



# Recent Important Developments in Psychical Research

By Hereward Carrengton.

(Member of the Society for Psychical Research.)

So much for the "mental" phenomena: Newer researches in the direction of "physical" manifestations have proved more conclusive, and at the same time more interesting and dramatic. Such manifestations do not, as a rule, bear upon the central problem of the "immortality of the soul"; and hence are of more interest to the physiologist and the physicist than to the psychologist or philosopher. But they are in many ways more intelligible and tangible to the layman; and hence more interesting to him than the mental phenomena.

Perhaps the most striking of these are the experiments recently conducted by Professor J. Ochorowicz, of Warsaw, Poland, with a young lady,—a private psychic,—by name Mlle. Tomczyk. These experiments are among the most interesting in the whole history of the subject; and should be briefly recounted.

Mlle. Tomczyk was sent to Dr. Ochorowicz, for treatment, some years ago, when suffering from a nervous breakdown, and other minor ills. He hypnotized her, in order to give suggestive treatments: and. in hypnosis, she spontaneously developed -all 'unexpectedly-"mediumistic" phenomena. These were, at first, very simple in their nature, and consisted in the ability of the psychic to stop the swinging arm or hand of a circular glass clock at any number she chose by merely pointing her finger at it and willing it to so stop. From this she developed the power of lifting or "levitating" small objects by placing her hands on either side of the object, and raising her hands, when the object in question was lifted,—as though by means of a thread or hair, passing between the hands, lifting the small object in question. (Needless to say, it was fully proved that no hair or visible support of this kind was

employed.) All these manifestations took place when the subject was entranced; and, when she emerged from this state, she knew nothing whatever of what had occurred.

Under hypnosis, a personality calling itself 'Little Stasia' developed, with whom Dr. Ochorowicz had many interesting talks regarding the phenomena. This personality he regarded for a long time as merely a dissociated "self",—a hypnotic personality, which had been created by the "setting" of the seances, and had no real existence of her own,—in spite of the fact that she claimed such independent existence, and asserted that she was the cause of all the physical manifestations. gave pause to this idea was that,—on one occasion, at least,—this little creature succeeded in having a photograph of herself taken, in a dark room, when the medium was with Dr. Ochorowicz, in another room altogether! This entity was then found to be a small girl, about twelve years of age, in no wise resembling the medium. This is how this historic photograph was taken:

Through the entranced medium, instructions were given to focus a camera upon a certain chair—having first placed a shawl over the back. This was done. Dr. Ochorowicz and Mlle. Tomozyk then left the room together. At the end of a few minutes they returned, developed the plate, and upon it was found the distinct imprint of a child's face,—evidently belonging to a body, seated in the chair and swathed round with the shawl in question! The experiment was performed in the hotel where they happened to be stopping; the photographic camera and plates were Dr. Ochorowicz's own, and the medium was out of the room, in the Doctor's company throughout. It has never been explained.

Perhaps the most interesting of all the phenomena which have been obtained through this medium are the so-called "radiographs"—photographs taken without any camera, and apparently by means of a form of radio-activity which issues from the medium's own body. Most of these photographs have been of "fluidic" or "materialized" hands, and they constitute some of the most striking and interesting experiments of late years.

These impressions upon photographic plates were obtained "mediumistically" that is, in more or less complete darkness, and without any apparatus. They are taken by means of a peculiar form of light which seemed to emanate from the hands themselves. Sometimes the hands were visible; sometimes invisible. Sometimes they were large, sometimes small. Sometimes they were fine and delicate and clearly defined; at other times, they seemed to be mere masses of matter in the process of condensation—partially "materialized" hands. The photographs were obtained only when the psychic was deeply entranced,-and then only on certain occasions.

