CANADA'S LATE PRIME MINISTER

A "Practicing Spiritualist"

Time magazine's, October 23rd edition, published a full column about the late Mackenzie King and drew attention to a startling footnote taken from the *Ottawa Citizen* which specifically states that Canada's Prime Minister was a "Practicing Spiritualist," who believed that his dead mother helped him with advice from the Spirit World.

As evidence, the oil painting (see photograph this page) in King's study must have been quite an inspiration because, as the article points out: "Whenever the Prime Minister was confronted with particular knotty government problems to untangle, he would retire to the solitude of his study in the attic of Laurier House."

It was there before the portrait of his Mother, which was always softly lighted and graced with fresh flowers and a cross, that King, a Presbyterian, made most of his decisions.

Time's information was obtained by the *Ottawa Citizen* from Dowager Duchess of Hamilton. The Duchess was also an ardent Spiritualist herself and said that King fully appreciated the spiritual guidance he received, not only through his own instrumentality, but through the instrumentality of British and American mediums.

The Duchess even goes on to say that he stood so high in Spiritualist circles that he often served as a go-between.

The *Time* clipping was submitted by Helen H. Behrans, Vincennes, Indiana, who wants me to define a "practicing Spiritualist." The answer could be: A "practicing Spiritualist" is one who goes to seances.

President, for McAree says: "On one of the last occasions when MacKenzie King dined out in Ottawa he remarked to his host about something which Franklin Roosevelt had said to him the other day.

Admitted he received spirit guidance

To further substantiate King's activities in the field of Spiritualism, an article written by J. V. McAree in the *Globe and Mail*, points out that the Prime Minister, before his passing, had actually talked with the spirit of F. D. R. and this means King, in the flesh, talked to the "dead" American 4th-term

"The host thinking this was a slip of the tongue remarked: 'Oh, you have been talking to President Truman?' Mr. King corrected his host and insisted he had been talking to the spirit of the late President Roosevelt and that they often had chats this way.

"An awkward silence ensued

for Mr. King was known to have been a life-long and practicing Presbyterian."

The original source for most of the above quotations was Fred Archer of London's *Psychic News* for his article started all these King news releases in Great Britain, Canada and finally the U. S. A.

What a story if it had all been aired while King was alive and in office but the Spiritualists seldom get a break of this kind any more than they did in the case of F. D. R. whose psychic experiences with a California medium parallel the Prime Minister's.

It was none other than Dr. J. E. Hett, Windsor, Canada, who was responsible for many of the seances King attended in the States.

Now back to the *Time* story where they mention the Duchess of Hamilton whose son, incidentally, is the present Duke of Hamilton and owner of the estate near Glasgow where Rudolph Hess landed in 1941.

Time said: "The Duchess went on to name some of the mediums King consulted in Britain and the U. S., and said that King stood so high in Spiritualist circles in both countries that he once served as an international go-between. An engraved gold watch given by Queen Victoria to John Brown 'in acknowledgement of benefits received from mediumship' had found its way to the U. S. (See photograph, Page 24).

as the intermediary to return the watch to England, where it was turned over to the London Spiritualist Alliance.

"There could be no doubt of King's faith in Spiritualist guidance," the Duchess insisted, "he tried constantly to 'see the vision.' His only reason for keeping his Spiritualist activities a secret was because 'in his official capacity he couldn't allow it to be too well known.'

"King's secret was indeed so well kept that his closest associates in Ottawa were unable, either to confirm or deny that he was a practicing Spiritualist. Some of them knew King attended seances in London and Paris, but attributed the curiosity to his religious nature and firm belief in life after death. None of them could say whether, in the privacy of his study, Mackenzie King actually tried to communicate with his dead mother or whether his Spiritualist experiments had any effect upon his conduct of the country's affairs."

The Duchess goes on to say: "Chances were that no one would ever know. The personal diaries which King kept every day and which might have shed light on the subject, were ordered destroyed after his death under the terms of Mackenzie King's will." (The Lincoln and Stanford cases all over again.)

Dr. Hett comments on this article: "My good friend, Mackenzie King was highly respected and honored all over the world. I must call your attention to the fact that there is one error in the article. John Brown was not the medium who

received the watch from Her Majesty, Queen Victoria. I often had the watch in my hands and was present when William T. Stead presented it to my good friend, Etta Wreidt.

