American Sits With Mexican Medium

If there is one thing that most impresses the constant student of spiritual phenomena, it is its universality.

All over the world, one finds the "people who see" (the seers,

the clairvoyants), the "people who sleep" (the trance mediums) and the "people who bring forth witnesses" (the materializing and phenomenal mediums).

No matter in what part of the world one may be, these things are known and these people are recognized. if only by a few.

During a recent trip to Mexico. I had reason to be reminded of the universality of psychic manifestations and spiritual teachings. Whether it was in the capital. Mexico City, or the jungles of Yucatan, we heard of la gente que ve (the people who see) and la gente que duerme (the people who sleep), as well as those who bring forth other types of psychic phenomena.

We were introduced to Senora Maria de Castorela, a medium who "sleeps," by Senora Maria Stella S. de Seyde, herself a clairvoyant who "sees". Senora Castorela conducts regular classes and healing services at her home, Jalapa 289, in the capital. Her story parallels that of many another medium whose psychic powers made themselves evident at an early age.

Speaking in rapid Spanish, she told of some of her experiences. From the time she was a little girl, she said, she realized, and those around her began to realize, that she was different from other members of her family. For instance, on one occasion she was sitting at the dinner table when she suddenly found her conscious self detached from her physical body. In fact, she said, she had the remarkable experience of

Puerto Ricans Sit With American Medium

Many years ago this beautiful island in the Atlantic. called by former President Theodore Roosevelt the "Switzerland of America," came into the knowledge and light of Spiritualism, which is known here as "Espiritisme."

From the beginning it had followers in all ranks of society; but in the days of Spanish dominion, when it came into life, the Catholic Church was reigning here supreme and whoever dared practice a more advanced or protestant creed had to emulate their brethren of early Christianity who had to hide in caves and to find ways to conceal their thoughts, their doings and their feelings.

Though this handicap slowed things somewhat, it did not altogether stop the course of its progress, and generalizing its teachings from which deeprooted convictions resulted. It is today in the hearts of many who in deference to tradition, or for other reasons, are not yet openly in it.

But the island is an enlightened community which enjoys its share of Latin spirituality amidst natural environments in which Nature was extremely lavish. Its valleys, mountains

colors of its sky. Its inhabitants also have, in a large degree, a mystical sensibility similar to that found early in history among the peasants in the rural life of Germany.

Some years ago Dr. Francisco Ponte, now for a long time a resident of New York City, purused here scientific studies and conducted investigations

finding herself floating above the table, near the ceiling, looking down not only at the other members of the family there, but at her own body, sitting immobile, as if in a daze. (Occultists, of course, will recognize this as a typical case of astral projection.)

Similar occurrences frightened her, because she seemed to have no control over them. However, she told no one about them at first, preferring to "suffer in silence."

"Yo creia que me estaba volviendo loca" (I thought I was going crazy), she explained.

It was not until 1935 that the true nature of her mediumship became evident. A series of family tragedies, including the death of her mother, shook her faith and challenged her emotions. How could there be an abundance of good in the universe with so much that was seemingly bad taking place?


She and her sister were discussing all that had happened to them when she suddenly burst into tears and cried out for help from the forces of good. She promptly went into trance, and for the first time the teacher who has since been the principal speaker through her trance mediumship came through and spoke to her sister, promising her the inspiration and help they had sought.

The teacher said he was called Cabellera Rubia (Golden Hair), because of the long, blond hair that hung down to his shoulders, and he comforted the sister with his assurance that the family's troubles had about run their course.

The next day said Senora Castorela, her sister's husband, who had been severely injured in a bus accident and was in great pain, suddenly and mysteriously found himself cured. He had once been at the point of death after the accident, and though he had lived, there seemed little hope for his complete recovery. Now he was healed. Since then, according to the senora, there has been many a remarkable cure brought about through the ministrations and manifestations of Cabellera Rubia, as well as

other communications through her trance mediumship.

During our stay in Mexico City, we attended one of the classes conducted by Cabellera Rubia. His was a message of inspiration, rather than in-

formation, and much of what he said was expressed in figures of speech and a cadenced language of poetic beauty.

Here are a few of his words, as translated from the Spanish: "Why are you sad? Why do

you not have confidence in Cabellera Rubia, because for you he makes the sun to shine, so that all of you may be happy and contented-because Cabellera Rubia, my dear brothers, causes the breezes, so fragrant and beautiful, in the afternoons and in the mornings to spread light, hope and perfume over the surface of the earth and to caress the plants and the flowers and the tops of the trees, so that they may be moved by a divine swaying, as if guessing your own divine thoughts.