The method of procedure was generally as follows: The medium being entranced, the room was darkened, with the exception of a red light, on the opposite side of the laboratory. In this light, the medium held up one of her hands (usually the right) and after a short time a fluidic hand and arm were seen to emerge from her (physical) hand, and stretch outwards into space. The "hand" generally resembled the medium's hand (which was always visible) though it changed its shape, at times, as will be described later. This fluidic hand was then requested to place itself on a photographic plate, held in the air, some distance away, by Dr. Ochorowicz, and it was seen to do so. Then it would rapidly return to the medium's body. After this, the light would be raised, the plate would be taken to the laboratory and developed, and upon it would be found the imprint of a hand-resembling that seen by the psychic.

The light "rays" which were emitted from the fluidic hand seem to be under the control of the psychic. They radiate not only from these fluidic hands, but also from the physical hands of the subject, when in trance, and have been made the subject of careful study by Dr. Ochorowicz. He

believes that these "ravs" are emitted by the etheric body of the medium, since they do not correspond to the anatomical distribution of the nerves of the physical body. They are more penetrating than the "rays" discovered some two years ago, and brought to the attention of the French Academy. The actinic action of the emitted ravs is feeble, comparatively speaking; and the visible light of the fluidic hands is less actinic than the invisible light. These rays cannot penetrate solid substances, like X-rays: in "thought-photography," on the other hand, the rays can penetrate solid substances with the greatest ease.

Dr. Ochorowicz thus describes a few of his experiments:—

"The somnambule said that she did not see the double's hand leave hers, but saw it placed upon the plate. It was placed upon it at an angle of 90 degrees from the position taken by her own hand. At my request, the thumb was made particularly distinct,—the whole hand being quite different, in contour, from that of the medium.

"I take another plate and hold it some distance from the medium's hand. She makes an effort to impress it, with the result that an immense finger, superhuman in size, is seen upon the plate when developed. Upon the next plate, which I hold about 25 cm. from her hands, three fingers appear, non-luminous—the light seeming to come from behind the hand, and shining through the spaces between the fingers.

"I now hold a plate at a distance of one meter from her right hand, which is held up in front of her. The red light is turned The somnambule sees a slightly low. shadowy hand detach itself from hers, which is at the same time, also, attached to a very long, thin arm, and which approaches the plate. The hand is very large she says, and is a right hand. places itself over the plate, which I thereupon remove and develop. A large hand is distinctly visible upon it. Finally, I hold a plate two and a half meters away from the medium's hand. The somnambule shivers and feels cold in her lower limbs, despite the fact that my laboratory is very warm. She again holds out her right hand, and a *left* hand, attached to a long, thin arm, is seen by her to detach itself and place itself over the plate held in my hand. Upon being developed, the impression of a very large left hand was found upon the plate—so large that only a portion of the hand could be seen. The whole of the medium's hand can easily be placed on the plate. These are very similar to the enormous hands seen in the Palladino seances, and said to be those of 'John King.'

"From the above facts, I think we are justified in arriving at the following ten-

tative conclusions:—

"1. That the hand of the 'double' can be larger than that of the medium.

- "2. That a left hand can be projected from a right arm, drawing its force from the entire body of the subject,—this being accompanied by a chilly feeling in the extremities and by congestion of the head.
- "3. That the arm of the double appears to shrink in size according to its distance from the medium's body.
- "4. That it is easier for the fluidic hand to imprint itself upon the photographic plate (negative) in white than in black.
- "5. That in the case of the large and shining thumb it is surrounded by a clear halo of light.
- "6. The etheric body of the medium, the double, behaves as though it were an independent spirit."

In a series of further tests, the fluidic hand was made larger and smaller upon request.

It will be seen that all these experiments depend upon the theory that there is an etheric or fluidic body, as well as a physical body; and that this fluidic body is capable of extension beyond the limits of the physical body, carrying with such extention its dynamic qualities. In fact we have in such instances what is technically known as "exteriorization of motivity"—or, the externalization of motor faculties beyond the physiological limits of the body. It is because of this that movements of solid objects at a distance from the body of the medium are possible: and all the many similar manifestations which have been observed in the past, in the presence of Home, Eusapia Palladino, Mlle. Tomczyk, and other mediums of a similar type.