"When the article was written, you will notice that they were not sure about it but I am positive that it was not Brown but Miss Eagle for when she died, she was childless and returned the watch to Queen Victoria who gave it to Stead with instructions to give it to the greatest medium in the world. In 1911, at Wimbledon, the watch was presented to my dear friend, Etta Wreidt."

In another article covering the whole affair, the *Toronto Star* closes by saying: "To what extent Mackenzie King's own psychic gifts were developed, the Duchess was not certain, but she knew that he based his belief very much on Spiritualism and always endeavored to 'see the vision.'

"How many other statesmen try to attune themselves to higher forces one cannot tell. That the world stands sorely in need of spirit guidance no one will deny."

While checking data contained in this article, a phone call from Dr. Hett also pointed out that he has had numerous conversations with King . . . the latest at Chesterfield Spiritualist Camp through a direct voice medium.

And so, it seems that ever since the first Spiritualist journal was published that the greatest stories about famous people being interested in spirit communication, seance if you will, never seem to get written, mainly because those in high places cannot seem to afford to be associated publicly with an unpopular truth.

And then, too, most of these people pass away without issuing a statement, particularly those who were more or less politically involved in world affairs. There can only be one reason for this. They, no doubt, felt and they had every right that if their public knew of their interest, it may have

caused them to be regarded, by the 99 percenters who don't believe, as a little "tetched" and thus they may be hampered in what they believed at that time to be more important — their career or their public work.

It all hinges on the ideas of people and what they think is important—a matter of spiritual values, which few truly great men possess.

And yet, they all come back and say: "Oh, I wish I had looked at things in a different

light." Very fine but it is too late. Would it be fair to call them "Spiritual cowards?"

Further evidence as to King's interest in Spiritualism is contained in a letter received from A. J. Pinard, 325 Besserer St., Ottawa,—"I've known for years that King was a Spiritualist as I obtained the information firsthand. Mrs. Wilder, now 70, the Montreal medium, told me she was engaged by King once a week all during the last war, and came to Ottawa just for that purpose. Mrs. Wilder was

Why I report my trips about the country where I visit Spiritualist Churches, centers, and conventions; and where I give addresses, trying to do my little bit to spread the “Gospel News” there is no death and that human personality survives the grave and can, under certain conditions, return to prove immortality.

Though I enjoy meeting people and having the opportunity to speak to crowds, the traveling and time spent away from the *Psychic Observer* office does cause me to work long hours to make up for my absence.

In September, we went by plane to Denver, Colorado, to attend the Convention of the Federation of Spiritualist Churches and Associations, Inc. of which the Rev. Billy Hill is president.

The Denver committee for arrangements was under the able direction of Dr. Lois B. Washburn. True to the breezy hospitality of the wide-open spaces of the west, all hosts greeted the guests with *open arms* and a spirit of comradeship unexcelled anywhere at anytime existed.

The convention was held in the Albany Hotel. The large ballroom was used for all services. The seating capacity was about 1500, and each meeting had full attendance.

It greatly encouraged me to meet people from North and South Dakota, Nebraska, Utah, Wyoming, Texas, Oklahoma, Minnesota, New Mexico, Oregon, Washington, and California as well as from the many other states which are usually represented at conventions.

There are relatively few Spiritualist Churches in some of the states of the mid-west, but the interest in psychic subjects is overwhelmingly great. Many who attended are subscribers to *Psychic Observer* and had read of the meeting.

I was delighted to see old Denver friends: Mr. and Mrs. Guy Emerson; William and Miss Irma Greenawalt, Pearl Ashbrook, and Mr. and Mrs. Allen J. Miller.

As I had not visited Denver before this trip, I enjoyed looking around the beautiful shops, hotels, and going to some of the famous restaurants. At a Denver landmark, *The Navarre*, Tremont and 18th Streets, we enjoyed Rocky Mountain trout. Few changes have been made in this historic spot which dates back to the early mining days of Colorado. If walls could speak, I daresay tall tales could be heard.

The famous Brown Palace Hotel is also unique. In many small shops, there are extravagant displays of Indian handicraft, beadwork, and jewelry.