"Why does humanity destroy itself? Why do you not unite, my little ones, so that the world no longer will have war? So that you will go in peace to where you were born (that is, to the heavenly state from whence all have sprung).

"To men who will listen to me, I tell them: allow life to run its course that in the end they may find the Red Rose of Christ. Then to those who say they suffer, I tell them: give me the thread of your lives, so that I may disentangle the skein of your lives, and when I have disentangled it, I shall form with that thread a divine cocoon of grandeur and spiritual light, and in God I will enclose you.

"And in that cocoon, so perfectly formed, my dear little ones, you will be enclosed. Then the walls will crack open, and you will emerge from it, converted into a butterfly of light."

An impressive part of the meeting was the ceremony of dar luz (giving light). It was explained that at each class, some spirit is brought through who has been caught in the lower or purgatorial regions of the astral world. Brought back to a sense of objective reality by manifesting through the medium's physical body, the entity often can be talked out of the "depths" and into the higher light of the teachers-a process reminiscent of Dr. Carl Wickland's famous experiments with distorted mentalities in the spirit world (as related in his Thirty Years Among the Dead).


On this occasion, the "lost soul" was introduced by a voice speaking through the medium calling herself Maria del Consuelo. She had, she said, brought a rebellious spirit, one

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confined by his thoughts to a place (consciousness) of great suffering.

"I come to ask you, please," said this Maria del Consuelo in Spanish, to those present, "to eradicate his desperation through the brain of this sister (the medium), for whom I am the protector. Strengthen her with all your good thoughts, because Maria del Consuelo is the one who takes in those who suffer in space, in the darkness of their consciousness, in the ignorance of what has happened to them on the surface of the earth."

The medium's body went through a series of jerking contortions as the entity took over, and her facial muscles were twisted by intermittent spasms. With great effort, the new voice broke through as though being pushed and urged by others to come through and say something . . . anything.

"Vengo" (I come), finally gasped the voice, and then continuing in Spanish, struggling for words to express an extreme misery it said:

"I come from where we know not who we are. I come from where one cannot see. I come! I come from where there is much suffering and weeping ... ?

Later came a tortured description of a veritable Dante's Inferno:

"Why do I go through the forest where all the trees are dry and the trunks are gnarled and also the roots and everything of which they are madetheir branches that spy on the ones that are going by, in order to grasp them to themselves? Why should I go by there? I do not want to go by there any more. I want to go by another

"Why do you take me out from where I was? - hearing the gnashing of teeth and feeling the pulling of hair. Why have you brought me to this place that I do not recognize? For what reason?

"I was satisfied where I was, because I had already become accustomed to the punishment, although I was thirsty, and

there was no water to quench my thirst; although I was hungry, and the apple trees full of fruit would go out of my reach; although I was hot, and the sun would burn my head still more, and there was no rain to put out the heat where I went.

"Why did I come here?"

The medium's sister, Senora Emilia Alvarez, undertook to pierce the entity's delirium.

"You know that the supreme law has the power to help you and to take souls out of the self," she said. "That power is depths where you find yourself stronger than you are. In this night, your hour has arrived. You are going to settle your account and retrace your path. Open your eyes to the light that is going to present itself to you this night, so that you can become aware of why they have brought you here and why the desperation must disappear from your spirit."

Then followed a colloquy similar in many respects to the argumentative urgings of the late Dr. Wickland in his efforts to shake the mental illness from the obsessing personalities contacted through the trance mediumship of his wife.

"Why was I taken to those horrible places?" cried the anguished voice through the medium. "Why?"

"Because," Senora Alvarez patiently explained, "those are places of purification. But those of you who come out of the darkness and have a taste of light cannot go back."

"Please do not torture me any further," protested the entity. "I have already suffered enough. . . If there is a God in the heavens, that God will have compassion on me and on all who suffer in that forest of horrors where you went to take me out."

"Naturally there is a God," rejoined the senora, "and from the moment you entered here. He has had compassion on you. This is your hour of spiritual

There was not the slightest suggestion of artificiality in the

intense earnestness of her plead-

"Open your eyes. Look where you are," she urged.

"I can't. I can't," came the reply. This light blinds me. I don't want to see."

