

"MY BABY LIVES" There was no pageantry of death

for little Tommy

It was early evening, when, through an accident, the Angel of Death suddenly descended into the midst of our family and snatched our darling baby boy. He was such a sweet little fellow, toddling through the house on his fat little legs, and his sunny smile and cute ways, wonthe hearts of everybody.

We never dreamed that when we started the day, before it closed, our little Tommy would be gone. He went so tragically and what is worse, his death was seemingly so unnecessary. In fact so much so that I, his maternal grandmother, cannot even now write about it without the hot tears scalding my cheeks. Because it is not important to this narrative, I will omit the unhappy details of Tommy's passing.

Now that I look back upon it, I cannot help but think it strange that just a few weeks before Tommy left us, my daughter (Tommy's mother) and I were walking by our family church, when she suddenly said: "Wait for me mother, I am going in and see the minister about baptizing Tommy."

"What do you want to do that for?" I asked. "Why not wait until Children's Day when all the other children are baptized and have Tommy baptized with them?"

"I cannot wait," she replied and left me in search of our minister. I shrugged my shoulders. If my daughter wanted to be in such a rush to baptize the baby, it was all right with me.

Later we talked about this incident: "Did she possibly have a premonition that the sands in little Tommy's life would soon run out? Somehow I believe this was the case. There was no pageantry of death for little Tommy. No funeral, no flowers, but there was the service of baptism. This comforted his grief stricken mother and father. And on that little grave, no beautiful and expensive floral pieces were left to wilt and die in the sun.

Instead the money, kind friends and neighbors wished to spend to express their sympathy, was put into a generous check which was sent to the cancer fund. This was done in the memory of little *Thomas Arba Clawson*.

Only those who have lost a tiny child suddenly can realize our grief. If his death had come as a natural result of sickness, it might have been easier to bear, but with the knowledge that, had a few seemingly minor things been different, our baby might be living today., He would be a little lad of three and a playmate for Billy who is not quite two years older. This was a cup of bitterness that was indeed hard to take.

Everyone was so kind to us. but it was the boys who had been soldiers in the recent World War that comforted us the most. They told us over and over again that when death is to come, it comes. There is nothing you can do about it.

It is as simple as that, and they told us many stories of the War that seemed to prove this hypothesis. All this comforted us, and may God bless them for their kindness and sympathy.

Another thing. I will never forget was the wonderful courage displayed by Tommy's mother. I went to see them early the next morning as they were attempting to eat their breakfast. For the sake of little Billy. Tommy's brother, they were endeavoring to act as if nothing out of the ordinary had happened.

can make a terrible mark on an older one. Grief can be very selfish and the aftermath of dramatic sorrow is not always good, but all this for the sake of little Billy was completely controlled.

It must have taken an iron will to do this, and I am sure that God Himself aided them in their emotional control. As a result of this, little Billy was spared experiencing the bitter sorrow that might be frightening to his little mind.

This proved wise for little Billy still talks with Tommy. We hear him when he is alone during the day and at night after we have put him to bed and strange as it may seem, this all seems perfectly natural and right.

Mrs. Brandt's guide, told us that she did not believe that Tommy could materialize until two or three years had elapsed. However, through the mediumship of Bertie Lily Candler and Fanchon Harwood. Tommy's father and I have been priviledged to see and talk with him. We know that he is well and happy, that his education is not neglected but is probably progressing far better and faster than our human minds can understand.

One of the greatest thrills of all occurred when I was priviledged to attend an apport seance through the mediumship of Gloria Taber at Jamestown, N. Y. Just two weeks previous, I had joined the American Foundation for Psychic Research, Inc., and as a member of this organization, was proviledged to witness this amazing demonstration.

Before the seance began, the

five of us who attended were seated on the patio in the rear of the Foundation. This is indeed a spot of natural beauty and restfulness. A lovely old apple tree stands a little off center, and around this the ground is covered with white concrete marked off into a flagstone pattern. Surrounding this are beautiful flowering shrubs and complete privacy is insured by a high walled fence.



