

# HOW IT FELT WHEN THIS SPIRIT WALKED UP AND DOWN MY BACK

During the past two years, members of the American Foundation for Psychic Research have been privileged to witness first-hand, outstanding demonstrations of various phases of physical and mental mediumship under reasonable test conditions.

Those who have followed the reports of these seances in *Psychic Observer* during that time are familiar with the type of work attempted and the modest success of these experiments.

On a number of occasions the mediums, after becoming familiar with the motives and seri-

ousness of the members, permitted all in attendance many privileges—tests seldom accorded those witnessing demonstrations of this nature.

The photographs of these phenomena previously published in this journal have created worldwide attention. Many of these pictures include rare photographs of materialization and some, by special request, have been republished in English Spiritualist journals. Two of the pictures taken when these splendid mediums served the A. F. P. R. last fall have already been published in November 10th edition. Both photographs have been gazed upon by a few, with the usual uplifted eyebrow. Others eyed them disdainfully with a natural smug complacency. Although many of these good people class themselves as Spiritualists, they emit an air of aloofness and claim the pictures are just too good and consequently do not recognize their import.

Like other reports, this article will conclude with the usual long list of names and addresses of those who were there; those who attended many of the seances held by these two outstanding physical mediums — Maude Kline and Bertie Candler.

Each of the pictures published in this issue, see Pages 12 and 13, are accompanied with lengthy explanations.

It is impossible to cover what actually occurred in all the twenty-two seances held by these two mediums during their stay at the A. F. P. R. and so, this report will only include the highlights as viewed firsthand. Even so, the greater portion of this edition has been set aside for that purpose.


For the demonstrations of materialization, Maude Kline was cabinet attendant whilst Bertie Lilly Candler served as the medium. Anyone knows that the results are uusually enhanced when the combined forces of two powerful mediums are used in the same seance by the spirit operators and chemists.

Each afternoon and evening, before the materialization seances were held, Maude Kline demonstrated her rare phases of blindfold billet, independent voice and traveling clairvoyance for which she is internationally known and those who have witnessed these demonstrations of late can vouch for the fact that all of her message work is outstanding. Aside from the billet being read by Mayflower, Miss Kline's spirit collaborator, an unmistakable independent voice can be heard. These voices are usually spirit friends of one or the other of the sitters whereas in former years, the spirit voice manifesting in this manner was usually Mayflower.

These independent voices are not just whispers. The male and female personalities are often are placed upon the table and throughout the entire series of seances, no billet remained unanswered. Maude has been known to average the reading of one billet per minute—sixty in one hour on many occasions.

During the Candler materialization seances, noted personalities manifested: *F. Homer Curtiss*, the late writer and publisher, Washington, D. C.; *Mary Baker Eddy*, whose plaintive message literally stirred the hearts of all present; *B. F. Austin*, noted Spiritualist auth-

able to make themselves heard the length of the room, in some instances twenty feet. These voices are definitely apart from the instrument in the sense that the origin of the voice seems to be always to the left and above the medium's head—at a distance of perhaps three or four feet.

On numerous occasions, these voices have been actually recognized. And when expressing themselves they not only utter endearing phrases but also transmit evidence of a convincing nature.

In all cases, the blindfold is securely tied before the billets or, editor and medium, whose works are classics in our field; *Elizabeth Harlow Goetz*, former trustee of the National Spiritualist Association whose message, although of a personal nature, carried with it a tone of sincerity and a plea for greater tolerance among those of authority in our Movement; and a host of others.

Many commented upon the philosophy of *Howard Candler*, the medium's brother and principal spirit collaborator. Of course, Silver Leaf, Bertie's cabinet guide is in a class by herself.

We were perfectly satisfied that nothing was concealed on her person or within the clothing. She carried nothing into the cabinet, not even a purse.

