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International Spiritualist Congress to be held at STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN September 1st to 9th, inclusive

The Ninth International Spiritualist Federation World Congress will start Saturday, September 1st, in Stockholm, Sweden, according to Rolf Carleson.

Upon the opening day, business sessions are scheduled morning and afternoon and in the evening of the first day (September 1st) a banquet "Dinner of Welcome," will be held at the Community Hall where the address of welcome will be delivered by David Bedbrook, General Secretary of the International Spiritualist Federation, London.

Arrangements have been made for all visitors to headquarter at Hotel Malmen in the city of Stockholm. Individual reservations should be made by letter direct to the hotel.

Business sessions will continue morning and afternoon throughout the days of the Congress and each evening, lectures and public demonstrations will be held in the Community Hall.

The committee for entertainment has arranged excursions for the visitors and individuals requiring service on the railways will be allowed a 25% reduction by filling in the proper forms upon their arrival.

Most of the papers submitted for reading, and all of the business sessions and transactions

will be given in English as well as Swedish either verbally or by furnishing English translations, currently.

Charles Victor Miller, known by his American friends as Victor Miller, was born in Nancy, France. His fame as a materialization medium began in San Francisco where he was occupied as a dealer in old pictures and Japanese art.

A detailed description of his phenomena is covered in Willie Reichel's "Occult Experiences" in which there is a record of outstanding physical phenomena, under unique conditions.

Reichel specifically states that the medium stood outside the cabinet whilst forms materialized.

All of these demonstrations took place in the early 1900's (1904-1908) and during that time, Miller demonstrated his unusual powers in all parts of Europe, especially France where records show his last public seance was held in 1908.

Spiritualist literature in those days include hundreds of thousands of words dealing in technical terms, all propounded by eminent psychic researchers of that day: Gabriel Delanne, C. de Vesme, Mme. Noegerath, Gaston Mery, Charles Blech, Leon Dennis, Baron de Watteville, Paul Lemarie, M. W. Bormann and Dr. Joseph Maxwell.

During the days when Miller was demonstrating his phenomena, (barring no one) the usual controversies arose. Prominent men differing violently with each other even as they do today.

The greatest tribute to Miller's mediumship appears in "Annals of Psychic Science," No. 21, 1906 in which deVesme declares "the genuineness of Miller's mediumship."

In his latter days, when Miller operated an antique shop in New York City, thousands flocked to his seances. Not one penny was accepted and those fortunate enough to view the phenomena were privileged.

Victor passed away in New York City several years ago.

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**Hindustani Spoken Through
California Trance Medium**

Hindustani, the native language of millions of the inhabitants of India, is a difficult enough language in its modern form, but when a visitor to Rev Richard Zenor's Agasha Temple of Wisdom in Los Angeles heard a voice through this medium speaking in an apparently ancient form of Hindustani, he was impressed.

The visitor was Herman Myer, now of 225 Loma Drive, Los Angeles, an industrial chemist, who some years ago had traveled throughout India as a chemist for the sugar industry.

He attended one of Rev. Zenor's regular public services at the Agasha Temple on a recent Sunday evening and, among the other voices which manifested through the trance medium, he heard that of a teacher known as Judamar.

Judamar at these services conducts a short healing proce-

dure and, in that connection, recites a chant or prayer. After hearing this prayer, Mr. Myer wrote the following letter to Mr. Zenor.

"It is with pleasure and gratitude that I confirm my conversation of yesterday with you. I have been several years in India and had to speak the native Hindustani and Urdu tongues,

as often I was the only white man on a sugar plantation.

"I recognized clearly one of the speakers coming through your mediation speaking Hindustani, although of a somewhat different character than that I used to hear, possibly more ancient.

"It would have been hardly possible for any one but a native of India to talk in this way, with the intonation and accent and melody used quite impossible to come from an American or European person."

Silver Birch Speaks!

This is a story about a home circle which has become famous. It is called HANNEN SWAFFER'S HOME CIRCLE. The spirit guide in charge is SILVER BIRCH, whose simple yet profound eloquence has been acclaimed by thousands in many lands.