For years I've ordered pascale celery from “*Those Green Brothers*” of Denver. Their nationally-known wholesale place is widely advertised in various magazines.

My good friends, Dr. and Mrs. Charles Rohlfing (Emma Roney) of St. Louis, motored to the convention. They had seen the gorgeous Rocky Mountain scenery and were especially anxious for me to gaze upon the majesty of these magnificent heights.

And so about 6 a. m. one morning, we set forth in their car and drove through Estes Park and Thompson Canyon. In a rustic building high up the side of the Rockies, we had a sunrise breakfast of ham and eggs.

I do not recall having seen a

nore glorious spectacle than the early morning bursting forth of that great ball of fire—the sun. These tremendous spectacles of nature make one fully appreciate the handiwork of the Creator. In fact, such experiences tend to puncture one's ego to the place of knowing that we are truly “*resting in everlasting arms.*”

My husband remained in Denver for the Federation banquet, but I had to leave for Chicago where the Rev. Anthony Camardo, pastor of the Liberal Psychic Science Church, 3449 Altgeld Street, extended me a signal honor by asking me to lecture at the formal opening of his new church.

Nothing could have afforded me greater pleasure because, amongst the Spiritualist mediums, *Tony* is one of my oldest friends.

In 1936, I recall how spell-bound I was when I heard him, while blindfolded, give out a volley of spirit messages in the Andrew Jackson Hotel, Nashville, Tennessee.

Such phenomena was then confounding to me, as, at that time, opportunities to witness demonstrations of mediumship were rare. Our friendship and business association throughout the years has always been most pleasant and satisfactory.

Several years ago, Tony gave me a solo clairvoyant reading. One little incident to prove spirit intelligence and identity etched itself in my memory.

The spirit of a lady named *E.W.* (full name given) asked him to thank me for the many

kindnesses I did for her late husband and her son.

Tony continued: "To prove herself, she describes a handsome vase which rests in a far corner. It is in the closet in the outer hall here. She says this vase occupied a prominent center space on a tall mantle in the front hall of her Louisville home."

The entire message was absolutely correct. Tony had never been in the Kentucky home hence he could not have explored any of the rooms.



over and knowing that Eddie Mackey has executive ability as well as fine mediumship and a host of friends, we realized that to schedule such a meeting would create a great interest in Spiritualism and would be of inestimable value to all Spiritualists everywhere.

Due credit must be given Mr. Mackey for the idea and also for the splendid work done by his committee on arrangements: Mr. and Mrs. Carl P. Decker, Myrtle Fisher, John Gallagher, Ernest Goodheart, Catherine Costely, Lilly Hibson, Margaret Price, Maude Robinson, Betty Sundquist and Anita Williams.

At the close of the last meeting, Mr Mackey invited Clifford Bias, James Laughton, Mamie and Ernie Schultz (who had motored from Philadelphia to attend the meetings) and Ralph and me to a little inti-

mediums and to thus obviously stimulate interest in Spiritualism.

My next scheduled lecture trip was to LeRoy, Illinois, to serve the J. T. & E. J. Crumbaugh Spiritualist Church. Here a *Revival Service* was held that extended from October 22nd to October 29th inclusive. My lecture was given October 26th.

To reach LeRoy, I went by plane to Peoria, Illinois, where I was met at the airport by Mrs. Charles Cunningham, wife of the pastor and several members of the church. LeRoy is a small town of less than 2,000 people. I arrived at night but like all Spiritualists, we had to sit about the table, drink coffee and have a snack. The entire conversation was about things concerning Spiritualism, mediumship, and various com-

munications which had been received.

My good friend, Dr. J. J. Carroll, Buffalo, N. Y., was one of the guest mediums, so after his seance, he joined the group and the conversation went on into the wee hours of the morning.

Never have I been so impressed with the great monument left to modern Spiritualism as I was by that of the Crumbaughs. During their lifetime, they were ardent Spiritualists and attended many seances. From the heaven world, they received amazingly accurate advice and suggestions about carrying on their material life, including the sales of property, etc.

Their young son was the guiding influence for this splendid advice and so, after having acquired quite a fortune, the Crumbaughs were told the time had come when plans must be made for the use of this money for the advancement of Spiritualism.

