

"My Father 'Dead'? -- I Saw Him!" ... says Arthur Godfrey

"My Dad-1 had not seen him for years -- suddenly walked into my room. He offered his hand saying: 'So long. Son." I answered: 'So long. Dad.' I said some kind of prayer. It was not eloquent but it came from the heart."

These are the exact words used by Arthur Godfrey in his syndicated column. "Lenten Guideposts."

The article, with headlines, "God/rey tells Experience with Timeless Force," explains in detail an experience with his father the very moment he passed away.

Hundreds of stories relating like experiences have been published and many will end with statements to the effect that the person seen, passed away at the exact time the vision or apparition was seen. After having offered his hand to his son, Godfrey relates that he never saw his Dad again.

Some may classify this experience as an astral flight, soul projection or what not. Godfrey says that one day he fell asleep in his bunk and dreamed this last meeting with his father for he says: "When I woke up, my buddies told me that at the exact time while I was asleep, the wires from shore hummed the news of my Dad's death." By "wires from shore." Godfrey recalls that it happened in 1923 when he was stationed on board a Navy Destroyer in charge of radio communications.

Whether or not this story has ever been told by him before is not known. It is hard to believe that it took him 28 years to

make up his mind to say anything about it. Even so, it proves only that the experience made a lasting impression upon him.

In his column, he begins the account of his psychic experience by saying: "Somewhere in this universe is a timeless, undeniable force. It's stronger



than granite, steel, majestic mountains towering into the sky ---or nuclear fission.

"Sooner or later—in strange and different manifestations that force touches every human. Sure, some pass it off as a phenomenon that somehow cannot be reduced to exact scientific formula. To others it is the hand of the Almighty—a reminder that regardless of the grandeur of man and his accomplishments — God is still 'running the show' here on earth.

"Now, I want to tell you of such an experience. I have remembered it across the years and it will ring in my memory for as long as I live.

"It's about my dad — God bless him!

"Let me explain a little about my dad. He was one of the most brilliant and warm persons I have ever known. A lecturer, newspaperman, magazine writer and reaconteur—he was at home in any society. He was the well-rounded man I always wanted to be.

"Of course, he had his failings too. One was a disinclination towards business and finance. As a result. he went through several small fortunes and sometimes things were tough at home. Thats why I went on my own at 15. But, I never blamed Dad.

"All this is prelude to the point I want to make. But, if in telling it, one human, faltering on the precipice of lost faith or shaken belief—takes heart my telling the story will have been worthwhile.

"For out of it. I learned firsthand about that timeless force in this world. Now, whenever the adulation of the crowd dins in my ears . . . whenever temporary wealth and fame assault Lydia Pinkham.

my senses and balance—it helps me remember that force transcendent above the world itself.

"It makes me remember how the hand of God is at work constantly and I am humble in His presence."

That Will to Disbelieve SATURDAY EVENING POST UNFAIR

TO ORGANIZED SPIRITUALISM

Their Business Should Be To Present the Case Fairly and Without Bias. This They Fail To Do.

Rose Mackenberg, self-styled "investigator" of psychic phenomena, has created quite an uproar with an article entitled "I've Unmasked A Thousand Frauds" in the March 3 issue of *The Satur day Evening Post*. Unfortunately for true Spiritualists, it isn't the first time. Miss Mackenberg, a former employee of Harry Houdini, has been traveling over the country "exposing" mediums for many years—and making a nice living by peddling her "findings" to a wide variety of magazines and newspapers from pulp to *Post*.

We won't go into the contents of the Mackenberg article in too much detail—we're sure our readers are all too familiar with it and others of its kind. Miss Mackenberg describes visits she made to various mediums and how she has tested them and found them wanting. Her method is to represent herself as a bereaved person and ask to communicate with non-existent spirits by posing names of fictitious husbands or mythical service men. Her test itself is a deception. As we see it, it's a case of pot calls kettle black!

Any lay person reading the article would receive the impression that all Spiritualist mediums are fakes, frauds, and charlatans. Miss Mackenberg gives many examples of cheats she says she has encountered, labeling them "medium" and "spiritualist."

