

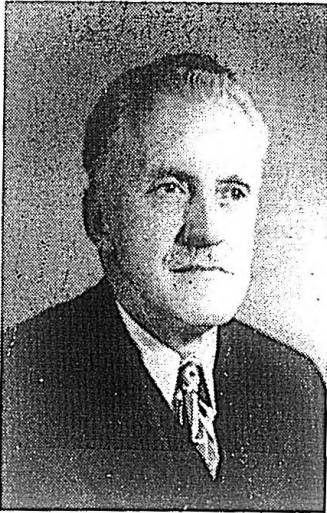

History of a kind was made recently in Los Angeles when, possibly for the first time in history, voices from the "other world" were telecast.

And it was also an historic occasion for another reason, because, again possibly for the first time, the television audience was treated to a sensible, intelligent discussion of the scientific aspects of the world of the afterlife.

As far as I know, spirit

voices have never previously been broadcast, either by radio or television. The voices in this case were introduced as a part of a television program. Dr. Gustaf Stromberg, the noted Mt. Wilson astronomer (now retired) and I were invited to appear for the telecast after DeVors & Co., publishers, of Los Angeles, had announced the release of the second edition of my book, TELEPHONE BETWEEN WORLDS.

He asked the questions

Stromberg and Crenshaw answered.

The station was KTTV, owned by the Los Angeles Times, and the program a kind of television feature page called "In Our Times." After our first appearance, the program's master of ceremonies, Roy Maypole, asked Dr. Stromberg and myself to appear again the following week, and it was on this second occasion that the voices were telecast.

During the intervening week, we arranged to make a professional tape recording of the voices through the trance mediumship of Rev. Richard Zenor (the "instrument" of TELEPHONE BETWEEN WORLDS). Excerpts were taken from the tape and reduced to a disc recording, which was then played in connection with our discussion of the book.

Included were both feminine and masculine voices. Two of the voices spoke in foreign lan-

guages, one Chinese and one Indian. The latter demonstrated a typical American Indian chant.

One of the feminine voices was that of the principal forecaster of "coming events" who occasionally speaks through Rev. Zenor, and although not reproduced on the air because of lack of time, a series of predictions was recorded on the original tape. In the light of subsequent events, some of these predictions, made and recorded in the presence of KTTV personnel, are now especially interesting. For instance, this one:

"There will be a complete change in the war picture in the very near future. . . ."

Then later in the recording: "You'll find a sudden change in the Korean situation, which will take place in three days."

At the moment, United Nations armies were going backward in Korea, and the news was discouraging, indeed. Exactly three days later, however, came the first dispatches, telling of a turn in the war. The U. N. offensive which began the great march back toward the 38th parallel had started and the news came precisely three days after the prediction.

During the recording, the prophetess speaking through Mr. Zenor and identifying herself as "Genevive Clearwater," repeated previous warnings of a greater conflict approaching, but added:

"If we can survive (the years) '51, '52 and '53, a global conflict will not take place, but our worst period is '51, '52 and '53."

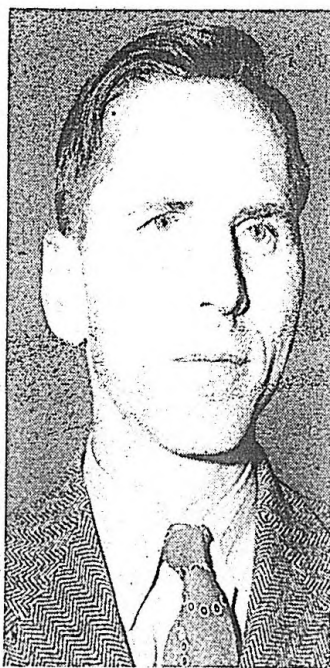
(She has frequently stated, incidentally, that the next great crisis area is Germany.)