## Statement No. 2: Room Examined

We, the undersigned, thoroughly examined the seance room located on the garden floor, 12 East Fourth Street, Jamestown, New York, and found the doors nailed shut and covered with black cambric, securely tacked. The doors were covered with weather stripping. The windows, nailed shut, were also covered with weather stripping and secured with bolts. There are no trap doors under the rng. No one can enter the room except through one door used for both an entrance and exit. This door is at the opposite end of the room from the medium's cabinet.

In the seance room, the heavily lined maroon brocaded drapes and the black cambric over the doors were examined. A black sateen curtain was stretched across a corner of the room diagonally to form a dark cabinet and we found no pockets anywhere; nothing was concealed in the room. The plain chair used by the medium was also examined. The cables and wires leading to air conditioner, lamps and electric record player were carefully checked.

## **Room Examination**

Before any of the seances begin, those in attendance are asked to examine the room. This is a "must" for the reason that every seance held at the American Foundation For Psychic Research, Inc., is a unit unto itself. Those who decline are respectfully told that in order to remain this request must be adhered to.

There is a reason for this. Only one person attending these seances the audience were asked to volunteer,--their duty being to examine the mediums.

## Photographs

## Explaimed

PHOTOGRAPH NO. 1: (See Page 12)

This picture shows both mediums entranced sitting before the cabinet, two of the trumpets levitated high above their heads. Note the veil of ectoplasm, half covering the head of Maude Kline. In some instances, the ectoplasm is shown extended from the medium to the trumpets.

In this instance, the force holding the trumpet in midair, did not photograph simply because ectoplasm properly understood is not a thing; it is a condition through which and

with which the spirit operators are able to manipulate at will depending upon the degree of power with which they have to work.

PHOTOGRAPH NO. 2: Published in November 10th edition of this journal, this picture created all sorts of comment. When viewing the original glossy prints of this photograph, the ectoplasm has the appearance of isinglass. According to Webster's dictionary, isinglass has the appearance of being transparent and whitish. Inasmuch as ectoplasm can be defined as a condition, it follows that it could manifest (be seen) in various conditions. For this reason, no group, whether they be "dyed-in-thewool" Spiritualists or so-called authorities on the subject, should ever get it in their heads that they know anything about the condition or form in which this life-force should manifest.

For the benefit of those who may think that this photograph is not authentic, they must first take into consideration the fact that the medium. Bertie Candler, entered the cabinet clothed only in a bathrobe and that billows of ectoplasm such as are photographed, could never, by the wildest imagination, be secreted upon any medium.

This photograph of a nun, materialized, shows only a chain around her neck. Before and after the picture was taken, not only a chain but a cross was also plainly visible.

Incidentally, the timing of this picture was miscalculated. It should have been snapped about thirty seconds earlier when the far - reaches of the ectoplasm extended an additional four to five feet out in the room.

**PHOTOGRAPH NO. 3:** Shows Maude Kline seated in a rather awkward position so much so that it would be a physical impossibility for her to actually create such a picture.

When this photograph was first printed, one of our armchair critics complained that her right foot was braced under the little "lead"<sup>†</sup> lamb. A fine brace were it made of lead and nailed to the floor but it is made only of wool and cotton. The critic also states that she cannot understand why there is a knot at the end of the one trumpet and why the trumpets had to be tied together. Anyone can see that the "KNOT" does not encircle the top trumpet whatsoever. Possibly, this lady owns a "seeing-eye" dog.

## PHOTOGRAPH NO. 4: (See Page 13)

Bertie Lilly Candler entranced with the lower part of the ectoplasm around her shoulders extending to the trumpet. The other trumpet is definitely above, connected in no way. In this picture, the lamb is again an innocent bystander and can be, in no way, accused of taking part in the seance.

It is strange, but true, that many are willing to accept the mental phases of mediumship as genuine whereas these same persons will condemn the objective forms. There are others

who insist that no matter how splendid the phenomena appears, even when photographed, yet it just cannot be true. They follow with charges based only on opinion that the phenomena simply must have been conjured up fraudulently, forgetting that those who attended this seance; those who supervised the procedure; and the mediums who gave of their physical bodies to carry on this type of work,-ALL have just as good reputations for honesty and integrity as do the critics who heckle and find fault. In many cases their reputations for fair dealing are far superior to those who condemn - especially those who were not even. there.