Again there was the parallelism with psychic experiences the world over-the constant reports from spirit communicators that those who are at all advanced in the other world are surrounded by a very real and visible illumination which often attracts entities lost in the obscurity of their own mental confusion.

"You have to withstand the spiritual light that is given to you as a charity," said the senora. ". . . You are a soul who committed many errors. and you have to erase them. You have to accept the light, whether you wish to or not."

"Luz," cried the voice. "Porque quero luz?" (Why do [ want light?)

"You cannot return from where you came," said Senora Alvarez. But that merely brought back the mental pictures which seemed to be torturing the entity.

"I have to go through a forest-dry without water, without fruit, without rain, where the sun will burn me."

The description continued like the ravings of a delirious mental patient.

"I have to go by the banks of a river," said the voice. "where from one moment to another it will overflow and cover the road which I am following.

"I have to go to the summit of a mountain where there is ice, and the ice will wrap me up and then form an enormous lake, and from there I will roll down the summit of that mountain, and I will drown in that

"I have to go by a river full of crocodiles, who will open their mouths and try to eat me. I will not go by that road.

"I have to go by a road lined with poisonous reptiles. I do

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which resulted, after four years of patient labor. in Materialization and Apports. A brief description of his work, which none has duplicated, was published by *Psychic Observer* in 1949. His leaving the island did away with what seemed an immediate awakening and retarded Modern Spiritualism for the people in general for almost a generation.

However, the flame he thus kindled did not die out and on the 18th of December last the

island was visited by Mrs. Hazel Herrejon of New York, a fine materialization medium whose pioneering work and kindness the people here will ever gratefully remember. She stayed ten days with us and gave six seances averaging thirty people each, though the last one was for a crowd totaling nearly four hundred.

Each of them was a big success and the few who left "unsatisfied" were far below the number we had anticipated, and some, if not all, anxiously await a new opportunity to check further before they accept as true, or definitely reject as fraud, the unbelievable phenomena of materialization.

Of course there were many beautiful cases, one spirit even walking up the steps back to the cabinet by itself, without help of any kind and in a sort of flying act, which, as we understand, is rather rare. A sitter with us was a Judge from a local Court, a man of excellent vibrations, who had the pleasure of seeing and talking to his beautiful wife on two occasions.

The third time. however, it was his mother who came and gave him conclusive proof of her identity through a request she often made of him during her last years on earth. She also said to him "Isabel came to you twice and it was proper that I come once."

On another night, Lucia, a sister in spirit of a member of the Committee, came and gave a wholesome bit of advice for the benefit of all, recommending that all study and acquire a good understanding of this truth, and pointing out to them that it will bring much happiness now and ability to enjoy, on arriving there, the places and conditions that they are preparing for us in their celestial abodes.

This Committeeman also had daily visits by Alice, a well known personality among those who have been at seances with him both at Chesterfield, in Indiana, and with Mrs. Herrejon

in New York. She is also fairly well known here by many who have read of her distinct and beautiful manifestations in these places, and every time Alice came out, during these seances here, all wanted to see her and to examine her features at close range.

One night when he asked her twice to turn her face to her right so as to enable people to see her better, she complied with her usual kindness; but when he made the same request a third time she said these words to him: "but I want to look at you also." Before the seances were over she had given him many additional proofs to the effect that she is close to him and that she knows his affairs even better than he

knows them himself.

Words cannot describe the beauty and value of these manifestations. They certainly contribute much to make our lives better: they certainly seem to lighten our burdens and to inspire us divinely. Those of us who could see well and appreciate properly what took place during these seances feel grateful of the opportunity this kind medium afforded us with her visit. But, good as the work had been this far, something still better was in reserve for the closing night, a demonstration that cannot be surpassed and that should be permanently recorded in the annals of Spir-

not want to go by that road, because the women I violated are converted into poisonous serpents. They are waiting to devour me, and they are waiting to clamp their poisonous fangs in me. I do not want to go by that road. . . .

"I am in great pain. I am in great pain."

Finally, after more persuasion, the entity agreed to listen, and *la senora* gave this admonition:

"Become aware that you have come to a spiritual center, where a charity is going to be done for you and where you are going to receive, perhaps for the first time in your spiritual life, the light that your spirit needs to illuminate your way.

"You committed in life many crimes. Naturally you have to pay for those crimes, whether you want to or not. But the spirit is strong and you cannot retrogress. They have taken you away from where you used to be, and those who come out of there cannot go back.