During both appearances, Mr. Maypole sought to bring out the attitude of modern science toward psychical research. Dr. Stromberg's two books, *THE SOUL OF THE UNIVERSE* and *THE SEARCHERS*, as well as his foreword to my own book, emphasize that scientists in their laboratories

can no longer ignore the proofs of a non-physical world which is behind and beyond all physical manifestations. This does not necessarily imply the validity of psychic phenomena, but a specific question on the subject from Mr. Maypole brought an interesting answer.

"Would you say definitely," Dr. Stromberg was asked, "that there is another existence and that science is willing to stand behind it?"

"Many scientists will nowadays," replied Dr. Stromberg. "They would not 20 or 30 years ago."

He is the author of "Telephone Between Worlds" and one of America's foremost propagandists for the cause of Spiritualism.

Then he made a very significant statement:

"The material world has become spiritualized. There is no substance behind it any more. That is why we have to describe everything, not as a mechanism, but in terms of mathematical formulae."

Earlier he had said:

"There IS another world, other than the physical world. It may seem strange, but there is because the very fact that we have a memory, that we have intelligence, have feelings—all these things indicate that there is something beyond matter, and that something belongs to an immaterial world, a non-physical world.

"Now, the strange thing about these matters is that our memories, for instance, are not impressed on the atoms in our brains. The are impressed on the brain field, which is immaterial, and that field, like other living fields, expands during growth, reaches full size at maturity and then contracts at the time of death."

In effect it disappears into the non-physical world. So death does not mean extinction, he made plain, but rather only a change from a physical to a non-physical existence.

He then explained that scientific evidence points unmistakably to the conclusion that memory and feelings, and so, personality, continue in this non-material world. But as to psychic manifestations which purport to come from that world, he declared:

"Many scientists are very skeptical. The reason is, as I see it, that there has not been any theory to account for those phenomena, and when a scientist doesn't have a theory to correlate his observations, he doesn't have any interest in them.

"But lately science has become spiritualized against its own will.

"For instance, in physics, matter has lost its substance. There is nothing rigid about it. It has simply evaporated into a kind of nothingness, but it retains its structure."

At this point, Mr. Maypole mentioned Duke University's experiments in clairvoyance.

"The interesting thing is," commented Dr. Stromberg, "that, although there may be much evidence of clairvoyance, scientists in general still are not interested because they have no way of explaining it."

Asked if scientists admit the existence of clairvoyance, Dr. Stromberg replied:

"Well, they admit it secretly, but not openly. They don't like it, because if, as they think, there is no scientific basis for it, they want to stay away from it.

"They don't like to work with things which can be questioned. They want a theory to explain the facts they observe. Otherwise, they are up in the air."

"In the past, they have not had any theory to account for such things, but lately there has been developed at least the beginning of a theory to explain psychic phenomena in general and, more particularly, the organizing force behind bodily growth."

He added: "All of those things are connected"

I commented that Dr. Stromberg had outlined the basic theory which he says can be used to account for psychic phe-

nomena in his foreword to TELEPHONE BETWEEN WORLDS. (Incidentally, it was first published in the Psychic Observer, which thus "scooped the world," and represents an important milestone on the road toward scientific recognition of psychic manifestations.)

I also pointed out that Dr. Stromberg's correlation of scientific data, showing that all physical life is rooted in a non-physical world, had been praised by Albert Einstein.

The television program itself was an unusual recognition of the growing and widespread interest in a rational understand-

ing of the psychic side of life. I was called quite unexpectedly by Mr. Maypole after the publisher's announcement was released.

Mr. Maypole asked me to discuss—and I did so—my "reporter's report" of what the other world is like, as related in TELEPHONE BETWEEN WORLDS.

I explained during the program that I had been studying Mr. Zenor's "telephone-like" mediumship for more than 15 years and felt that I had received some very satisfying answers, not only as to the "what, where and why" of the after-life but also as to why we are going through the trials and experiences of the earthly life.