The trance medium, a non-professional, prefers to remain anonymous. His view is that his identity does not matter and that only the guide's teachings are important. The circle has been visited by Juliette and Ralph Pressing, editors of this Journal

The account that follows is based on the transcribed verbatim notes recorded by an expert stenographer, a member of the Circle. There had been invited a man who had come from South Africa. He is an Old Spiritualist who declares that his footsteps have been guided for many years.

As usual, the Circle was opened with a prayer from Silver Birch, who said:

"Let us strive to attune ourselves to the highest that we can reach. Let us attempt to fill ourselves with some of the divine love. Let us approach the author of all being.

"Oh Great White Spirit, Thou who hast created us in the image of Thy spirit and whose life is our life and whose love sustains us and whose laws guide us, we desire to draw close to Thee and garner some of Thy wisdom to help us on our eternal pilgrimage.

"We do not approach Thee with fear in our hearts, cringing on bended knee and prostrating and abasing ourselves. Rather do we seek to come to Thee with uprightness, with a consciousness that we are Thy children. Thy spirit is within us, and there in nothing in life on earth or beyond that can ever part us from Thee.

"We recognize that Thy infinite law encompasses the whole majestic universe and all that it contains. Nobody is cut off

from Thee. all are accessible to a wealth of love and wisdom which is theirs for the asking when their souls and minds are ready.

"We express our gratitude at the opportunity provided us to pierce the veil which separates too often the two states of life and enables us to return and manifest some of the wisdom and knowledge which we have gained in other spheres of activity. Because we have been enriched we desire that others too should share our privilege, so that it will be an incentive to

them to spread truth and light and knowledge to those who are in need.

"Our task is dedicated to the purpose of service, to reach the largest possible number, to bring them within the orbit of Thy light, out of the shadows and darkness into the glorious sunlight of spiritual freedom. Equipped with knowledge, they can begin to understand the profound purpose of life and order their own activities in such a fashion that they fulfill the purpose of their being. By so doing the world of matter will rid itself of the many diseases, jealousies, selfishnesses, disharmonies, wars and chaos that are pestilential cancers.

"We strive to usher in that greater era in which all will recognize that they are parts of

Thee and of one another, and build their systems of life accordingly, living in peace, amity and concord. This is the prayer of Thy Indian servant who seeks always to serve."

Then came the guide's usual greeting:

"I am very happy to come amongst you and to bring you my love and greetings from the world of spirit."

This was followed by a greeting to visitor:

"I am happy to have the privilege of welcoming into our midst a new friend, one who is not a stranger to the truths of the spirit, who has traveled the path and has reached a stage of awareness where much is being revealed. I want you to feel very welcome here, to regard yourself as one of our family circle so that in the short time at our disposal we can perhaps learn from one another.

"Son, it is a long road that you have traveled, a road where the milestones marked many decisive stages. But you know that you are guided by love that seeks to use you in the great plan. Now you can look back and see that even what appeared to be very dark shadows were essential elements in the great plan. It was only by casting away apparent security of the material and following implicitly the promptings of the spirit that you could fulfill the role that that you must play. You understand to what I refer?"

"I do indeed," was the reply. "Thank you, I appreciate what you have said."

"My son, do not thank me, thank the Great Spirit," said guide. "We are merely His ambassadors striving to reveal His love, His wisdom and His knowledge. It is a privilege to serve. There is no joy comparable with it. The task you are to perform before you lay down your physical body is a significant one. Much has been revealed to you, stage by stage.

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There is much more to be done; you have caught glimpses; the full light, the complete illumination, has not yet descended on you. This requires slow development and spiritual progress before it can be yours. You understand me?"

"I do, yes," came the answer.

"You have asked yourself many times what is the purpose of all this," the guide added.

"I feel that there is a purpose," said the visitor. "I have not questioned the purpose. I am particularly anxious to see a little light that will illumine the path a little further."

"You know—perhaps you do, I am not sure—you are an old soul. This is not the first time you have trod this path. Do you know that?"

"I have had awareness of something in that respect, but it conflicts with certain other ideas that I have which I will not touch on at the moment."

"I know about your conflict," the guide told him. "That can easily be resolved. That is the conflict between this aspect of consciousness which is functioning in your present existence and the larger aspect behind which is part of your larger existence. Do you follow me?"

