidental.

They examined the bed, the patient's skin, every object that came within her reach. They watched Anna Morano, taking turns at her bedside, for a recurrence of the strange phenomenon. The light did not appear for several days, but finally one day at noon Dr. Sambo noticed the phosphorescent light again emerging from the patient's breast.

He darkened the room, sent for his colleagues, and together they observed the clear light emanating from the mysterious source in the woman's breast for over twenty

minutes. At the end of that time the light slowly began to fade and then disappeared completely. The doctors were baffled and could find no solution.

In spite of all the discretion on the part of nurses and doctors, the news of the strange phenomenon spread rapidly in Pirano and the neighbouring fishing villages.

Anna Morano was known to be a highly-strung, nervous person and a great church-goer. She never missed a procession or a fiesta, so the population of Pirano was quick to jump at the conclusion of a miracle. People began to visit her house as a shrine and her fame spread throughout Italy.

Anna Morano was next taken to the Psychiatric Clinic of the University of Rome, where she was placed in a private room under the inspection of Professor de Santis, Italy's foremost authority on Neuro-psychiatry.

Cine Film Record Made

Since then, Anna Morano has been under constant medical and scientific supervision. Dr. Glocondo Protti, a radio-biologist of international fame, has been in close attendance. He once succeeded in taking a cine film of the emanation of light from Anna Morano's breast, and declares that it is absolutely impossible that the emanations of light should have their source in some swindle or delusion.

Dr. Protti conjectures that Anna Morano's nerves and senses are constantly preoccupied with one all-prevailing idea of a religious character.

The men of science explain that this "obsession" has produced a transformation in some of her organs—a certain dissolution of internal tissues that cannot be registered by any other means but is apparent in the strange sensation of light.

That is the scientific hypothesis. But what does it amount to? Nothing more nor less than that the phenomenon of materialisation, looked upon with so much scepticism by the scientific world, can no longer be regarded as an impossibility even by the most incredulous medical men.



The words of the ancient curse had been all too literally fulfilled. As for the fields, they had reverted to heathland.

Hangman's Round

consecrated ground.

Miss Reeve conducted me to the area that has recently been put under cultivation, and pointed to another relic that is linked with the Elizabethan curse. This particular sector of the land is known as "Hangman's Round," and from Miss Reeve I learned that another Sturston parson, upon whom the curse had apparently descended, ended his life there by hanging from this tree.

"When I decided to farm the field," said Miss Reeve, " everyone pointed to the oak tree and told me that no good would come of it, and that my labours would be unfruitful. But I am hopeful that with faith and hard work the curse may yet be defeated, and already I have had some encouragement.

"Curiously enough, when things were at a very low ebb with the farm, and we did not know what to do, there came



a high wind which blew all the lower branches off the oak tree. I have left them where they have fallen so that the villagers could see; and if you believe in omens, surely this is a good one, which augurs well for the crop."

A Previous Ceremony

Then she recalled that the late Rector of Merton had studied the curse and had once held "a proper curse-removing service" with prayers, on the site of the old church.

Having this in mind, and in view of her new experiment, Miss Reeve approached the clergy who have parishes adjoining her land, and invited them to conduct a

Rogation service, for which she wrote a special prayer. This service took place on May 13th, and was conducted by the Rev. E. Stanley Thomas (Rector of Merton, and Vicar of Thompson, Tottington and Sturston) and the Rev. G. H. Tugwell (Vicar of Stanford).

A Special Prayer

CURSE

The service was a typical Rogation-tide ceremony and opened with a hymn, after which the Vicar of Stanford read the usual Rogation prayers. During the singing of the hymn, the Clergy led the villagers along the road to the fields, where the congregation said together the 67th psalm.

The procession had by then arrived at Hangman's Round. Here the Rev. E. S. Thomas read the following prayer:

Special Prayer for the Sturston Fields
O GOD who knowest when the sparrows and smallest of Thy creatures need Thy care, bless we pray Thee, this land of Sturston; give it Thy mercy and bless the fruits thereof. Restore it to the graciousness of seed time and harvest and remove therefrom the ancient curse which has hitherto rested upon it. We ask that the labours of our hands may find favour in Thy sight, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Minister's Statement

I interviewed the Rev. E. S. Thomas, who explained that when he was asked to officiate at the service, he considered it was his duty to acquiesce.