Considerable interest also was shown in the explanations included in several chapters of TELEPHONE BETWEEN WORLDS on how prophecy is possible and the examples of some significant prophecies. These include, of course, the forecast of a great psychic age and an age of peace, of scientific development and abundant prosperity, following a 25-year period of tribulation that began about 1940.

The telecast was an historic event for still another reason. Were it not for the discovery of one of the great pioneer psychic researchers, Sir William Crookes, we might not have television now, for it was his discovery in the 19th century of the cathode ray "Crookes tube" which paved the way for the development in this century of the cathode ray television tube.

While Crookes was scorned by his colleagues for his physical experiments, he was hailed and honored for his discoveries in the field of physical science. Therefore, it was appropriate, indeed, that one of his discoveries should have made possible the unusual recognition via television of psychic research as a proper field of inquiry for science.

A Decision To Be Made

During these days of high production costs, and there is no relief in sight, *Psychic Observer* is confronted with a serious problem.

This problem was handled several years ago when we were forced to raise *Psychic Observer* from 10c to 15c. At that time, one of our contemporaries raised their price simultaneously: another Spiritualist journal followed suit several months later.

Production costs vary, depending upon where printing is done, but the variation is so slight that under present conditions, in order to carry on, some action must be taken. *Psychic Observer* has two alternatives: either to raise the retail price to 20c or discontinue the use of expensive glossy paper and use newsprint—the type used by daily newspapers.

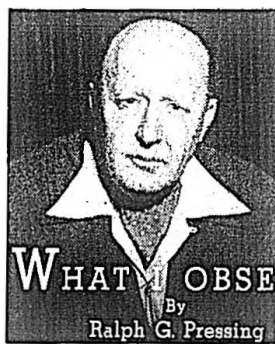
Many will remember that for years, "Progressive Thinker," when it sold for 5c, was published on newsprint. The three weekly Spiritualist journals published in London now use newsprint.

Our problem is: Something has to be done and in view of this explanation, we would like to have an expression from our readers as to whether or not we should put the journal out on cheaper paper, thus cutting costs, or raise the present price of the journal to 20c.

Some readers seem to think that the rising costs could be offset by charging more for our advertising. This would be an imposition as our circulation does not warrant a raise of price in this department.

Others say we should eliminate the free church listings and receive revenue from the churches for this advertising. This would afford revenue to offset the rising costs but could be a hardship to the churches, especially under present conditions.

Still others say we could cut the size of the paper to twenty pages, as our contemporaries have done, but this would not allow full news coverage. At the moment, *Psychic Observer's* twenty-four pages carry more



column inches of reading than any other Spiritualist journal.

True, *Psychic Observer* can carry on and absorb the rising costs but, not being subsidized, it is a question whether this could not go on indefinitely. At present, material, production costs, mailing, addressing, folding and labor actually costs 12c per copy and this same journal is being sold to the churches at 11c.

All magazines, Liberty, Colliers, etc., have increased up to five times during the past years whereas *Psychic Observer* has only been increased from 10c to 15c.

We welcome letters from our readers who may have some solution to our dilemma and would appreciate frank expressions as to what each feels could be done or should be done.

Thorne Carries On

A letter has just been received from Bertha Fischer, Brooklyn, N. Y., which confirms a previous statement made in this journal: "Thorne gets around."

Findlay Praised

Cambridge Dilemma

Fred J. Buniel, who has visited this country numerous times, never fails to communicate and send interesting articles to us from Santiago, Chile.

A recent clipping taken from the Latin American edition of "Time," March 19th, with the heading, "Fellow Wanted" reads: "One London daily headlined the story: 'Ghost Hunter Sought.' This was the newspaper's way of saying that Cambridge University's oldest fellowship was looking for a candidate again. Cambridge was willing to grant 300 pounds a year (for a maximum of two years) to a qualified and acceptable student who would investigate 'some problem in psychological research.'"