"I follow that."
"In certain states, when you have withdrawn yourself from the world and, as the Bible says, you have been filled with the power of the spirit, your soul has come into its own and you have felt that touch with the larger self, as it has clamored for recognition, beating in on the senses of your body.

"As to the purpose, it is the great purpose that activates and motivates all those who return from our world and who belong to those groups who are dedicated to the task of serving mankind. It is to cast the bread of knowledge upon the sea of ignorance, to hold the light so that souls in darkness can see its rays, to indicate a haven and sanctuary for those who have lost their way, for the troubled in mind and spirit who seek peace.

"It is a great purpose which unites us all and makes us one.

It is a purpose that is greater than all the differences of body, of race, of nationality, of religion. And you have your part—your special part—to play in this plan, and you have helped many."

"I am very grateful to you for explaining the matter as you have," said the visitor.

"There are two problems that confront us," added the guide. "One is to awaken slumbering souls to the task they have to perform; the other is to hold in check those who are awakened, for they desire to rush when the power of the spirit must discipline itself according to the laws which make its flow possible.

"The Great Spirit is not in a hurry. The universe will not disappear; the laws will not

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change. Be patient and know that what has been revealed to you is an indication of what is still to be revealed to you, and have perfect faith that the love which guides you will not fail you if you are prepared to serve with a full heart."

Invited to ask questions, the visitor said:

"Man I believe is the highest work of Omnipotence, the Creator of the universe, and as such he, in his physical and organic structure, is a microcosmic manifestation of the macrocosm, each formed and functioning without differentiation. Yet what is it that determines and effect the apparent separate personalities of individuals, the numberless types of countenances, expressions, emotions, tendencies, identifiable and re-

cordable differences in each being, embracing degrees of intelligence, mannerisms, voice, aptitude, capacity, etc.?"

Silver Birch answered:

"Do not confuse matter with spirit, or matter with mind. Man is a triune being—obeying the natural laws of the universe. His body obeys the physical laws, his mind, the mental laws, his spirit, the spiritual laws, and all these work in concert with one another. Thus you have laws within laws within laws, sometimes seemingly contradictory, but not in reality, when you have the key which unlocks the riddle.

"Not only are there laws within laws, but each aspect of man's being mingles and merges with other aspects, so that there is a constant interplay of the mental, spiritual and physical forces. There is no sharp dividing line between the three aspects of being.

"The body is obeying the physical law of heredity. The mind is the expression of the spirits as contained by the physical brain and the other physical senses. The expression of spirit in matter is limited by the matter through which it can express itself. Thus there are infinite numbers of variations and permutations of expressions, because the spirit is affecting the body and the body is affecting the spirit so far as its expression is concerned. Does that make it clear?"

"To some extent it does," was the answer. "That will help me very much indeed. Since I believe that man is outborn from his source, the source of all life, are you able to help me to understand what are the stages, and their nature, in the transition of individual man from his origin to this lowest plane of matter, from which I assume that the soul, at the time of its separation from the physical body, ascends in progressive stages through the spheres to ultimate reunion with the Infinite? If this is so, what are the stages and the nature of man's progression hereafter?"

"No I cannot," was the guide's frank answer.

"I cannot express the whole of spiritual life in language which is restricted for its understanding to material things. There is no language capable of explaining fully the infinity of spiritual life. But, very briefly, man is a spirit; the Great Spirit is not a man. The Great Spirit is the primal source of all existence; the Great Spirit is the cause, the supreme architect, the King of Kings.

"Spirit is life and life is spirit. Man, as spirit, has always

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existed; man, as individual spirit, starts his existence with earthly incarnation, so far as this plane is concerned. The purpose of matter is to provide an individual vehicle for spirit and the reason for earthly existence is to help that individuality to unfold.

"Death, which is birth into the spirit life, is the means by which the individuated spirit takes on the second stage of its pilgrimage, that is, to develop, quicken, unfold and to perfect all the innate qualities of spirit, so as to draw closer to the source of all being. Man, being spirit, is potentially perfect as the Great Spirit is perfect. But I do not think that the reunion is achieved in the sense that man is absorbed into the Godhead. Rather do I assert that the processes of development and perfection are as infinite as the Great Spirit is."