He deplored the sensational way in which the ceremony had been reported and emphasised that it was a serious devotional gathering attended by villagers who gained their livelihood from the land and who, in consequence,

were very much in earnest about what

they were doing.
When I asked the Rev. E. S. Thomas
if he believed in the curse he replied.
"I don't think it is a matter for belief

or unbelief, for anyone who understands anything about the country must make allowances for a certain type of outlook which views these things in a very different light to the attitude adopted by the townsman.

"To be present at such a ceremony is to understand and appreciate it. After all, the people for whom it was performed live a great deal nearer to nature than do many of their critics.

"However, I think it is a mistake to analyse ancient beliefs such as this because people in the country move and think more by instinct than logic, and it is very difficult

to arrive at the cold facts of such an issue. I believe you can no more get to the bottom of a mystery like this by argument and logic than you can understand the mystery of the Sacrament by a similar process.

"Phenomena like these are mysteries and can only be apprehended by the power of spiritual discernment. To attempt to thrash out by debate these ancient accretions which have become embodied in the Church is an attempt to argue impossible."

There the matter rests. determined effort is being made to live down the belief that the fields of Sturston will no more provide crops. Practical steps have been taken, and the good offices of the Church have been employed.

Whether Miss Reeve will succeed in her valiant effort to turn this doomed land into productivity, only The Rev. E. Stanley Thomas and Miss L. M. Reeve, whose time will tell.

But now the villagers have hope.

At all events, they see wheat growing where none has grown before. Who knows what the harvest will be?



in Norfolk this week, men and women were kneeling in the fields, at a special service, to for the lifting of an ancient curse. The land down there has been barren for years, and many of the folks in these parts believe that all the trouble is due to a curse put on the old manor house, which is now in ruins, and on the old church, which is now in ruins too.

"Speaking for myself, I shouldn't rule out the possibility of a curse blighting crops. For one thing, beliefs of that sort have been held in the countryside for centuries, and I think men and women who live close to the soil do have their own wisdom, which is often deeper than that of the scientists; and also I don't think there is any doubt that unseen influences at any rate do cling to certain places.

"I've relatives myself who instantly know when they go into an empty

house—I suppose it's by the feel of it—whether it is a happy or unhappy place, and in an unhappy house they are instantly oppressed by a load of invisible misery or gloom or even horror. And if human beings can be blighted like that, by lingering influences, I suppose it is possible, at any rate, that crops might be blighted too."

Sir Dudley in the past, like many of us, disliked the idea of reincarnation. He now sees, however, after talking with the higher Guides, that it is beyond all doubt a fact to which it is useless to attempt to shut one's eyes; and he discusses the conditions under which it may be presumed to take place.

Particularly fascinating, too, is a revelation of the secrets of alchemy. Sir Dudley's medium when the book was written seemed to be on the point of discovering the Elixir of Life.

SOME WELL-KNOWN OMENS

The howling of dogs is perhaps the most widely known portent of approaching death and is in fact an almost universally recognised omen. Considering the strong bond of affection and sense of attachment

which often marks the relationship between a man and his dog, coupled with the fact that dogs possess a high degree of psychic awareness, this sensing of approaching death is more easily understood. There are, however, many so-called death omens which have a perfectly natural explanation and are therefore not worthy of mention.

In England great stress is placed upon the phenomenon of pictures falling from walls, which happening becomes all the more mysterious when it is found that the cord is intact and the hanger or nail is in its correct position on the wall. In such cases as this it is futile to attempt to supply a natural explanation as the phenomenon is definitely one of a supernormal nature.

Another omen which, though not necessarily portentous of death, usually indicates the advent of disaster, is tapping on a window pane. Sometimes the tapping is caused by a solitary bird striking the glass with its beak, and when, as is sometimes the case, the bird makes several visits, tapping on each occasion, the event becomes something more than a mere ornithological curiosity. Sometimes tapping on the window is produced by some unseen agency.

