Arthur Ford Speaks...

EXTRACT FROM AN EASTER SERMON

For years, thousands have heard Arthur Ford speak. His scholarly lectures rank high in the field of Spiritualism. Here is an excerpt from a sermon he delivered one Easter morning: "The modern religionist should be profoundly grateful to the scientists for their service to religion. If you have ever read Burns' 'Tam O'Shanter,' you will realize in what a world of superstitious fears mankind has lived.

"Bells were first put into church steeples, not to call folk to worship but to scare the devils out of thunder-clouds: even the old cathedral bells of Eurone are inscribed with declarations of that purpose. The ancients hardly believed in God so much as they believed in malicious devils everywhere.

"Now, the Gospel removed the fear of these things from the first Christians; it made them aware of a conquering alliance with God, so that believers no longer shared the popular dread of devils.

"But so long as storms, pestilences, droughts and every form of evil were supposed to be the work of devils, even the Gospel could not dispel the general dread. Only new knowledge could do that. While Christianity at its best has removed the fear of devils. science has removed the fact of them as an oppressive weight on life.

"Today, we not only do not fear devils but we do not think of them at all. We have science to thank for our freedom. By this clear facing of facts and tracing of laws, science has lifted from man's soul an intolerable burden of misbeliefs and has cleansed religion of an oppressive mass of credulity. True religion never had a deadlier Joe than superstition and superstition has no deadlier foe than science.

"So, if today, we hold a worthier view of God, with no dark background of evil spirits and devils to harass and frighten us. it is due not only to the simple Gospel of the master whose victory over death we celebrate today, but also to the illumination of science that has banished the ancient dreads."

To the understanding of the Spiritualist, Easter, the anniversary of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, typifies spirit return to earth environs through the phenomenon of materialization.

Jesus realized that He was to be killed. He also knew that the disciples would not be strong enough in faith to continue His teachings unless He demonstrated over death.

The law-makers were told: "Destroy this temple but within three days I will raise it up
again," John 2-19. To prepare
the minds of His disciples for
His own return, He invited
Peter, James and John to accompany Him up into the
mountain where He went to
pray.

On this occasion, Jesus was transfigured before them; and

His face did shine as the sun and His raiment was white as the light. "And, behold, there appeared unto them Moses and Elias talking with him."

Then Peter answered and said unto Jesus: "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if thou wilt, let us make three tabernacles; one for thee, one for Moses and one for Elias."

While he yet spake behold a bright cloud overshadowed them; and behold, a voice out of the cloud which said: "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased, hear ye him."

But it was God's plan that the mission of Jesus Christ be known to the world.

On Sunday morning, three days after the crucifixion, Mary Magdalene, who loved Jesus devotedly, went to the tomb where His body was laid. To her great surprise she saw that the stone which had barred the way to the tomb had been rolled away. The body of Jesus was not there.

She ran to tell Peter and John what she found. They returned with her to see that what she said was true. They didn't know what to make of it, but, still afraid of the law, they went straight back to their homes. They evidently figured that they would be accused of stealing the body and would be arrested for interfering with the government.

But, Mary was so deeply grieved, she loitered about for a while, hoping for some solution

It was at this time, that she saw two angels sitting, one at the head and one at the feet, where Jesus had been. They asked her why she was crying and looking for Jesus amongst the dead, and reminded her of the prophecy of Jesus "Destroy

but He told her not to touch Him. "Touch Me not, for I am not yet ascended to My Father, but go to My brethren and say unto them, I ascend unto My Father and your Father and to My God and your God." John 20:17.

Mary Magdalene rushed to tell her friends. The news spread rapidly.

Many times Jesus appeared in His spirit form. Peter, James and John had seen Moses and Elias appear on the mountain so they were mentally prepared for the phenomenon of Jesus' appearance.

But, Thomas had to have conclusive proof by asking to

place his hand in the wound in his side before he could believe. This story of the Crucifixion and Resurrection is the foundation of all Christian Religion today.

The outstanding fact is—He came back.