"I follow that and I am grateful," the visitor commented. "What you have said on the second question somewhat explains the third, which is as follows:

"Is reincarnation, as expounded by its propagandists, a fact in the operation of the fundamental law governing the destiny of the soul of the individual man? If not, are the individual characteristics and peculiarities in each human being accumulated inheritances from previous births in other states or planes anterior to this, in the course of his descent to earth and prior to transitory incarnation on this lowest plane, from which he ascends on another or opposite path, his progression accelerated or retarded according to his experience and accumulations in all stages of his being?"

To this Silver Birch answered:

"It is not easy to answer in a few sentences questions touching the profundity of existence. First, I must say that I am not clear as to what all the propagandists of reincarnation teach, but speaking for myself, and after all, I have no authority to speak for any other, I assert that reincarnation is a fact. I have no quarrel with those who disagree with me. I have

seen individuals who have previously incarnated into matter. It is done by those who have specific missions to perform, a voluntary act in order to redeem a pledge.

"What incarnates is another of the same individuality, and I do not mean personality. If you visualize man as an individual, who in his earthly life is like an iceberg in which you have one small portion manifesting and the larger portion not manifesting, then that is the end of one incarnation. In a successive incarnation a portion of the submerged self will come into the world of matter—two different personalities, but one individual.

"In spirit life, as progression takes place, it is part of the submerged self that comes to the surface all the time. Do not attempt to understand all that is involved in reincarnation, or judge it with the eyes of matter, but try to see it with the reason that comes from the knowledge of the spirit."

Right at the end, the guide spoke these words:

"Now let us draw close, as close as we can, to that power which fashioned us all, to the Great Spirit of life whose servants we all are, without whom we cannot exist, whose wondrous plan has made provision for each of us, even when we cannot see it. Let us express our gratitude for the many blessings which we have received and most of all for the gift of life itself with all its infinite possibilities.

"Let us count ourselves as fortunate for the knowledge which has been vouchsafed to us, for the majesty and sublimity which we recognize as directing all our activities, and let us strive to be worthy of it so that others may recognize us truly as ministers of the divine.

"Thus shall we qualify for the tasks laid upon our shoulders, acquit ourselves, draw closer and closer to the source of all being and feel the cloak of infinite love and the mantle of infinite wisdom wrapped around us beneath the everlasting arms.

"The Great Spirit bless you all."

My last scheduled engagement for serving Spiritualist churches was in Buffalo, New York, at the John Carlson Memorial Spiritualist Church, 95 Johnson Park, of which Rev. Edith Sandy is pastor.

Briefly, in a large building which was originally designed for fraternity clubs rooms, the John Carlson Memorial Church holds its services. 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William Aldred

For over twelve years, it has been my desire to witness the mediumship of Rev. William Aldred of Muskegon, Michigan, but not until I visited the Independent Spiritualist Association convention at Fort Wayne, did an opportunity present itself.

Several years ago, however, I witnessed Aldred's direct-voice mediumship, demonstrated at a Spiritualist camp under severe conditions. At that time, I was satisfied his work was worthy of favorable comment and so stated in the columns of this journal.

Through the years I heard he possessed outstanding materialization and so, when the opportunity presented itself, I joined a group of some 25 persons who assembled late one evening during the convention at the home of Rev. Violet Rice, pastor of the Undenominational Spiritualist Church of Fort Wayne.

Before the seance began, three men, including myself,

were permitted to examine the medium and relay our findings to the rest of the sitters. We were all satisfied Rev. Aldred was divested of any thing or object before the seance began—and said so.

The red light, used during the seance, was mounted on a camera tripod and as the meeting progressed, the dimness or

ent at a materialization seance and due to the excess number of people occupying the room, a door was left open. I seated myself on a chair in the doorway, thus blocking the entrance.

For some unaccountable reason, I have found that some mediums appear rather nervous when I attend. Whether it is because of my presence, I cannot tell but in any case, I have been told that it seems that during my presence, unusual phenomena invariably takes place.

There is no proof for this statement because I cannot give

brightness of the light was regulated from within the cabinet by Midget, the inimitable spirit collaborator of the medium who, incidentally, seemed to go all out in an effort to bring forth what proved to be startling evidence.

Before the seance opened, the sitters were questioned as to their understanding of the phenomena they were about to witness. Less than half in attendance had ever before been pres-

on the spot descriptions of seances I do not attend but accept statements from others. When these statements are notarized, they stand confirmed as much as any statement presented in a court of law.