"You know that the supreme power has the force to take out from the blackest depths souls like you who are rebellious.

"You were suffering horrible tor uses there, but you did not want to come out, because you were afraid—because you were a coward, and after leading the life you led, you do not have enough valor to submit yourself to the good forces, to ask for all your crimes."

At this moment, the medium's body was thrown violently from her chair and onto her knees. The voice cried out:

"Tell them, here I am on my knees. I am on my knees, asking pardon. . ."

The strenuous session ended a few minutes later with a few final words from Cabellera Rubia, and Senora Castorela emerged exhausted from her trance.

It was a strange experience for norteamericanos unfamiliar with such procedures but understandable in the light of recognized accounts of similar experiences in this country and in view of the many descriptions of the sad plight of individuals who leave this plane, weighted down by the fixations of a blighted consciousness or nagging conscience.

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

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## Hazel Herrejon's Mediumship

The repetition of a thought will sometimes make a definite impression upon the consciousness of one who reads, so once again, I shall give you a report of another extraordinary materialization seance that was held recently in New York City. The medium, Rev. Hazel Herrejon, 530 West 136th Street, is an exceptionally gracious person and is most co-operative in setting up conditions whereby the minds of those in the seance are completely freed from any sense of doubt.

She invited a committee to examine the room in which the seance was to be held. Due to close quarters in New York City apartments, she uses a clothes closet for her cabinet. This closet is completely bare and empty. Across the corner of the room, there is stretched the usual black sateen curtain. She removed all clothing and the women sitters assured themselves that she wore only a dress and undergarments.

Many spirits appeared fullformed and life-like. My mother and two of my spirit guides came to me. It is most interesting to observe the difference in the way the spirit guides build up the forms with various mediums.

A marked characteristic in Mrs. Herrejon's work is the color tone of the materialized flesh which actually looked real and the lips were red and I even observed the perfection of the fingernails and the bone structure of the various hands. There was an exceptionally bright light at the demonstration.

Perhaps, these details would not remain clear in the memory of each and every person present but there was still another point that made a great impression on me. It was when the cabinet attendant stood at one side of the curtain, and a spirit woman appeared and called for someone in the audience who came forth.

During this part of the seance, a natural conversation followed and the spirit suggested As Told By

they stand over to one side of the room, quite a distance from the cabinet, so they could converse privately.

This spirit woman turned to the cabinet attendant and said: "We are going to stand to one side because I want to talk privately. It may be quite awhile but in that way, we will not interfere with the seance."

One by one, each person in the seance was called forward to receive a loved one and al-

though I did not clock the length of time the spirit stood at the side talking with her relative, I do not believe I would exaggerate in saying that it was all of fifteen or twenty minutes. I repeat, this was all in an extremely bright light.

On occasions, there were three spirits visible at the same time. Toward the close of the seance, Mrs. Herrejon's spirit mother came to greet the people. While in the earth-life, she had a little dog to which she was deeply devoted.

It is said that animals are psychic and I certainly believe that this is true. During the time the seance was in progress, I did not hear or see the little animal, but immediately upon the appearance of this spirit mother, he came bounding into the middle of the room, barking and jumping up and down.

The spirit woman leaned over and took the little animal into her arms. It was plain to see the cuddling and lapping of the little dog toward her face. It was one of the most natural and life-like episodes that I have ever witnessed in a seance room.

Oftimes, I am accused of telling tall-tales about the things that happen in seances. If one has not had personal experience with psychic phenomena and especially materialization. I can well understand that these reports may seem almost beyond credence.

"Nathaniel" by Rochester H. Rogers: Psychic Observer Book Shop, 10 East Fourth Street, Jamestown, New York; \$2.00.


Due to the limited field of readers interested in Spiritualism and psychic phenomena, any book specifically written along these lines is bound to have a limited sale. When any author of a book of this type begins to call a spade a spade and releases evidence and makes positive statements regarding survival, the sale of such a book is doubly limited.

But let someone talk about the subject of survival in veiled terms, let them write in platitudes using high-sounding words and the public reaches a stage of exultation and with bated breath will purchase the book provided their preconceived

Rochester tradition and has arrived at that age when he cares not what his "friends" think of his opinion. His style, his sincerity, his horse sense, his factual interpretation of the Bible stories (for centuries distorted by the theologians) has already clarified the thinking of many skeptics. The book belongs in the library of every Spiritualist to be passed around to his intellectually blind and dogmatically prejudiced friends and acquaintances.

