Fall Conference of the Spiritual Frontiers Fellowship

The Spiritual Frontiers Fellowship held its Fall Conference in Chicago on Nov. 2nd and 3rd, at the Austin Westminster Presbyterian Church whose minister is Dr. Clarence E. Showalter. Dr. Showalter conducted the opening devotional service, which was followed by the introduction of the conference theme: PSYCHICAL EXPERIENCES EN RICHING CHRISTIAN LIFE, by Rev. Paul L. Higgins, President of the Fellowship and minister of the Hyde Park Methodist Church of Chicago. He emphasized the need for

raising psychical experiences to spiritual levels in order to reach the essence of religion.
Rev. J. Alson Smith's discussion on "The Spiritual World—The Christian Homeland" followed, and his thesis was that man has seemed to lose the sense of the reality of the spiritual world, which he must regain in order to meet the living God, and to be once again aware of and able to use for himself and others the power of the world of spirit. To do this men must let go of self and of materialism,

and steep himself in the know-ledge of things spiritual, so that he can then translate that knowledge into social action. Trying to regain the spiritual homeland of us all is the aim of this Fellowship.

"The Value of Psychic Aware-ness" was the subject of Rev. Ar-thur Ford's talk. He pointed out that it is difficult to understand why so many ministers who preach immortality and things spiritual should be so disturbed when members of their church-es try to find some proof for

themselves of these very things. The value of psychic experiences is that they can furnish this proof, and they take religion out of the theoretical realm.

Churches which do preach and demonstrate the powers of the spirit, as in healing, are filled to overflowing. While we all do have and use psychic abilities of various sorts whether or not we know it, we can all attain awareness if we willingly seek it and have patience,

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Persecution of Spiritualist Mediums Continues

Transition

Spiritualism records the transition of another of its devoted and selfless workers—the Rev. Janet Stine Wolford of Hanford, California. The well-known medium passed on to the land of Spirit during October at her home, 1300 N. Irwin St. The services were conducted at her church, the Church of Revelation, on Oct. 16th.

Rev. Wolford organized and incorporated the Church of Revelation on Jan. 2, 1930, at Long Beach, Calif., in conjunction with the Long Beach Wedding Chapel where many beautiful wedding ceremonies were performed. One day 27 couples were joined in holy wedlock.

In 1934 Rev. Wolford moved to Hanford, California, where she continued with her selfless work for Spiritualism. She helped establish branch churches in many cities throughout the United States' and her organization was affiliated with the Federation of Spiritual. Churches, Department of Commerce, the National Council of Churches, and listed with the year-book of America and Clergy Bureau During the past year church services have been conducted under her direction by ministers of the church.

Rev. Ruth Mikesell, secretary of the Church of Revelation, who told the Observer of Rev. Wolford's passing, ended her letter with: "Rev. Wolford never allowed her illness to interfere with helping those in need and giving aid to those sick in body and mind. "We know she is not with us in the material, but we shall be guided by her hand, helping us to continue on with the work she loved. The church will continue to grow in memory of our beloved Sister and Pastor. "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

Once again, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Rev. Lorraine Nesbitt and her husband, William Nesbitt, of the True Spiritual Church, 4229 W. Garfield Ave., were tricked by masquerading policewomen. In return for kindness and a willingness to help a fellow human being, these two Spiritualists were treated as common criminals, the Spiritualist minister temporarily "locked up" in a cell and given an intense cross-examination. All because they like all of us who are Spiritualists, believe that we do not die, believe that we should strive toward self-realization and believe in the principle—"Love ye one another."

These two were cleared of the charges of "vagrancy by fortune telling." Thank God—there was a judge sitting on the bench, the Honorable Robert W. Hansen, who declared in his statement: "it is not for the court to rule whether spirits or visions did appear, but to decide whether people have a right to believe as they wish.

"The freedom of worship is not limited to the major faiths or established churches," the judge said. "It includes beliefs that the majority of people may find incomprehensible."

The charges grew out of visits on Aug. 26 and Sept. 9 by policewomen Miss Geraldine Sampon and Mrs. William Johnson. They said that while the audience sat in darkness two hours Mrs. Nesbitt claimed that she was receiving messages because of her "psychic sensitivity." Contributions were taken before the service, they said.