He taught: "these things I do, greater shall ye do also." In the light of psychic science, we can understand the bright cloud that surrounded Jesus at the time of the transfiguration and materialization of Moses and Elias. In the seance room, bright clouds of ectoplasm gather when spirit materialization takes place.

We can understand how the stone could have been rolled away because in the seance room, we have seen solid objects dematerialized and taken away.

In the light of psychic science, we can also understand how the body could have been taken away, because we have seen birds and animals dematerilaized and brought into the seance room, fully materialized.

If an object or live animal can be dematerialized, if the spirit collaborators do not choose to re-materialize the object into its original form, I should think it plausible that the chemical elements could be released into space, such was probably the case when Jesus' body disappeared.

Jesus' spirit appearances were always in the dusk or dawn.

In the light of knowledge gained through experience in the seance room, we know that the spirit chemist guides request dim, red or blue light: Ectoplasm, drawn from a medium for demonstrational purposes, dissipates rapidly when subjected to light rays.

Hence the dusk and dawn were the times chosen by Jesus (CONTINUED PAGE 5, COL. 4)

Having been asked to write an article on Spiritualism, it would presumably be expected that I should start by saying whether I regard the subject as belonging to the category of Science, or of Religion. But, for me, the phenomena of Spiritualism are nothing more nor less than demonstrations of Laws of Nature, of which our Spirit Friends know how to make use.

This definition is largely substantiated by the phenomena in which Ectoplasm — a purely human emanation from the physical body-plays so large a part. I witnessed some years ago the ectoplasm exuding from the feet of that wonderful Austrian medium, Frau Silbert, form itself into the fingers of a hand, with which, guided by Frau Silbert's spirit control, Professor Nell, it manipulated the articles placed under the table and materialized them on the surface, etc.

But for enlightenment on the subject of Spiritualism, we recommend enquirers to study the conclusions of that ancient, learned, and much esteemed Roman advocate, Cicero, (B.C. 106). He, as may be remembered, wrote two treatises on the subject of Spiritualism entitled respectively "On the nature of the gods" (or, "Spirits and Divination").

In these works, his endeavor was, as he tells us, "to free himself from the reproach of partiality and to lay before his readers the opinions of various philosophers, the men might judge for themselves which were most consistent with the truth." For, as he says, "the manifest disagreement among the most learned on this subject creates doubts in those who imagine they have some certain knowledge of the subject."

So we see that the situation in B.C. 106 was much as it is today. There was no unanimity, either of belief or unbelief. Some learned men believed, and others disbelieved in Divination (known to us today is Spiritualism).

But, in his treatise on Divination, Cicero asserts, without any room for probability, that "as far as I know, there is no nation whatever, however polished and learned, or however barbarous and uncivilized, which does not believe it possible that future events may be indicated and understood and predicted by certain persons."

And he further affirms that he could "without hesitation declare that a single instance of presage and prediction, all the points of which are borne out by subsequent events, and that definitely and regularly, not casually and fortuitously, would suffice to compel an admission of the reality of Divination to all reasonable minds."

But, we may ask, if the fact of survival and the possibility of communion with those who have survived death, had always been known, why did it. need Cicero's advocacy in the first century B.C.? And why, in our twentieth century, does it still need the advocacy of our Spiritualist propagandists today?

We boldly affirm that this is because Science has not yet corroborated the beliefs of Spiritualism. It has been a misfortune for the cause of Spiritualism that the subject of a future life has been, in the past, in the hands mainly of the Churches, rather than of science.

The Churches, for their own disciplinary purposes, have hedged the subject of life beyond the grave, with conditions which have no validity as affecting the fundamental ques-

to appear before men. There is no such récord, but modern bright lighting differs greatly from the dim candle light of olden times. So even when spirit appeared and visited in the homes of friends and disciples, it must have been in a dim light.

And, too, in the light of psychic science, we can also understand why Jesus admonished Mary not to touch Him when He appeared in the garden. In the seance room a spirit who has not had experience in com-. ing back usually is quite weak at first. We are told not to touch the spirit unless they give us permission to do so.