PHOTOGRAPH NO. 5: Shows the same nun as in Photograph No. 2, taken about two minutes carlier. Maude Kline to the left was being told to stand back to allow room for the expanse of ectoplasm. Note also that the nun's face is completely covered with etheric substance whereas in Picture No. 2, the condition is somewhat cleared from her face.

PHOTOGRAPH NO. 6: Shows the same materialized nun receiving instructions from Maude Kline, left and Juliette Ewing Pressing, right, that she is about to have her picture taken and that she has nothing to fear. With this assurance, Fhotograph No. 2 was made possible.

Few realize the uncertainty with which a materialized form enters into experiments of this kind. They are not always sure of results. Some are timid. Others apprehensive—knowing that no matter how successful they may be, their medium will have to suffer criticism.

In fact, one of our correspondents has already complained that the ectoplasm in Photograph No. 2 is chiffon. This woman also refers to the selvage edges and then goes on to say: "I will swear to this." —and she was not there!

It appears that people will "swear" to things they have never seen. Not only does this woman "swear" but says the materialized form is obviously the medium—claiming she can see a vacant chair in the background of Photograph No. 2, (CCNTINUED ON PAGE 5)

whereas that chair isn't in the cabinet at all but is the chair in which Maude Kline, as cabinet attendant, sat before she was told to step back. Mrs. Candler sat on another chair back of the curtain!

It is just such people that go on "swearing" and "swearing" and not knowing what they are "swearing" about.

PHOTOGRAPH NO. 7: This is the result obtained when a personal request was made. 1 asked to be privileged to have a materialized form walk over me. Again, this picture was snapped too late because I definitely remember, and this is substantiated by all sitters, that I was entirely covered by ectoplasm whilst the materialized spirit, Silver Leaf, who incidentally is at least six inches shorter than the nun, walked over me. Not only over me, but up and down the length of my back several times so that I could report the sensation. (See page 1.)

The impression of sensation is difficult to explain. It was as if the lamb, standing to the right, were taken in hand and its legs pressed, one after the other as in steps, up and down my back. Nothing more. Nothing less.

All present swear, and they were there, that Silver Leaf did, indeed, walk the length of my body.

We were unprepared for a certain feature in this picture. The billows of ectoplasm, the source of which is out of the range of the camera, exuded from medium Maude Kline, the lower portion of whose body is photograped. This may account for the extreme amount of ectoplasm visible . . . all of which may have been necessary for the walking experiment.

Maybe, at some later date, the conditions will be such that a better picture of such an experiment can be taken. This is possibly the first time anyone has been photographed lying in front of the cabinet in an effort to find out just what it would be like to have a materialized spirit walk over them.

And what does this prove? Merely that no human could walk the length of anyone, step by step, and walk lightly, because the weight would have to be shifted at every second step, proving beyond a shadow of a doubt that no human had a part in the experiment and since there was no human, the medium is ruled out and the "weight-proof" stands as being a materialized spirit. When anyone has had a similar experience they will be qualified to differ. Until then, this record stands.

In the mass of correspondence received after Photograph No. 2 was published, one communicator states that he could explain it all away. When asked to do so in 1200 words, a letter was fired back stating that it would take 5,000 words because he wanted his criticism to be comprehensive. This only goes to show to what lengths a researcher will go to explain away something he has never seen.


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
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## For The Record

On Page 24, December 25th, 1950 Psychic Observer, three photographs appeared with the heading, "Bias' Perfect E.S.P. Score Under Test Conditions." The cut lines under the photographs explained how the eyes of Mr. Bias were taped, crisscross and that, over this tape, a black blindfold was tied.

The caption said that John Gordon Spalding vouched for the fact that the medium could not see under the blindfold. For making this statement, I have been taken to task by Mr. Spalding himself.

While Mr. Bias was preparing for this E. S. P. test, he called to persons in the audience, asking anyone to come forward to satisfy themselves that the blindfold was secure.

purposely invited Mr. Spalding to the rostrum because previously as the evening progressed, I learned of his extreme interest in this sort of thing.