No one, regardless of their enthusiasm, or their ability to describe, could present in detail a vivid portrayal of all the phenomena that takes place during a materialization seance—especially when attended by

total strangers (to the writer) whose spirit friends present startling evidence which may not seem so to a casual observer.

Even so, numerous bits of evidence were presented to the sitters in such a way that their authenticity was unquestioned.

For instance, whilst many of the spirit friends were on the floor, all could hear a sharp slap administered to the medium's body by Midget,—proving that said medium was inside the cabinet, whilst the form was manifesting.

I have witnessed other technique proving this point, but this particular procedure was new to me. New also, in my witnessing of like demonstrations, was the fact that many of the forms, whilst out on the floor several feet from the cabinet, would vanish with an audible "swish." To describe this disappearance with the words, "as quick as lightning" will best tell what took place.

All through the demonstration, even though I sat at a distance in the doorway (leaving my chair to block the entrance) I was called up to view the materialized forms. To me the most vivid was a Catholic nun, whose black habit (and there is black ectoplasm) could be plainly seen. This coupled with the fact that the sister possessed a well-modulated voice added much to one's conviction.

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"Who Flies The Kite?"

A Sequel To "Has Spirit A Science?"

"Has Spirit a science?" asked the Rev. Dr. Thomas F. Opie, D.D., Great Barrington, Mass., in his address at the banquet, held in the Masonic Temple, Jamestown, N. Y., March 31st, celebrating the 103rd Anniversary of the Spiritualist Movement in America.

In introducing the speaker of the evening, Juliette Ewing Pressing said: "Another milestone along the way is the fact that we have with us a most distinguished gentleman who, throughout his entire life, has served the cause of Christ and taught the beautiful teachings of Christ. He did this fine work under the banner of the Episcopal Church and they, of course, are rather closely allied to us insofar as thought is concerned. He has spent many years in the newspaper field and he was at one time, associate editor of the organ for the Episcopal Church, known as *The Churchman*, which is the oldest religious journal published in the English language."

After a brief historic look at the events surrounding the famed Fox Sisters' psychic experiences at Hydesville (1848), the speaker asked, "How old is Spiritualism?" He said that it was possibly as old as man himself, going back to Joan of Arc, back to John on the Isle of Patmos, where this disciple of Jesus received, psychically, while in a trance ("in the spirit") from the "Seven Spirits," the mysterious symbolic messages known to the civilized world for a bit under two thousand years as the Book of Revelation.

He referred also to the psychic episode of "The Transfiguration," observed annually on August 6 for almost two thousand years by orthodox "Christians of many sects." He said, "The Church celebrates this feast but does not have a rational explanation of it. Jesus

and three of his disciples 'saw' and 'heard' two old prophets who had been deceased from this earth for centuries.

"I cannot understand how the Church leaders can evade the fact that here was 'communication' (just as surely as that claimed by the Spiritualists — and give a series of explanations which actually require more credence and 'gullibility' than does the plain fact that here was 'reality'—spirit-reality of an undeniable form.

"No other 'explanation' ex-

plains this 'other-worldly' event. If you have a 'faith' that can transcend 'fact,' and the 'proof' of that fact, you must be a spiritual Colossus indeed!"

Dr. Opie went on to show that the Bible is filled with reference to spirit-facts, to 'communication' with celestial beings—all the way back to the time of King Saul. "So far as I am able to find out from extensive study covering at least thirty years in this field, the story told in the twenty-eighth chapter of the First Book of Samuel," he said, "is the oldest 'recorded instance' on record,

of a case where a discarnate (one 'out of' the flesh) and an incarnate (one 'in' the flesh) actually had conversed. There it is in the Jewish-Christian writings. What do they do with it? How can they 'explain it away'? It has stood as a challenge to our credence since the year 1058 B.C.!"

"Show me a fact," he went on, "and on this fact I can base a 'cause'—but a 'cause' not based on 'fact' is something else indeed. Why will not people believe? There are not only good spirits in the Unseen, but evil ones also — as we have both good and bad on this plane here and now.

