# LECTURE

As it was in the time of Christ and so it is to-day, Religion has been the conflict of the ages. There are so many Religious beliefs, but all heading for the one direction, to God. Religion is the knowledge of the relation existing between us and God, with the understanding of the duties and results. It is intellectual and practical. The Mind must be informed of the nature of the relation which exists between man and his God. The performance of these duties constitutes the great business of human life.

The relation existing between us and our God, cannot be understood without some correct views both of the Divine character and our own God. As a being, infinite and eternal, possessed of moral excellence, as our creator, as the author of all our Blessings, as our Redeemer and Judge. There must also be a knowledge of ourselves as moral and mortal beings capable of serving and pleasing God. These truths being understood, the obligations of obedience of love and trust in God. God is Infinite Wisdom, the ruler of all things, the light of the world, Without this God Power our world would be dark and destitute for the want of Spiritual Food.

God has made Himself known to mankind in various ways, from age to age, previous to the times of the Prophets of Israel. Every man

thinks his religion is the one and only true religion. There are many systems, many theories in regard to God and mans relation to Him. Man to-day is thinking a great deal more than ever before, and the result of his thoughts is agitation. Agitation creates conflict. This conflict is going on to-day just as it has been for many years. It increases as man progresses. We find him to-day a reasoner, compared with what he was in the past. As a religious being he has accepted the ideas of his forefathers from generation to generation. Once in a while an occasional man will rise from the masses whose soul is dissatisfied with this and refuses to be tied down with mere dogmas and creeds. These brave souls look for something higher and better. The aspirations of their souls have expressed themselves in their lives and these lives have left their impression upon the minds of earth. The exceptional man who has appeared at intervals, always differing from those around him, always oustandingly bold from others, has invariably been the radical of his time. He has always startled and shocked the world at large.

The Master Jesus was such a man. And after thousands of years, look at Him, is there or has there ever been one man who is more worshipped and loved? Yet in His day he was called a radical, and truly hated, because he dared to openly defy the Jews, condeming their customs, their religion, even entering the Temple itself and condeming their usage and forms. Showing no respect even to the High Priesthood. Every where he spoke openly in defence of right and justice and truth as he beheld them. All his teachings were a great deal in advance of what preceded them.

It is interesting to remember how everything which happened to Christianity happened to Christ first. It is all recorded in the Gospel, in which His life is told. But that is all in the past history. We come now to our own religion, Modern Spiritualism. Have we not gone far in this our movement, of course we have. We as Spiritualist Ministers teach the true teachings of the great Masters that have gone on before. Do we not have the greatest teachers of all time, come to us in the silence and the seance room? Do not these great teachers of old vibrate back to us here on the earth plane, telling us to get rid of the old dogmas and creeds, to break our chains of bondage, to live and learn the true

meaning of a true religious life while we are still in the flesh? Throw away your chains my friends and live the true Spiritual Life, that God in his infinite wisdom wants us to do. Has He not shown us the light and understanding of a perfect religion.

O'! many people will laugh and scoff, (just as they did in the time of Christ") at us for delivering ourselves as a true believer in the truth of life after death. If this is not true, well where did all the old teachers that lived on this earth plane of ours, from the beginning of time get their information? Was it not from Spirit, of course it was. But we the lowly Spiritulist, bring these truths to man in all its beauty and simplicity. The true meaning of Gods love for man, without the pomp and glitter of paganism. We are the true teachers of religion. Straight is the gate and narrow is the way. Although the idea of perfect righteousness is ones allegiance and conduct to whatsoever is good and true to the just and merciful is a principle of the spirit ever present and influencial with the conscientious religion.

Jesus said to his disciples whom he loved, "Lo, I am with you always", so I Believe our loved ones are with us, to help us in the battle of life. After that battle has been fought, as Paul said while confined in prison in Rome, "I have fought a good battle", they hover around the dying bed, like they did around the rich mans gate to bear away to paradise of God the soul just emancipated from its earth dwelling".

# PITCH A TENT AND BUILD

Abraham and his people were wandering shepherds. They lived in tents which were easily taken down when they moved the sheep to places where the grass was more abundant. They represent the human race in the second period, a step ahead of savagery, but not yet what we call civilized. The distinguishing characteristic of civilized man is that he builds homes and cities. His industries are established and he brings the raw material to his place of business instead of moving his place of business to his source of raw material. His home becomes a house or a castle rather than a tent. His altar, if he has one, becomes a church or a cathedral.

In Bible symbology, the tent, the house or the castle represents the abode of man; while the altar, the church or the cathedral represents the dwelling place of God. A study of man's homes shows the progress of the race from savagery, through barbarism to the present, and toward the future. So, a study

of altars and temples reveals the progress of the individual soul toward its ultimate perfection.