"The two ladies whom I met as
Gerry Rodems and Jean Anderson
came to our church on Wednesday
evening, Aug. 21st. Our midweek
service began at 7:30 P. M. and
they received a message as did all
who attended church that evening.
"On Aug. 22 Gerry called and
sasked if she and her girlfriend
could sit in our class on Monday
because they were very interested
and told them to arrive before 7:30
P. M. because once the class starts,
the lights were turned off and we
didn't open the door. I also told
her there was a fee of 50c each
for the class unfoldment and material. That's 'O.K.' she said.
"The two ladies came to the class
that Monday evening and were introduced to the other students. We
asked if they were afraid to sit in
the dark, saying that was how we

developed our mediumship and they said 'No, we are not.'"

In her statement Rev. Nesbitt explained what transpired in the class, stating that when the students were asked to give whatever they might receive, a message was given to "Jean" by a student who saw pine trees around her. In attempting to interpret the message. tempting to interpret the message, this policewoman stated that she came from Green Bay which is a heavily wooded area.

According to Rev. Nesbitt 'Gerry' called again, asking if they might sit in on an afternoon class. Once

sit in on an afternoon class. Once again permission was granted and the two women visited again on September 9th.

Prior to the opening of the class the Spiritualist minister explained that she specifically told the students that "this was not a message circle but a spiritual development class for the study of the Spiritualist religion." She also stated that "the fee of 50c was to help pay for materials used in the classes."

Service Begins

As is customary with our circles the group sat in the darkness, opened the circle with a song, prayer and meditation and then

prayer and meditation and then more songs.

If there was any deception, it would seem from the minister's account that these two policewomen were guilty of such action. Rev. Nesbitt's statement declares that during the class each of these two told of having spiritual vision — "Gerry," who claimed to have seen a waterfall, and "Jean" who said "she got a

long pink rose standing among many rocks."

"I gave the healing and blessing prayer," Rev. Nesbitt continued, "and one student gave the
closing prayer, another the prayer
of thanks to the Spirit Loved Ones
and the guides. Various students
are asked to give these prayers at
each class so as to help them to be
able to pray whenever called upon
no matter where or when."

There was a birthday celebration scheduled after the class for one of the students and while the paster was helping to prepare the luncheon, the two women approached her and said: "Rev. Nesbitt, can the two of us talk to you alone for a minute?"

Rev. Nesbitt assented and took them into a small side room. Then "Gerry" said: "I hate to do this but we are policewomen" and she held out a badge.

Rev. Nesbitt's reply—"Well, God love you."

And she continues: "Then 'Gerry' asked if I could come down to the District Attorney at 9 the next morning. I told her no as we had a funeral. Then she told the other woman to get the men in and one came in. (These were policemen stationed outside.) She asked him if Wednesday morning would be O.K. I asked what it was all about and they told me: 'Oh, nothing, the D. A. just wants to ask you some questions.'

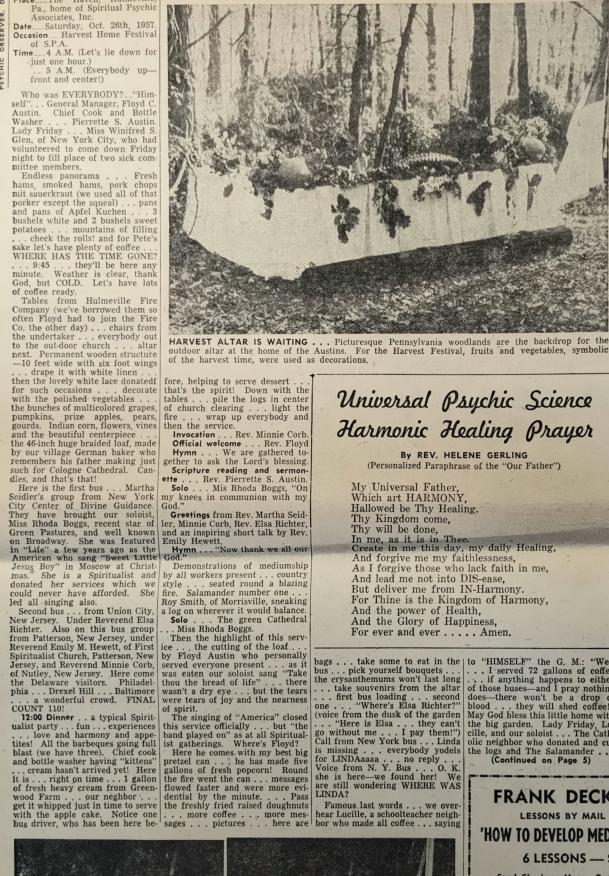

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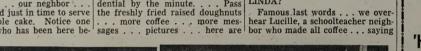

Statement Of The Court

THE COURT: There are some differences in the testi-

THE COURT: There are some differences in the testimony here between the two police officer witnesses for the State and the witnesses for the Defense, but I think it is fair to state that the general picture as to the type of a meeting that was being held and the purpose and the arrangements under which it was being held are clear to the Court and do shine through the testimony of all witnesses.