But this partial detachment of the etheric body from its physical partner also gives rise, on the other hand, to another set of phenomena known as "exteriorization of sensitivity"-in which sensation of feeling is carried on, in this fluidic body, independent of the physical body. Thus, if the fluidic body has been removed from the physical body by means of hypnotic suggestion,—as has frequently been accomplished,—and what seems to us the "empty air" is picked with a pin, the subject feels this prick on her own physical body, in the spot exactly corresponding to the place pricked on the "fluidic body." (Of course, the medium is prevented from seeing where the fluidic body is pricked). Meanwhile her own (physical) body is completely insensible and anaesthesic.

These researches have been carried on for the most part by French experimenters, -who are far ahead of the rest of the world, in many respects, in psychic investigation. Having satisfied themselves years ago that the facts are genuine, and supernormal, they set themselves the task of studying them from the scientific viewpoint,—with the natural result that they have progressed far beyond the majority of English and American investigators, who are still squabbing over the very authenticity of the facts! One day this will, of course, be proved to the satisfaction of all; and then it will be realized how far behind this country is in psychic investigation of every character. This is, I consider, a standing disgrace in a country such as this, which prides itself on its freedom, its riches and its open-mindedness. sides Dr. Hyslop and myself, there is hardly a man in America who is studying these questions from the scientific standpoint; and who is willing to devote his life to the work. Dr. Hyslop, being a psychologist, is naturally more interested in the psychological problems; while I am frank to confess that the physical phenomena interests me more. But the whole field should be investigated. In France, the Government has endowed the General Psychological Institute with nearly a million francs,—allowing a number of first-class scientific men to study these problems as

Thus, we left the little Island of Koati with deep regret, having concluded our investigations and measurements of the ruins.

# Jugglery and Spiritualism Compared

W. F. Jamieson, of Pentwater, Michigan, in a recent issue of the "Truth Seeker" in an article under the caption of "My Journey Into Spiritualism-and Out" compares Spiritualism with Jugglery. In a selfsatisfied and confident manner he proves that Spiritualism is all a fraud. And how does he prove it? By a dogmatic statement that it is so! # Health Hints for Efficiency

Primitive man knew only of his legs as a means of locomotion. By and by he ventures upon the back of a horse and finds that a swifter method; and for ages the horse was the swiftest method of transit known. The ancients used to dream of their footmen and horses having wings, and the Greeks immortalized winged Mercury and Pegasus,—both prophecies of the future when men would fly. With the Romans the galley-slave was the only known method of navigation. Columbus, by means of sails to his vessels, crossed the Atlantic. A century ago the application, by Fulton, of steam to navigation enabled us to cross the ocean in two weeks time; now by the aid of steam we can encircle the globe in less than five weeks. Men are never satisfied. Something better and better still is demanded. When a boy I remember the wonder accorded the velocipede; then came the short era of the bicycle, which already is a matter of history. Not over fifteen years ago the automobile was a source of wonderment. Now on a pleasant evening it is difficult to cross Rockefeller Boulevard in Cleveland on account of the passing procession of autos coming and going. Yet onward is the cry; and not ten years ago

the Wright brothers taught us to fly, and today it is a common thing for pleasurecraft and army men to navigate the air: all of which foretells the approaching of a time when men will sprout wings, and soaring, "know the joy a bird knows when it goes fleeting." Efficiency has become a common term in modern nomenclature in all walks of life. Not many years ago-Standard Oil Co. wasted more oil than they marketed. Today that waste has been gathered up, refined and utilized in the form of scores of by-products of more monetary value than the worth of the original oil. The waste paper rag-man: teaches us that nothing need be lost. In the packing-house district of Chicago all! the pig is utilized; his feet for gelatine, bristles for brushes, stomach to fill the druggist's shelf with pepsin. Nothing is lost but the squeal.

In all lines of business, in shop and factories, there is coming in a system of standardizing human effort. Every movement is made to count and economy of motion is demanded. If five movements of the arm and hand will accomplish a work, why make six? In a day's work it oft measures the difference between success and failure. 20% saved in motion is

a cutting of overhead expenses just that much.