The real reason for calling people to the rostrum is to have them verify the conditions. This is obvious. These people volunteer to act on behalf of the audience and, at no time, should they leave the rostrum until they are satisfied. The fact that nothing was said, it follows that the audience naturally assumes that they (those examining) have no fault to find.

And so, naturally, I was under the impression, after the evening demonstration was over, that Mr. Spalding was satisfied that the medium could not see and that is all I said in the caption of the article because it reads: "Regardless what anyone may say, no one can see under these conditions. Mr. Spalding vouched for that." If Mr. Spalding was not satisfied, why did he not say so at the time?

Furthermore, I did not say Mr. Spalding accepted the spirit hypothesis but to be fair, I may have implied it. Now I realize he feels otherwise but how was I to know, especially in view of the fact that several days after the meeting. October 21st to be exact, Mr. Spald-



ing wrote me: "I take this opportunity to say that I was present on both evenings of the Spiritual meetings held under the auspices of the American Foundation for Psychic Research at the Diplomat Hotel in this city and found the proceedings very interesting."

On the strength of his attitude during the meeting and the statement in his letter, the captions under the three pictures were written.

All of this happened before Mr. Spalding received a copy

of our story. Only then did I learn of his change of attitude because in his letter dated December 12th, 1950, he writes: "I have been furnished with a copy of he Psychic Observer, number 295, dated December 25, 1950. I note that in a series of three photographs in connection with a demonstration given by one 'Rev. Clifford L. Bias,' purported to be of extra-sensory perception, my picture appears as a witness. The printed statements in connection therewith point out that the witnesses

were satisfied with the conditions and also that I had vouched that regardless of what anyone may say, no one could see under the conditions imposed.

"Your printed statements are absolutely false wherein I am mentioned. You were present and never heard me make any such statement. There were also present other persons known. to me, whom, since your publication, I have questioned regarding any statment I may have made or what my actions might have implied.

"In no expression, nor by any action, did I convey the idea that I was satisfied with the conditions imposed nor vouch for anything, let alone the authenticity of the proceedings in the method of blindfold, card or billet readings. I was. as a matter of fact, very kind to your demonstrator by not expressing one way or another what my personal opinion in the matter might have been.

"Throughout the years, I have witnessed so-called psychic demonstrations. I have been very considerate wherein my expressions concerning these demonstrations might have an effect on a conscientious believer.

"Therefore, I must, in this instance, request that you immediately retract the statements you have made that I was in any way satisfied with the procedure or that I vouched for anything."

Immediately upon receipt of this letter, I wrote Mr. Spalding asking him to send to me the exact wording he desired for a retraction and was informed, in his letter to me dated January 2nd, that I should use excerpts taken from his letter dated December 12th.

In other words, he wishes me to say that he, "in no way, by word or action, stated or implied, did he vouch for the genuineness of the Bias demonstration."

During all the letter writing back and forth, after the article appeared, I received an answer to Mr. Spalding and this answer came from the man who wrote the article, Thomas F. Opie, a minister.

Mr. Opie is aware of the letter of objection Mr. Spalding wrote to me and in all fairness, his answer to Mr. Spalding must be published. Mr. Opie was also on the rostrum and at times just as close to the medium as was Mr. Spalding and is as qualified an observer from the standpoint of integrity and experience as anyone in the audience including Mr. Spalding. Mr. Opie feels that Mr. Spalding is entitled to his opinion: and that his actions are justifiable in the sense that, in all fairness, his position at this time should be explained.

However, Mr. Opie also feels that he, too, has a right to state his opinions and that these opinions are ably expressed and

own veracity, my own powers of observing objective reality, and my own ability to report what falls under my own preview.

"While this lecturer, hypnotist, consultant, etc., does not mention either me or my factual report of these sessions of the Foundation, he goes out of his way to say: 'Throughout the years I have witnessed so-called psychic demonstrations and to date I have not seen one single convincing one.' That is simply grotesque.