The two defendants are charged with a violation of a state statute providing that a person who derives a part of his support as a fortune teller or similar impostor,, end of quote, is guilty of violation of this statute. We are here confronted with the challenge of determining whether or not this particular type of meeting is to be termed and found by the Court to be fortune telling, namely, the prediction for gain, of things to come, or whether this is a spiritualistic meeting expressing the religious belief of individuals that it is possible to communicate with the souls of the departed.

It does appear that this particular meeting did open with a prayer, was followed by the singing of hymns and other songs, that there was what has been variously described as a period of meditation or concentration, and that it was accompanied, as is not unusual at religious services, by the passing of a collection basket where participants in these meetings or classes were expected to contribute fifty cents, as a participation fee in the series of classes or meetings.

songs, that there was what has been variously described as a period of meditation or concentration, and that it was accompanied, as is not unusual at religious services, by the passing of a collection basket where participants in these meetings or classes were expected to contribute fifty cents, as a participation fee in the series of classes or meetings. It is true that statements were made at this meeting by others present, including the defendant, indicating that a person's health would improve, indicating that troubles would vanish, indicating that things would be better, but I think in the general purport or purpose of this type of meeting, it is not for the Court to decide whether or not such messages were received or whether such spirits did appear, or whether such visions became real to people who were present, for we are, I think, by the nature of this type of meeting, pushed to the recognition of the fact that the Court, under our American law and Constitution, has to assert the right of individuals to believe that such messages were received and that such visions did appear.

I think it is fair to state—and I am taking the testimony now of the witnesses who appeared, other than the defendants, for the Defense—that we are dealing here with what appears to the Court to be a small off-shoot of or an independent group somewhat related to the Spiritualist Church or Conference in the United States, and I think, however small in numbers the group may be, it does appear to the Court to evidence a deep-seated belief in the rightness and correctness of a belief in communion with those who have departed, and I think it is for this Court to say that the constitutional guarantee of freedom of worship is not to include only the major faiths and established churches; it is to include the religious beliefs and practices that even the overwhelming majority of the members of the community find it completely impossible to share or approve.

"The idea that it is possible, by contemplation or prayer, or otherwise, to establish communion with the spirits of people who have departed the earth, is an established religious

people who have departed the earth, is an established religious belief, even though it may be felt or shared or followed only by a small number of people . . . I think it is true that any American does have a right to believe in the principles and precepts of Spiritualism . . ."

This, in part, is what the Honorable Robert W. Hansen, Judge of Branch 1 of the District Court of Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, stated when he handed down the decision concerning the case of Rev. Lorraine Nesbitt, as covered in this issue of Psychic Observer. of Psychic Observer.

He recognized that Spiritualism is an established religious belief and that we, as Americans, have a right to believe as we wish.

Two good Spiritualists were subjected to insult, indignities and embarrassment because they chose to fight for what they believed was true. The Nesbitts do not stand alone. In the annals of Spiritualism, in our country only, there are many, many more mediums who have been treated as "common criminals" as they were. No doubt, there are some of you who, now reading these lines, can look back upon a similar experience of your own.

It is you who are our martyrs and it is up to us, who believe what you are used to demonstrate, to carry on the battle of legal recognition with you.

Again, we must hammer home the point that has been printed and reprinted by not only the Observer, but by Chimes and other leading psychic journals-unity within the ranks.

and other leading psychic journals—unity within the ranks.

When the several hundreds of thousands of Spiritualists across the face of the earth have one main representative body, this childish nonsense of "booking" a Spiritualist medium for "vagrancy charges" will stop. Let's face it squarely—in unity there is strength. As long as we are divided within ourselves, bickering within our own Movement, not willing to stand by our fellow believers—we are more detrimental to the religion and philosophy of Spiritualism than all the masqueraders who are trying to "expose" Spiritualism.

With all of the so-called major religions, there is a never ending stream of fund-raising campaigns for this purpose or that purpose. Never a word said from any legal agency— BUT, let a Spiritualist medium ask for a donation, no matter how small, and they are "cheating poor people of their

Are not our mediums, our ministers entitled to a living? not we entitled to our own churches, and Sunday Schools?