The Spiritualist understands the Resurrection and can, with faith, based upon knowledge, follow and demonstrate the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Our spirit friends and relatives come back to prove "There Is No Death." He came back to prove Immortality to the world. Believe-Believe on Him.

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HEALING CENTER

Although thousands of books have been written on the subject of mediumship, there is much we can learn through continual experience, and these books have been written by men and women who spent up to 5J years in psychic research either as mediums or serious investigators.

Few there are, even those with a tremendous amount of first-hand knowledge, ever make a statement or allude to the fact that they considered themselves an authority on the subject.


Some find the study of physical mediumship most confusing and confounding; an elusive thing, even more so than mental mediumship.

Inasmuch as this article deals with trance control, and this can be classified as a phase of physical mediumship, it can be said. without hesitation, that in all the books and articles ever published, in none have the authors actually clarified the modus-operandi.

Since each trance medium is a law unto himself or herself the technique, about to be explained, applies only to Rev. Frederick Nicholson of Boston, Massachusetts, now living at Lily Dale, N. Y.

Not that other mediums greatly differ in their demonstration of this phase of mediumship but rather to show that the spirit collaborators usually operate through their mediums in a distinctive and unique manner.

Rev. Nicholson's principal



collaborator, Dr. John Bolby Hazelwood, told me, during a private sitting held at the American Foundation for Psychic Research, Inc., Jamestown, N. Y., that he has been in the spirit world for several hundred years, and that he was born in Melbourne, Australia.

After passing into spirit, Dr. Hazelwood selected his medium, Frederick Nicholson, only after years of experimentation. His

selection was made because of certain chemicalization latent in his intermediator's human body-a certain something he was able to work with because of the natural synchronization of his own spirit body with the etheric body of the medium. This was over 30 years ago.

Dr. Hazelwood told about the handicap under which he worked at that time. His selected medium, now known as

Rev. Nicholson, was only 24. He was a Baptist and Dr. Hazelwood was confronted with the problem of making his chosen medium conscious of the fact that he had, indeed, a work to do for the spirit world.

It all started in Providence, Rhode Island when Fred was "impressed" to go to a Spiritualist church with a friend. He told me he did not want to go and when I asked how he was impressed, he replied: "Well, I don't know. I went against my will and only to do my friend a favor."

When Fred arrived at the Spiritualist meeting, he had hardly entered the hall when the mental medium who was working pointed him out and told him things no one knew and above all, that he. a Baptist. was destined to work in the field of Spiritualism.

All of his animosity, all of his belligerance toward the subject seemed to vanish. according to Fred. after his experience with this medium. He said he felt lighthearted after a certain "current" came over him. An effect produced much as the connecting of live wires which cause light; a condition so to speak due to proper chemicalization, experienced when direct contact is made by a spirit through a medium,-whether it be mental or physical mediumship.

Hundreds have had this same experience; many say they knew something was going on within their very being; while others (CONTINUED ON PAGE 7)

tion "Has. Man, or has he not, a soul-body which survives the death of the physical body?"

That should be a question, not for theological argumentation, but for scientific investigation. Survival is either a fact, in accordance with a Law of Nature, or it has no validity as a belief.

Although the implications of Survival may be of theological importance, the fact of Survival. of physical death, is primarily of biological, physiological significance independently of creed or race or sex, or character.

Science and Religion have always been at loggerheads, and we suggest, as a hint for ardent propagandist Spiritualists today, that they should content themselves with the beliefs gained from personal experience, especially with the phenomena of Ectoplasm, that their Spiritualist experiences are primarily demonstrations of Laws of Nature, of which our Spirit Friends know how to make use. In short, Survival, the subject with which Spiritualism is concerned, is either in accordance with, and due to laws of Nature, or it has no validity as a belief.

And we may well take to heart Cicero's affirmation that "Belief in Survival has always been maintained by the greatest philosophers, poets, and by the wisest legislators who have framed constitutions and founded cities." And we feel inclined further to applaud his impatience when he exclaims "Knowing all this, must we wait until the very animals give their verdict?"

sense a certain spiritual upliftment. Few there are who have been able to put their finger on just what actually does transpire.