"The grant came from an old Cantabrigian named Frank Duerdin Perrott. When Perrott—at the start of the Spiritualistic inquiries of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle—the university huffily said no; it suspected a hoax. In 1927—the year Perrott died—Cambridge relented. In the 24 years since that time, however, only two acceptable scholars have been found.

"Last week, Cambridge was looking for a third fellow to

carry on the quest for what Perrott defined as 'the existence of super-normal powers of cognition or action in human beings in their present life, or the persistence of the human mind after bodily death.'

It is strange to find what people will believe in order not to believe and Cambridge University is no exception and merely substantiates the fact that donations to staid colleges for psychic research is generally dissipated either through argument as to how the money should be used or whether it should be used at all.

I was brought up in a Spiritualist family, my father being one of the outstanding mediums of his time. An unusual incident first aroused his interest in this phenomena. His background being Catholic, he, of course, knew nothing about Spiritualism when he first met the girl whom he later married (my mother). Her family were Spiritualists so she had some knowledge of communication.

One day she called on my father's mother, and while she was there she saw my father coming down the street. In a spirit of fun she stepped behind a door to frighten him when he came in. Slightly to the right of the door hung a picture of my father's Father, who had been dead for some years.

As my father stepped into the room, raps were heard on the wall just above the picture. They were so loud that they were heard by his mother who was in the kitchen at the time. All being attracted by the continuous rapping, they gathered around and began asking each other what it could possibly be.

My mother, being the only one there who understood what it might be, finally overcame her reluctance and asked if it was my father's father. She was answered by three distinct raps, meaning "yes".

Of course, this was hard for my grandmother to believe, but she said, "If this is really you, can you tell us where my sister Lottie is?" The answer again came back "yes".

Lottie was a sister who had severed all connection with her family many years before and about whom they had heard nothing for a long time. No one had any knowledge of her whereabouts.

They then went through the alphabet and numerals, receiving a rap whenever they came to the correct one, until they had received the city, state and street address. They wrote a letter to her at the address they had received and my grandmother said, "If we get an answer back from this, I will be convinced there is something to this business."

In a short time, they received a reply, and Lottie couldn't understand how they could have known her address. This completely eliminates the theory of mental telepathy in this instance as surely no one knew her whereabouts.

This incident, of course, aroused the interest of all concerned, and a developing class was started. After about six months, they began to get raps on the trumpet and in a short time more started receiving voices

and finally trumpet in the light. Later they started materialization and met with great success. I could tell of many incidents but shall only take time for a few.

At one time, when my mother and grandmother were washing dishes in the kitchen, my father went into the cabinet which was just off the dining room with no thought of anything special in mind but merely to aid in his development.

In a short time, a large Hindu appeared in the kitchen. My grandmother asked him if she could have a piece of his robe, and he reached down and tore off a piece of it and gave it to her. She kept it for several days and showed it to several people. Finally, she went to get it again, but it had dematerialized.

One afternoon when I was about sixteen years of age, an old lady and her husband came to see my father and I saw the following take place in the daylight. The lady did all the talking as her husband spoke only Dutch. She said that they lived on a farm and although her husband was deaf he kept hearing voices and at times was even knocked down while out in the barn. It was making him very nervous, and he had consulted doctors who had merely attributed it to nerves and were treating him for such. However, the disturbances had persisted, and some friend of his had advised him to see my father.

My father held the trumpet for her, both ends being away from his body, and she conversed for about an hour with the spirit of her husband's brother. He explained that the reason he had been so persistent was because he had cheated his brother out of an inheritance before his death, and now wanted to confess his deed and be forgiven.

This entire conversation was carried on in the Dutch language. My father is of Irish descent and can speak no language other than English.

At one materialization seance, the spirit of a nun appeared and asked the group if they would like to see something unusual. Of course they said they would, so she asked them to be patient and went back into the cabinet.

After a long time, she came out of the cabinet carrying my father, who was the medium, in her arms. She placed him in a chair in front of the cabinet and kept making passes over him while she talked a

long time to those present. Then she picked him up and carried him back into the cabinet.