"What in the name of reason would this critic and gas-attacker expect to 'see' in a spiritual manifestation of this sort? Would he like to have a Spiritual minister and mental-physical medium such as the Rev. Clifford Bias, say, conjure up the whiskers of Moses of old? Would he have the medium reveal the Throne of God and have him.

vinced, he was certainly one of a very few skeptics, as the audience reacted, on the whole, as if they had caught a vision of Unseen Reality.

"Spalding was one of the 'witnesses' to the 'blind-folding' of the medium, on the occasion of the calling of the Extra-Sensory Perception cards, of Duke University fame. He now takes exception to Psychic Observer's statement, in its December 25th issue, that he was 'satisfied' that the blindfold was complete and that the medium could not 'see' the cards-all 25 of which he called rapidly without a miss.

"In my own report of this episode, I write this: 'I certify that he (Clifford Bias, the medium) could no more have "seen" the cards, had their "face" been turned his way, instead of vice versa, than the reader of these lines could waltz on his own eye-brows.' That statement J

The medium positively cannot see through his own sense of sight but, what Spalding either doesn't know or will not accept, is that a spirit, Sylvia, acts as Bias' eyes, sees the cards and simply tells Bias (clairaudiently) what they are. As simple as that.

Ints explanation is too much for those obsessed with magical ideas,—people who will not admit they are stumped. Although Spalding did not say he could duplicate the demonstration. If he could, there is nothing preventing him from hiring the Diplomat ball room and sending out circulars. Then he could hope 700 people would attend. If anyone showed up, he could ask two Spiritualists to come to the rostrum and superintend the ad-hesive tape and blind-fold placement over his eyes and then see what happens.

Rather than accept the spirit hypothesis, there will always be those who either condemn or present some far-fetched solu-tion which is usually harder to comprehend than the true

"I tell him and you and all comers, that I was completely convincedas were practically all of the seven hundred and fifty other persons present-judging from the amazing 'spirit' of the sessions themselves--from the 'reaction' to all this, since 'spirit' apparently means nothing to men like this attacker. They were, as a body, 'overwhelmingly sympathetic, convinced, inspired-the devotees and the non-Spiritualists as well,' as I expressed it in my own original appraisal of this demonstration.

"If John Gordon Spalding, lecturer and hypnotizer, was not conrepeat-and I will pose it against either the honesty, the sincerity, the ability to say what's-what of John Spalding, Sam Jones, John Doe, or any other individual who was there.

"Certainly John Spalding, whose picture was shown with the medium (see above) during this demonstration, made no protest that the man was 'not properly blindfolded'-and well so, for he would have been laughed at and ridiculed by practically every soul in the hall. If he was indeed 'not satisfied' as to the conditions, that was the time and the place to say so, since he was asked to volunteer and 'staged' witnessed all this. Could it be that he was 'deceived' by his own senses and yet did not have the courage to say so? I wonder.

"If any man on earth, with normal

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faculties and any modicum of integrity, could witness a blindfold of this sort and still hold that the medium 'could see,' could testify after-the-fact that there was reasonable doubt, one must only conclude that he was too stubborn to be convinced or else lacked the desire to accept what he was observing with his own eves.

"Now remember, this was no magician's show! This was no stageplay to 'fool' anybody (as I stated in the original report). Bias is not a 'magician'. He made no attempt to convince anybody of legerdemain. He was not out to 'entertain' an audience-nor to deceive the eve. He was out to make a demonstration that Unseen Intelligences were about, and that they aided him in a startling demonstration. This he did do-in spite of John Spalding or anybody anywhere to the contrary.

"I would suggest that Spalding himself call a public meeting in New York, paste two pieces of adhesive tape, criss-crossed over each eye, with a heavy black cloth covering both, turn himself into a bipedal professional clown, 'waltz over the stage on his stiff eye-brows' and then swallow himself and look out of his unhearing ears, bray a bit from time to time-and announce that the 'proceeds' from this little 'demonstration' would be devoted entirely to the Society for the Suppression of Knowledge.