We mentioned before that there are states, such as Colorado, whose statutes include "clairvoyance" under the vagrancy charge. Think of this! Clairvoyance—a gift possessed by most of our mediums and ministers.

Are we being too optimistic to hope that the day is near when the leaders of each of our Spiritualist organizations will meet round one table and discuss the tactics that must be employed to safeguard our mediums.

when there to not a safeguard our mediums.

We are sure that there is not a psychic newspaper or magazine, nor a psychic journalist, who would not give their all—give complete backing, to publicize such an action.

Our several organizations have minor differences, but each of their presidents should be big enough to forget these when it comes to a major issue concerning our religion.

Only the other day we received a letter from one of our healers who said he must stop his ad because a certain person in his town continually was calling the police, complaining about the work he was carrying on. He was a Spiritualist and evidently, to her way of thinking, Spiritualism was the work of the devil and must be driven away. This healer was never convicted but he was suffering continual persecution. Yes, we strive for peace within but how much easier if we can have peace without. We live in a modern world and cannot, even if we so desire, withdraw into a shell of self-meditation and reflection twenty-four hours of each day. Most of us strive for respectability—why should our religion be deprived of it?

be deprived of it?

Leaders will sway to the wishes of their followers if they see it is the desire of the majority. Let each of us take just a few minutes to appeal to our particular organization or church for unity within our religion.

Good mediums are at a premium—it is up to those of us who benefit by their gifts to give them the protection and love they need. When we are one—then can we feel the day is nigh when we will not be a minority religion but a majority religion.

Spiritualists Need The Historic Figure Jesus As The Way-shower For Life

Elder Brother Called Himself Servant of God

The real Jesus of history is as different from the Jesus of orthodox Christianity, or better called "Churchanity" with its man-made doctrines and dogmas, as light is from darkness. His was the Kingdom of the Heart, of brotherly love and service to all God's children who are on the way to becoming one with the All-Father, Infinity. "God is Spirit," not "a spirit," is the correct translation of the original Scripture, from the Aramaic, the language spoken by Jesus.

This Man of Nazareth was never interested in any static Procrustean organization that stretched or cut off all alike to fit them into a cramping ecclesiastical system of rule and rote. His were the laws, truths, secrets of the universe, and He and His followers lived largely in the fourth dimension where signs and wonders were the world's every day realities, as they are today to advanced and enlightened souls. He never set Himself above others or the possibilities of mankind, or claimed Deity. Speaking of Himself and His work he said, "Greater things than these ye shall do."

And when the rich young man

And when the rich young man called Him "good Master," He replied, "Why callest ye Me good?
There is only one good, and that is God." Peter in his famous sermon at Pentecost says, "Jesus of

There is only one good, and that is God." Peter in his famous sermon at Pentecost says, "Jesus of Nazareth, a Man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs which God did by Him, in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know." John, who perhaps knew the Master better than others declared, "Now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when He shall appear, we shall be like Him."

Jesus, instead of calling Himself the "Son of God," called remember that the original Aramaic, the oldest language in existence, translates those words as "Servant of God." Jesus was the best, the greatest, the supreme Spiritualist of all time, so far as we know—our Elder Brother, the Way Shower, differing from us in degree of advancement rather than in kind. He knew nothing of the dogmas that orthodox attaches to Him, such as original sin, everlasting damnation, immaculate conception, virgin birth, trinities, atonement, or the Lord's Supper as celebrated.

No wonder the great mystic, poetartist, the Syrian, Kahili Gibran says that every hundred years Jesus of Nazareth and Jesus of the Christian Church (orthodoxy) meet in a garden among the hills of Lebanon, and they talk a long time. But each time Jesus of Nazareth goes away saying to Jesus of the Church Christians, "My friend, I am afraid that we shall never, never agree."

Jesus had the gift of prophecy and predicted the Fall of Jerusalem and many other national events, besides telling the woman of Samaria truths about the future of Samaria, its worship, the living water He was giving, and then about her private affairs, the number of husbands she had had and the present one who was not her husband, so that she ran into the city and cried, "Come see a man that told me all the things I ever have done—Is not this the Christ?"