Of course, my father met with the usual skeptics and was put to all kinds of tests such as placing his feet in flour, being chained to a chair, and then having netting nailed all around him, and all the indignities to which a medium is subjected. But he finally drew the line when they wanted to nail him in a box, saying that when he was nailed in a box it would be after his death. But, regardless of tests, the results were the same.

He is getting old now and has been in poor health for a number of years and has given up materialization entirely. Occasionally, he will sit for trumpet and practically always we feel materialized hands all around the circle as well as voices and the trumpet moving all about; but it seems to be so tiring for him that we seldom can get him to do it.

Having grown up with these demonstrations going on, I have always known the phenomena to be a fact but when I grew up I turned away from it and labeled it all evil. My reason for this was because my father was then a frequent drinker and seemed to be encouraged in it by his spirit guides. This led to unhappiness in our home, and I reasoned that if there was any good in Spiritualism they could have helped in that situation.

I have since come to realize that we attract the kind of forces that are on the level of our own spiritual development, but it took me a long time and much travel and study to come to this conclusion.

For a number of years, I would have no part of Spiritualism and even made it a point to condemn it. About twelve years ago, an uncle of mine, James E. Walker, who incidentally was the one who introduced me to you, began to change the picture for me. He was well known throughout Michigan and other places as a public speaker on this subject, and it had made such a change in his life that I was forced to admit it could not all be evil.

He asked me if I thought I was being broad-minded. He said, "I understand you are on the Board of Trustees and Chairman of the Building Committee of the North Park Presbyterian Church."

I answered that I was and he then said, "Would you condemn all of your church because of the conduct of one of its members?"

Of course, I replied that I wouldn't and he said, "That is exactly what you are doing with the greatest knowledge on this earth."

He also said that a little knowledge of anything is dangerous and it was unfair of me to judge until I had made a thorough study of the subject. I began to see what he meant and have been an ardent investigator since that time. I have

contacted some of the well-known mediums, among them Clifford Bias, T. John Kelly, Theodore C. Russell, Fanchion Harwood, Edith Stilwell, and "Billy" William Elliott Hammond.

I have read a great deal on this subject and have also made the acquaintance of a Joseph Sadony, Montague, Michigan, a world-known counselor. He has personal letters from royalty, and Mahatma Gandhi. Many Hollywood celebrities are his personal friends and visit him here. He attributes his ability to give counsel to extra-sensatory perception and is one of the most brilliant men I have ever met. I value his friendship highly.

As my knowledge of this subject

has broadened out, I have come to the realization that this is the most wonderful thing on earth; for what is more important in life than the study of life itself? If only more people would grasp the true worth of the philosophy and apply it to living their everyday lives, we could be well on the road to a happier world.

It is my hope that, in the near future, Spiritualist churches can become more united, then great strides could be made in presenting this wonderful knowledge to the world, for it is a knowledge that can strengthen every religion, regardless of creed.

In attending various Spiritualist churches, I have had the feeling that the phenomena has been over emphasized and the philosophy relegated opportunity is being missed. While it is necessary to have enough of the phenomena to convince the skeptics, once that has been achieved it should be given second place.

I also think our churches should try to influence people to be very careful about selecting the mediums with whom they sit, as bad influences can easily be attracted if they are not careful in their choice.

I am pleased to see the *Psychic Observer* taking the stand it does, and think you will have a great part in creating a lasting unity as well as doing a grand job of bringing this wonderful knowledge to the world.