HEADLINES TO MAY

A Running Commentary on the News By the Editor

"HAVE tabulated forecasts made in a group of large-circulation newspapers concerning probable developments in Europe and I have found that they were considerably less than 50 per cent. accurate," Arthur S. Wade, former City Editor of the Evening Standard told the City Centre of the Bank Officers' Guild when he lectured on "What Do the Papers Say?"

The above report appeared in World's Press News dated May 4th. Was it merely a coincidence that, in the same issue, that journal should devote a paragraph to the amazing accuracy of PREDICTION'S political forecasts?

In HIS broadcast talk from Verdun, the Duke of Windsor declared: "As I talk to you from this historic place I am deeply conscious of the great company of the dead."

For the first time "The Return of Peter Grimm" was presented on an English stage. The theatre was The Kings, Hammersmith, and the play, which deals with survival after death, had previously run for over two years in New York.

A PARLIAMENTARY BILL to legalise mediumship is being sponsored by Mr. Harry Price. Mr. Price said he hoped to get the Bill introduced into Parliament this autumn.

A CONFERENCE of Spiritualists, with public demonstrations by an American medium, Mrs. Gertrude Handy Irving, was recently organised in Stockholm, by Dr. Carleson. For the time being, however, the police have forbidden it to be held.

UPTON SINCLAIR has written a book giving an account of remarkable psychic healing.

Denk Leicht (Germany) describes fresh observations and proofs by medical men as to the strange phenomenon of stigmata displayed by Teresa Neumann.

A DIVINING PENDULUM has gained for the holder of one tenth of a ticket in the National Lottery of France the sum of 5,000 francs. The number of the ticket, 1,250,974, was settled upon by the swing of the pendulum.

FROM CALIFORNIA comes an account of miraculous healing by prayer. A patient with a leg badly hurt through a fall was told by the doctor to stay in bed for two weeks. Unable to remain away from work the injured party removed the doctor's bandages while praying for divine help. There followed swiftly a complete cure.

BETWEEN INCARNATIONS the length of time is decreasing, according to the Rosicrucian Magazine (U.S.A.); so it results that a greater number of egos are reborn at one time than was formerly the case.

Professor P. Venkato Rao, writing upon "Palmistry and Its Antiquity," in the Astrological Magazine (Bangalore, India), says that originally the Hindus studied the lines and marks on all parts of the human body. This practice they called the study of Samudrika. It was not until afterwards that they made a more specialised analysis of the lines on the Palm—which was termed Hast Samudrika.

Peace Societies are Utopian, protests a Bombay journal, the *Theosophical Movement*, "because no amount of argument based upon esoteric considerations of social morals or expediency can turn the hearts of the rulers of nations away from selfish war and schemes of conquest."

L'Astrosophie, discussing the horoscope of Pope Pius XII, remarks that its outstanding characteristic is the singular power of the native to follow one line of action unshaken by external influences. But the chart for the "moment of election" confirms the natal and progressed ones in its indications of menaces from secret enemies.

THE POPE: The pontificate of Pius XII will be a troubled one, prophesies *L'Astrosophie*, and its duration will not be as long as that of his predecessor.

This Monthly gives, in its April issue, some interesting international predictions for the not far-distant future. Germany's hatred of England is bound rapidly to increase. The health of the Fuehrer will decline. Friction is foreshadowed between Goering and Goebbels. The prestige of Mussolini will diminish. Troops will be sent from Italy to quell risings in Abyssinia.

RUMELIUS casts Neville Chamberlain's horoscope, in *L'Avenir du Monde*, and concludes that he will be able to solve the conflicting elements which separate the two adverse camps in European politics.

MAHATMA GANDHI, during one of the two great annual fasts in India, which last from three to five weeks, has had a revelation, says Neues Europa, as to the moment of his death. "My life nears its end," he is said to have announced, and to have prognosticated the day and even the precise hour of his departure from this earth. His family, however, desire to keep such knowledge secret.

THIRTEEN is not necessarily an unlucky number, maintains Le Monde de Demain. It brought good fortune to Edmond Rostand, whose name was composed of 13 letters; he made his debut with the publication of a play, the title of which contains the same number. Moliere had no fear with regard to this supposedly unlucky 13, for it was upon January 13th, 1668, that Amphitryon saw the light. Undeniably 13 exerts a favourable influence for some people. Leo XIII, for instance, was one of the 13 popes who celebrated their episcopal jubilee.