In the feeding of the four and five thousand people by food apported to His hands which He broke into pieces and gave to His disciples for the multitudes He demonstrated the same power that precipitate de the manna for Israelites under the leadership of Moses those years in the wilderness, when God directly fed them from heaven. As to levitation, teleportation, Jesus many times disappeared suddenly from the midst of crowds that were trying to harm or kill Him. One time when they did not like His sermon they took Him out to a cliff to throw him over it, but we read that He disappeared from their midst.



Another time they picked up stones with which to kill Him, but suddenly He was not found among them. He walked on the water or was levitated above it on certain occasions. His control extended over the elements — the wind and the waves obeyed His voice. He could speed up the natural—processes of nature, as when He turned water into wine. He read people's thoughts and purposes, exercised evil spirits, and healed all manner of diseases, even to raising the so-called dead. After His own decease He returned to earth for some forty days or more, came through locked doors, appeared and disappeared.

One time as a materialized spirit He took a long walk with friends to Emmanus, had supper with them, was recognized, and then disappeared—thus He demonstrated the continuity of life and the "gifts of the spirit." He communicated with saints and angels and "holy spirits" as the "Holy Spirit" was formerly called. The discarnate ministered to Him. Likewise did His disciples, following His example, so both He and they were Spiritualists.

The primitive church was founded upon the life and teachings of the Way Shower. The disciples of the Master were first called "Christians" in Antioch, called by the Romans Caesarea. There the primitive Christian assemblies or churches were practically the same as our Spiritualist churches today. The teachings consisted of the Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes, the Golden Rule, the Sayings of Jesus, the Lord's Prayer. Such words as "By their fruits ye shall know them," and "Whatsoever a man sows that shall he reap" were built into the lives of the members.

In the early church were two offices which long since have ceased—the office of the prophet and the office of the angel. In those days, angels talked, walked and worked with man. Each church had its medium, an indispensable part of it. Naturally the bishops and deacons later under Constantine and the Roman Government were of legal bent of mind, took upon themselves administrative responsibility which involved material affairs — the handling of money, worldly prestige, often self-aggrandizement, and so came to battle against the spiritually minded, because they could not cope with the interference and spirit-guidance from the

and so came to battle against the spiritually minded, because they could not cope with the interference and spirit-guidance from the other world.

The way had been paved for all this when Jesus' primitive and simple religion changed under Paul and his followers. Both orthodox Christians and Spiritualists rarely if ever realize that we have two distinct types of Christianity, Jesus' Christianity and Paul's Christianity—absolutely different. Briefly, the reason for this is that Paul who never knew the humble, simple Jesus, had a vision on the Damascus road when he was cruelly persecuting the followers of Jesus; temporarily he was stricken blind. Some scholars think it may have been hysterical blindness common in that day, sometimes from a stricken conscience or other causes.

But as the Bible tells us, Jesus spoke from the other world to Paul and directed him

to healing. Paul naturally concluded that any one who could be the means of his receiving his sight was God or Deity, so he built his Christianity on the Godship of Jesus, the Son being God of very God, which idea was later accepted by the followers of Athanasius against he opposite group, the Arians. But when Constantine made Christianity, he chose the belief of the Athanasians, made all others heretics, and started the bloodblazed trail of what is now modern Christianity or "orthodoxy."

ern Christianity or "orthodoxy."

Moreover, after receiving his sight, Paul spent fourteen years, according to the Bible, in the Arabian desert and vicinity, formulating "his religion." In the Book of Romans Paul speaks of people being "judged according to my gospel"; and in Second Timothy he says, "Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel." Scholars do not find it difficult to understand that Paul's gospel, is not Jesus' gospel, but largely Mithraism, a pagan-religion both of Paul's and Constantine's, days. Constantine made it his state religion and adapted Christianity to it—later it was absorbed by Christianity. Christianity.

Other Saviors

Other Saviors

In those early days, the followers of Jesus were surrounded by numerous pagan religions that in general followed a rather definite pattern which greatly influenced Christianity as it grew up. For example, in Mithraism, a rival of Christianity. Moithra was a Persian god of light, acting as a mediafor between Supreme God and man. The savior gods, usually born of virgins, often of a mother who had some form of the name "Mary," were born in a cave or manger, over which a star shone, were worshipped by shepherds and Wise men; later they performed miracles. They were born at times represented by our present Christinas and Easter, were the "Lamb sacrificed for the sins of the world"—thus were the saviors to all believeres. The soul was considered separated from God and through sacrifice attained union.