In their will specific directions for the building of a library and church edifice were outlined. Instructions also were given regarding the administration of the fortune and how it was to be handled thenceforth. One provision was that the Board of Trustees of the Crumbaugh Estate must include a Spiritualist. The library was established for the city of LeRoy but it was specifically stated that a Spiritualist church be permanently maintained.

An endowment, for salaries and maintenance, is derived from the various investments and properties of the Crumbaugh Estate. This endowment must also be used to keep in good repair the 14-room parsonage which occupies a large corner lot directly across from the Spiritualist church.

Throughout the day, visitors poured in from the surrounding towns and countryside. During the afternoon, I accompanied Ruth Duff Wilson, an active worker and member of the Crumbaugh Church, for a walk into the town.

Evidently, it was spirit guid-

ance, because rarely am I concerned over the inscriptions on monuments. However, from a distance, I saw at the end of the street, a tall bronze statue of an Indian. I asked Mrs. Wilson its significance and she told me that a well-known Spiritualist had given the park and statue to the city of LeRoy. She suggested we view the statue at close range.

For some reason, I felt I should copy the inscriptions that covered the four sides of this monument. The heading: "A Beautiful Road to Heaven via West's Precepts" is followed by a "Program Everyday."

This is the program laid down for the people of LeRoy: "Love and think of the Supreme Power. Control your temper. Try to keep cheerful. Do all the good you can. Be honest, truthful and temperate. Help the poor, needy and sick. Encourage the weak and timid. Make a specialty of trying to add to the happiness of someone today and all other days. Cultivate love, peace and harmony."

The philosophy continues: "Life is too short and time too valuable to waste in angry strife. Be slow to pass evil reports about your neighbors. Be diligent in searching for something good to say about others and when you find it, don't wait until they are dead, but say it

at once. When you find a person on the down-grade, don't kick him in the gutter but help him by kind words and acts to strive for better conditions. Try to scatter rays of sunshine and happiness along the pathway wherever you may be. Do good today; you may not be here tomorrow."

These admonishments are signed by S. H. West, said to be one of the greatest Spiritualist propagandists in the State of Illinois.

That evening, when we went to the crowded church, the first person I recognized was my good friend, Dr. Clifton Crosby whom I have known for many years. When I spoke to him, he introduced me to a very lovely, little lady and said: "This is a descendant of S. H. West who gave so much to LeRoy."

This revealed to me the reason for my interest in the statue in the park. I had made no specific plans for my address so I used the West precept as a keynote.

Mr. West also donated two very beautiful specimens of amazing precipitation phenomena done through the famous Bangs Sisters. One is a life-size picture of a young woman, Pansy, the guide who directed Mr. West through some sixty years of his ninety-year life.

The other is a splendid likeness of Abraham Lincoln, dressed in a white robe with stole. He was a member of an Inner Lodge who did earth-plane work. It is not surprising to be told that Mr. Lincoln carries on such work in the heaven world, as it is common knowledge that Nettie Colburn Maynard was the medium for seances held at the White House when he was president.

Several years ago, when the Lincoln papers were given to the Library of Congress, there was included one or two spirit messages Lincoln had received. A correspondent of *Psychic Observer* wrote about this so we sent for a photostatic copy of these spirit messages and we now have them in our files today.



We have been asked by numerous subscribers why, if we thought the pictures so outstanding, we should restrict their re-publication, and why they could not be released to the world promiscuously.


By "world," I suppose they mean all the newspapers and magazines in the land who have for scores of years, tried to make light of the case for Spiritualism.

Myrtle Grant, Champaign, Illinois; Gladys Cunningham, Darlene Reynolds, Ruth Duff Wilson, Clinton, Illinois; and Rev. Charles Cunningham.

Miss Reynolds is a young girl, about 17 years old. She is the niece of Mr. and Mrs. Lyle Phillips. Mr. Phillips is a trustee of the Crumbaugh Estate and also of the church. This young girl seems to be unfolding an extraordinary gift. When placed within a locked cage, trumpets and chairs can be seen to move about. It reminds me somewhat of the old-timers, the Eddy and Davenport Brothers.