"RODOPHE," another writer in Le Monde de Demain, sees in the chart of Herr Hitler an assurance that before long his health will fail, and with it his despotic power.

The Question Everybody is Asking

7HAT a world! There was 1914 and Mons and all that. Then there was 1938 and Munich and all this. After the bloodiest war in known history, it staged a "peace"—a peace on terms so foolish and impossible that the result is a state of affairs that defies description.

Anyhow, here we are. Out of every pound you or I earn

by the sweat of our brows, out of every Franc, Reichsmark, Lira, Peseta, Peso and Yen earned by our fellow-humans in France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Mexico and Japan, an irritatingly large percentage is devoted to paying for preparation and equipment for the mass-butchery we call war."

Meanwhile, all over the earth loud-speakers bellow, State-subsidised newspapers print, every kind of agent and orator broadcasts, intensified hate propaganda.

Yes, what a world! We must not lean back comfortably,

we Britons, and speak of the "world" as though it were another plane of existence outside the BV British Empire. We must needs

carry our share of the common responsibility. If the horrid pictures of civilization destroying itself, so often painted by our Jeremiahs, are never to materialize, it is up to us to study the cause and cure of present world evils. Otherwise, we perish.

You may study the problem from two angles—the orthodox or the unorthodox. If a strictly orthodox line of reasoning appeals to you, put down this article and turn to your scientific tomes and standard works of reference. If, however, you would like to approach the world problem-which, mark you, is your problem and mine, for no detachment is possible these days-from a different angle, let us invoke any help that Astrology may give.

Let us not forget that ever since the dawn of time, rulers of the world have done so. On the book-shelf before me is the text of reports made by the Astrologers of Babylon to their King—not so far from the time when Nebuchad-nezzar saw the fiery writing on his palace walls. Three wise men followed a star and changed the religious history of the western world. A soothsayer, you will remember, exchanged words with great Caesar before he came to his doom. Nostradamus left a virtual time-table of coming European events behind him-a schedule which is now in process of fulfilment. Nicholas Kratzer, John Dee, William Lilly and a host of others have successfully contributed to the world's foreknowledge to an extent never

equalled by any other school of thought. What light, then, can the stars shed on our present

Let us make a preliminary survey of the main probabilities which face the peoples of the earth at the present time. Then let us turn to the present and near future positions of five major planets which must surely play a dominant part in world history.

Here are the probabilities which are offered to the world at present: how far they may be realized depends upon the vice or virtue, the courage or cowardice, of mankind:

(1) The peoples of the earth will degenerate into a state analogous to that of bees. The growth of classification, organization and specialization will put an end to individualism. Each human being will become a blind, unreasoning cog in the world machine. This process has already set-in in the Dictator States: it is slowly spreading to the so-called democratic Nations.

(2) Such a development, which is probably in direct conflict with the ultimate purpose of life, would have to be brought to an end.

Yet (if mankind is foolish) it might and

probably would last throughout the "Aquarian Age," i.e., from a date within the next two or three centuries to

a terminal date between two or three thousand years hence (see notes below on the "Aquarian Age").

- (3) If, on the other hand, mankind, making use of the freedom of choice given by the gods, makes the necessary effort to develop reasonable individualism as in opposition to mass-regimentation, the present situation and the near-future progress of mankind may be saved.
- (4) Owing to the positions of Saturn and Uranus and other important astrological factors, the population of these islands and the populations of Europe and the United States will tend to concentrate populations of Europe and the United States will tend to concentrate into two very widely separated classes. On the continent of Europe this division of mankind will group the people into a tiny minority of rulers on the one hand and the vast mass of ruled on the other. The rulers (Dictators and the official class immediately associated with the Dictators) will acquire power and prestige akin to the "Divine Kings" of the Ancient World. The workers—the dumb regimented masses—will relapse into the worker-bee state already mentioned. In Britain a parallel process will take place. The ruling and monied classes will become more and more aloof, select and powerful; the

classes will become more and more aloof, select and powerful; the ruled or working classes more and more standardized and officialridden. Such a state of affairs cannot last very long-1943 or 1944 will mark its break-up.