Mithraites believed in the Trin-y, practiced baptism, the Lord's upper, made the sign of the cross,

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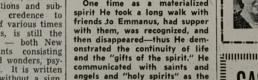

kept Sunday as the "Lord's Day"; kept Sunday as the "Lord's Day"; its priests wore vestments, the Vatican was the site of its worship, and on the last day of Mithra would judge the world as the Logos and Incarnate Word of God. A student of Church History and Comparative Religion will find valuable facts in a host of books, among them Dr. Arthur Weigall's PAGANISM IN OUR CHRISTIANITY, Kersey Graves' SIXTEEN CRUCIFIED SAVIORS, Paterson's MITHRAISM and CHRISTIANITY, and RT. HON J. M. ROBERTSON'S CHRISTIANITY AND MYTHOLOGY.

But the church assemblies of the historical Jesus, up until the Council of Nicea in 325 A.D., were largely Spiritualistic. The most learned and illustrious bishop, Origen, of about 180-A.D., in his PRINCIPIIS, said when asked about "diviners" and "mediums":

We suppose the powers of these holy and immaculate souls are brought about by long abstinence, protecting them from evil spirits, in their devotion with all perfection and purity to God, and that by these means they have assumed a portion of divinity and earned the grace of prophecy and other divine gifts.

And again, in this early Christian or Spiritualist assemblies, the Latin Church Father, Tertullian, about 190 A.D. said in his DE ANIMA:

We have a right to anticipate prophecy and the continuance of spiritual gifts. Now, we are permitted to enjoy the gift of a prophetess, a sister among us who possesses the faculty of revelation. During the religious service she falls into a trance, holding communion with angels, beholding Jesus Himself, hearing divine mysteries explained, reading the hearts of some persons and ministering to such as require it. When the Scriptures are read or psalms sung, spiritual beings minister visions to her.

The "sister" goes on to tell of a materialization," a soul that appeared to be spirit, but so real and substantial that it might be touched. In every way it resembled a human form."

Talked With Angels

In those days, good men listented and looked for manifestations of the angels or "messengers" sent from heaven, and they were not disappointed. They were ever mindful of injunction: "Be not forgetful to entertain strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares."

Briefly, a few words about the man-made doctrines the orthodox church attributes to the Master

in Jesus that keep Spiritualists from their acceptance of and full allegiance to the Way Shower. Of course He never mentioned or had anything in His teachings about immaculate conception or virgin birth. Paul said the Master was "the son of Joseph." It was long after the Master's death that a large portion of Christianity added a fourth god or goddess, Mary, the other three being considered by many as the Trinity.

When virgin births became too popular in the early Roman Empire, there was made a law against a woman announcing such a claim—it was commonly used as an excuse for ordinary pregnancy. There was also abroad the idea that a woman might conceive at the mere approach of a spirit or divinity. Some historians state that when the idea of virgin birth was fastened upon Jesus, nobody took it seriously, since being born of a virgin was like the other gods—and many considered His as a divine being, apart from others. Dr. Arthur Weigall says, "The Christian creeds are paganism rehabilitated; the old gods ousted by Jesus have crept back; their temples having been destroyed, they have come to church."

In the early days of the Christian church Jesus was/not thought of as Deity. He was the Son of Man, Servant, not Son, of God—true translation of Armaic. His Deity was voted in at the Council if Nicea, 325 A.D., under the control of Constantine, the murderous emporor of the time, who did away with Spiritualistic seances because his murdered subjects and relatives came back and accused him in person. He adapted Christianity to Mithraism which called for a Deity as substitute for Mithra, a god.

There were many attempts to establish the Trinity as a church doctrine in various forms; finally in 787 A.D., it became an established doctrine in the Western churches, also the worship of idols, images were allowed. Great was the gulf between the simple Spiritualistic religion of Jesus and Christian Churchanity. Then followed the decay of civilization, the closing of the universities, he loark Ages beginning with the Fall of t

But before this immorality, commercialism, temporal power had crept into the Church. Jesus' teaching of sowing and reaping, here, hereafter, on earth in lives to follow, the facts of rebirth or reincarnation were thrown out of the primitive churches in 553 A.D. and replaced by easier doctrines, such as the doctrine of forgiveness.

People were not inclined to stand by their own deeds and take the results, so, since they had many sins they wanted to commit, they felt the need for the doctrine of forgiveness and the permission to pay the priests for "indulgences." Where there is a will, there is a way. But rebirth was taught by Jesus and in the New and Old Testaments of the Bible and also in the Apocrapha. It was common knowledge in Bible times, as in all times. It was later preached in the 13th century in the public square of St. Francis of Assisi — a doctrine that explains all the inequalities and seeming injustices of life.