Well, let's give Rose Mackenberg the benefit of the doubt. After all, a girl has to eat, and Spiritualist-baiting is a popular sport. Magazines pay well for it. So let's assume Miss Mackenberg has encountered fake mediums masquerading as "spiritualists" and out to make a fast buck. Let's assume she submits her articles to magazines such as the Post in good faith —that she sells her articles by presenting provable facts to the editors, we will have to assume also! So far, we haven't read about them! The articles are built on generalities. Miss Mackenberg does not. at any time, name names or give place and date where and when her so-called exposes occured!

Why not? Surely she and the editors of the *Post* are not afraid of libel suits? If, as Rose Mackenberg says, she has "exposed" these fake mediums, she must have sworn records to back up her statements. Who were the witnesses? Why are their names not given?

At one point in her story in the Post, Miss Mackenberg describes a seance with "A woman whom I'll call Mrs. Eva Knarf, which is not, of course, her real name." Why won't Miss Maskenberg give the real name? Could it be that Miss Mackenberg, supposedly bent on scientific debunking, was so careless as to not make a point of liming up factual evidence and sworn witnesses? Later on in her article Miss Mackenberg describes how she was instrumental in causing the arrest of a fake medium and how "this time the proof was sufficient"—he was found guilty of fraud and sentenced to jail. There, again. no name—although there can be no danger of libel if the case is a matter of court record.

And the *Post is* receiving such letters from those who want the truth to be told. We have in our offices carbon copies of many letters sent to the *Post* in protest against the Mackenberg article—including many from members of other denominations. Such letters, however, seem so far to have no effect on the editors. None have been published!

A letter sent to the *Post* by H. A. Crow, Kent, Ill., said in part: "What she (Miss Mackenberg) received from this article in your paper could hardly be called 'hay' and at the expense of 20 million who know the truth of spirit return even though they are not all known as Spiritualists. Many are members of other denominations. You have an article from the atheist point of view, now why not one from the Spiritualist?"

Spiritualism is a legally recognized religion.

The reason we are so interested in Miss Mackenberg's failure to name names is not that we don't realize she may have encountered some fakes. The reason we want the facts is that, to your editor's knowledge, *Rose Mackenberg has* never attended a seance where a recognized Spiritualist medium was the instrument! But how can that be proved when the complete data is never made public? How, until we know whom Miss Mackenberg has "investigated." can the general public separate the wheat from the chaff?

The editors of the *Post* (we like to think due to honest ignorance, have presented this article in a way that reflects on the sincerity and integrity of the entire Spiritualist movement. Oh, there are a few protective phrases such as "Is there any medium who can call up the dead . . . There may be . . . " (but) "I have never met any." These are sufficient to protect both author and publisher from libel suits. They are also tokens of "open-mindedness" to be referred to

when the complaints from those unjustly wronged by implication start pouring in to the Post offices.

It has just as much right to a fair, unbiased press as Catholicism. Presbyterianism. or Christian Science, just as random examples. Yet, time after time, articles such as "I've Unmasked A Thousand Frauds" appear in the press to fling mud at it.

True enough, no barbs are shot at the denomination itself, because "spiritualism" is spelled with a small "s" and those protective little phrases are dropped in occasionally-but the inference is there in the mind of the public! The



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
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It Happened at Chesterfield Extraordinary Psychic Experiences (1950)

Year after year, since acquiring knowledge of Spiritualism, I have recounted psychic phenomena experienced especially at seances. Some of these articles were included as chapters in the compilation of my book "Adventures In Survival". Now, with the book published, the events continue to transpire and I participate and enjoy them as ever.

Frankly, when I visited Camp Chesterfield, near the end of June, 1950, for the opening of the summer season. I expected somewhat of a repetition of former experiences. Matters of personal corroboration are not usually included in my writing. I anticipated making but few notes for I thought that there would be insufficient new material to warrant complete articles.

I arrived with some personal concern, being troubled about a nephew's illness. Other personal matters also perplexed me. However. I knew if I could be helped, I would receive the needed advice and guidance. I was, therefore, prepared to relax and enjoy a very much required change of pace. I thought a few weeks would afford a metamorphosis for me and scarcely expected to spend the entire summer camp season at Chesterfield. But I did!