The book itself is a series of short sketches and essays illustrating some of the eternal truths of life - truths well known to the early Christians and the little band of present-day Spiritualists, yet still beyond the ken of the Doubting Thomases of the yesterdays and to-

ideas are not upset and these books of platitudes are read with bated breath because all people really want to know whether they will survive the change called death.

Down through the ages, there have been many books in which the author expresses his convictions based on evidence received at seances with Spiritualist mediums. All of these books have had a limited sale because it seems that the minute you mention Spiritualist mediums, the reader interest and buyer interest ceases because these instruments of God are regarded with horror by the masses steeped in orthodoxy and all religions of that nature.

And now we have "Nathaniel" written by Rochester H. Rogers, an elderly lawyer, who is steeped in five outstanding photographs of ectoplasmic structures which show the psychic rods and psychic manifestations taking place prior and up to the time of materialization. These pictures were taken during a seance with Iona Brandt, St. Louis medium.

"Just a moment," says the Spirit-

ualist, "may I come into the discussion. What about psychic dreams that foretell events, solve problems and reveal facts actually occurring great distances from the dreamer?"

"Never heard of such dreams," says the plain man, "I'll believe in them when I hear of any well-authenticated case."

The plain man has now no longer an excuse to cover his ignorance for William Oliver Stevens has published a book, "The Mystery of Dreams" (Psychic Observer, Inc., \$3.50) that will give him plenty to think about. Here is a fascinating array of dreams that came true which the author thinks are examples of clairvoyance, telepathy and precognition.

Every dream quoted is factual and provided by individuals whose testimony are above suspicion. The skeptic who would dismiss them as worthless should pause and remember that men have hanged on less evidence.

The implications of psychic dreams are enormous and far reaching. If, for example, a lady in England sees in a dream the vision of her dying brother in America at the very hour of his death, can we dismiss this as a coin-

Yes, we may, if we only know of one such occurrence, but can we honestly use the same explanation for hundreds of identical incidentsguaranteed by sane and practical

Coincidence is like elastic, it can only be stretched so far then it must snap. Any scientist will tell you that when phenomena occurs constantly, it must be regarded as a law of nature-nonsensical and unlikely though it may seem.

The scientist who believes that life and the universe can be explained only in material terms is always uncomfortable when confronted with psychic phenomena. He either sneers or ignores it. Well he may, for it invalidates his whole materialistic structure-that all can be explained in terms of matter.

One genuine telepathic dreamonly one-proves that there is an exception to his rule and this exception, he must account for, otherwise his theory is not secure.

Remember-telepathy is one mind contacting another mind without physical or material means.

The scientists of the nineteenth century, led by Darwin, Huxley and Lancaster, postulated that man was

simply a refined animal possessing an enoromus well-developed brain and that there was no necessity to consider that there was anything spiritual or psychic in his make-up. The modern scientist has abandoned this theory and one wonders if the spread of psychical research has caused this conversion. It may be so, the average scientist is a cautious individual, he does not reveal all his knowledge.

For this state of things, we have to thank the pioneers of the past, Wallace. Barrett, Lodge, Hyslop, Hodgson and Prince. The battle is not completely won, there is much work to be done before mankind is convinced of the spiritual nature of man and his survival when this life is over.

William Oliver Stevens — a trustee of the American Society for Psychical Research—is to be congratulated on being one of our standard bearers and his latest book will encourage the survivalist and cause the skeptic to think long and hard.

"The smallest facts" wrote Aldous Huxley, "can be a window through which we may look at eternity." And, psychic dreams may indeed prove to be a window which, some day, will open a vista where one "make look at eternity."

## Why Spiritualism

## Has No Central Government

In 1848 the spirit of an itinerant peddler who had been murdered in a house in the hamlet of Hydesville, on the outskirts of Newark, N. Y., manifested when the house was occupied by a new tenant family by the name of Fox.

It was later determined that two of the Fox daughters were physical mediums, and that this made the manifestations possi-

The matter attained nationwide publicity. It caused people all over the country to "sit up and take notice." In fact, it caused a furore not only in this country but also in England. William Howitt wrote in his History of the Supernatural:\*

"Circles were everywhere found to receive spirit manifestations; and, so early as 1852. Philadelphia alone reckoned 300 circles, and in 1853 there were 30,000 mediums in the United States.