We know that the human body is the real Temple of God. The early caverns in which religious rites were celebrated and later the vaulted chambers and domed cathedrals were replicas of the human anatomy. This applies to the temples of Egypt in which the various rooms and passages were symbols of the various blood and nerve passages, the glands, and organs of the body. The temple of Solomon at Jerusalem was unquestionably an anatomical temple, and its plans reveals the physical, astral and spiritval bodies of man and their co-relation.

The symbol of Abraham repreman as the cosmic wanderer, the nomad, of the universe, who has not yet established a permanent home or a complete consciousness. He was and still is, in fact, seeking a "Promised Land." Whereever Abraham went, he pitched a tent and built an altar. The tent represents only this dense body that endurer but a short time, the altar shows a desire to keep contact with the divine nature.

The altar is the symbol of God's presence. It is a constant reminder of that presence, which man is so prone to forget. Most of man's time and energy is given to the production of food and the provision of shelter. He has had far too little time for the finer things, cultural and religious. The worship of God has been pushed into the background, thus becoming a secondary activity, or even neglected entirely.

Moses pondered this problem when he planned the social system under which millions of men have lived since his time. He set aside one day in seven when men should cease all other activities and worship Cod. That was a simple solution when man was in the pastoral agricultural stages of evolution, watching sheep or tilling the soil. But life has become very complex in modern times. It is keyed to a higher pitch. Men work harder now than ever before, with brain as well as body. We have failed to see that, as life increases in complexity and work becomes more demanding, the need for worship of God increases in direct proportion. Work and worship should go hand in hand, for they are

The failure of religion to keep pace with modern life, to adjust itself to modern needs, has relegated it farther and farther into the background of human interest. Millions of men today give no thought to God ,or to religion. They pitch their tents but do not build altars. Every man wants to own a home and to keep it beautiful. It is the deepest human instinct. Drive around town on a Sunday morning in spring or summer, and you will see men mowing their lawns, painting screens and weeding victory gardens, rather than going to church. And why not? They have worked six days in the shop, store or the office and now they have a day off; and the painted and the garden tended. lawn must be mowed, the screens

Why go to church anyway? they ask. They know the hymns that will be sung, and they know every word the minister will say, for they have heard the same old words many times before: all about how

nice it will be in heaven, or hor uncomfortable in the other place. After a week of hard work, that old morris chair, house slippers, pipe and Sunday paper seem like heaven enough right here and now! If those men had any idea that there was really something for them in church, they would go! But a sense of duty or fear of consequences will not move them. If they thought church would improve their health, help them make more money, give them real peace of mind; instead of a new worry about the soul, or lift them up and inspire them instead of depressing them with thoughts of sin, they would go to church.

Every man is naturally religious. His urge to worship God is as strong as his urge to build a house or conduct a business. Man always pitches his tent and builds his altar, the thought of God's presence is common to all men. But the thought of omnipresence is too indefinite; it overpowers the imagination. We feel that we must localize God somewhere. So we build an altar. Men of limited thought soon conclude that if God is localized in one place, it follows that

he is not in other places. This concept led to the formulation of a theology of heaven and hell: one place where God is, another place where God is not. It is one of the inconsistencies of theology that the doctrine of heaven and hell clashes with the doctrine of omnipresence. If we say that God is everywhere, then there is no place where God is not. Then God must be in both heaven and hell. But if God, all goodness, is in hell, then it is not hell; for no evil can be in the presence of all-good.

There is a revolution underway at present in religion, just as there is in economics, industry, politics and every other department of human life. God does not change, but man does, in his understanding, his viewpoint and way of thinking. For instance Pike's Peak looks very different when viewed from different angles and distances. God does not change but my viewpoint does, is I get closer to him and the clouds and mists of ancient superstition and ignorance clear away from my mind.

Abraham's search for the Promised Land was at first like a game of "blind man's bluff." He

had a very hazy idea about it as being somewhere afar off. He traveled from Ur, by a devious route, into the land of Canaan. Yet he seemed no closer to his goal. Then it occured to him to ask God for more definite guidance. God answered his prayer and told him, "The land thou seekest will I give unto thee and thy seed forever." In a word, God told him, "This is the land of promise. You are now standing upon it." When this realization came, Abraham arose from his knees and built an altar there.

Jesus made this truth very plain when he said, "The Kingdom of God is not 'lo here,' or lo there.' The Kingdom of God is within you."