As regards world history in the immediate future, i.e., during the next three or four years, two things will become apparent to all men:

- (a) That the totalitarian States will develop along lines entirely different to those originally visualized by their founders—just as the character of the Soviet system has changed.
- It will be realized that organized religion in the West has failed utterly, and an effort will have to be made to find a spiritual crusade to replace it.

July 1939 is in the centre of a "Key Period" in contemporary world history. It sees the final occultation of Uranus by the Moon, ending a long series of similar occultations which have been upsetting the sanity and peace "What's Next" is a peculiarly appropriate of the western world. theme for such a period.

The five great factors which shape world history are represented by the planets Neptune, Uranus, Saturn, Jupiter and Mars. There is a sixth factor—the planet Pluto—but his potentialities and radiations are as yet unascertained. There may be other factors—other as yet undiscovered planets.

Let us make a brief survey of each of the above. Each radiates a characteristic influence which is concerned with particular phases of human thought and activity—individual

and collective:

Neptune

Neptune radiates a world-influence which in its constructive effects makes for spiritual revolution, tolerance, fellowship and a Utopian state of affairs. Its destructive manifestations are very terrible. The rays of Neptune affect masses of people simultaneously. We have a typical Neptunian phenomenon in the wave of war fear, war mania and generalized panic which is now sweeping over the earth.

At present Neptune is in Virgo, passing finally into Libra in the late summer of 1943. It is probable that before Neptune leaves Virgo (which sign is especially concerned with food production and public health) there will, for one reason or another, be a state of complete chaos and possibly scarcity in the world's food supplies. Furthermore, his position has a prophetic significance in regard to epidemic disease, which will in the next four years sweep over the continent of Europe.

When Neptune passes into Libra there are good grounds for hope that, as Neptune has astrologically to do with the common people in the mass, the cruel oppression which will steadily develop up to 1943 will be relieved. The ideal communal state will never be realized at this stage, for if human society were perfect "The Oversoul" would

cease to use this globe as a school-room!

Incidentally, Neptune is concerned with herd-exploitation. Bolshevism on the one hand and Fascism on the other (both forms of State capitalism, both being the same in their effect on the masses and differing only in name) are alike activities of the Neptunian ray impinging upon human society.

Uranus

Uranus is the "key" planet of the present phase of human mass-life. It is owing to the recent frequent occultations of Uranus by the Moon and other related portentous phenomena which cannot here be detailed, that the recent series of terrifying crises in Europe have arisen. The first of this series of occultations was in the middle of July 1938: it linked up with an important Eclipse affecting the same Zodiacal area in May 1938: thence onwards these occultations, with their accompanying configurations, were frequently repeated. The last of the series will occur in July 1939.

Now Uranus is the planet which (figuratively speaking) smashes and stamps flat any existing work of God, Man or Devil which has grown effete, obsolete and unserviceable. It will in the end surely smash much that is evil in the social and economic system which just managed to survive the Great War of 1914-18. It will smash that economic system —or, at least, knock away and replace the defective parts of its structure—before it leaves Taurus in 1942. Be sure

that between now and then—or very soon after 1942—the Money Kings who corner and control the world's supplies of necessities and the War Lords who corner and control human lives, will be taught a memorable lesson. Reason: Taurus, the second sign of the Zodiac through which Uranus is moving has specifically to do with money, finance, property. With Virgo (see note on Neptune above) Taurus is concerned with the world's food, clothing and housing.

In 1942 Uranus will pass into Gemini: the Sign of the Zodiac which is concerned with social freedom, interchange, intercommunication, transport, education in a general sense and the United States of America in a particular sense. The masses will benefit, the U.S.A. will benefit also and probably become, with Russia, the dominant power of the

world—certainly the dominant air power.

As Taurus astrologically links up with cultivated land and building sites, no doubt a pretty severe blow will be dealt at property values and landlordism—one of the curses of our present age.