On the day of my arrival, while walking about the grounds. I was summoned to the Sunflower Hotel. I thought it was for a long distance telephone call. As I came towards the entrance to the Camp where the hotel is situated, I was hailed by the genial gatekeeper and introduced to a gentleman who had arrived by car. He said that Rev. Mable Riffle, executive director of the Camp, had asked him to locate me. The sum and substance of it was that he was in charge of the state service for the Indianapolis Times Newspaper and had asked for a story of several



hundred words on the opening of the summer camp.

I submitted the story later and asked if | could obtain the paper containing the article after it was printed. The Camp is located an hour and a half's ride from Indianapolis and newspapers were difficult to obtain. I thought then that others might also be interested to read Camp news. Therefore, I ar-

ranged that a number of papers be delivered as he made his route to the towns nearby.

With the co-operation of the affable gatekeeper, the sale of papers was undertaken. The gentleman in charge of circulation for the State then informed me that a daily write-up of the happenings and news items on the Camp would be acceptable and that the papers would be delivered regularly. This seemed an opportunity too great to pass up and arrangements were made accordingly.

The interesting part about this was that prior to leaving Chicago for Camp Chesterfield I had inquired of Chicago papers as to whether they would he interested in stories about the Camp. Some of the editors whom I knew, were out of town. and the others did not indicate their willingness to co-operate.

In previous years, the Camp had had difficulty in securing the right kind of coverage anywhere except in Spiritualist papers. If a reporter could ridicule or distort the happenings. then that was considered news.

The town of Anderson, near by, did not find that the events at the Camp warranted even religious news writeups. Only when a woman had previously sold some stories of "exposure" and other wild accounts. was there ever anything printed about the Camp.

It was a delightful surprise to find, in the papers delivered to the Camp, my story about it and its mediums. This story, a column long, even occupied front page position. Since all the papers, left for distribution were quickly bought up, it now became a daily task to furnish a day-by-day story for the entire two months of the Camp season.

The first story featured the opening of the 67th Convention with its flag-raising ceremony. Information on the visit of the Boston Harp Duo Artists, Gladys & Kenneth Custance, was printed on the front page. Both are not only Spiritualists but mediums and message bear-They head a church in ers. Boston besides carrying on professional musical careers.

Rev. Genevra Peet, a featured inspirational speaker, was given a write-up, so also was Rev. Maud Kline, missionary-at-large

for the National Spiritualist Association, who came to the Camp for several weeks' stay.

Philosophy classes led by the mediums Rev. James Laughton and Rev. Eddie Mackey; the daily classes taught by Rev. Marta Wittkowski Mallory; and the Forum by Rev. Clara Medcalf, we all included.

Austin Wallace was a named featured speaker. Juliette Ewing Pressing received several notices for her lecture work and participation in the annual "Etta Bledsoe Day" program. Rev. Mallory, the gifted opera singer and the organ music of Exie Hardy added greatly to the program.

Vesper Services and most mediums, lecturers and message bearers were featured. Dr. B. F. Clark and Dollie Clark received good publicity since they were local Indianapolis folk, as did also Rev. Van Mier.

The public materializations offered through Rev. Fanchion Harwood and Rev. Lula Taber; the demonstration of card writing by Rev. Mary Langley Beattie as well as the public apport demonstrations were, however, omitted. Whatever the reason, and however, co-operative the *Indianapolis Times* proved to be, I personally regret, that these notable demonstrations of physical phenomena were not included.

They did publish my articles about painting - on - silk by Charles Swann and the public demonstrations of Rev. Clifford Bias with trumpet-in-the-light. The publicity ran fairly regularly on each day's events until the end of Camp when the annual meeting and election of officers closed the season.

Rev. Mabel Riffle, secretary since 1911, and her remarkable independent - voice work was written up, so also was the billet work of Rev. Edith Stilwell and Rev. Mamie Schulz, as well as the latter's leadership in class work. Col. John D. Johnson. Gordonville, Virginia, a former major under General John J. Pershing in France. was mentioned as a distinuished visitor to the Camp.