The Theosophists call it the "union of souls," the Reincarnationists call it "kindred souls," but the Spiritualists call it just plain "unfoldment of mediumship."

And this answers the question (at least in Fred's case): Do spirit guides select the mediums or do mediums select spirit guides?

During a sitting with Fred Nicholson, Dr. Hazelwood said and predicted that a member of the circle would definitely unfold objective clairvoyance and even direct-voice. When asked how he happened to make this statement, he replied: "It is difficult to tell." He was then asked: "Do you come to conclusions of this kind because of the color of the sitter's aura or what?"

He replied: "Yes, many times we can tell by this observation but in some instances, the proper chemicalization cannot always be discerned by a spirit."

And then Dr. Hazelwood continued: "Regardless of what we may think when we view the aura we always check with the spirit collaborators close to the sitter and in this way, we learn the phase of mediumship being stressed by the collaborator in respect to the medium who is sitting for spiritual unfold-

The perfection of Rev. Nicholson's trance can be discerned by anyone who is fortunate enough to have a private sitting with him. The ease in which Dr. Hazelwood entrances his medium is amazing. The controlling spirit's characteristics manifest, the twirling of a moustache, which Rev. Nichalson does not have but which Dr. Hazelwood evidently possessed during his earth life, always makes the sitter know that it is, indeed, he.

During entrancement, many times Dr. Hazewood will direct his conversation to a spirit

standing by and on numerous occasions, even extend his hand as if to shake the hand of the spirit desiring recognition. In most instances, Dr. Hazelwood repeats what the spirit standing by him says. At no time, during all the years I have observed his mediumship, have I ever seen or known any other spirit entity to entrance him.

Many people ask: Since spirit language is thought, how can a spirit control talk to another spirit-talk in the way we understand conversation?

This is something I don't believe anyone will be able to answer until they are a spirit.

In giving predictions. Dr. Hazelwood explained that the modus-operandi was not difficult: "We see the causes or we

are told the causes. We merely repeat to you the effects," says Dr. Hazelwood. "It is our interpretation of the effects of certain causes wherein some of the errors lie and then, too, there is the time factor."

Since we are told that there is no time in spirit, our messages are sometimes repeated in these words: "two days or two years, etc., according to your time."

And so, there is much we have to learn. The more we learn, the less we know as compared with what there is to know. Many spirit guides differ, they are not perfect, but

each soul, whether in the body, is continually striving, or should toward perfection. After all, that is the real purpose of life for both spirit and mortal.

The Vagabond King

Correspondents have drawn our attention to a statement made by Rudolph Friml, composer of light opera (Rose Marie and Vagabond King.)

The clipping from Newsweek, submitted by Eric G. Hagen of New York City, quotes Friml, when he tried to explain how he wrote his music, as saying: "I sit down . . . and put my hands on the piano. And I let the spirit guide me! No, I never do the music, I never compose it, no, no, I am a tool, I am being used . . . it comes from someone, a spirit perhaps, using me so that when I go home at 2 A. M., I cannot sleep but must go to the piano and place my hands upon the keys and improvise."

The other clipping from the Washington Post, submitted by Rev. Alice W. Tindall, tells of an interview Bill Brinkley had with Friml. The interview refers to Friml's startling confession made to the Post reporter who describes the composer as a tiny elf of a man with sparkling eyes, wisp hair flying in all directions.

When the elf man was asked how he accounted for his talent, he quoted the words published in Newweek, except this journal left out the part where Friml says: "I play, play, play, never know what I am playing."

Of course, the researchers may call this secondary personality but whatever it is, the best answer seems to be spirit guidance. Anyhow Friml ought to know.

Ectoplasm in Canada

What is catalogued as "The First Recorded Evidence of Ectoplasm in Canada" was submitted recently. The statement reads: "The following episode relating to the first recorded production of ectoplasm, in

Canada, illustrates in a remarkable way the extent of knowledge available to certain determined spirit operators in intimate contact with material conditions, to bring about a successful manifestation of psychic power, as desired by a group of investigators.