Saturn

Saturn—that much abused planet—stands for the great Cosmic forces which have to do (in the psychological world) with ethics, justice, continuity and tradition: with discipline, scarcity, fear and death among mankind.

At present the stern task-master of mankind is in the end of Aries—a position which has called for frequent comments in this column in view of the link-up between Aries and the British Empire. It is just about to pass into Taurus: it touches Taurus in August and September 1939 but goes back into Aries then until March 1940. Between April 1940 and May 1942 it will be passing through Taurus.

Its radiations during the next three years or so will therefore be associated with those of Uranus on account of their common sign position. Here is yet another factor which presignifies food scarcity (or waste?) and increasing

oppression of the masses by their masters.

Without being melodramatic, it may be said that in a sense this position of Saturn, considered with certain other factors, certainly does denote "the end of an age." In 1942 Saturn will pass into Gemini: in 1944 into Cancer. Its passage through Gemini will probably be coincident with scientific and mechanical developments which effectively shackle the present apparently unlimited destructive powers of air-craft.

Iupiter

After glancing at the positions and probable activities of Saturn, Uranus and Neptune it is comforting to turn our attention to Jupiter—the star of prosperity.

Up to the first part of May 1939 Jupiter was in Pisces. On the 11th of that month he entered Aries which, as already stated, is a Sign which has to do with the British Empire. Jupiter does not stay long in one sign: it will be in Aries approximately a year, moving into Taurus at the end of May 1940. Nevertheless, its passage through Aries makes one more optimistic regarding Empire affairs.

In practical astrology Jupiter has to do with prosperity and plenty in the world at large: its radiations tend to support or restore law and order. It is curious that its ingress into Aries roughly coincided with the departure of His Majesty King George VI to America. Disquieting as are the significations to be deduced from the positions

The Cautious Cancer Type

HEN the fourth sign of the Zodiac (Cancer, "The Crab") is mentioned, manypeople have an uneasy feeling that, somehow or other, the disease and the sign have some connection each with the other. Nothing of the kind. Statistics show that Sun-Cancer people are no more liable to the disease than any other type.

Another popular error is the impression that Sun-Cancer people are "hard shelled"—like a crab. Again, nothing of the kind. The Sun-Cancer temperament is cautious, careful, discreet, reserved, not at all "hard boiled." They are intensely sympathetic people.

This year the Sun enters Cancer about breakfast time (G.M.T.) on June 22nd and remains there until it enters Leo in the late afternoon of July 23rd. It repeats this performance at approximately

the same dates every year. Hence, if you made your first bow (or ought we to say "musical sound"?) to this admiring world within the period above, you may count yourself as one of the great "Sun-Cancer" tribe. In Great Britain they are a numerous tribe—considerably more than one-twelfth of the total population.

Or maybe you were born at some other time of the year, but at your birth Cancer was passing over the Eastern horizon, or a group of planets was in Cancer. In that case, you too will have a good many Cancer characteristics and to some extent pass through the type of experience scheduled for the Sun-Cancer type.

Some people, alas! are so transparent or so dull that one gets bored or angry with the effort to understand them. Not so with Cancer people—there is always something interesting about the typical Cancer individual. Mark you, these people are by no means easy to read. They never "open out" to a stranger at first meeting. It is when you have known them a week, a month, a year or a decade that you begin to realise what good stuff they really are at the bottom.

They are conservative folk (I am not using the word in the political sense). Even in these flighty days they believe in the family. Master or Miss Cancer regard father or mother with genuine affection and respect, a characteristic which they keep right through life. Thus it comes about that the man who marries a Miss Cancer

surely has to resign himself to mother-in-law. Love of home is strong; pride in ancestry marked. Don't get irritated, therefore, if your Sun-Cancer friend appears unduly to emphasise the distinguished record of his forebears. Pedigrees mean a lot to him and, after all, there is no harm in pedigrees.

Psychologically speaking, the Cancer type react in an extraordinary degree to the influence of other personalities, to changes of environment, to moods, climatic conditions, and the "feel" of the places they happen to be in. Even changes of the Moon

affect them. If you don't believe me, observe the speech and action of a typical specimen at New or Full Moon.

Furthermore, things seem to happen in their lives at changes of the Moon—more than with other people.