Dr. H. F. Miller, Odessa,

Texas, and the remarkable story surrounding the manifestation of his daughter Helen, her organ playing and singing, received good coverage, though I was disappointed that the glosses of the pictures which were printed in the *Psychic Observer*, and which we had permission to use, were omitted.

A dozen times or more the stories made front page news. On the Etta Bledsoe Day, when the late famous medium is heard through the mediumship of Rev. James Laughton of Detroit. in independent voice at a public demonstration, one of the outstanding camp events, the story was carried over the wires of the United Press. Small wonder that it made news! The extra-ordinary program included talks by Franklin Delano

Roosevelt Harry Houdini, and Billy Sunday. (See Psychic Observer, Oct. 10, 1950.)

It was arranged that the Incianapolis Times send photographers to take pictures of the Camp and its grounds. A group picture of all the mediums available posed at the Trail of Religions. This "Trail" is a magnificent monument to the religions of the world. It is an unique, artistic, and meaningful structure -- nothing like it ever before having been erected in the world.


The Auditorium was also

photographed whilst services were being held. One service that day was the public seance for Independent Spirit Drawings through Rev. Maud Fox and Rev. Loretta Schmitt. Their pictures were especially selected for inclusion. These pictures were posed in the beautiful new home of Rev. Schmitt. The photographer prefessed an action shot and suggested that they hold something to read. They selected the *Psychic Observer* at the table beside them and held it up so that the name of the paper was quite discernible in the printed picture.


At the camp alone, over 500 papers of this Sunday edition were sold. It was also distributed all over the State. It, too, was the edition that was sent to all of the 37 other Scripps-Howard papers in the syndicate, and was the one selected as exchange with other papers. This feature story with three large pictures covering the top half of the paper, made important news. The caption used for it was "Devotional Services."

It may be mentioned in this family paper for Spiritualists that because it was Saturday with no article pick-up on Sunday, I had to submit the Sunday and Monday stories together. Though carefully marked, a mixup occurred and the accompanying story was not on the pictures portrayed. That story was in another paper. The reading public was not disconcerted about it for the story, so far as they were concerned, was apropos. It related to the news that a Spiritualist, Clemencia A. Traverso, Bay View. Catano, Puerto Rico, had made a five-day journey by air to the camp.

The purpose in relating this account of publicity is to indicate to other camps and Spiritualist groups that, if conveyed as dignified news and reported as religion. Spiritualism can become as important of coverage as other news in some papers. True, it requires a trained person to handle this type of publicity. Language, spelling, punc-

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tuation should be correct. There should be gen cralnews value to the storics. Where, a church utilizes raffles, card parties, and other such such such activities I believe such stories should not be included.

Would it not be better to educate our Spin jualists to give a tithe and whole heartedly rather than utilize what some orthodos churches have capitalized on? Thore are other types of social gatherings that could well be employed, such as book reviews, related films, dinners, luncheous, to as or brunches, and especially church services with integra ted psychic phenomena.

Since we regard Spiritualism as religion only the highest type of service and observance should be tolerated. Every church codes well establish a book, pamphatet and magazine table as an extructional feature. At some camps, such as at Camp Chesterfield, and elsewhere the book shop is a valuable adjunct to the camp. Let not Televiston entertainment rival book knowledge in timeconsuming insterest!

It is made a ware in some circles that we may be entering upon a period of religious revival. Spiritualists should actively engage in forwarding their cause. Some amongst us find it expedient to hide "behind the bushel basket," the rest should widely proclaim that Spiritualism is truth, knowledge, science, philosophy and religion which presages a new era for mankind.

Materialis m here meets its most dreade d foe. Spiritualism is at the heart of every religion. If the Liberty Bell rings in our land, right ousness and truth must also peal forth. Education is the path way. For the past century, scientists have verified many of the claims of Spiritualism. Now the believer and knower in the masses must proclaim it. Mediums must ever make progress, not alone in the all-important mediumship; they must also understand their own cause and not lose themselves in their work and cater only to

those who want to know their future.

If all who KNOW Spiritualism would band together and be counted, upholding their

The Temple of 500 MEDIUMS By

James Crenshaw

Author of "Telephone Between Worlds"

It is hard to believe that in one center there would be more than 500 trance mediums.