When you came to know the God within, then you know the truth that sets you free from the cosmic wanderlust. Then at last

the prodigal wanderer has returned to his Father's house, to the real "temple altar to Jehovah." And, like Jesus of Nazareth, he has made at-one-ment between the absolute and the relative, between the God omnipresent and the God here in his own temple. Then the God present can speak to the God omnipresent, and the very waves of the sea will obey you. Then you, or the God in you, can say to the fire, "Warm me but do not burn my hand," or to the principle of gravity, "Bear me up lest I dash my foot against a stone."

If you have thought of God as a majestic being, apart from you and the world, surely you have outgrown that naive and hopeless belief. Make your heart an altar where God dwells forever within equally important.

# THE LORDS PRAYER



# THE FORTUNES OF LITTLE GEORGIE

A child, young, fair, and innocent, lay dying among the pillows of a snowy couch in the upper room of a large and spacious house, -the only child of wealthy parents; whose hearts seemed breaking under the necessity of giving their loved one up to death,—for these parents had no idea or knowledge of the spirit world, and the power of its inhabitants to return to earth and to minister to their friends. All that skill could do or love suggest had been tried for the recovery of their one ewe lamb, but all in vain; slowly and surely the change was stealing upon him, and in a little while his spirit had joined the angel band.

Out in the chilly streets, not far from the stately mansion of which

I have written, another child, as young and fair and innocent as the first, sat shivering with cold, and trembling with hunger. What was to be his fate? who could tell? This was the offspring of poor, respectable parents; the father had passed to the spirit world, the mother had earned her bread by hard labor, until an attack of acute bronchial trouble threatened her life, and she had been taken to the hospital for treatment, where she still lingered, battling with disease; while her little boy, uncared for and alone, sat in the street, or roamed about, picking up a bit here and there as best he could, returning at night to the humble room he had always called home, to throw him self upon his lowly bed and weep ' imself to sleep.

You may ask, in doubt, "Can such things be? Are such things allowed in a Christian land?" and we answer: "Yes; here in your boasted civilized country, little children, the pride and flowers of humanity, are permitted to struggle up through poverty, hunger, cold, and misery; and then you wonder at the existence of crime, the spread of evil."

# EARTHLY PATHS.

The child of the wealthy parents passed to the higher life, leaving that elegant home and lonely and desolate, and those parents' hearts sad and sorrowful. The mother of the little street-waif also passed on to the other world, leaving her beloved boy homeless and destitute; for the authorities, finding that the woman was no more, sent to her former home to ascertain the whereabouts of her friends. The neighbors could tell the messenger nothing only that there was a little boy of about eight years; but they had seen nothing of him of late. Of the woman they knew little ;she

a hard-working, decent body who minded her own business and did not talk much.

Corpluding—without taking the trouble to investigate the matter—that the child had been taken care of by some one who knew its mother, the city authorities ordered the burial of her remains, stripped her former abobe of its humble possessions, and when in the coldness and darkness of night the

Just three weeks after these events, a wealthy farmer arriving from a Western city visited the institution in search of a boy to accompany him home and learn to do chores on the farm. Our friend Georgie was selected to accompany him; and after giving the references required by the institution concerning his character and ability to care for the child, the stranger departed ,taking the little one with him. But arriving at his destination, it transpired that the man of wealth had not taken the child into his own service, but had brought him from the East to deliver into the hands of a neighbor of his, a

hard, grasping, relentless man, who proved to be a most terrible and heartless task-master to our little boy, whose life now became one of drudgery and abject servitude.

Time passed; the health of the child began to suffer severely under the severe treatment received. This only served to harden his master toward him. It seemed that death must soon come to his release, when an event happened which changed the entire life of the boy, and brought him under conditions favorable for the growth of his hitherto stunted powers, as well as for the unfoldment of happiness within him.

We are not unmindful of the work of the spirit; in this case, the work of many spirits. The poor mother who had breathed her earthly life away upon a hospital cot had joined her husband and found a sweet home in the spirit world; but she had not forgotten her little, homeless boy on earth, and it was now her purpose and her mission, aided by her companion, to work early and late for that child's welfare.

With sorrowful hearts did they watch over their loved one, with

anguished feelings did they behold the misery of his daily life, caused and promoted by the severity of his cruel master; and it was with the greatest anxiety that they sought to guard him from evil, and to guide his spirit in the path of right.

Smarting under the infliction, he had crept away to his humble room, beneath the

eaves of the old house, and, throwing himself upon the lowly bed, had sobbed himself to sleep.

It was yet early evening, when our little boy suddenly awoke, to behold the well-remembered face of his mother beaming upon him, and to hear her well-known voice saying: "Come, my darling, you have remained here too long, I cannot see you suffer under the power of your cruel master another day; follow me, and God will take care of you."

The child, bewildered and but half awake, not doubting but that his mother had found him, and had come to take him away—for he had never realized that she was dead—