Mrs. Pressing led us through a gate into an adjoining court yard. We passed through this yard, which was tastefully landscaped, into the medium's quarters. Here also is the famous seance room, which has been pictured so often in *Psychic Observer*.

When she stepped back into the cabinet to allow my dear daddy to take her place, he entered into a similar exchange of loving thoughts; complimenting me on the progression I was making in my spiritual work especially inspirational writing.

Next, I was expecting to see dad's sister and was a bit startled to have a "Frank" announce his name. He chided me for not knowing him at once. so I immediately called the full name of a second cousin of mine whom my dad was very fond; so much so that he tried to help Frank resist the weakness of excessive drinking. Not being able to respond to dad's help. Frank finally took his life. Dad and I had often wondered just how much he would have to pay as he travel d the road to progression, for he was a fine fellow when sober.

Next came a former minister of mine. Although he preached in a Universalist church, he was always deeply interested in Spiritualism. I know, because I shall never forget our talks on the subject.

I asked this minister if he had finished the book he was writing while on this plane and he said: "No. I have it only half finished, but am expecting you to go on where I left off."

A Critic Attacks Dickson's Mediumship Amy Marshall Answers . . .

It all started when a "Mr. Jones" informed Psychic Observer that J. J. Dickson, the California materialization medium, had been arrested and charged with fraud. Now read the facts of the case as told by Amy Marshall.

1763 34th Avenue, San Francisco, California, Januay 2nd, 1951

Dear Mr. Pressing:

Now that all the festivities of 1950 have passed, 1 can answer your letter of November 20, 1950, with which you enclosed a malicious note from someone, whose address was omitted, but who wrote as follows:

Oakland, Calif., Nov. 15, 1950 Dear Friends:

On the front page of your Oct 25th issue of the Psychic Observer you printed a picture of James J. Dickson and of a materialization.

In analyzing the picture I notice that the materialized figure of the man was a rather short fellow—about the size of Dickson.

You probably do not know, that Dickson was arrested several years ago in San Francisco, while giving a demonstration, and yards of phosphorescent gauze was found in the 'cabinet'' with him—and draped over him—was confiscated by the police and used as evidence (ngainst) him at his trial. He was found guilty and fined.

He is a charlatan and imposter. Yours very truly, J. A. Jones. After reading your letter and the enclosure. I thought "Of course, Mr. Pressing knows the facts in connection with that incident." but on further consideration decided that in case there there were details with which you were not altog ther familiar. you should certainly have them.

In the fifty-two eventful years that Rev. James J. Dickson has been lecturing and giving his public and private materializing seances. scientists. educators and professional men and women have been welcomed by him. and had the privilege of attending his private seances, that a more thorough appreciation of his work might be gained. And I believe that you will recall an article concerning his mediumship which appeared in the May 25, 1949 issue of Psychic Observer, contained a quotation from a letter received by Rev. Dickson from W. T. Stead, in

April, 1911, wherein this wellknown editor of the London "Review of Reviews" wrote "Would you be willing to come to England say for a couple of months to enable us to see what can be done and if so on what terms would you come. * * * Other equally great compliments have been received by Rev. Dickson, but modesty forbids disclosing them.

Because Rev. Dickson's materializing mediumship is so extraordinary, because psychic power of such stature is relatively uncommon, he is, and has been, singled out for attack. 1 know you realize, Mr. Pressing, that neither Rev. Dickson, his Church members and followers, nor I, are disturbed over letters such as you forwarded to me. I know that I speak for all when I say our wish is that the whole world might have had the opportunity which has been ours these many years, the opportunity of learning Spiritualism's philosphy directly from the lips of our departed loved ones, and witnessing their spirit manifestations of celestial beauty.