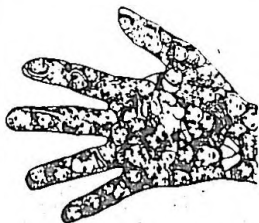

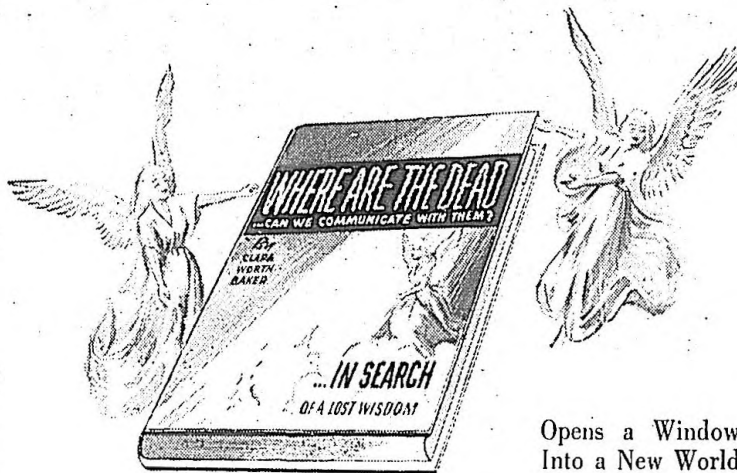

A Profound Study of Life After Death, Spirit Communication, and Telepathy

Thought is the most important thing in the whole world.

The peculiar thing is that though everybody realizes the importance of action, contemplates it, makes sure before doing it, few realize that action can only be born of thought, and that thought (intangible and invisible as it may be) has the power to make or break the world.

It is probably because it happens too quickly. "Oh, I just thought it," you say, as though that covered the whole thing.

But thought can be governed and directed, it need not be like a vane veering in the wind, something that drifts willy-nilly, bad thought, good thought, in-between thought, unimportant thought. It should be the major importance of one's life.

Have you ever paused for a moment to realize that if everyone made a frantic effort to control bad thought (for even that helpless matterless get-you-nowhere thought) it would make a new world?

Thought is so important that it survives the grave. It is thought that goes on, yet here in this life it is apparently something about which few people "think."

At one time I was very interested in Theosophy, which deals strongly with the importance of thought. I had until then believed that thinking was something that happened like a flash, and over which no one could hope to have control.

I found that if I practiced, I could rigorously debar thought that was destructive, because it hated intensely, was bitter, was fiercely resentful, and could only reflect in time upon me, and make me the same.

The moment that one began to control thought, one's life changed very considerably. Because one changed oneself. One had attacked the fundamental in life.

Since everything begins in thought, that, and not action, is the point that one must amend.

How often at the seance, how often with mediums preaching under control, do you get the

same argument: "If only people thought differently?"

This does not mean what it may appear to the casual observer, just that their outlook was different towards Spiritualism, but that their attitude towards the whole world through thought was changed, and ordered and controlled.

We have all seen men and women who, working themselves up into a violent passion about something, "stew on it" for a bit. They let thought run riot. They let loose every force of evil they possess, believing that because they have only thought it, it is still locked up inside them, and therefore is not so very wrong. But it is extremely wrong, because thought is intangible but it does *not* stay inside you. It is a reflector.

We are all of us to be compared with wireless stations that receive and give out invisible waves, which other stations can pick up. What you think at this moment, thousands are picking up from you without realizing what is happening.

You owe a responsibility to them and to yourself. In your thought you are creating the world of tomorrow. When you say: "How I hate that other person, I wish to Heaven I could get even with them." you are letting loose a force of evil which would shock you by its enormity, if once you could realize it.

If you say: "That poor person, how I wish I could help them, they've always been so sweet." you are doing them an invisible good. You are helping

them slightly. You may not think so, but you are. Thought is powerful.

Thought, being something intrinsically of yourself, renders no lip service. Too often life, and the way we have to live and act and behave, have made you utter little lies as part of everyday existence. You say: "Oh, I'm so sorry," when you don't mean it.

You have to say something, you have to express some polite regard. Thought does not do that because it is always true. Thought is real. Thought never expresses a sympathy, a love, or a hate, that it does not mean—and it means it intensely.

During the whole of your life, thought is building you yourself up, and making something of you. It is that thought which at the hour of passing goes forward with you. What you think today, you are tomorrow.