"But I am persuaded that the good spirits vastly outnumber the evil, when you consider this vast universe on the whole (not merely on this planet, where evil seems just now to be concentrated!)—outnumber them about as a million herds of elephants outnumber a single mosquito."

"Has spirit a 'science'? Spirit has at least three sciences: Psychic research in general, metaphysics and Spiritualism. These, it is true, are infant sciences, but they are here with us and they are lusty babes, who will 'grow up' — as surely as that evolution is a fact and not a fiction. One scientist at least has observed that matter reduced to its lowest form is 'light'—but I believe that beyond light is Spirit—probably the 'First Cause' of everything we see and observe about us on all sides, as well as the abstract matters of truth, idealism, love and the good life."

Dr. Opie quoted Sir Oliver Lodge, of England, whom he considered the "greatest physicist" of all time, as saying, "All the wonderful world that is around me—all that I can detect with my five senses, is simply the 'robes' with which Infi-

nite Mind has clothed itself." He quoted another as observing: "I think that science is more 'religious' than religion is 'scientific'."

"Yes," he continued, "I think we may say that Spiritualism is the science of the Unseen, the science of God, if you prefer. This is the science of the Absolute—of Reality reduced to its lowest (or its highest!) denominator."

He made reference to the last book of the Rev. Dr. Sherwood Eddy, entitled "*You Will Survive After Death*, (*) and felt that now orthodox religion can no longer repudiate the findings of modern Spiritualism. "This book, written by a scholar and a Christian author, with some forty others to his credit, a man whose integrity can no more be questioned than can his scholarship, endorses every one of the essential tenets of your Spiritualists. But it has been practically ignored by both the secular and the religious press in America! I read more than thirty different periodicals a month—and I have seen only one review of this significant book—and this reviewer's final sentence was, 'I did not find this book particularly helpful.' I wonder why! Certainly it was not the fault of the content of the book itself!"

Reference was also made to the fact that the British Bishops some time back appointed a committee of the best minds in religion, in education and in medicine to study the whole subject of psychic phenomena, including Spiritualism. After a serious study of two years this committee submitted its official Report—which was "heard in secret" and actually "suppressed" — until the news "leaked out" after a decade had elapsed. The speaker considered this suppression of a factual Report as "unwarranted and unworthy—if not actually contemptible."

The "Declaration of Principles" of the National Spiritualist Association in the United States, were read in full by the

guest-speaker, who added, "If there is a nobler expression of honest religious philosophy than these: 'We believe in Infinite Intelligence'; that both physical and spiritual phenomena are the expression of Infinite Intelligence; that the highest morality is contained in the Golden Rule'; that 'We affirm the moral responsibility of the individual' — it has escaped my research."

The following striking quotation from Sir Arthur Conan Doyle was also read: "I believe that within the last eighty years

a flood of such knowledge (spirit-phenomena) has been conveyed to us, and that we have been extra-ordinarily blind as to its validity and its overwhelming importance. So convinced am I of the vital nature of this psychic knowledge that I have been gradually forced to the conclusion that it is *the most important event which has occurred in the world since that raising of ethical standards* which we associate with the revered name of Jesus of Nazareth, and that on the plane of religious knowledge as apart from ethics, *it is actually the most important event of any.*

"For consider what it means if it be true. We claim that we can break through the barriers of death, that those who have lived in this world have not changed either their form or their character, but only their vibrations—so that instead of

manifesting through the flesh-body, which is a low and slow vibration, they live now in an etheric-body which is on a high and fast vibration, and therefore invisible to our ordinary mortal eyes, exactly as many things in our daily life fail to impress our senses because they are too fast a vibration."

In concluding, the speaker quoted a verse which he held, was "freight-with the meat of co-operative thought," even if it lacked the potency and polish of "real poetry." Here it is:

"Who Flies the Kite?"

"Who flies the kite? I, said the boy, it's my chief joy. I fly the kite.

"Who flies the kite? I, said the wind. It's my chief whim. I fly the kite.

"Who flies the kite? I, said the string. I'm the very thing. I fly the kite.

"Who flies the kite? I, said the tail. I make it sail. I fly the kite.

"Who flies the kite? They are all wrong. They are all right. They all fly the kite."