"Mr. Spalding adduces a matter that ought further to be treated in a situation of this kind. He says that the Psychic Observer, 'in the few issues I have seen.' has a habit of 'taking exception to the magician and his methods.' As a newspaper reporter I have witnessed no end of 'magic.' I have seen magicians. professional, and magicians, amateur and casual. I have been fascinated by their slight-of-hand, their undisputed finesse at deceiving the eye and the ear-if not the rest of the physical senses. So doubtless have the publishers of this paper: And too, I have read carefully every issue of the Observer for a number of years. I have yet to read anything in its columns that would discredit any accepted magician.

"The magician's field and the medium's field are about as remote as any two realms of activity, thought or modus operandi. The magician is avowedly, honestly, admittedly out to "deceive" the eye or the ear. He makes this announcement to the world. His audience knows this to be the fact. They know they are

going to be 'fooled' and tricked, and duped-and deceived. That's what they are there for. And it is fun. It is mystery. It is fascinating.

"With the medium, the whole status quo is at variance with this set-up. He is not out to 'deceive' anybody. He is not in for 'fun,' tricks, sleight-of-hand or stageplay. If he were, the whole thing would be discredited. He would be 'outmagiced' by the magicians.

"Incidentally, I, myself, referred to the 'spirit-writing' on scores of cards contained in a basket during the billet-reading demonstration at Hotel Diplomat, as 'spiritually magical'. I hold to the term-and I defy Mr. Spalding or any avowed magician, hypnotist, lecturer any-

where, to duplicate this episode of the psychic, UNDER SIMILAR CONDITIONS.

"Here is something out of the realm of the physical, hence utterly foreign to the magician's art. That Mr. Magician, with his trunks of paraphernalia, can duplicate certain things done by the Spiritualist, does not discredit the medium. Nor should it discredit the magicianexcept when he protests that the Spiritualist's demonstrations are bogus.

"There are today millions of dollars of 'counterfeit' money 'floating around all over the lot. This stuff is obviously fake, in the appraisal of the expert. It does not in any way discredit Uncle Sam's official currency. It simply proves that there is something sound somewhere something worth 'copying'-in another form.

"That the magicians assay to 'reproduce' some of the demonstrations of the Spiritualist mediums, in no way wipes out the authenticity of the demonstration. It only takes another form. The great Houdini, earth's master-magician of them all, spent a great deal of time 'exposing,' as he thought, the works of mediums. He did nothing of the sort. He merely demonstrated that certain 'tricks' may be duplicated, under other aegis and under other methods.

"Spiritualism is here to stay. It is the fundamental basis of all life-physical, mental, spiritual. To undertake to belittle it, to discredit it, to 'fake' it, is unworthy of any open-minded person-and is to fly in the face of Absolute Reality -to defy God and to crucify the religious spirit."

The only difference between a Spiritualist publication and the publications opposing Spiritualism is that we try to print both sides of a controversy. I trust that in the future, when our mediums are attacked in other newspapers, we will be granted the same privilege. That is, to state our views and have these views printed verbatim. I should live so long.

## Meme, Meme, Tekel

As a result of the article written by Thomas F. Opie when he reported the Spiritualist services sponsored by the A. F. P. R. at the Diplomat Hotel, New York City, dozens of letters were received.

With but few exceptions, this article was considered one of the very best ever to appear in Psychic Observer. (Dec. 10, 1950.)

At no time, during my experience in the field of Spiritualism, at times when I had hoped outstanding writers could become interested in reporting services and seances, have I known anyone to be so en-(CONTINUED NEXT PAGE)

thused, especially after the first experience, as Mr. Opie.

And now, I note that in the "Letters To the Editors" column, there appears in "The Churchman," December, 1950 issue, an article, written by Mr. Opie, which carries the heading "Spirit Demonstration." It is rare, to say the least, that an apparent orthodox journal would publish it without a "P. S. comment."