"My attendance at the seance when this psychic phenomenon occurred and the reality of the materialized substance firmed by photographic print and further substantiated by the touch of several observers, was brought about in a unique manner, as subsequently revealed to me by J. D. Young, Winnepeg, Canada.

"It appears that at a previous sitting of the group a desire had been expressed to the Control collaborating for a tangible demonstration of "ectoplasm" in a form capable of being photographed. request met with a response that in attempting the experiment it would be necessary to add an additional member to the group in the person of a man having the name of Ernest Mann (204 Glenwood Crescent, Toronto 13, Canada.)

"At this particular juncture I was totally unknown to any of the sitters having only recently taken up residence in a remote suburb of Winnipeg. Evidently this fact did not deter the persistence of the spirit directing the search, for after many disappointing enquiries I was finally located and invited to participate at the seance. which proved so highly successful and marked a significant mile-stone in the progress of Psychic Research in Can-

Rhine Commits Himself

great responsibilities which confront investigators were gently but firmly placed on the shoulders of psychic researchers when Dr. J. B. Rhine, director of the Parapsychological Institute of Duke University, U. S. A., recently delivered the tenth Meyers Memorial lecture to the British Society for Psychical Research, London, England.

His comments came towards the end of his address, some of them in the form of challenging questions. Dr. Rhine said: "The Russians are right—if man is a materialist system." If man was only composed of matter then dictatorship was the logical sequence. The professor also wants to know what was going to happen to religion if it were found from researches that there was nothing spiritual in

Then there was freedom. Freedom was a very precious thing today, yet in psychology they had never dealt with it, nor could they say whether there was any true freedom in

Was that division where man could be a distinct unit from his body a real one, he wanted to know.

These issues, he said, were not things that could be fumbled with, neither did he think that we had all the time in the world to investigate them. This to greater endeavor brought the 55-year old professor from North Carolina applause.

At the commencement he had received a warm ovation. Speaking in a quiet confidential manner, he gave a commonsense discourse easy to understand. One felt that here was

not so much psychic researcher investigating human beings as a human being delving into psychic research.

His address, naturally comprised a resume of his work at Duke University, and after twenty years of laborious work he was of the opinion that "we may never know whether telepathy of the mind-to-mind type really occurs."

"Some of the evidence for pure clairvoyance did stand up," declared Rhine.

The Professor was at pains to explain that time after time he and his group of researchers had had to go right back to the beginning because of faulty approach work. In pointing a lesson to other researchers he impressed on them the necessity of conducting investigations without preconceived ideas, and he particularly stressed that they should avoid philosophical

On the question of survival. Rhine found himself up against two problems. The first was how to evaluate the results so that they could be objectively assessed in a way that they would have some scientific value.

The second was that he did not know whether the resultsand some of them were remarkable-could be accounted for by the faculties in the medium.

In asking the question, "Does a spirit survive death?" we were assuming that a body possessed a spirit. He thought this was the wrong approach and that the question should be put this way: "Was there something in man we called a spirit? If so, does it survive death?"

Then there was the difficulty that until you knew what spirit was like you did not know what experiments to devise. In the meantime, until proper experiments could be evolved. Rhine advocated an open mind and a readiness to investigate anything which appeared to be of a non-material origin.

"Keep in touch with philosophic and religious groups who claim to be practising things we are investigating, was his advice.

INDIVIDUAL, PERSONAL. ROAD TO: SPIRITUAL PHILOSOPHY

All Scientists Do Not Prove Many Attempt To Disprove

In the beginning, and won't you as a thinker agree, a basic truth must be found before that truth can be duplicated. And the first principle of attempting to understand and rule upon a truth is that the attempter attack his subject with honest frankness; an open mind; a mind that is not closed by false pride or prejudice.

Spiritualism, with its mediums and seances, has long been a controversial subject. It has remained so mainly because its investigators have lacked the courage of their convictions, or,

having courage, have been inept; blinded by a faint glimmer from a ray of truth but not the whole.