Some of the conditions under which Rev. Dickson's mediumship enables the loved departed to demonstrate, are as follows:

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2—It is not unusual to see a ball of light, approximately four or five inches in diameter, either come over the top of the cabinet curtain, or appear in the middle of the room near the ceiling, then descend to the floor, and as above described, build up before the eyes of the hushed audience

me for he was such a scholarly man and I felt I was not fitted for the task. However, if he wishes me to go on with it, I know he will instruct me how to go about it.

Then a little premature baby, a grand niece of mine I had the privilege of naming at a previous materialization seance, appeared. She was like a cherub wrapped in a swirl of gossamer veiling, when she announced she was to be my little message bearer. I was overcome with delight.

Then it was that Mr. Clark said he believed the seance was over but before I reached my seat, he called me back and my dear nephew, Wayne, came running to me. He said: "Aunt Allie I thought I would never make it but here I am!" Wayne informed me that he was in the war zone helping the boys to make the transition. I asked him to step a bit closer so I might describe him to his mother. This he did and, at the same time, sent her his love and protection.

As I returned to my hotel, I felt sure that all who looked upon my face could see a certain radiance. I sensed as much for I knew I had been kissed by angels. until in full form, give its full name and be recognized—and after conversing, walk along the front row and disappear through the solid wall, without going near the curtain.

3-When R. G. Svendsen, Jens Svendsen and Carl D. Schyberg returned from vacationing with Rev. Dickson, in May of 1950, each one reported seeing, and speaking with, several fully materalized spirits while Rev. Dickson lay sleeping.

4—When Rev. Dickcon is visiting socially in the homes of friends or followers, spirits often materialize, speak with all present and then vanish without either cabinet or curtain being used.

5—In the glorious Spirit Dance, under the audience's own test conditions, three and four materialized spirits danced to a musical accompaniment.

6—Quite often before a materializing seance, public or private, spirits materialize and speak as they stand beside Rev. Dickson outside of the cabinet.

7—And in the daylight materializing seances, Rev. Dickson, in most seances, sat outside of the cabinet, fully conscious, and joined in conversation with the spirits and the one sitting for the seance!

How I wish those who write spiteful letters, and who possibly have never attended one of Rev. Dickson's seances, had been sufficiently interested to attend and witness some of the public demonstrations, and learn for themselves.

Members and followers who attend Rev. Dickson's weekly meetings with regularity, *develop their own psychic power* with the help of their spirit loved ones, and continually report on the beautiful spirit demonstrations they receive in their own homes!

But to get to the specific instance referred to in the Jones letter:

In 1924, when this incident occurred, Spiritualism, as a religion, although not accepted as generally as it is today, had its loyal followers, and unfortunately, "charlatans" and "imposters." Any thinking person knows that real Spiritualists are more eager to rid such "imposters" from Spiritualism than are any civic institutions organized for such purpose, for it is the real Spiritualist mediums who have always borne the brunt of the faker"s chicanery. long after he or she has moved on to other fertile fields. And, unfortunately, some mediums, jealous of another medium's ability. do more harm to the cause of Spiritualism than its full-fledged enemies. By their

words or deeds they show ignorance of the very mediumship they profess. If they understood, they would zealously uphold and respect every phase of psychic power. Although it may appear that I have deviated from my subject, it is not so. for the individual who swore out the warrant for Rev. Dickson's arrest, referred to in the Jones letter, was the accomplice of a medium! And during the hearing, the medium was delighted with the opportunity to discredit Rev. Dickson publicly.

The trumped up case against him was heard in the Police Court of this city, the charge being that he had fraudulently obtained money at his religious

services. Of course, the usual calumniations were made regarding mediums who produce phenomenal manifestations. At the conclusion of all testimony and the arguments of counsel, the jury retired for deliberation, and after several hours returned, with a verdict vindicating Rev. Dickson. The date was June 20th, 1924, and Spiritualists familiar with the case, consider that Spiritualism received one of its greatest early boosts with Rev. Dickson's vindication.