Yet in Mexico City there is such a center. In fact, I saw 100 mediums in trance at one time! All were healers, whose controls worked through their trance state to provide tangible help for the hundreds and thousands who came to this remarkable place for help.

The center is known as el Templo de la Fe (the Temple of Faith), located in the San Simon colony of the Mexican capital, and while healing—on a scale perhaps never dreamed of in other centers—is one of the outstanding activities, the philosophical teachings, which attract more thousands to regular lectures, are considered the more important manifestations brought through key mediums.

The mediums or *facultades* are drawn from every walk of life, and practically every trade and profession are represented among those who contribute their efforts to the temple's activities. No one receives a fee. That is forbidden. All which is done is truly a work of love, with those who are well-to-do and those who are poor contributing in like measure to the work of the center.

It was not an accident that my wife and I found *el Temple de la Fe.* We were led there. In a sense, it was by a devious route, but we were nonetheless led. It happened this way:

At the entrance to the famous basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in the Villa de Guadalupe of Mexico City, there are many venders of souvenirs for the tourists and other visitors who flock there each day. Among these *vendedores* was a little, wizened, poorly dressed man, whose specialty was the silver medallions which honor the Blessed Virgin.

Sometimes he also sells tickets for the national lottery, and on this particular late afternoon, with rain beginning to fall from darkening skies, he approached an uncle of my wife and begged him to buy the last of a sheet of lottery chances so that he could go home for the day.

Now, there are many such venders in Mexican cities, and one ordinarily ignores them unless really interested in their wares. Sellers of lottery tickets are especially numerous and besiege one in every public place.

But for some reason, my wife's Uncle Maurice was moved (he later could not explain why) to buy the one crumpled ticket the little man held out to him. By now the rain was falling briskly, and they took shelter in the dark doorway of the cathedral to complete the exchange.

As if on impulse, the little man suddenly held out what appeared to be a silver trinket. He said in Spanish, "Take this and keep it with you always. It will protect you from evil." Then, as if by explanation, he said he was connected with a temple or center where thousands met daily and where many marvelous things were done, such as the curing of ill persons of all kinds of-ailments.

He did not seem to know exactly why he had chosen Maurice for this honor and this explanation. Or, at least, it was not clear at the moment to Maurice. I, of course, knew nothing of the incident until we all returned to our hotel that night, and Maurice related what had happened. I examined the silver "charm," which turned out to be a small edition of one of the medallions on a chain, though perhaps more delicately and artfully made. That was not important. I knew immediately that I must find the little man

who gave it for I had heard of this center before and had wondered how I was going to locate it.

The next day we returned to the cathedral. Maurice disappeared in the direction of the venders' booths, but reported a short time later that he could find no trace of *el pequeno* (the small one). He did not have a booth of his own, but simply sold what he could by standing in front of the basilica or wandering from place to place. I urged Maurice to try again.

Finally. as we were about to give up Maurice appeared with a dark. slight, poorly dressed Mexican. dangling strings of silver medallions from one hand. This was. said Maurice, *Senor* Abrahan Albarez. He was. I would say, around 60. and only about five feet tall.

A stubbly, grizzled beard emphasized the creases in his dark, weather-beaten cheeks. Deep blue, powerfully penetrating eyes searched out the meaning of my mission from beneath the brim of a faded native straw hat.

He apologized for his tattered clothes. "I was meant to be

poor in this lifetime," he said in Spanish-the Spanish, incidentally, of an educated man.

I told him in my own halting Spanish that I wanted to visit the center, and finally it was arranged that my wife and I should go with him the following day, which we did.

He met us at the basilica again -- he said he had spent all of his life in the shadow of this famous cathedral—and we went by bus to *el Templo de la Fe*. We had been joined, meantime. by a tall, lean, also strawhatted friend of *Senor* Albarez, introduced to us as *Senor* Pedro Montero.

He, it was, who impressed us with the unique functions of the temple. This center was not merely a place for personal communication, he said, though that was possible once each year, but for spiritual development and the spiritual uplift of all mankind. Healing through spiritual means was a part of the overall plan to prepare for a new dispensation, a coming age of peace and harmony. This center, we were given to understand, was a kind of "New Jerusalem" of the western hemisphere, presided over by the Prophet Elias (Elijoh) and supported, in the body, by modern incarnations of the Children of Israel.