We human beings are inescapably meted from the measure that we invest. What we sow, we reap. We do so automatically, and irrevocably. If, then, we sow fear, ridicule and distrust, is it logical that we can expect to harvest other than fear, ridicule, and distrust?

An ingrained trait in the makeup of the human race is that we feel that we must ridicule anything that we do not understand. And we do so without making any attempt at understanding. We laugh in order to hide our lack of understanding. And, without understanding, we cannot accept anything of scope until we have a "world-shattering" personal experience; an experience which is to our eyes concrete proof.

However, the simple fact that most of us ignore is that we cannot have such an experience without effort and groundwork.

Scientists cannot prove or disprove an axiom by ignoring it or ridiculing it. In fact, the common concept of a scientific

attitude is in error. SCIENT-PROVE. ISTS DO NOT RATHER, THEY SET UP A HYPOTHETICAL AXIOM, AND ATTEMPT TO DIS-PROVE IT. If a Scientist cannot dislodge his theories by every available means of destruction, he realizes that he has a basic truth and can build up-

Spiritualism did not begin one hundred and three years ago with rappings by the Fox sisters at Hydesville. It did not begin in the mind of Britain's Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. the famed creator of Sherlock Holmes. Spiritualism was born

in the beginning of time. Its teachings are firmly rooted in every divine instrument. It teaches of laws placed for the use of men by GOD.

Many creeds say that the miracles produced by Spiritualist mediums are profanations of Jesus Christ. But from where did the truth of Christ come?

For countless vears. Christians have read our Divine instrument: The Bible. We have read and revered the passage:

"Verily, verily, I say unto you He that believeth on me The works that I do shall he also do

And even greater works than these

Shall he do: Because I go to my father.'

We have read those words of Christ from our Bible; read them and loved them, and yet, because of their utter simplicity, could not accept the truth therein.

We cannot swallow the bare truth as expressed so simply. But that truth is the basis for the Spiritualistic cult. Spiritualists accept this truth, they accept it to the limit of their own personal development.

Unfortunately, we Spiritualists have few mediums who claim to be true and equal emulaters of the teaching of Jesus Christ. For, being human, they are limited to the things that belong to humans. They make mistakes and are subject to their bodies the same as all of us.

We human beings have many failings. We are too ready to

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mistake the power of God for GOD. We mistake the laws, the love, and all else, that is of

God for GOD.

The philosophy of Spiritualism differentiates between them thusly: No one, nor any group, can know and describe GOD to another. If any of us profess to do so, we are professing wrongly. In every Divine instrument is the statement, "I AM THE LORD. THY GOD, BUT YE SHALL KNOW ME NOT.

How then is it possible for a man to describe that which he doesn't know? How can men attribute things to God, saying GOD is this or GOD is that? How can a tiny finite mind grasp something which is infinite? When GOD is given attributes. GOD is limited and therefore becomes finite, merely a picture of man's hopes, and ideals, and imaginative wishes.

COSMOPOLITAN'S article. THE HAPPY MEDIUM, was a gentle ridicule of Spiritualism: its seances and mediums. Because of the controversy of the subject such articles will continue to appear.

I do not mean this as an attack against either the article itself or the two authors personally. I am attacking the harm such superficial articles do the embryo thinker. The fellow who is just beginning to glimpse the fact that each of us must formulate his own individual and personal philosophy of life.

Such an article as THE HAPPY MEDIUM does almost no harm to Spiritualism as an exponent of religious thinking, but they do place a stumbling block in the path of the sincere seeker.

The student of metaphysics, knowing the motives behind most of our modern writing, knows that authors often take advantage of a controversial subject for the sake of the monctary reward. Such writings, presented in a supposedly popular vein, are often based upon a single phase of the subject and on incomplete, utterly surfacr-scratching research.

Would a scientist, or anyone,

attempt to ridicule a theory by looking at it from only one side? Can Spiritualism then be judged because of one seance and one particular medium? In order to evaluate a thing is it not wise to use every available fact, or even invent some?