However, because of the numerous times within that year, that the Church meetings were interrupted by the police, it became necessary to settle the matter. Therefore, The Spiritualist Church of Revelation, through its Pastor, Rev. James J. Dickson, filed for a Writ of Injunction against the San Francisco Police Department, in the Superior Court of the City and County of San Francisco, State of California. Louis H. Ward was the presiding Judge and the action was No. 157490.

In August, 1925, the Spiritualist magazine, REASON, published in Los Angeles. California, edited by Dr. B. F. Austin. carried the following paragraph from the San Francisco. Calif;

CHURCH ASKS LEGAL BAR ON POLICE TO HALT INTERFERENCE

Charging violation of the constitutional right to "worship God after the dictates of their own conscience," parishioners of the Spiritualist Church of Revelation, 156 Carl Street, aued today for an injunction against Chief of Police O'Brien and Detective Thomas Hoertkorn, nemesis of seers, who are accused of causing the arrest of the Pastor, the Rev. James J. Dixon, six times in the last year. Once, it is charged, Hoertkorn drew a gun on the pastor in the pulpit and handcuffed him before the congregation. Presiding Judge Lonis H. Ward ordered Chief O'Brien and the detective to show cause on May 25 why an injunction should not issue. S. F. Call.

Judge Ward granted the Writ of Injunction prayed for by The Spiritualist Church of Revelation, and a copy of the Judgment for the plaintiff follows:



jury on the 4th day of June, 1925, the plaintiff being represented by its counsel William H. Schooler, Esq., and the defendants being represented by George Hull, Esq., City Attorney, Maurice C. Dooling, Esq., Assistant City Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco, Arthur J. Hearst, Esq., and Michael J. Riordan, Esq., their attorneys, and the following proceedings were had:

Witnesses were sworn and examined and oral and documentary evidence were introduced on behalf of the plaintiff and no evidence being offered on behalf of the defendants others than the cross-examination of the defendants. Thomas Hoertkorn and Morris Harris, the action was continued until the 7th day of August, 1925, and thereafter until the 14th day of August, 1925. when the action was submitted to the Court for its consideration and decision:

And the evidence and the law having by the Court been heard understood and fully considered and the Court having heretofore made its findings of fact in writing and its conclusions therefrom in favor of the plaintiff and against the said defendants and directed that judgment be entered in accordance therewith:

Wherefore, It Is Hereby Or-

dered, Rejudged and Decreed, and this Court does hereby order, adjudge and decree, that the said plaintiff have judgment in its favor and against the said defendants perpetually enjoining, restraining, commanding, requiring and prohibiting the said defendants Daniel J. though not in his or their presence; or, when a felony has in fact been committed, and he, or they, have reasonable cause for believing the plaintiff, or any of its members to have committed it, or, on a charge made, upon a reasonable cause of a commission of a felony by the plaintiff, or any of its members; or; at night, when there is reasonable cause to believe that plaintiff, or any of its members have committed a felony: and from humiliating terrorizing, intimidating and annoying plaintiff, its officers, members, pastor, employee and employees, in conduct of the business of said plaintiff corporation, or in the enjoyment of its religious ceremonials wherever

the same may be conducted in the City and County of San Francisco, State of California.

It Is Further Ordered, Adjudged and Decreed, that a permanent injunction issue out of and under the seal of this Court directed to the said defendants in conformity herewith.

And, because the age-old question. "Why doesn't the Spirit World Protect its Mediums from Attack and Persecution?" always arises when such incidents occur, perhaps it is well to give the Spirit World answer:

"For hundreds of years, individuals and organizations in power, on earth, have tried to keep man from learning the truth of eternal life. SCIENCE and SPIRITUALISM

S PIRITUALISM has done much towards acquainting man with his subjective self. Spirit communications have revealed that the mind is "independent" of the brain. Materializations have displayed the appearance of the psychic body to people who are not clairvoyant. Other types of psychic phenomena have shown, in one way or another, that the subjective self defies the limitations of the physical realms.

While these manifestations are interesting and absorbing for many individuals, their true values lie in the possibilities for application making for the benefit and upliftment of Man.