In business matters the Sun-Cancer type is discreet, methodical, reserved, somewhat stubborn, and unyielding. They are very trustworthy people. I was greatly amused to read in a recently published Astrological treatise that the Cancer type just cannot keep a secret. This is a fair specimen of the sort of nonsense that gets into modern Astrological literature.

These people are good sailors. Oddly enough, their inclination to seafaring does not seem to

render them immune from sea-sickness (Cancer has to do with the stomach). They often earn their living among fluids, i.e., as hotel keepers, dyers, pharmacists, in the brewery and distilling trades, making or selling cosmetics, in the fishing or shipping industries. In many cases there is a natural flair for handling real estate, for agriculture and for all that concerns the land and its produce.

Thrift is strongly marked; saving is a characteristic of the Cancer temperament. Furthermore, just as they like to save money and store goods so they love to save life. Hence, many good doctors, nurses, midwives and workers in the Public Health Services have Cancer prominent in their horoscopes.

During the period of infancy and childhood the Cancer type seem to register frequent changes of personality. Especially is this the case at the beginning and end of adolescence. Hence, parents whose children have Cancer dominant in their horoscopes should never be surprised if little Mary or young John grow up into very different individuals!

The typical Cancer face is round, broad and pale. The eyes have usually an extremely sagacious glint, being rather moist but not large, the nose has no particular characteristics, the mouth fairly wide, the chin round, ears small and set close to the head; the neck is fleshy and towards middle life often shows creases or folds in the skin. The chest is exceptionally deep and broad. The shoulders

ULY starts with a Full Moon; the New Moon occurs about nine o'clock (G.M.T.) on Sunday the 16th. At that moment Jupiter is in the Ascendant at London, Neptune, Mercury and Pluto near the Western horizon. Mars is in the twelfth House. This is not a "martial" New Moon,

however, and gives ground for hopes that the state of crisis so unmistakably indicated by other Astrological factors will successfully be resolved without war: Moreover, Jupiter is by now well established in Aries, one of the ruling signs of the British Empire, and close to the Moon's position at the time of the Vernal Equinox in March last.

One turns from a study of the New Moon chart feeling tense but not pessimistic.

Mercury starts his July journey in the 2nd degree of Leo, turns retrograde on the 28th July and in the 25th degree of Leo and in the last three days of the month slips back into the 24th degree once more.

The position of Mercury in the latter half of the month has a definite interest for readers who were born near the 18th August. For them, more travel, correspondence, argument and intellectual activity than usual.

Venus on the 1st of the month is in the 21st degree of Gemini, which sign she leaves on the 9th. Passing through Cancer from that date, she leaves the 28th degree of this sign by the end of the month.

The July position of Venus should some-what benefit those whose birthdays fall between the middle of June and the late middle of July. As much depends upon the particular date of birth, however, and as Venus is moving so quickly, her effect will be comparatively fleeting.

Mars, just below, is in a position of special interest to both Astrologers and Astronomers. To the naked eye Mars now appears unusually bright in the evening sky: he is to be seen towards midnight above the Southern horizon. At present he is very near to the Earth, but one should not deduce from this that his war-provoking effect on the Earth's population is necessarily increased.

On July 1st Mars is in the 5th degree of He moves retrograde all the Aquarius. month, passing back into Capricorn on the 22nd. On the 31st he will be found in the 28th degree of Capricorn.

People born near the period between January 18th and 25th necessarily have their horoscopical Suns affected by the July position of Mars and, in consequence, will have a pretty strenuous time. Those with birthdates exactly six months away from the foregoing period will also feel its effect, but not get the same benefit from his constructive and energising properties.

Jupiter moves slowly from the 8th to the 9th degree of Aries during July, turning retrograde on the 30th. Hence, March 29th and 30th subjects should receive at least some benefits from Jupiter's bountiful store.

Just at present Jupiter and Mars are close together in the night sky: both showing up brilliantly among the surrounding stars.

Saturn changes his sign in July, passing into Taurus on the 6th: before that he was in the last degree of Aries. By the end of the month he is just entering the 2nd degree of Taurus. Such a position may tend to slow down the affairs of readers who are born on the 22nd April or thereabouts; everybody born then, or on and about October 25th, will come to grips with the realities of life.