"It is not to be supposed that all this went on without opposition. On the contrary, all the old Protestant leaven was dreadfully violated by this extraordinary demonstration. The press, the pulpit, the scientific chair, were all in agitation against it. It was denounced as imposture, humbug, blind imbecility, vilest superstition; and by the religious, on the other hand, as downright demonry and sorcery.

"No matter, its wonderful facts were open to everyone who chose to see them, and people believed their own senses rather than the wild satires of learned folly.

"The Rev. W. R. Hayden, writing in 1855, said, 'Eight short years ago, not a single individual in the United States was known as a spiritualist; at this date 2,500,000, at a moderate estimate, profess to have

arrived at their convictions of spiritual communication, from personal experience. The average rate of increase has been 300,000 per annum.'

"In two more years we find it stated in the Spirit Journals of America, that the number of convert Spiritualists were upwards of three millions, a number equal to the united members of all the thirty thousand American churches; far outstripping the conquests of Lutheranism or Methodism in their Augustan periods.

"Amongst these were statesmen, members of Congress, for-

eign ambassadors, judges of the higher courts, clergymen in great numbers, lawyers, doctors and professors. Amongst them were Judge Edmonds, Dr. Hare (Professor of Chemistry at the University of Pennsylvania), a Protestant Bishop, Professors Bush and Mapes of New York, and Channing of Boston."

Among the many investigators were John W. Edmonds, a Judge on the highest court in New York state,-the Court of Appeals-and George T. Dexter, a physician. These two gentlemen met at circles, became friends, and decided to conduct their investigations together. The result was that they discovered that both of them were psychic sensitivesthe Judge possessing subjective (mental) mediumship, and the Doctor, objective (physical) mediumship. They later wrote a book on their mediumship and spiritualistic experiences.

When calumny was hurled at the Judge, even by church peo-

ple, and he was slanderously accused of consulting spirits as to how to decide cases in court, he resigned from the bench and went on a speech-making tour of two months to spread his new faith. He went from Boston in the east to the Mississippi in the west, as far south as the Ohio river, and as far north as Milwaukee.

On his return to the practice of the law in New York City he speedily rose to a first rate practice. The people had so much confidence in him that they promptly elected him to the office of Recorder, but he respectfully declined the office.

The Judge wondered why efforts to organize the enormous number of Spiritualists in the United States into an ecclesiastical organization had not been accomplished. He inquired of, and reasoned with, the spirits with whom he was in communion, in regard to their plan.

They replied that they did not want an ecclesiastical hiearchy to come into existence, and that they were endeavoring to prevent it. They wished to avoid the error made by other religious bodies-the creation, eventually, of an ecclesiastical oligarchy.

"It has therefore been," he says, "a cardinal principle with the spirits to let no one have undue prominence over his fellows; and we have none such, and are not to have."

The Judge explained this at length in an article in the Spiritual Magazine for April, 1861, as follows:

When the reality of spirit intercourse began to dawn upon me, I at once said, "If this is true, it must be for all mankind, and not for any particular people. Its end and aim must be universal, and its manifestations and instrumentalities will be seen everywhere."

Still I thought that concentrat-

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ed action would be serviceable -and it was attempted, but in vain. Over and over again, here and elsewhere in the United States, efforts at organization had been made, and some of them in a spirit of wisdom and freedom that removed all reasonable objection here among us-but every such effort has failed.

To what shall we ascribe these cognate failures? Surely not to a falling-off in the number of believers, for we are increasing marvelously every day, until we are counted, in this country alone, by millions. Not to any diminution in the interest which the subject excites, for we behold that interest constantly augmenting, and men of character, education and ability enrolling themselves in our ranks.

#### Spreading Truth

Men have been to see me from the four quarters of the earth, of different nations and languages. Letters come to me from Europe, Asia, Africa and America. I hear of manifestations among the Indians on the Rocky Mountains, the slaves at the South, the Arabs in Northern Africa, the natives of the Isles of the Pacific. I have heard of my own publications being found on the Himalayas, and among the whalers of the North Seas.

I behold Spiritualism in the churches - Catholic and Protestant - and that so strongly existing here, that the priesthood have been obliged to recognize and tolerate it, and some even to use it. The pulpit has stilled its denunciations, and the Press has learned to acknowledge its reality; and now, day by day, numbers are added to those who shall be saved.

And yet no organization of our adherents can be successful, no concentration of our power be permitted? If this movement had been of human device, the human means of organization and concentration would long since have been in full operation. But if it is divine in its origin, it needs no such mortal appliance, but each

soul shall move in its own orbit around the great center of the system, forming part, indeed, of a harmonious whole, but preserving its own individuality to the end.