Remember the statement, THERE MUST BE A BASIC TRUTH BEFORE THAT TRUTH CAN BE IMITATED? Certainly there are some hangers-on beyond Spiritualism's sanction. Mediumship in most of its forms has had many dabblers.

But, will not human beings dabble in every phase of life? Isn't a great deal of life an ugly shell when it is exposed? That is why this piece is entitled A ROAD TO AN INDIVIDUAL, SPIRITUAL PHILOSOPHY. We must learn that only what is personal is sacred. It is sacred because the individuality is the only thing that travels the eternity of life.

We laugh when comedians say: "You can't take it with you." But any thinker can easily see the truth therein. We can't, no man can. All but the spirit is dross; nothing but the soul moves in eternity. And mediums, being human, must develop their souls the same as the rest of us. They get no special dispensation just because they happen to have the sensitivity necessary for mediumship.

But all any honest examiner of Spiritualism needs to do in time of trial, is to get out his Bible and re-read the words of Christ, "-these things that I do ye shall also do, and greater things-"

Can we believe the words of Christ when mediums of today produce dis-carnate forms that walk and talk, normally and lucidly? Jesus called for Lazarus to quit his tomb and come forth. On Easter, Jesus himself arose from his death, and was seen and talked with AF-TER HE HAD PHYSICALLY DIED.

Christ walked upon water. Mediums levitate; i. e., lift solids without visible support. Jesus fed hundreds of people by asking for manna, and manna fell from the skies. Mediums produce apports, (Apports are gifts from another plane of life). There are many more examples of the things that Christ did and that mediums also do, or attempt. And both are performed through the power of GOD.

However, to the genuine student of metaphysics; the sincere seeker after a personal and individual philosophy of life, the phenomena or "miracles" of Spiritualism is not the sought-for result, and are therefore only of secondary importance.

By the phenomena and because of it, Spiritualism hopes to attract those who will in time rise above the contemplation of the phenomena and form for themselves an individual philosophy that can be depended upon and can help each man over the mountain-crags of life.

The philosophy that comes to a seeker after his study of Spiritualism, and its phenomena, is creedless. It is raceless and colorless; in fact, it recognizes no human barriers. It recognizes only the brotherhood of mankind, and is concerned only with that which is basic with all men: THE SEARCH FOR GOD.

The man with an individual spiritual philosophy is not concerned with wondering whether my conception of GOD is the same as his. He makes no attempt to describe GOD, realizing that a finite mind cannot define that which is infinite. He can therefore separate the power of God from GOD.

The man with an individual philosophy does not believe that his road is the only road. He knows that the road to a personal philosophy is filled with heartaches and disappointments, and jagged pitfalls. He will only

repeat the words of Jesus Christ: "—these things that I do ye shall also do, and greater things—" and will realize, like the scientist, that here is a possible basic truth.

Through association with mediums, learning their techniques and methods of seance-room operation: In fact, by an overall and sincere investigation of physical phenomena, the investigator is led by his consuming interest into a contemplation of the philosophy. It is a natural course of events, and is, of course, the aim of Spiritualism.

By finding answers to the how and why of the phenomena, the open-minded investigator is forced to dig deep into the philosophy. It may well be that a seeker will not find all of his personal answers within the confines of Spiritualism, but that is perfectly all right with the Spiritualist. Spiritualism's creed is the founding by each man of an individual spiritual philosophy, and the Spiritualist does not limit his scope by hard and fast rules.

The Spiritualist will honestly state that, while religion has a single goal, that goal may be reached by as many roads as there are people. His road is just one.

The foundation of the philosophy formed through Spiritualism will contain a knowledge of the trinity of body, the planes of life apart from GOD, and, the primary, but all important fact that there is no death; just interchangeable life. In passing through the change we call death, the spirit merely leaves the physical body and inhabits the second, etheric or astral body. The third body of the trinity is simply called the spiritual body.

Spiritualism removes fear by teaching that each of us is responsible for our own conduct on this, the initial, or "seed world" plane. Not being able to define GOD, Spiritualism does not depend upon theorizing that GOD is the judge, jury, and executioner for the human race.



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