People dealing only with surface emotions maintain that they cannot help what they think. You *must* help "what you think" if you are to get anywhere.

See it from the other viewpoint, destroy the thought as it is born. And this you cannot do by hating more, or seeking to disrupt it, but only by dissection.

Encourage deep and loving thoughts; and although you may feel in return that you have—you'll probably say—"grown sloppy," you will find a far stronger ego, one who gets far more joy out of living, and who attracts the best from your fellows (who are keenly alive to kind thinking), and therefore derives only the best for yourself.

Beautiful action is born of beautiful thought. It is impossible for any of us to do anything really good without thinking good thoughts first, and without radiating good from those thoughts in the world in which we live, and in the next world too.

This is something to think about. The whole of your future lies in your yourself, not in what you do. Think rightly, and the rest will follow.

"Is Psychic Power ... GOD GIVEN?"

The Spiritualist is often asked if he believes everything he finds written in the Bible. When he replies that he thinks that the Bible is a collection of books, which are mostly documents of the Jewish race, and not binding at all upon the races of today, he is met with the harsh accusation of being an atheist.

A book of law for the Jew, who peculiarly holds to customs and usages pertaining to his tribal god, Jehovah, cannot be applicable in its entirety to the Christian. Paul quarreled with Peter over points of Jewish law and said, "*I withstood him to the face, for he was to be blamed.*" (See Galatians 2:11.) If Peter was right in sticking to the letter of Jewish law, then Paul was wrong to disobey it.

A law which condemned any person who taught contrary to the Jewish religion, or did entice others away from that religion, also provided that such a person be stoned to death for blasphemy. This law was the one the Jews obeyed when they condemned Jesus to death as a blasphemous. (John 19:7).

Jesus had broken the Jewish law; he had proclaimed a new "*Word of God*" which was to have more authority than the one the Jews patterned their religion and their laws after. This, to the Jew, was the rankest of blasphemy.

Jehovah (Yah-weh) according to the Hebrew prophets, gave strict orders regarding everything in the Jewish religion. He had selected the Jews to be his chosen people, disregarding all the other nations on the earth. and yet Paul said that "*God made of one blood all the nations of men for to dwell on all the face of the earth*"—Acts, 17:25. But the Jews believed according to their scriptures that they alone were the favored in the sight of their God.

I need not go into all the details of the wars and punishments which accompanied the rise of the Hebrew nation. Its record is saturated with blood and cruelty. Any nation that opposed them was visited with the fierce wrath of Jehovah. His actions throughout the record of the Old Testament proclaim him the most vicious tyrant ever heard from.

The character of the God of whom Jesus taught in the New Testament was a spiritual being who had created the heavens and the earth. His affection for man, his offspring, was tender and full of compassion. The Jehovah of the Jews breathed forth vengeance and tyranny.

When the Egyptians forced the Jews into captivity, they found themselves in the midst of plagues and vexations. Jehovah caused the door posts to be marked with blood wherein dwelt a Jew, that he might know where to find his own. That house should be free from the wrath of a jealous God. But the door posts of the Egyptians which were unmarked showed the great God of the Hebrews where His enemies dwelt.

"For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the first born in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment."

"The blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt."—Exodus 12:12, 13.

If Jehovah was the all-seeing God of heaven, why did He need to mark door posts in order to find His own people? It is supposed that God knows all things, even the secret thoughts of man. We might also put the question of why He visited His vengeance upon the innocent beasts of the field. Such cruelty is inexcusable even in a god!

A spirit leader who could thus persecute and destroy the

Egyptians naturally would use every means possible to frighten his people into strictly keeping to his leadership.

Therefore he sought to keep them away from the knowledge and customs of the nations that surrounded them. Early in their history he had declared, "I thy God am a jealous God and my glory I will not give to another."

When he found them liable to seek after the gods of the other peoples He gave strict orders against it.