We entered a grayish-green stucco building through a labyrinth of small outer courtyards. One would hardly suspect from the outside that an auditorium large enough for more than 1000 people was built here.

Beside the main door inside one of the courtyards was a sign. reading in part:

"Esta casa fue construida por sus propietarios los esposos Senores Jose Pacheco y Carmen P. de Pacheco sin ayuda pecunaria de nadie..."

Translated. the message in full was:

"This house was constructed by its owners. Senor Jose Pacheco and his wife. Senora Carmen P. de Pacheco, without pecuniary help from anyone. Exclusively for the spreading of the Spiritualist Doctrine, having been ordered the 9th of January, 1923, and the studies beginning on the 1st of September, 1925. Mexico, D.F."

Another sign translated told us:

"Our major satisfaction is to serve the humble and if you wish to reward us descend from greatness to humility."

At each door we passed through, we had to be approved by the one stationed there for that purpose. Our two hosts made the necessary explanations, and finally we were introduced to *Senor* Jose Pacheco Dominguez himself. He was a large, tall man with graying hair, whose smile and handshake had the warmth and vigor of a morning in early spring.

This was *el guia*, the principal "guide" of the temple, who had built this place with his own hands and those of his friends and had devoted his life to it without any kind of payment whatever.

We passed among small knots of people waiting in the courtyards into the main assembly hall. There we who are used to strange sights and incredible phenomena saw perhaps the strangest sight of all our varied experiences: not less than 100 *facultades* or mediumistic heal-



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ers each in a deep trance, lined up along one wall, ministering to the needs of long lines of supplicants.

In the main part of the auditorium were benches to accommodate those waiting and, as was explained later, for the hundreds and thousands who at various times attend the catedras or lectures given through selected trance mediums.

Those waiting to interview los facultades included all types -men. women, children. Some were well dressed. Many were not. A few wore no shoes. Others carried bundles. Obviously they had come by from their marketing. Mothers with babies were seen frequently.

There was a line in front of each healer, with others waiting on the nearby benches. As the spiritual treatment was given, the *facultad* patted the face and body of the suffering one to administer the healing power, at the same time emitting a hissing sound. This was explained as being a part of the procedure to drive away negative forces around the individual being treated. The intermittent hissing of all the lacultades produced a sibilant chorus. both eerie and awesome.

During the treatments, the entities manifesting through the mediums spoke constantly, advising, encouraging and recommending other measures of treatment to be undertaken between visits to the temple. Assistants stood by with jars of balsam or charged water, attractively scented, which was sprinkled on the patients at the conclusion of the treatments.

Both mediums will be featured.

We were told that each *[acultad* had a single control who took over during the trance state and was in charge of the healing procedure for that particular medium.

Like the people they ministered to, the facultades seemed to represent all walks of life, and Senor Pacheco told us that many professional men and women, including architects, lawyers, engineers and even a few medical doctors were among those on the staff of the temple.

"But," he added, "when they enter here, they leave their titles at the door, for they come to the temple to continue their spiritual studies and to be servers of humanity."

All in the temple are "hermanos" (brothers and sisters) with equal status. as far as worldly qualities are concerned. but exhibiting different degrees of spiritual advancement.


All give their services freely, and a sign on one of the walls below the great wooden beams that extended across the auditorium reminds everyone:

"It is not necessary to leave money here. Receive charity and teach yourself to do charity on your way."

At the front of the hall was a raised platform, a portion of which was set off with a gold curtain. An ornate, tall-backed chair was provided for which ever medium might be chosen to act as the channel for the catedras or lectures from high teachers. A kind of altar, banked with flowers, also was provided. Above the flowers was a painting of the symbol of mystic orders everywhere, the "all-seeing eye" - the eye of clear-seeing, of inner vision and universal wisdom.

Also on the platform was a huge porcelain container for the main supply of balsam in the healing.

We were told the doors of the temple were closed at a certain hour, so that the healers could conclude their work with those still waiting. As the last of the

ones being treated made their way to the mediums-some accompanied by friends or relatives who took notes on the advice given - the murmuring, hissing babble of sounds ended.