The time has arrived when old men are pigeon-holed. Young blood is demanded to head our banks, offices, and factories. A large candy establishment with three retail stores in Cleveland has a beardless youth at its head. One of our most successful banking institutions, with several branches, has a boy as president and another as secretary.

The machinery of to-day is scrapped tomorrow and sold to the junk dealer. Why? Because of the demand for the accomplishment of better and more profitable work.

Young man, apply these facts to your own case. Are you getting all that you are entitled to get out of life? Do you have on the high-pressure gauge? human machine is the most economical made; utilizing a far greater amount of the heat energy produced than any other machine. Does it matter what care you give the automobile, as to the amount of service you will secure from it for a certain period? It is any less important that the human machine receive due care and consideration? Let us study this machine, this human locomotive. Like the railway locomotive, it requires fuel to produce energy. The coal in the fire-box produces heat, some of which heat is transformed into working energy. So the human engine consumes fuel-food to produce heat, some of which heat is transformed into nerve force, glandular power, muscular energy.

This brings us to the important question of foods, or fuel supply. Does it make any difference whether we feed this machine corn, oats, wheat, rye and rice, or, on the other hand, beer, tea, coffee, flesh, and white bread? It certainly does. You cannot attain the acme of thought and action on a diet that lacks any essential elements of food, or that is already filled with waste products. Your body structure requires sixteen different elements. These must be found in your food daily, or the body suffers. Do you know what foods are rich in iron for your blood, phosphorus for your nerves, potash and nitrogen salts for your muscles? What study is more important for you? Is Algebra, is Latin, is Geometry? "The greatest study of mankind is man."

Reverting again to the question of food supply, what food will best keep your brain at a point of excellency where it will respond most readily to your demands upon it for thought? What shall you eat to enable your muscles to reach their highest point of endurance? Which are the best blood making foods?

Rice contains three times the amount of nourishment contained in the best lean beef. Rice is the chief article of diet of over half the race, and was the principle diet of the Japs in their campaigning in Manchuria, (and they never lost a battle). De Lesseps said it would have been impossible to have dug the Suez canal, had it not been for the barley and date eating Arabs. The South American Indian carries heavy loads over the Andes mountains. subsisting on nothing but a diet of plantain and bananas. Black bread and vegetables is the diet of the sturdy Swiss mountaineer. Oats suffices for the Scotchman, macaroni and chestnuts for the Italian, corn for the Russian, but the German and American must have their beef and beer. Consequently their kidneys are breaking down under the load. Every twelfth man dies of Bright's disease of the kidney. Look well to your diet and thus save your kidneys. Cancer from pork eating is on the rapid increase and soon will outdistance tuberculosis.

According to Gen. I:29, the race started out on a non-flesh diet, and without tea. coffee, or pork on their menu. over one half of the people of the earth are still living on this primitive diet. The late Dr. Nicholas Senn, who traveled in many countries, said that in those countries where no pork is eaten, appendicitis and malignant diseases are unknown. Any of the cereals, any of the legumes, any of the nuts, contain three times the amount of nourishment contained in the best lean beef-steak. Beef contains 28% nourishment and, besides, a great deal of poisonous waste. Cereals, legumes, and nuts contain 85% to 90% nourishment, with no poison and but little waste. Then which foods will produce the most fuel energy? Figs contain 57% nourishment, dates 67%, bananas 27%, the latter nearly the same as meat. Fish, fowl, and eggs contain 22%.

# The Coming Race

By Edward Lord Lytton.

#### Chapter 6.

I remained in this unconscious state, as I afterwards learned, for many days, even for some weeks, according to our computation of time. When I recovered I was in a strange room, my host and all his family were gathered round me, and to my utter amaze my host's daughter accosted me in my own language with but a slightly foreign accent.

"How do you feel?" she asked.

It was some moments before I could overcome my surprise enough to falter out, "You know my language? How? Who and what are you?"

My host smiled and motioned to one of his sons, who then took from a table a number of thin metallic sheets on which were traced drawings of various figures a house, a tree, a bird, a man, etc.