#### Other-Side Plan

I have often, within the last six or seven years, reasoned with the spirits with whom I have been in communion in regard to the plan of their operations - have well understood what it was, and have from time to time been instructed wherein I could aid in the work. Evils which afflicted the past and retarded the progress of truth in the olden time, they were determined now to avoid. Man's proneness to worship objects palpable to the senses, rather than the invisible Crea: tor of a boundless universe, should no longer be indulged with the opportunity of deifying the instrument rather than the divine influence.

This, movement was not, therefore, confined to one instrument, but was confided to many, and they of every conceivable grade of society, so as to render the worshipping of them too absurd to be thought of for a single moment. It has therefore been a cardinal principle with the spirits to let no one man have an undue prominence over his fellow; and we have none such, and are not to

No Mahomet, or Luther, or Wesley, is to be found in our ranks to interpose their imperfections between us and a direct reception by us of the Truth from the same source whence they claimed to obtain it. No one man shall stand in our midst, like Moses, clothing his commands with the formula, "This saith the Lord." But each shall work out his own salvation; to each shall be accorded the liberty of doing so in his own way.

There was another evil which the spirits were determined to avoid, and that was one which would surely flow from organization. In every organization there must be some minds to lead, guide and govern - and hence would arise inevitably an

oligarchy among us. There is such a proneness in man to save himself the trouble of thinking for himself-such a disposition to indulge a mental indolence, by accepting a faith ready made for him, that the designing in all ages have taken the advantage to enslave and benight him.

#### Church's Lost Power

Hence the churches, which have done so much good in speeding man upward. have been shorn of much of their power and their usefulness to advance him still farther; and from this cause the Church now has become, as the Jewish Church became 1800 years ago, an instrument rather of man's retardation, than of his advancement

Had this matter in which we are engaged been of human origin, it would have been easy to have formed a hierarchy among us. There are enough among us who could be tempted with the prospect of power; and the constant demand we hear for something certain, definite, reliable, from the spirits, shows us that there are enough ready to yield to the temptation of having somebody to think for them.

And I know of nothing short of divine wisdom that could have prevented these elements, so rife as they are among us, from producing the same results which have been since the world began to spring from the same causes. I confess that when these designs were revealed to me, I could hardly conceive it possible to escape the consequences which the whole history of the race seemed to declare were inevitable; and I have watched the movement with great interest to see if the purpose would be carried out.

I think now, from the success which has attended the effort thus far, that it can. God grant that it may! For there is no tyranny so debasing as that of mind over mind - no bondage so destructive to human progress, as the mental. Your own poet has nobly said: (CONTINUED PAGE 14, COL. 3)

### 3. The Ministry of Heaven

In the third volume Zabdiel gives place to Kathleen, who passed from this world in 1893 and now acted as the link between the spirit Band and Mr. Vale Owen; and other matter was given by one known as Leader. He goes very deeply into science and philosophy, but also treats of such subjects as building a temple, rescuing people from the hells, the story of the People of Barnabas, the Descent and Ascent of the Christ, and the sacraments.

Here is a passage reminiscent of the Christ's parable, "the kingdom of the heavens is like leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till it was all leavened."

Leader says: "Such duties as are assigned to you have all been worked out as to their class, and the end to which they tend, by those who dwell in realms far above you. These schemes of allotted service are transmitted downward until they reach you, and are made known to you sometimes in one manner, sometimes in another, and to one more plainly, and to another less watchful not so plain.

A much-needed book, for instance, will be projected. Those in a sphere whose dominant note is Science may consider the outline of the book, and hand it on to another sphere whose note is Love, where a softening effect will be infused, and the scheme handed on. A sphere where Beauty rules will add illustrations giving harmony and color to the theme.

Then it will come to a company who study different traits dominating the races of mankind. They will examine the theme, and look for the nation most fitted to launch the venture on the world. Then they will select the next sphere of its journey. It may need an infusion of historical precedent, a poetical vein, or romance.

"What started out a framework of hard scientific fact may issue into the earth-plane as a

scientific treatise, a history, a novel, or even a poem . . . Before it reaches you, it may have been so transfigured as to become an Act of Parliament, a play, or even a commercial enterprise."