Senor Pacheco then cleared the center section, and the mediums took places on the benches. There, in trance, with eyes closed they sat for a little time as if in meditation. When we asked what they were doing we were told:

"Se sientan a dar luz." (They are sitting to give light.)

At each service it was explained the mediums devote part of their time in trance to 'give light" to spirits of darkness in the astral world. Their ministry, therefore, is not confined merely to those on this side of life, but include unfortunates in the other world as well.

At a command from Senor Pacheco, the meditation ended. and the facultades began brushing themselves with their hands, shaking the hands vigorously at the end of each stroke. This was designed to brush away foreign or negative vibrations which might be clinging to their auras as a result of their work with many low type forces it was explained.

I recognized these gestures as being precisely the same as those used for the same purpose by certain of the trance teachers through Rev. Richard Zenor of Los Angeles - again emphasizing the universality of mediumistic practices.

We were now invited by el guia to accompany him to the platform. He spoke a word, and all of the mediums arose. They were still in trance, eyes closed. As they remained there, virtually motionless, Senor Pacheco turned to us and remarked in Spanish that they would continue in that state until he gave the command for them to come out of the trance. This he did, and we were treated to the remarkable experience of watching some 100 mediums emerging from deep trance simultaneously. They all did so with the typical gestures and movements which we had seen hundreds of times in the case of Mr. Zenor and other trance mediums.

Suddenly I realized the true function of Senor Pacheco. I should have recognized it before, because from the beginning he was introduced as the chief guide (guia). He was, it became plain. a "doorkeeper" in the flesh for all of these mediums, just as surely as other trance mediums have their chief guides or doorkeepers in spirit.


For instance in the case of Richard Zenor, the doorkeeper is a Navajo Indian, known as "Dr. Navajo." It is his duty to see that the medium is properly protected and directed during his trance state.

But in el Temple de la Fe, where all the mediums fit into an integrated plan and program, it is only logical that one 'doorkeeper" should be in charge of the entire group of facultades. And obviously, in . view of the mass activity carried on. it was logical and necessary that the chief doorkeeper be one of this world, rather than of the spirit world, as is true of most mediums who work independently.

By this time, heavy rain was falling on the roof of the temple, and following the singing of a closing song-a beautiful, rousing number, written especially for the temple-we were invited to remain until the weather cleared. This gave us an opportunity to ask Senor Pacheco and other members of the staff a little about the history of the center.

The temple itself goes back to 1923, but before then Senor Pacheco himself was a student at the original center founded in 1866 by a former Catholic priest. Roque Rojas, who discovered the possibilities of mediumship through a young girl called Damiana Oviedo. Because of his activity, he was forced to leave the church, but made contact with spiritual teachers who were to direct the activities of the movement down through the years.

Gradually, other mediums were developed under the direction of these teachers and in 1923 Senor Pacheco received what he says was a "call" to establish the center known as el Templo de la Fe. He and Senora Carmen P. de Pacheco devoted almost all of their time and energy to its construction and to the work carried on there, without compensation.

Senor Pacheco receives his income by working two 24-hour shifts each week as a "director of water and sanitation" for Mexico City. The remainder of his time is spent at the temple.

Mediums have been developed through special courses, which require them to be entirely self-sacrificing and devoted to the principles of the temple. In fact, they must sign a statement upon undertaking their spiritual studies that they will not receive any payment for their services but must always undertake hacer la caridad (to do charity). Classes de desarrollo (development classes) for over 275 at a time are conducted regularly.

(P-811) The staff of the temple, as explained during our visit, included 67 *pedestales* or mediums, who deliver *catedras* or lectures in trance. From 1000 to 1500 persons attend these lectures, according to the accurate figures kept at the temple.

The *facultades*, defined as mediums who in trance give conferences explaining the philosophical content of the lectures and who also do the curing, numbered 518.

In addition, there were 10 videntes or seers, including Senora Pacheco, who have been shown to possess definite clairvoyant ability.

Other members of the staff included 56 columnas (columns), whose duty was to keep order, and nine plumas de oro (golden pens), who were the stenographers charged with compiling the lectures as given.