When we returned to the parsonage after the service, a long table set for 15 was stretched out in the dining room. Many who had come great distances to visit us were

— CONCLUSION —

This concludes the tape recorded account of the Spiritualist propaganda meeting sponsored by the American Foundation for Psychic Research. Previous installments of the New York meeting will be found in December 10th and December 25th (1950) issues of this journal. The dramatic conclusion of the meetings was marked by the phenomenal clairvoyance of all three mediums standing before the audience — relaying messages from the spirit world. Bias speaking . . .

Mr. Bias: "I want to talk in here. I am in that vibration and I heard the name Barbara that comes to a man far back there Stand up, please! (Man stands up).

"I get the name of Mickavolitch or Mickovolitch, or something like that which I am not able to make out. There is a spirit standing by you who is wishing to send greetings back to you. You have a sister

in heaven. And I want to say that there is someone by the name of Adam. Do you know who that is? Yes, that is your grandfather. ('Correct,' shouts a man)

"Now, your mother is here on earth and your father also is on earth and I know this because your Grandfather Adam sends his blessing back to them. There is someone by the name of Lillian and another Louise who comes close to you.

(Bias here turns to another lady for a message).

"Here is a Fred. Is he an old sweetheart of yours? (Lady says 'No!') Well, he is a friend that you think a lot of. There is another lady a sweet little lady that comes close. What is your name? (speaking to the entity) Her name sounds like Anathasia. That is your grandmother. (Lady says yes.)

"A doctor, the name sounds like Bancroft is by your side. There is a message for you. It will be better for you as you have been rather discouraged lately to stay with the group; it is better to listen to those teachings and follow the advice of the teacher.

"This is not your year, Barbara. Next year will be a good year; but stay where you are. It is a time of growth. Tarry thou in Jerusalem

until that beard be grown. (Laughter).

(Mackey joins in here.)

Mackey: "A little dog came up to me. This little dog gives the impression that he is with someone. My own teacher, Dr. Stewart, tells me that this dog, by the name of Rex, is with Bob. Is there someone here by the name of Bob? (Voice of a lady could be indistinctly heard accepting the spirit.)

"Who is Dekka? Do you have someone in spirit by the name of Bob? (Lady says her father.) Who has red hair? (Reply, my brother) There is a Dorothy here too and a Ruth. All are reaching out to you.

"There is a little lady saying: 'Please speak for me, Mr. Mackey. I am Grandmother Morgan.' Who is Pat Casey? He is someone you know. All right; but Rex is growl-

ing all about here. All right Rex, be quiet and stand right here. (Great applause.)

(Laughton immediately begins to give a message.)

Laughton: "Right here there is a lady who speaks to me; also a young man who was speaking when Mr. Mackey was talking. What is your name? He gives a name that sounds like Thompson and is reaching, I believe, for his mother. Out in the audience right over there. (Laughton indicates to whom he is speaking.) Let me have your voice instead of just raising your hand, because people say that unless the messages are actually accepted, it does not prove anything.

"He is saying Mildred and his name sounds like Billy. His middle name being Manley. Manley Thompson. He is named after your father. Your father stands here. What is your name. Dad? He gives a name that sounds like Julius Manley. Was he a doctor? Was your mother's name Ida? (Lady's voice far back in the room says that all the names are right.)

"Well, they are here together. I have someone else calling and is speaking about someone belonging to your husband. Is he O. C. Thompson? (Lady says that is right) Was his name really Osolio? (Lady answers that it was: 'Oscola.' Great applause greeted this recognition.) He is now speaking either about your father or grandfather or someone he had a nickname for. What is it? Did he call somebody 'Digypopa'? (Lady says that is correct)

(Mr. Bias who evidently was in the same vibration as Laughton begins to speak at once and continues with the message.)

Mr. Bias: "Theo, Theo, Theophanus, is the name like that? (lady says Theophinius.) Is that Clara? (Voice of woman says: 'Yes') That name means 'Experience of God' derived from Theophany. You know, I am speaking for a sweet spirit whose name is Louise. (Voice says 'Yes') That is your mother in heaven and out of heaven she comes tonight to bring her blessing and love to her daughter.