The rite of sacrament of the

The rite of sacrament of the Eucharist or Lord's Supper as celebrated in the orthodox chuch is not as instituted by Jesus. The early Latin Church Father Tertiullian speaks of the Eucharist, a feature of the pagan religion, Mithraism, and says that "in the first century the Christian Eucharfirst century the Christian Eucharist was a ceremony of remembrance and a part of a common meal. There was no reference to Christ's blood — it was symbolical of the life and knowledge made known to us through Jesus." In a Mithraic celebration of Eucharist wafers were used marked with a cross, and water, not wine, was used. December 25th was the birthday of Mithra, the god of the sun.

Doctrine of Atonement

The doctrine, man-made, of the Atonement is the most obnoxious to the followers of the historical to the followers of the historical Jesus. It is pagan in origin. The ancient world believed in the sufferings and deaths of gods as beneficial to man. Adonis, Attis, Dionysos, Herakles, Mithra, Osiris and other deities were all saviorgods whose deaths were regarded as sacrifices made on behalf of mankind. It was made clear that the god sacrificed himself to himself, similar to the Father-God appearing himself by the sacrifice of the Son of God in orthodox Christianity.

of the Son of God in orthodox Christianity.

The dying and rising again seemed to have its origin in the fact-that nature seemed to die in the winter and revive in the spring—this idea giving rise to the belief that death was necessary to life. So, the god bimself must die to insure his own life's revival. Human sacrifices also were a part of many early religions as recorded in the Bible among the Israelites, Abraham, and others who offered to the Lord human beings.

The Atonement, among the Hebrews, had its inception in the days of Moses when the scapegoat was sent into the wilderness to die, after the hands of the congregation had been laid upon it to bequeath their sins to the animal. Later, it was a doctrine brought into Christianity (Churchanity) by John Calvin, a murderer, who had Sevetus burned to the stake be-

cause he differed with him in beliefs—a man that was so hated that the citizens named their dogs after him and kicked them about; yet a man, so history tells us, who influenced the thinking of half the human race, and who has doubtless degraded the conception of man and God more than any other who has lived upon the planet.

Calvin's false meanings attached to the Bible words, history says, became general in books on religion about 1650. And before Calvin, the Atonement in the sense of "making amends" of "expiation" was found in Archibleon Angelogical Calvin, and a Archibleon Angelogical Calvin Calv nd in Archbishop Ancelm's WHY DID GOD BECOME

MAN."

This atrocious, unjust, barbaric doctrine was a plan to solve the problem of original sin, a myth or legend found in one form or another throughout the world, but was brought by the Jews from Babylon in the days of the captivity, along with the idea of eternal damnation, the devil, and other doctrines, and passed on to the Christians who interpreted it in a far different way than the original meaning. This idea that the misbehavior of two people could plunge the whole human race into hell fire was so revolting that many of the Old Testament prophets witnessed against it.

Ezekial declared in effect that a fundamental law of God is that "no one could be punished for the iniquities of another," or be "righteous instead of another person." The idea of "substitution" is in defiance of Scripture. Man, of course, as Jesus says, bears within himself the fruits of good and evil deeds. Sin is its own punishment and virtue its own reward. Emerson, writing in his "Journal" of the Four Vedas, said: "It is as sublime as heat and light and a breathless ocean. It contains every religious sentiment, all the grand ethics which visit in turn each noble poetic mind . . . is is of no use to put away the book; if I trust myself in the woods, or in a boat upon the pond, Nature makes a "Brahmin" of me presently: eternal necessity, eternal compensation, unfathomable power, unbroken silence . . . This is her creed. Peace, she saith to me, and purity and absolute abandonment—these panaceas expiate all sin, and bring you to the heating of the present of the content of the period of

solute abandonment—these panaceas expiate all sin, and bring you to the beatitude of the Eight Gods." It is said that Emerson, in his, latter days, always carried in his pocket a copy of the Bhagavad Gita, and he became known as the "Boston Brahmin."

Schopenhauer contributes this: "How entirely does the Upanishad breathe through the holy spirit of the Vedas! How is everyone, who has become familiar, with that incomparable book, stirred by that spirit to the very depths of his soul! From every sentence deep, original, and sublime thoughts arise, and the whole is pervaded by a high and holy and earnest spirit... The access to the Vedas by means of the Upanishads is in my eyes the greatest privilege this century may claim before all previous centuries."