Before we left this remarkable place, we had another demonstration that our visit was no coincidence but was apparently a part of a design and plan. Among those who explained the temple's activities to us was *Senorita* Esther Garcia, who spoke excellent English. During our conversations with her, she mentioned that another visitor from Los Angeles had been to the temple previously, and asked if I knew "Rose R"

Later I found that Rose, too, had been guided to *el Templo de la Fe* in an almost incredible manner.


She said she had been searching in Mexico City for some type of spiritual center, so that she might see how mediumship was carried on there. No one seemed able to help her.

One day, she was attempting to find the Mexican office of the company which employed her in Los Angeles. She and a friend asked several passers-by to direct her to the address given, but none spoke English well enough to be of any real assistance.

Before he left, Rose said she again was "impelled" to ask this man the same question she had been asking so many others without result: Did he know of any spiritual center she might visit during her stay in the capital?





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
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Always signing himself "Yours truly, Parrot. Wildcat." *W. J. Colville*, was, during his lifetime, one of the chief notabilities in the psychic world, also one of the most unique personalities. He occupied a niche in the temple of famous psychics peculiarly his own ..., Possessing super-abounding vitality and sparkling humor derived from his frank enjoyment in his own mild eccentricities.

When Colville visited the office of London's *Psychic Gazette* shortly before his passing, the editor had an opportunity to interview him. By leading questions, there was extracted from him the following autobiographic story and confession:

"I am a cosmopolitan of mixed nationality, I began my lecturing when I was a mere kitten. At seventeen years of age, I went to America and lectured throughout the Eastern States. I returned to England a few years latter and then journeyed to California at twenty-two where I had some success. I lectured on a great variety of subjects: religious, philosophical, sociological and psychic phenomena.

"I had no particular training. I was educated at an ordinary preparatory school. I reckon my knowledge comes to me largely through spiritual.illumination. I rarely meditate. I believe in concentration.

"If anyone gives me a subject to speak upon or write about, my discourse unwinds itself while I speak or write, but not previously. I lecture frequently on subjects presented to me when on the platform.

From my fiftcenth year. I have been able to give improruptu verses on subjects called out by the audience or sent to the platform. I weave a poem embodying all the subjects mentioned, without even knowing what the next line will be. Some of these poems have been published. They are nearly always correct in rhythm, and some have a good deal of substance, while others have but little. Different influences inspire them. In regard to the many subjects offered, I make no effort to remember them.

"As an author I cannot tell you how many hooks 1 have written; there are probably twenty of considerable size, and a large number of smaller works. My books unwind themselves in the same way as my speeches. formerly "The American Foundation for Psychic Research, Inc."

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W. J. COLVILLE

(William Wilberforce Juneval Colville)

Poet, Author, Lecturer, Seer, Prophet, Philanthropist

October 6th, 1856-January 15th, 1917

"One of my most congenial occupations is book-reviewing, of which I have done a great deal. That is considered one of my strong points. Because I can grasp the substance of a book in a very short time, and give a very fair account of it.

"I might be described as a hard logician. (Do put that down, please, for I like that!) I have a considerable amount of kind-heartedness, but only a very little of what the world commonly calls sympathy. I have a very strong sense of justice, and positively demand fair play for others equally with myself. That could be viewed as a strong point in my character.

"I have a natural gift for conceiving and delineating character, so that I can write novels with great case, and make the characters thoroughly alive. That is natural to me. My novels have had a fair sale in America.

"I can write a book of fair size in two weeks, without mental or physical discomfort, sitting eight hours a day at a typewriter, provided I have no other occupation at the time. I never re-write anything, but I carefully correct my own copy. When I have to write a novel I never plan a plot: I never know what is coming, and I am much interested in its development as if I were reading another person's work, and yet every character is to me a living reality.

"I firmly believe that most descriptive writers are in close communion with other entities, so that their minds blend in such near union that it is almost impossible to decide where one begins and the other leaves off. I would call it psychic collaboration. I think that is general experience. I can realize the characters, whether commonplace or superior, while I am writing; I feel I am in company with them as much as if they were with me in the same house."

Most of the books written by W. J. Colville were published many years ago by a New York firm.