"Here is someone else: Hello, Clare. (Lady corrects by saying Clarence.) That is what he calls you. (Yes) He is your brother. (Yes) He is saying something about furs. Was he connected with furs? Well, he is talking about that. Are you expecting some furs? (No.) You may look forward to Christmas. ☼

"Anyway, I say that he is bringing you his blessing. By your side there is someone by the name of Julie that comes close to you. You know, there is a condition that makes me ask if you have had something wrong with your tongue? (Lady says yes) You did have something? (Yes) Of course, all women have something wrong with their tongues. (Great applause followed indicating that those present agreed)

(Mackey immediately takes over:) Mackey: "I heard somebody calling as Mr. Bias was speaking. There

are many calling. Why there are thousands of spirit people here tonight. Someone is saying: 'This is Joe.' Then someone is saying 'Nelsworth,' or something like that. He is calling for someone who has the name; 'Odell.' (Lady answers: 'Here!') Will you stand up please. Yes, Odell, I reach a vibration of you brother Joe who is here. (Lady says he was a friend.) Was he killed in a fight? (Yes) That is the Joe who is here. He is calling out to you.

"Who is Oscar? Do you know

who Oscar is? Do you know who Inez is? There is a confused vibration here and many names calling you. Who is Grandmother Strand? (Woman says her mother-in-law) She is your mother-in-law; she is here with you.

"Then I heard someone calling the name of Neil. (Woman says he is her father.) Who is Thelma? (Lady says her mother-in-law.) Mother-in-law; my Lord, how many mother-in-laws did you have? (Great laughter) Would you know someone by the name of Nelson, William Nelson? (A man's voice confirms the name.) Then would you know one by the name of Noworth or something like that? (The lady gives the name *Nosworth*.) Well, that's near enough for me.

"They are all sending you their greetings and I leave you with that thought."

(Mackey barely finished when Laughton chimed in with the next message.)

Laughton: "I heard the voice of someone calling the name of Edith Van Lu, who was a doctor. He is calling to Edith Van Lu. (A hand is raised in the audience.) Don't just raise your hand; speak out your voice helps us get your vibration. The Doctor speaks to me and gives the name like McKurk. (A man and woman together affirm the name.) Can you understand? (Yes) He was a dentist. Yes, because he speaks to me about that and he is urging many to come.

"Now, I heard somebody right over your head saying: 'This is Ruby.' (Man says right) She is your sister who went to the spirit world through cancer, I believe, just a short time ago, but not very long ago. You know I heard her saying that she is all right now."

"I don't know, but I seem to be in touch with Edith. (Yes) Have you just come back from a trip way out West? (Yes, lady said) We are checking up now. Were you in Los Vegas? (Yes) Oh, I see. Well, did you win anything on the slot machines? (Yes, both said which caused great laughter by the audience.) I heard a spirit saying that you did not win much, just a few dollars.

"Did you take your earnings back to your boy? (Yes, to my son, woman replied.) You have two sons, one Arnold, the other Edwin. (Yes) All right, then I leave with you that message." (Bias now takes over)

Bias: "There is someone calling the name of Mary on this side of me. I hear the name of Benny. Where do I go with Anne? (Here,

woman calls.) Yes, and you have a Mary in heaven. There is another Mary that comes. There are two of them. Oh, wait, there is a John, a Charles and a Will that come together. (Yes)

"There is a doctor with you that is your teacher. She is speaking about a ring or some jewelry that belongs to her. She wants you to keep that in the family and desires to let you know that she is proud of you and happy to speak to you." (At this point, Mackey tunes in with another message.)

Mackey: "I speak to the man in front here and give him a word of encouragement. Someone said: 'I brought six people with me.' Six people now stand before me. Who are they? There is a Rita here, a Dorothy, a Bill, a Mary and a Margaret. (Lady says that is her name.) The whole gang is here and you know they say: 'We have Bill with us; we can't leave him out because he is the head of the gang.'

"They send their greetings to you and want you to take courage as they are all behind you. I leave that message with you because so many are speaking around here." (Laughton takes over)

Laughton: "Somebody is calling a name that sounds to me like 'Tennis,' who is asking for Kenneth. It is for someone over there that is Louise. (A woman calls out that that is right.) He is trying to reach you.

"I do not know, but I seem to be in touch with many Italian and Polish people because I hear all sorts of foreign names. If I can say this name, your mother had a very odd name. She is speaking here to me and I heard her calling what sounds to me like Bianca. Is that her first name? (Yes) Her second name is Montero. (Right, lady says) All right, Bianca Montero; I hear her speak that name.