In our present day, adaptations of this order are usually the result of scientific application. But, we may ask, "What has science done to capitalize on these revelations?"

It is indeed unfortunate, that while men of science regularly explore new fields in search of truths and principles, here is a field that has been largely avoided. In fact, my observations have shown that they were more determined to disprove the phenomena than to sift out or principle was obtained, it would have sufficed the need of scientific groups to have merely stated the fact. Progress depends primarily upon the application that is made of a principle, not upon the manner in which it was determined.

As an example of the type of information that should be presented to scientific students of human nature, is the fact that spirit messages reveal (1) that souls in the realm of spirit reside on various planes, and (2) that residence on a given plane is dependent upon the degree of understanding the individual has attained.

pears frequently in Spiritualist literature, is any evidence to be had wherein psychologists have made a classification of MAN based upon the degree of understanding he possesses?

In our economic, social and political structures, do we not find need for able leaders who possess various capabilities? Is not the present state of worldwide confusion, so abundant in these troubled times, due to the lack of capable leadership and a true evaluation of different peoples?

Even in our peace time economy, we rely principally upon accident to jostle people into useful places in society. What a shameful waste of human effort and talent.

As a second example of Spiritualist information which should be used by scientific minds, is the frequent reference that is made of "the enlightened realms" in terms of "high vibrations." It does not require much in the way of observation or study to determine that the individual takes on a higher rate of vibration as he progresses. or conversely, that he takes on a lower rate of vibration as he retrogresses.

Indeed, this matter of vibration is a very simple fact. BUT, have electronic engineers been requested to develop a *Human Frequency Meter?* An instrument of that order would pro-(CONTINUED ON PAGE 10)

I frequently encounter people who complain about their lighting. although the systems employed represented the ideals of the lighting industry.

Experience showed that one type of lighting would be satisfactory for some people but not


Furthermore, this study gave indication that many other adaptations were also to be made which would greatly improve our understanding of current problems.

2. The Highlands of Heaven

The second volume of writing came, not from Mr. Vale Owen's mother, but from Zabdiel, at that time resident in Sphere Ten, according to his own system of numeration.

His range of subjects is very wide. He deals with evil and sin, inspiration, light and darkness, alchemy and astrology, transmutation. elementals, the origin of species, and many other things. What he has to say gives us a clear portrait of himself, too, as a fellow-student further advanced than ourselves, who now sees problems from another vantage and can dig further into the mysteries of creation. As he probes su creation seems to him more wonderful and majestic, and the Creator more wise and loving.

Evil Is Real

But the very intensity of God's love is terrible when met by some willful opposing obstacle, and causes great pain to the latter. This, and only this, is the fire of hell. If this does not make hell and evil real, what could? argues Zabdiel; and if so, then evil beings are real. These he calls "the undeveloped," because a sinner lacks the faculty to know the good. His is rather blindness from birth than blindness from misadventure.

Many who live apparently good lives on earth are shown to be undeveloped when they emerge from earth-life, but only gradually do they under-



stand what they have lacked unknowingly so long.

Opposing Forces

Illustrating a point he makes about good and evil, Zabdiel uses this analogy:

The appointed paths of heavenly bodies are shaped by two principles-the right line and the curve. Suppose that earth set out on its journey, traveling in a straight line, its potential movement. Directly it

leaves that point it begins to fall towards the sun, and forming a ellipse. There is no straight line here, but a series of curves worked together.

Yet the sun's pull was in a right line. So the combination of two straight lines of energy bent the earth's path from the straight to the elliptical. We would not, however, say that because these two forces are exerted against each other this is a bad scheme.

There is a like opposition of forces in human life. Many say it is imperfect; that might have made a better way. Some doubt His wisdom and love because they see only a small part of the curve (the great orbit of existence), and conclude that it is falling to destruction.

Certainly things might be otherwise, but they would not be so beautiful in their completed orbit.