CYRIL SCOTT

The
Mystic



Cyril Scott, who will be 71 this year, has performed the unusual feat of achieving distinction in three different professions. As a composer of serious music (often featured in B.B.C. programs), his first symphony was performed at Darmstadt when he was only 20; as a poet he is well known to discerning readers; and as a writer of numerous books on philosophy and Occultism he has a large and devoted following.

One of the aims of Occultism is to help the student to think for himself. Unfortunately its initial impact has often the reverse effect, and the beginner merely exchanges one orthodoxy for another. Part of the responsibility for this must be shared by writers on occult subjects. An objective examination of occult literature shows much mediocrity, relieved only occasionally by gems of authentic transcendental wisdom.

I do not think it would be an exaggeration to say that the proper place for a great deal of so-called occult writing is the dustbin.

The most reliable information on Occultism, of course, comes from genuine mystics and Occultists (naturally very rare). Next in authenticity, are the writings of pupils of the enlightened, and in this category Cyril Scott has a well-earned place.

Scott might be described as an occult "existentialist" insofar as he insists upon the necessity of relating occult teaching to the human situation. His outstanding service to Occultism, in my opinion, is that he has shown, in a dramatic and convincing form, the numerous virtuous disguises that prejudice, vanity and spiritual pride

assume when the student of Occultism attempts to translate his theories into terms of everyday living.

Thirteen years ago, when I was bedazzled and excited by my first glimpse into the complexities of karma, rebirth, the Masters of Wisdom and other occult subjects, a friend lent me a book called *The Initiate*, by an anonymous writer who signed himself "His Pupil." I could not have had a better introduction to Occultism. Written in semi-fictional style the book told the story of a contemporary Western initiate as seen through the eyes of "Charles Broadbent," one of his pupils.

It described the initiate's influence on the way of life of a number of ordinary people, and the manner in which he helped them to achieve a greater awareness of themselves and their relation to others. It impressed me because of its psychological truth, and I immediately obtained and read its two companion volumes—*The Initiate in the New World* and *The Initiate in the Dark Cycle*.

Not until several months later did I discover that their author was Cyril Scott.

When a man writes a book, he willy-nilly exposes himself to the public gaze in all his profundity or shallowness of out-

look, his strength and his weaknesses. Scott's writings show that, whether one agrees with his premises or not, they are for the most part founded on a close observation of actual human conduct.

In the "Initiate" trilogy, for example, we are shown true-to-life people making confused attempts to apply charity and love in their own lives. As ordinary unregenerate human beings their failure to achieve this laudable ambition is only to be expected, but the story of their brave, if misguided, efforts makes absorbing reading.

There is the young wife, battling gallantly against a natural feeling of jealousy when she sees her husband drifting away from her; the old lady at the dinner-table, complaining of indigestion and solemnly telling her neighbor that "she supposed it must be her karma"; the woman who nearly wrecks her domestic life because of her attempts to convert her unwilling husband to Theosophy; the struggle between emotional possessiveness and an intellectual appreciation of its futility that goes on in the mind of a middle-aged man, and the obtuseness of his wife who interprets selfishness in married life as meaning that her husband has to make all the sacrifices.

None of these people were fools, and almost all of them had the privilege of help from a genuine Master: some of them were quite versed in the theory of Occultism and knew a great deal about karma, rebirth, the subtler bodies of man, and the complex details of the Cosmic Hierarchy.

The reason for their failure was lack of a corresponding moral growth. They were victims of that adult childishness which Scott has described in *Man Is My Theme*. They had not yet outgrown the mental patterns of childhood.

The "Initiate" books contain one of the few really convincing portraits of an illumined saint that are to be found in contemporary literature. Jerome K. Jerome made a creditable, though over-sentimentalized, attempt in *The Passing of the Third Floor Back*. But for the most part, portraits of this kind are almost invariably flat and unconvincing.

The reason is, of course, that wickedness is much more common than absolute goodness, and more obviously capable of forceful and dramatic treatment.

Scott's "Initiate," on the other hand, is almost wholly credible, and he does succeed in conveying, not an impossibly idealized lay figure, but a real personage whose compassion for suffering humanity is tem-

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pered by his complete understanding of the hidden forces involved.