No authors are ascribed to the Vedas. Recent archaeological discoveries point to the conclusion that introspection, by definite techniques, has been practiced in India for 5000 years.

Professor Norman, in the "Bulletin" of the American Council of Learned Societies, has this to say: "India has developed certain valuable religious attitudes of mind, and ethical notions, which are unique, at least in the wideness of their application to life. One of these has been a tolerance in questions of intellectual belief—doctrine—that is amazing to the West, where for many centuries heresyhunting was common, and bloody wars between nations over sectarian rivalries were frequent."

The Vedes were a revelation by sound, "directly heard" (shruti) by rishis. They are a literature of chant and recitation. The 100,000 couplets of the Vedas were not written, but transmitted orally by priests, for millennia. They were preserved by noting the order (anupurvi) of the words, rules for combinations, of sounds (sandhi), the relation even of letters (sanatana), and by mathematical ways of checking the accuracy of memorized texts.

Yet we harp continually on the cliche that "the "Kingdom of Heaven" is within you. The Orient has known—and practiced—this for thousands of years before we children of the West had even heard of it!

WHEN Drake, the great sea captain, was dying in the Caribbean, he bade his comrades take his drum to England, and hang it, so that, in the hour of danger, it might sound. The drum still hangs in the old sea dog's home, Buckland Abbey, near Plymouth. The last time it was heard was on the morning of November 21, 1918, when the German fleet steamed into Scapa Flow, to surrender. The British Fleet was waiting the arrival of the Kaiser's proud but vanquished ships, neither officers nor men being able to believe that the enemy would surrender meekly. Every ship was cleared for action, every man at his station. On the bridge of the "Royal Oak" stood Admiral Grant, Captain Maclachan the Commander, and other high-ranking officers. Shortly after 9 A. M., Admiral Grant saw the German Fleet appear out of the mist, expecting to hear their guns bark their defiance. Instead, he heard the steady, rhythmic sound of a small drum beaten in "rolls," and so did the Commander. Twice the vesel was searched, but no trace of drum or drummer was found. The Commander himself toured the ship, but found nothing, while the drum carried on. By 2 P. M., the British Fleet, in a huge square, surrounded the German ships; only then did the drum cease.

Once again the old cry of "orthodoxy" was raised. "How terrible" they said!!! Yes, yes, how terrible—for Spiritualists!! In ignorance they abuse something they don't know a thing about—BAPTISM. I think it is just about time we Spiritualists understand what the rite of baptism actually signifies.

Baptism is very, very important —espiecially to Spiritualists. Do you know that the 'Gift of the Holy Ghost' means mediumship Do you know the ministry of our Master Jesus started WHEN HE WAS BAPTIZED? Do you know that when he was baptized he received the 'Gift of the Holy Ghost'? These are not moot questions just for the sake of controversy and we Spiritualists should know the answers. To better undertsand these questions and what the Act of Baptism indicates we should first know what the 'Holy Ghost' means. Do you know? It's important to us that we know EXACTLY. It's so very consequential!! In the first place there is no such word as holy ghost in the Helprius or Greek. The word

consequential!! In the first place there is no such word as holy ghost in the Hebrew or Greek. The word was probably a translation or conjecture of St. Jerome, who translated the first bible, the Latin Vulgate, from the Greek into Latin.

In the Greek translations the word Holy Ghost was rendered, "ek haggion pneuma" which means, in the Greek, "THE GOOD OR PURE SPIRIT." So, consequentially, when you receive the 'Gift of the Holy Ghost' you are receiving the 'Gift of the Good Spirit' or MEDIUMSHIP!!

Englishmen Ask: Who Paved Way?

Who let in the police? This is one intriguing question that arises in connection with the reported raid on a Helen Duncan seance at Nottingham.

According to Mr. Timmins, at whose home the seance was held, the door must have been opened by one of the police who had gained entry as "sitters."

The answer to this question has The answer to this question has so far not emerged, and it raises wide issues concerning the rights of the private householder. In law, an Englishman's home is his castle, unless the police have good reason to suspect that a felony is taking place.

Those newsapers which have so far reported the case are to be congratulated on their fair treat-

Peter Simple of the Daily Telegraph has asked bluntly: "What were they (the police) doing there at all? Have they nothing to do?"

He suggests that whether or not the medium was a fraud, she was no threat whatever to public order or morality.

So far only one side of the story has emerged. It suggests irrespective of any question of fraud or genuineness in the matter, that the police acted with some high-handedness.