Alchemy and Fairies

Once science had a soul, when outer manifestations in matter were of secondary interest. Thus, in alchemy and astrology, men studied the grades of spiritual workers (elementals) who rule the earth from many spheres, within certain limits of action. The many facts they discovered, being not of earth but spiritual, had to be expressed in language not in common use. Hence fairy tales in Europe and tales of magic in the East, which are really surviving descendants of past sciences, changed and distorted with time.

Jack and the Beanstalk

Jack is colloquial for John, he who wrote the Apocalypse. and the beanstalk is adapted from Jacob's ladder, by which upper spheres are reached from carth, spheres which are real countries, with natural scenery, houses and treasures. But these are often held by guardians hostile to us. Yet we can by boldness and skill wrest away the treasures and bring them back with us to earth, and can stop the guardians from regaining them, depriving us of the fruits of conquest.

This tale is picturesque and ludicrous in form because it is passed on from age to age by people who do not know its deeper meaning, or they would



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not have nicknamed the original as Jack. But, as his customary attire shows, this happened at a time when holy things were lightly esteemed.

Our Evolving Universe

The various creatures of our universe originates not from matter but from the heavenly realms, where watchers and workers, when our universe was nearing its present condition, consulted with higher spirits, and shaped their plans accordingly.

They found that this evolving universe was meant to reflect the personalities and types of those in charge of it. Thus arose different orders of life. with various human types and characters. One of the laws governing the watchers and workers is "that, among all minor and temporal variations and seeming diversity in operation of the powers put in their hands. the guiding principle should be UNITY. towards which all should tend eventually."

The universe was not made for man alone, any more than the sea was made for sea-creatures only, or the air for birds. Man invades both elements, for dominion is to the greater being. Man is lord by permission, ruling that in which and over which his Maker has put him. Likewise there are beings greater than he; and as he rules the lesser, so they rule man and use him.

Yet man is not merely their tool, for he is ever a freewilled being.

Light and Darkness


When we speak of darkness we mean a lack of certain vibrations which enable the retina of the eye to register the presence of external things. In the regions of spiritual darkness on Zabdiel's side of the Veil a similar condition also obtains. People in darkness live there because they lack the ability to receive light vibrations. When their faculties changed they see more or less clearly. Those who live in. say, the Fourth sphere do not penetrate into the Fifth

to stay there, till they have become developed enough to bear with ease the intensity of its light. They soon become used to it, and were they to return to the Fourth it would seem dimmer to them than formerly, though still they can see comparatively easily.

Yet, "we do not proffer gifts as slaves to princes. But we do come and stand by you with gifts which gold of earth cannot buy: and to those who are humble and good and of a pure mind we give these gifts of ability to understand the Truth as it is in Jesus . . .

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
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KASHMIR

Kashmir is popularly believed to be a dreamland of mystic leisure. There is something haunting in its tempting loveliness. The name is said to have originated from a love legend of fairyland: Kasho, a djin. and Mir. a lovely fairy, who in days gone by fell in love with one another, still live in happy seclusion in some unknown beauty spot. on top of one of the hillocks around Srinagar, the capital of Kashmir. This valley of lakes. flowers, and tall coniferous CHENAR trees, is named after them

Muslims form the bulk of population. They are extremely handsome and capable of great endurance and physical labor. Their womenfolks are lovely, well built and endowed with great physical charm. They are however simple, ignorant and unaware of their innate charm and attractiveness. They in fact, are like the flowers around them.

There is a sprinkling of Hindus too, who, in the main, are Brahmins, the priest class of India.

The national language is called Kashmiri. Persian influence seems to be predominant in its make-up. Hundreds of words of Persian origin are in common currency. Persian poetry seems to be a great favorite. The mystic poems of great Sufi poets like Hafiz, Roomi and others are sung in each home and during festive occasions, no festivity is complete without recitations from one of the favorite mystic poets of Persia. In the main, these great Sufi poets speak of spiritual beliefs, stages of inner development and point to a way of life that leads to ultimate Atone-ment with the Supreme Being.