"Your father is here. What is your name? He gives it which sounds like Vita. (Yes) That is close as I can catch it coming over the spirit wire. He speaks broken English to me; but he just wants to reach out and touch you with his message.

"Now someone is saying: 'This is Ed.' He is your husband. (Right) You know he is standing on one side and you have an old sweetheart that is standing on the other side. (Great applause) He says that he does not think I can get his name as it is a cracker-jack. All right, what is it? It sounds like Giuseppe (lady says that is right) Fine, now

I will leave that with you. (Much applause.)

Bias begins with the next: "I hear a name like Nota, Nota, and I want to go back there. Are you John? (Pointing out a man, Man says: 'yes'.) I want to talk to John. Do you know John that you have a father in the spirit world named Nota? Then there is another by the name of Netta or Netty who is for the lady with you. Are you together? (Yes) I do not hear all you say, anyway I have the name of 'Corner.' Were you a Corner? (Yes)

"I bring a blessing from Anna, your mother and your dad are in heaven. There is a Bishop, a man dressed in a Bishop's robe. I believe. He is Bishop what? (Answer was not clear as the voice was too far from the microphone.)

"Then there is another man who says he is far from being a Bishop. He is Grandpa Mike. (Yes) He is a good old wonderful man. You are worried about John. Is that your boy? (Yes) He is here in this world and you are concerned about his personal happiness.

"Of him, I am afraid that there is going to be a going around in circles; but your responsibility is to be his parents, to guide him, love him and guard him. Let him stand on his own feet and make his own decisions. That is what you have decided to do. You are praying for him but you are keeping hands off about his personal matters. You understand. (Yes)

Oh, wait, here is someone else, who gives the name of Frank. Is that it? (Lady confirms this) All back in the days gone by. He was your old sweetheart was he not at the time you met John? (Lady says 'yes' which caused much laughter.) He is here and he tells me that he went out of this life in a tragic way. I see water, water, water all around me. He was drowned. (Lady says that is right.) He is glad though to come back to say: 'I am living still,' and he wishes you both well.

"And I know John, that you wish him well, too. (More laughter) You keep track of time in connection with him. Ah, he is telling me something now. He tells me that you have his watch. Have you got it now? (John's answer to the medium's question was not recorded for it was lost in the great laughter.)

(As soon as the laughter subsided, Laughton immediately began.)

Laughton: "Someone is calling a name, another odd name and I have got my good hearing aid on tonight.

The name sounds like Pepso, Pepso. (Lady could be heard saying, 'Oh!')

That is over here. Is that Elso, Elsa, is it? (Yes) Well, that is a very odd name and he is trying to reach you. I heard someone saying uncle with a name that sounds like Ludwig. You understand? (Yes)

"Then I heard someone else. What is your name? It sounds like Grandpa and Grandma Cramer who are here. Do you know, I hear bells like Christmas ones ringing. It seems that I vibrate with you as though you always had a sad memory at Christmas and New Years. (Lady starts to explain)

"Don't tell me lady, let me tell you. That is what we are here for. But must tell you what they are telling me that you had a brother, Ernest, who. I believe, they brought to you on Christmas Eve."

(At this point, the tape ended before the complete message was recorded, however the medium said that he was told by a woman in spirit who was German that she was persecuted as a psychic in Germany, even put in prison during the reign of the Kaiser. (Bias again)

Bias: "There is another spirit here who says she is Aunt Eny. Well, she went to heaven in the summer time, July, 1949. ('Wonderful and correct,' lady said who was receiving the message.) She is sending her greeting to you. There is a Bill. That is your boy. The father is William. You know, he is away from here, way up North. He is up at Cape Cod. (Lady says that is right.) He has established a great laboratory for scientific research. The spirit people are proud of him and are happy, happy indeed.

"Oh, wait, there is someone else standing by my side. Oh, my guide is telling me that you have in your possession a little container, like a little box, a little possession of some kind. In that there is something that is very precious to you. (Lady says, 'yes,' that is very true.) You do not have that with you tonight, do you? (Lady says no, but . . .) I know that in your home there is a little box and in that box, I count one, two, three, four, four letters. ('Oh,' lady says, 'that is marvelous.')