In Isaiah we read:

"And when they shall say unto you, seek unto them that have familiar spirits, and unto wizards that peep and mutter, should not a people seek unto their God?"—Isaiah 8:19, 20.

But, as Moses Hull points out, "the text does not say that spirits cannot communicate; it does not even hint that it is wrong to communicate with spirits."

In Deuteronomy we find the law more explicitly stated:

"There shall not be found among you anyone that useth divination, or an observer of the times, or an enchanter, or a witch, or a charmer, or a consulter with familiar spirits, or a wizard, or a necromancer."—Deuteronomy 18: 9 to 12.

"An observer of the times," might mean an astrologer or a weather prophet.

And yet we read in 1st Samuel, chapter nine, verse nine, that

"Beforetime in Israel, when a man went to enquire of God, thus he spake, Come and let us go to the seer: for he that is now called a Prophet was beforetime called a Seer."

A Seer is a fortune-teller; a true fortune-teller must be a psychic — and the Spiritualist mediums are psychics! So here we have a Bible text which upholds the Spiritualist medium and calls him a Prophet. That is grand praise indeed!

If to consult with familiar spirits is an impossibility and an abomination, then Jehovah was not very logical to issue a decree against something that couldn't be done. Such an edict was a waste of Jehovah's time.

Spiritualism's critics should be reasonable and admit that the very fact that the Bible texts speak out against "*talking with the dead*" confirms the possibility of so doing.

King Saul defied the edict of Jehovah when he sought to communicate with the spirit of Sam-

uel. The "woman of Endor" was his medium and she had a familiar spirit. See 1st Samuel, 28. The woman, "*when her familiar spirit was come,*" says the text, rebuked Saul for trapping her into giving him a spirit reading. Saul, anxious to speak with the spirit of Samuel, cried, "*No harm shall come to thee for this thing.*" Later in the account the verse reads, "*And Saul perceived that it was Samuel.*"

Jesus transgressed the Jehovah edict when he talked with the spirits of Moses and Elias on the Mount of Transfiguration—Luke 9. He did not think it a sin against God to speak with risen souls.

Jesus promised his disciples that the "works which he did, they also should do." "*And greater works than these shall ye do.*"

Spiritualism with its encompassing philosophy of life, does not belong to any one age of humanity's history. Dr. Samuel Johnson once said:

"That the dead are seen no more, I will not undertake to maintain, since every age however rude and unlearned has testified to these things. Though men deny it with their lips they confess it with their fears."

If it is the natural law of God that souls leave their physical bodies at death, then it is a natural law that allows them to return and communicate with their friends on earth. This must be true regardless of all the laws set down in all the Jewish Bibles anywhere!

God is a universal God. His law and dominion are from everlasting to everlasting. His Infinite Mind stretches before and after the Hebrew race was created. His laws for spirit and flesh are observed in the existence and activities of every race of people that history has any record or knowledge concerning.

We pray for His guidance and wisdom. Shall we limit our wisdom to a set of laws observed by a selfish and cruel people who saw in their God only a being molded and shaped to the Jewish decalogue?

Jesus rebuked the narrow vision of his people. He led the way toward light and under-

standing for the soul. He encouraged men to contemplate the great spiritual creation of man in the universe.

There was superstition and bigotry as well as some beautiful poetry in the precepts of the Jews.

It cannot be a sin for me to ask to hear from my father and mother who are in spirit. They were nearest to me while on earth, shall they not be interested in me now that they dwell in the spheres of light?

Christianity advises me, on

Scriptural evidence, to seek the companionship of angels. Sain'ts and angels flood the account which is the foundation of the Christian Church. Then shall I be condemned because I earnestly seek to reach out into those spheres wherein they dwell?

Let no harsh dictum of Jewish Scripture withhold from us the beautiful joys of spirit communion. There are angels hovering round, and some of them are our very own dear loved ones.

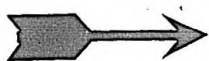