Uranus is in the 21st and 22nd degree of Taurus—a "surprise packet" for owners of birthdates centering upon May 12th and 13th. Uranus sometimes upsets our apple-carts but he always brings something interesting!

Neptune moves from the end of the 21st degree to the middle of the 22nd degree of Virgo. Here is a position which especially will interest students of mysticism who are born in mid-September, though this same position may involve others born about the middle of March in a spot of complication.

Problematical Pluto is (for him) moving quite rapidly from the middle of the 1st degree into the commencement of the 2nd degree of Leo by the end of the month.

Those who are interested in the Moon's Node and its possible reaction upon their personal horoscopes should note its position during July:—
July 1st: 6th degree of Scorpio.

July 31st: 4th degree of Scorpio.

of Neptune, Uranus and Saturn, the passage of Jupiter through Aries will help to support the British Empire in its hour-or rather yearof supreme trial.

By June 1940 Jupiter will have taken up its position in Taurus which it leaves at the end of May 1941. Herein is prospective benefit to Ireland and Palestine-there is some hope that after the excessively difficult period these two countries will pass through in the near future, peace and order may be restored to them. Then, at the end of May 1941, Jupiter enters Gemini to leave there late in June 1942. The U.S.A. will be so much the better for this Geminian position of Jupiter; Holland (and, incidentally, Scotland) will feel the power of his beneficent rays while he remains in Cancer. Unfortunately the more dominant planetary influences at the present time are all antagonistic to the sustaining rays of Jupiter.

Mars is a comparatively quick-moving planet : its revolution round the Sun does not take so very much longer than the annual revolution of the Earth. Consequently, it rapidly flits from Sign to Sign. Nevertheless, it serves to stir up turmoil and strife in various parts of the Earth as it passes from Sign to Sign according to the Nations governed by those Signs.

The position of Mars has a very special interest to astrologers at the present time. In June and July 1939 it is almost stationary in the first few degrees of Aquarius: here again is a disruptive radiation which will help to intensify the great and almost final crisis in world affairs which is scheduled for a date approximately about July this year.

the left nostril to capacity and then, without pausing, sends the air out through the right nostril, closing the left one as he does so. Once again he inhales through the right nostril and ejects through the left.

Practise this exercise three to five times, four times a day—upon rising, during mid-day, in the evening and before retiring for the night. The Yogis of India and Thibet practise Pranayama at dawn, mid-day, evening and at midnight. I suggest the former times for students of the West, knowing that Eastern discipline is perhaps a little too much to ask of them.

The next two steps for the student to master are called Pratyahara and Dharana. What do they mean? In the literal sense Pratyahara means gathering towards oneself, or more explicity controlling the functions and behaviour of the mind, similar to a person who throws off suffering by denying it, or by mentally suggesting that he is not suffering. Fixing the mind on the lotus of the heart, or on the centre of the head—that is what is called Dharana. You reach Dharana by meditation.

The Last Steps

The last two steps or paths the student must reach in fulfilling the principles of Raja Yoga are Dhyana and Samadhi. If you can fix the mind on one centre for twelve seconds that is called a Dharana; twelve such Dharanas will be a Dhyana, and twelve Dhyanas, will be a Samadhi. To practise Dhyana, sit straight, and look at the tip of your nose. Later on you will come to know how that concentrates the mind, how by controlling the two optic nerves one advances towards the control of the arc of reaction and so on to the control of the will.

Swami Vivekananda once said in one of his lectures, "Samadhi is the property of every human being—nay, every animal. From the lowest animal to the highest angelic being, some time or the other one will have to come to that state, and then, and then alone, will

religion begin for him.

"And all this time, what are we doing? We are only struggling towards that stage; there is now no difference between us and those who have no religion, because we have had no experience. What is concentration good for, save to bring us to this experience? Each one of the steps to attain this Samadhi has been reasoned out, properly adjusted, scientifically organised, and, when faithfully practised, will surely lead us to the desired end. Then will all sorrows cease, all miseries vanish; the seeds of actions will be burned, and the soul will be free for ever."