Cyril Scott has specifically stated (cf. *An Outline of Modern Occultism*) that he was a pupil of the "Initiate," though not the one whose identity is concealed under the pseudonym of "Charles Broadbent." This of course, is one explanation of the remarkable conviction of sincerity which the "Initiate" books manage to convey.

At all events, those who would like to read an account of how a contemporary Western Master lives, and his relation with, and effect upon, the people with whom he comes into contact, are invited to buy or borrow this book at all costs.

In view of the fact that Cyril Scott is first and foremost a composer of music, the accomplished technique and prolific output of his literary work is something to be wondered at. His excursions into biography (*My Years of Indiscretion*); humor (*The Ghost of a Smile*); psychology (*Man Is My Theme*); health (*Doctors, Disease and Health*); and (*Victory over Cancer*); Occultism (the "Initiate" trilogy, *An Outline of Modern Occultism, The Vision of the Nazarene, The Greater Awareness*, etc.) and other subjects, prove the wideness of his literary net.

All of these books, however, are linked together by the author's deep preoccupation with the philosophy of Higher Occultism.

Concerning the theoretical aspects of Occultism his *Outline of Modern Occultism* (*) is, in my opinion, unrivalled as a comprehensive introductory survey of the subject. It is a simply-written and impartial account of the occult movement and its doctrines.

Avoiding the pretentiousness only too common in this field, the *Outline* aims at the reason rather than the emotions, and does not hesitate to ventilate unpalatable facts in the interests of truth. For example:

"No religion, creed, school,

mystical or occult society holds all knowledge: they are, every one, only stepping stones to the realization of Truth . . .", and "we may ask the reader not to . . . imagine that it is Occultism which produces such characteristics as a fanatical attitude towards sex or diet, peculiar clothes, solemn faces or other

insignia of people who take themselves too seriously. Occultism is their excuse and not the cause."

Scott is quite frank about the scandals which at one time split the Theosophical Society into warring camps, pointing out that Occultism is not a miracu-

lous panacea for all human ills, and that therefore it has naturally failed to cure many of its adherents of the seven deadly sins. It is this realistic approach, based not on life as we would like it to be, but on life as it is lived, that make Scott's books so well worth reading.

The Evil forces lay a snare of bodily, as also sensual pleasure in attainment, and lure the frustrated one into seeking refuge in sin, forgetfulness and over indulgence.

The strong ones in attainment or frustration keep their feet firmly on the ground and their wits about them. To these help comes in various ways and if they are able to listen to the apparently imperceptible telecommunications from the Divine they gain in their loss or gain something that lifts them up into spiritual regions and opens up new and greater vistas of life.

A state of preparedness to accept help is enough to ensure the advent of needed guidance and solace. When such is the case they are graced with a new path that leads to bliss and glory. The call of flesh, however, is more endearing to the human heart.

In attainment, the happiness is inter-twined in a state of caressings and love-makings and in disappointment and de-

spair a longing to satiate the acute emotional tension draws other desirable objects, often as a consolation or compensation on the rebound. The evil forces make it their business to see to the supply of all the essential elements to deviate the person from the path of Light to the narrow tunnel of sin and decay and ultimate annihilation of all that is left in him or her of the Divine spark.

This is where they are doomed to failure. The soul is never dead and can never be annihilated. Veils can hide, dim or obliterate visibility for some time but not for all times. Even the most forlorn and the lost man or woman, in moments of some acute pain, consciousness can feel the inner prick and can feel the fall. That is enough. The soul or the Divine in the man is yet struggling howsoever helplessly and feebly.

It is in such cases that the Master's touch alone can heal the wounds of sinful decay and bring the dying one back to life of the spirit world. Never

in any shape or degree of fall is there loss of hope. We, all of us, are ever welcome to a resurrection and that, too, in this very temporal and transitory life of ours.

One heartfelt cry for help can and does bring the Master's touch from the unknown. It is an S.O.S. that never fails. The work or ages of the forces of the Dark can be nullified in a single moment of real cry for help. This is what every seeker ought to know and never give up; and there is a seeker in each one of us.

Human flesh is a great burden and a liability of course, but this very embodiment, in its acute pain may prove the greatest blessing in our last moment before going under. The light is never denied and is ever near at hand. It is said that the Divine is nearer to you than you yourself are to yourself. This is not a figure of speech; *it is literally true!*