Shagoofa Fair. the bringing in of the Spring, is their greatest national festival. They welcome it with music and poetry. It is celebrated with ecstatic joy, feasting and entertaining. It is commemorated annually around mid March.

Throughout the valley on this day fairs are held. The biggest of all these celebrations is around Srinagar. About ten miles off. across a small range of hillocks, is a vale shaped beauty spot. This miniature dreamland is surrounded by low lying hills and is rich in flowers and sweet scented herbs and fruit trees. This is where the big event is annually celebrated. From far and

near men and women flock there to welcome the Spring. A day previous to the fair, especially through the night, people begin to pour in. They come in small bands in gay colorful native costumes, singing laughing and full of a new joy of life. They endeavor to out beat other bands in the choice of flowery niches and rich foliage canopies where in they pitch their portable tents. Incessant rounds of china teacups from their ever ready samavars accompany their rejoicing. And when the greyish tender dawn draws near this miniature valley begins to

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send a sea of songful currents heavenwards. There is an almost sacred rapture in this heartful musical spring offering of theirs. With sunrise the ritual ends.

The Valley of

Spiritual Beliefs

The song inaugurating the Spring is the song of Spirit. It is rich in mystical delicacies and speaks volumes for their innate beliefs in the things of the spirit. The symbol of Spring to them, is the symbol of a new life. A cycle ends and a new one begins. Life is a process which without ending goes on to the ocean of Divinity and eternity. They welcome the Spring dawn with devotional fervor and offer the confirmation of their belief in the continuity of life, in the form of a hymn that reveals the sanctity of their inner life.

Shepherds abound in the valley. These are a nomadic tribo. In winter they descend to the lower regions of the hills whereas in summer they ascend to the top of the mountain ranges. They are a very sturdy and hardy people, and are extremely good looking. They are known to have a romantic look in their eyes. Their shepherdesses are like fairies from some distant land of bewitching charm and loveliness. Strangely enough these living images of fairies devoutly believe in the existence of fairies and unseen entities. They have an unshakable faith in the agency of the unknown helpers of the spirit world. And when a lost sheep turns up they celebrate the occasion with offerings and prayers to the spirit helpers. In their simple ways they accept the rescue work of the spirit people.

Kashmiris, irrespective of their religion or creed, are inclined to believe in the spiritual values of life rather than in the material ones. Mysticism and occult beliefs are common. They believe in the existence of fairies, ghosts, poltergeists and

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



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

Dr. S. M. Van Duyzers has been pastor of the church for the past nine years. His wife, Jacoba, lecturer, teacher and mental medium, assists.



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SPIRIT PHOTOGRAPHY

The two spirit pictures on this page, received through the mediumship of *J. Edward*, noted Spirit Photographer, were taken at *Camp Silver Belle*, Ephrata, Pennsylvania, last summer. The sitter, *Josephine Bostwick Dunn*, 94 Orange Ave., Irvington, New Jersey, describes them as being the most evidential proof of survival and supernormal phenomena experienced in her 30 years of Spiritualism.

Photograph Number One



In Photograph number one, Mrs. Dunn recognizes the spirit extras in the upper left and upper right hand corners. The printing, in German, translated to English: "She will neither hunger nor thirst. She will come nigh to the Sun. Scattering then her mercy, she will be led to the Water Springs." The signature and wording is significant to Mrs. Dunnn. The explanation is known only to her and cannot be disclosed. Photograph Number Two

The spirit extras on photograph number two have also been identified by Mrs. Dunn. "JESAJA 49-10" explained: refer to Isaiah Chapter 49-10th verse and read: "They shall not hunger, neither shall they thirst. Never shall sun or sirocco (*) plague them; For he who pities them shall lead them, guiding them to springs of water." The message received at the time explains the purpose: "This is for you and Anita, and for the girls and myself."

(*) "Sirocco" means: Hot winds of cyclonic origin.