"These four letters are from a man, a man that you loved in a spiritual sense; a man whom you admired; a man whom you corresponded when he was in this life. That man stands by my side here to greet you.

"He is very glad that you have carried those four letters in that special box as something very pre-

ious. He is now greeting us all as the author of the Betty books: 'Stewart Edward White.' (Great and prolonged applause when this message was acknowledged.)

(Mackey also hearing the same spirit picks up Bias' message.)

Mackey: "I heard a voice call out as I was listening to the wonderful message from that great soul, Stewart Edward White, and saw a group of people. One of the group says: 'I wish you would speak to my mother who wants so badly to hear from me.' Someone by the name of Wally is being called. Right down at the back, I saw a star and I mean really a star because your boy earned a gold star for you.

"He says: 'Mother, Dad, July, I am here.' Tonight your boy, Wally, comes. It seems to me that he is in uniform of an aviator who went down over Burma. That star is his gold star. He says: 'Do you know who I have brought with me tonight? I have brought the man who was the captain of the plane.' What is his name? Captain Beford, who is here tonight in the spirit world coming to you. (Acknowledged)

"There are a host of people present. There is a Carbata coming through here. Then, there is a Greta reaching forth and a Constantina who is your mother. (Lady says father.) Your father sends you his greetings. Then I heard what sounds like the concertina. Do you recognize that? (Lady confirms that her father played the concertina.) He did? He plays it again tonight because he is so happy you are here. And he says: 'I go with you all the time, Greta, when you go to see Wally.'

"Is that Wally ...Paul? (That's right, Lady says.) That is a little baby, Wally's son whom he never saw. He sends his greetings to Josephine, his wife. She is married again, he says. (Yes). Oh, is she? Yes, she is married to one named John and they are so happy.

"He also says: 'Do you know who is with me tonight? He is an old friend.' What is his name Wally? Charley Goldsman. (Although words were not distinct, evidently the party recognized the spirit.) He is welcome. Wally says that Charley Goldsman went down over the North Sea. (Right) He went down over Africa, he says, Burma. We are all together now, he tells me and he is often standing beside you.

"Oh, yes, do you know someone by the name of Jude? Is that John's brother? Judd, there is a Judd here. (That is Bud, Bud, lady says) Oh, Bud, that is John's brother. He

is speaking to you. He says that often we come and stand by you as you go into the house.

"I have never been to your house but 'there on a rack on the wall you have all of my things,' Wally says. You have a rack with his pipe and other things on it. His smoking pipe is there. He says: 'You go there and touch these things. I want you to keep them there because I am always with you. Thank you friends.' (Great applause.)

(Mackey now took the floor to close the meeting.)

Mackey: "We will close the meeting with a prayer. Let us all rise.

"O, Heavenly Father, Father of the Universe, for these things we have done do we thank Thee. We have only been the instruments of

Thy power and because faith tonight has entered into this room, we have done the things that You said we would do. For all the angels that have not been spoken for, but who are here tonight, may we have their blessing and may their children and their children's children have your blessing now and forever in the name of Spirit Communication. Amen. We thank you all."

At the close of this great meeting, there was intense excitement among the people as they exchanged views with each other about what they had heard and seen. These impressive and objective forms of psychic phenomena, when broken down by critical and exhaustive analysis, lead to the discovery of a priceless universal truth.

The mediumship of these valiant workers left them with no other course but to enter the field of Spiritualism. In a short time, they were invited to speak at several Chicago Spiritualist churches where they met Rev. Marie Von Neily and Otto Von Bourg, the latter having just arrived from Switzerland. For years, Otto was featured at Lily Dale Assembly.

While in Illinois, the Van Duyzers met a lawyer by the name of Wilcox who was the founder of the Mission of Love Church organization. Mr. Wilcox invited them to serve one of

his churches in Aurora, Illinois, where Rev. Anna Kness was pastor.

It was while serving with Mr. Wilcox that the Van Duyzers met Rev. Anthony Camardo, who was, at that time, a student of Spiritualism whereas today he is an outstanding lecturer, teacher and mental medium conducting services in Chicago's new Liberal Psychic Science Church.