#### Presence Forms

Many descriptions are given throughout the script of exalted spirits, especially the Christ, appearing in Presence Form, whereby they manifest in spheres lower than their own in a vehicle appropriate to those spheres. In this volume the Christ shows himself as Christ All-conquering, Christ Sorrowful and Glorified, and Christ Regal. Leader and his company, too, sometimes assume Presence Forms, merging into the view of those to whom they show themselves.

They can do so, it seems, because a developed spirit may become consciously present in any sphere through which he has once passed. Having once experienced the conditions of, say, Sphere 2, he is omnipresent in Sphere 2, able to resume its conditions by an effort of will, and so actually "going there."

The Christ, who lowered him-

The Christ, who lowered himself into earthly conditions and appeared in the flesh, can at will visit any of the spheres which he crossed on his way to earth. The fleshly body of Jesus the Christ, therefore, was a Presence Form, his vehicle of manifestation in physical conditions.

Whether in the flesh or out of it, a spirit who appears in any sphere by this method is really present; the Presence Form is no mere animated simulacrum, the actual manifesting person being elsewhere. The form contains the veritable consciousness of the manifestor. His consciousness is projected into another condition, much as the human double sometimes acts apart from the physical body, though, in that case, not always consciously. It is hard to find a true analogy of things that seem strange to normal experience.

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#### Does God Evolve?

On page 107 Leader makes the following statments:

"We here have come to know that Spirit, sublime as it is in essence, is not the sum of Being. As beyond the realm of the material stretches the spiritual, so beyond those far and distant heights of light impenetrable, and holiness in awful purity towards which we think our way, there lies Being which is not Spirit alone, but which into Itself absorbs all that Spirit is at its whitest sublimity. and encompasses the sum total of spirit resultant in a universe of sublimity higher still . . .

We may go even further and say that, since everything in Creation sems to be developing. men are becoming gods, God is growing into Being, and Being into something still more sublime, and so on indefinitely. Which means that man, God, Being, and all other Somethings are imperfect, and Perfection does not exist. Yet Leader insists, "so far as we are able to project our minds into that far immensity of life and being we cannot see any end to our outward going."

#### **Evil Giants**

Inhabitants of the hells, we learn, are not of one type and pattern; freewill and personality are there as elsewhere, and so some are great personalities and some of less account. The good go up and the evil sink.

Tempering evil with good does not belong to the economy of infernal regions. So evil left together with evil works blasphemies not possible in earth's composite society.

They are ever reaching after more ease, hoping to escape slavery by promotion. But when promoted the glamour fades into a miasma of fear, for they are nearer to the hated archfiend who holds chief power. Yet they still seek advancement, only to writhe in agony and despair more than before.

Those arch-fiends are gigantic in stature, deformed and ugly, clad in grimy robes of mock-royalty, lords of squalor. Yet the evil which permeates their personality overlies potential good. Evil giants are ugly because they are out of tune with the Father-God, and they are powerful because evil is positive and their distorted personalities are strong in evil, even as they could be in good-

"Whatsoever is beautiful is always true," says Leader, "and whatsoever is ugly and ill-favored in form outwardly will, on closer study, be found lacking in the grace of truth." All that flows from God is orderly, and in harmony with the fairest aspirations of us, His offspring. What answers to this quality is Beauty, for Beauty is that which pleases; and harmony is a garment of love, which is ever pleasing to those who respond to love's endearments.

"He is the freeman, whom the truth makes free."

And when any human device, be the pretence what it may, stands in the way of the advent of the truth to each mind, according to its own capacity to receive it, its direct tendency is to enslave, and to retard, if not to debase the immortal spirit that is within us.

The High and Holy Ones who are dealing with us now see this, and seeing, they are determined to avoid. Hence all seems chaos in our ranks; yet we are moving forward with a harmony of action that is marvelous in its existence and in its results.

There is then in the movement, concentration of action, though not of our handiworkthere is organization, though not of mortal fashioning; and we can, well afford to dispense with any of our own contrivances. Let it not, however, be understood that there is nothing for us to do-nothing in which we can act in concert with each other. There is indeed much for all of us to do, both singly and together.

We are a fellowship body composed not of individuals but of duly organized churches and associations. To be duly organized, a group must be chartered by some parent body or by the State in which it functions. F.S.C. honors your existing charter no matter there received and F.S.C. recognizes your existing ordination no matter by whom it was conferred. The only 'paper' granted by F.S.C. is a simple Certificate of Membership for each Church or Association in our fellowship."