In these designs I recognized my own style of drawing. Under each figure was written the name of it in my language, and in my writing, and in another handwriting a word strange to me beneath it.

Said the host, "Thus we began; and my daughter Zee, who belongs to the College of Sages, has been your instructress and ours too."

Zee then placed before me other metallic sheets, on which, in my writing, words first, and then sentences were inscribed. Under each word and each sentence strange characters in another hand. Rallying my senses, I comprehended that thus a rude dictionary had been effected. Had it been done while I was dreaming? "That is enough now," said Zee, in a tone of command "Repose and take food."

#### Chapter 7.

A room to myself was assigned to me in this vast edifice. It was prettily and fantastically arranged, but without any of the splendour of metal work or gems which was displayed in the more public apartments. The walls were hung with a variegated matting made from the stalks and fibres of plants, and the floor carpeted with the same.

Did I want to silence the birds? I had but to draw a curtain over the aviary, and their song hushed as they found themselves left in the dark. Another opening formed a window, not glazed, but on touching a spring, a shutter ascended from the floor. formed of some substance less transparent than glass, but still sufficiently pellucid to allow a softened view of the scene with-To this window was attached a balcony, or rather hanging-garden, wherein grew many graceful plants and brilliant flowers. The apartment and its appurtenances had thus a character, if strange in detail, still familiar, as a whole, to modern notions of luxury, and would have excited admiration if found attached to the apartments of an English duchess or a fashionable French author. Before I arrived this was Zee's chamber; she had hospitably assigned it to me.

Some hours after the waking up which is described in my last chapter, I was lying alone on my couch trying to fix my thoughts on conjecture as to the nature and genus of the people amongst whom I was thrown, when my host and his daughter Zee entered the room. My host, still speaking my native language, inquired, with much politeness, whether it would be agreeable to me to converse, or if I preferred solitude. I replied, that I should feel much honored and obliged by

the opportunity offered me to express my gratitude for the hospitality and civilities I had received in a country to which I was a stranger, and to learn enough of its customs and manners not to offend through ignorance.

As I spoke I had of course risen from my couch; but Zee, much to my confusion, curtly ordered me to lie down again, and there was something in her voice and eye, gentle as both were, that compelled obedience. She then seated herself unconcernedly at the foot of my bed, while her father took his place on a divan a few feet distant.

"But what part of the world do you come from," asked my host, "that we should appear so strange to you, and you to us? I have seen individual specimens of nearly all the races differing from our own, except the primeval savages who dwell in the most desolate and remote recesses of uncultivated nature, unacquainted with other light than that they obtain from volcanic fires, and contented to grope their way in the dark, as do many creeping, crawling, and even flying things. But certainly you cannot be a member of those barbarous tribes, nor, on the other hand, do you seem to belong to any civilized people."

I was somewhat nettled at this last observation, and replied that I had the honor to belong to one of the most civilized nations of the earth; and that, so far as light was concerned, while I admired the ingenuity and disregard of expense with which my host and his fellow-citizens had contrived to illumine the regions unpenetrated by the rays of the sun, yet I could not conceive how any who had once beheld the orbs of heaven could compare to their lustre the artificial lights invented by the necessities of man. But my host said he had seen specimens of most of the races differing from his own, save the wretched barbarians he had mentioned. Now, was it possible that he had never been on the surface of the earth, or could he only be referring to communities buried within its entrails?

My host was for some moments silent; his countenance showed a degree of surprise which the people of that race very rarely manifest under any circumstances, howsoever extraordinary. But Zee was more intelligent, and exclaimed, "So you see, my father, that there is truth in the old tradition; there always is truth in every tradition commonly believed in at all times and by all tribes."

I answered, that under the surface of the earth there were mines containing minerals, or metals, essential to our wants and our progress in all arts and industries; and I then briefly explained the manner in which, while exploring one of these mines, I and my ill-fated friend had obtained a glimpse of the regions into which we had descended, and how the descent had cost him his life; appealing to the rope and grappling-hooks that the child had brought to the house in which I had been at first received, as a witness of the truthfulness of my story.