The article reads: "Not long ago in the city of New York, this writer was witness to some startling phenomena. At the risk of being adjudged under a delusion, or even of being incapable of evaluating objective reality, I wish to tell 'Churchman' readers a few things about this experience.

"Two sessions of over two hours each were held under the auspices of the American Foundation for Psychic Research, which new organization has its headquarters at 10 East Fourth St., Jamestown, N. Y.

"Three Spiritualist ministers who were expert mediums were there. I am informed that there are over 2,000 Spiritualist churches and congregations in the United States, recognized under the Bill of Rights and functioning under terms of religious freedom.

"These mediums all gave addresses on the subject of a Spirit universe and each demonstrated mediumistic powers which convinced some 750 people, each evening, that they had been 'contacted' by Unseen Intelligences.

"One of these mediums, completely blind-folded 'called' every one of the 25 extra-sensory perception cards, of Duke University fame, without a single miss-and he has done it many times. But the most dramatic demonstration was the 'spirit-writing' episode.

"Scores of white correspondence cards were placed in a small wicker basket, with another such basket on top as a cov-When removed, fifty or er. more of these cards had 'writing' on them. I was on the stage during the process-and there wsa no 'magic' no 'slightof-hand' stuff.

"These three ordained ministers, of religion, are not magicians and they are not out to 'fool' anybody. I have two of these cards before me now. They contain idealistic, religious expressions of a high order and are 'decorated' with drawings, done under Spirit conditions. One was in Latin, and the medium does not know Latin. Another was written from right to left and has to be held before a mirror to be read.

"Well, the Bible has reference to 'spirit-writing' you know

-where 'a man's hand' appears, at the feast of Belshazzar, and wrote these words: 'Meme, mene, tekel, upharsin.' I challenge any linguist to 'translate' them-but a seer did 'interpret' them: 'Thou are weighed in the balance and art found wanting."

"This is just the way it is with millions of orthodox Christians,, outside a limited circle of convinced persons, who 'will not be convinced though one arose from the dead"."

The mediums referred to in Mr. Opie's article are Edward Mackey, James Laughton and Clifford Bias. The latter being responsible for the E. S. P. demonstration as well as the independent writing on cards.

## "Sir Oliver Lodgish"

Olive F. Marsh, Orleans, Massachusetts, thinks Sir Oliver Lodge was not only a great scientist but that he was a "greater man."

Her letter tells about the time her husband took her to hear Sir Oliver in 1918 when he lectured in a large auditorium at Springfield, Massachusetts.

"Memory of his words fail me," says Mrs. Marsh, "because it is hard to describe how delightfully 'Sir Oliver Lodgish' he became. His lofty presence on the rostrum was something to behold and that gleam in his eye pierced the very souls who listened breathlessly to the glad tidings-that those who passed away in the First World War, LIVE!

"I remember standing in line to greet this distinguished visitor and recall what the woman just ahead of me said: 'Oh, Sir Oliver, would you mind explaining all about relativity.' I can still see the consternation that spread over the pink and white cheeks as he answered: Some other time my dear, some other time'."


And this is just one of hundreds of experiences; many as yet unrelated-with a man who always said he knew nothing as compared with what there was to know.



now ready to do. Five years they have worked steadily, a five year program behind what they called an "Iron Curtain." Iron clad to the eyes of everything but God and the Spirit World. Today they are said to have the largest land army and the greatest underwater defense on earth.

Today they have this Western hemisphere, Northern and Southern America—you call it, yes, North and South America, surrounded outside your 12 mile limit by their infernal underwater boats, I believe you call them submarines. Just as sure as your men now are being backed off that peninsula of Korea, just so sure will your boys face again the hordes of the communistic group in another upset in Europe. Germany may be next, Yugoslavia, and don't forget that all

You will live as you have never lived before, you will have a world of oppression as you have never had before. You have a few months left and in those months, cling to the hand of your Heavenly Father and ask to be shown what you can do. You will have to forget all your

I spoke to this world about the atomic bomb and I said at that time that if man continued to harness the atom that he would bring into being an instrument that could destroy the entire planet. 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






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
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# CHURCH NEWS
