## HEALTH AND HYGIENE

trol in habits of eating and of restriction of food to the actual, systematic, physiological requirements. If diseases are to be curred, or morganized exclusive absorbed, the restriction must be carried to the point where the system lives for a time on the waste locked in its tissues, and carried in the blood. This is 'cleaning house,' and the food, like the sail of a beat, must be trimmed flat enough to allow the body to weather the conditions present. Starches and sugars are the most likely to clog the system; and means and other foods should be controlled."

The above item contains information that has been known to hygienists for decades; the hygienic method of curing diseases by regulating the food supply; yet when any one not a doctor attempts to help others to health by the use of hygienic rules be promptly arrested at the instigation of some county medical board. There is a determined attempt now being made all over the United States to prevent any one but a drug doctor to give advice to the sick. Bills have been introduced in state legislatures making it a crime for any one but a doctor to recommend or suggest anything to a sick person; if these bills become law, it would be a crime to-tell a friend to take a hot bath or to use mustard plaster for a cold.

the British Medical Association, asid: "After all these long years of flickering hope I am prepared to costeed that the indiscriminate maining and slaughter of animal life, with which these bacteriological methods of research and experimentation have been insepanbly associated, cannot be proved to have assed one single human life or lessened in any appreciable degree the load of human suffering. I have ventured to make that pronouncement before, but in halting, academic fashion. I reiterate it here and now with the strongest and fullest conviction."

## What Science may Soon Reveal to Us

THE whole scientific world is to-day eagerly expecting the announcement of the discovery of something new and starting. There is wide divergence of opinion as to just which is discovery will be, but it is fairly well settled in tending of most observed that is more than bloom of the opinion of most observed that it will provide us with an entirely new means of navigating the six.

We have been so accustomed to think of the spirit world as being at an infinite distance from us that it is hard for us to believe that in all likelihood it is close around us. The teachings of science, however, show us most conclusively that there is a vast unexplored region around us, into the depths of which we have as yet been unable to penetrate. The comparatively recent discovery of the vaso-motor nerves has placed auto-suggestion, we are told, well within the bounds of tangible medical science. Says Mr. Finot: "The forces of our soul, properly directed, can render us wonderful services in the matter of prolonging life. Auto-suggestion—the power of will used with conscious effort to a given end—can prolong life. Autosuggestion, improperly directed or abused, shortens life. On reaching a certain age, with a long record of shattered ideals behind us, we voluntarily give way to the overwhelming idea of approaching dissolution, We lose confidence in our strength and powers. Under the pretext that old age lies heavily upon us, we adopt sedentary habits and lead idle lives. By degrees the blood becomes vitiated; tissue refuses to recreate; the body becomes a prey to all kinds of illness to which inactivity has pre-disposed the system. Old age, in fine, comes upon us, long before it is due, and solely because we have abused our powers of auto-suggestion."

What, then, is the remedy? In plain language, to live by surto-suggestion, not to die by it. Goeth, clearly states the case when he says that "man can command nature to eliminate from the body all matters that cause him suffering." Negative action, however, will by no means suffice. We must stock our minds with active beneficent auto-suggestions and direct them in their proper channels. In this connection, Mr. Finnet cites the case of an English hypochondriac whose physician had resorted to every known remedy without effect. Finally, as a desperate measure, the patient was ordered to have his sitting and bed room walls plastered with the legend, "Oh, I am so jolly!" And, in a short time, he became a sound man mentally and physically—clearly, a victory for auto-suggestion.

Mr. Finot lays down these specific injunctions: Reflections on the shortness of life are obnoxious; one must remember, rather. Seneca's famous dictum that not so much the shortness of time as the amount of it that we dissipate, is of consequence. A rational use of the functional organs is insisted upon, from early youth, with the rejection of all depressing ideas, and the conviction that the body possesses a real power of resistance to the invasion of time. We should also acquiesce in the Herelian principle that there is much good in what appears to be bad, if only dispassionate reason be given full play. Above all, work is necessary, without which, as the sage of Weimar says, no man is free. Theoretically, Mr. Finot says, life can be shown to be equal, potentially, to a one-hundred-and-fifty, or even a two-hundred-year span. Even practically, he thinks, the potential span of life is much greater than people dare imagine. In a consideration of the "age of retirement," which is generally-and absurdlyplaced at 60, he says that when men retire at that age from active life, the result is that active life begins to retire from them.

The critical period of old age, he finds from a comperbusive study of mortality statistics, lies, under actual conditions, between 80 and 85. If a man can weather this crucial hustrum, the odds are in favor of this reaching, or exceeding, the century limit. It frequently takes a man, he asserts, eighty years to acquire as full knowledge of the capacities and capacities of his organization, under the present conditions of knowledge. # Can the Dead Send Messages to the Living?

THE question of whether the dead can in any way communicate with their surviving friends on the earth has been raised again by the announcement that certain members of the American Society for Psychical Research are receiving measages which they believe to be sent by the discarnate spirit of Dr. Hodgson, the recently deceased president of that body. It is only within the last forty or fifty vears that a serious

attempt has been made to apply scientific tests to the mories of communications from the dead, in which the literature and popular tradition of every race are rich. The Society for Psychical Research ones its existence to the desire of a few courageous men to apply such tests. Its work has been much misconceived by outsiders, who are as ready as usual to seize upon the Indicrous elements and to ignore the methods of research which appeal to men of the caliber of Prof. Richet and Prof. Barrett, Sir. Oliver Lodge, and Sir William Crookes.

What is really important in regard to this very interesting question of possible comminications from the dead, is not to ask whether they are good or had for mankind but simply whether they can be above to take place. And of this war still awaiting definite and irrefragable proof. There are, of course, counters alleged cases in which a message has been precived from a deceased friend or relative, whether through a "medium" or by automatic writing—with planchter or otherwise—or in a dream or a waking vision. But as yet none of these has satisfied that essentific inquires, although many people—like Archdecom Colley—are quite honestly convinced that they have received such comminications.

In order to satisfy the test of science, such a communication must fulfill two or three simple conditions. In the first place, there must be a definite message, capable of permanent record. The mere apportions of a deal friend is not utilicine, because we can exerc be sure that it is not an halbridation, due to some shormanl state of the witnesser errorus system. Secondly, the message thus received must state some fact which (1) is capable of proof, (2) was within the knowledge of the aligned sender, (3) can be demonstrated ant to have been known to the releiver,

This at once rules out all the communications as to the future state of disembodied spirits which form by far the greater part of the recorded messages received by mediums; and as yet there is no absolutely convincing case in which such a message has been received, though Mrs. Piper's communications from "G. P." are understood to have been satisfactory to many investigators.

The late Mr. F. W. H. Myers was the first to point out that the time was ripe for experiments to be made on these lines. "Why should not every deathbed," he asked, "he made the starting point of a long experiment?" He suggested that every one who was interested in this question, should leave behind him the materials for a satisfactory test of his future ability to communicate with his unreview friends.

. "The simplest plan," he said, "is to write down some servence embodying an idea or a name which you fell it probable that you will remember, if you remember anything, and then to seal this sentence up in an envelope, without communicating it to any person whatever. Then label the envelope "Posthomous Letter' and send it accompanied by a letter giving name and address, to the secretary, Society for Psychical Research, 30 Hanover square, London, W. The secretary will acknowledge seccipt and store the letter safely, with others of the kind. If, then, the writer (it may be many years afterward) finds himself capable of sending a message from the drebe world, let him mention this test sentence and try to reproduce it. The sealed envelope can be seen be opened; and if the spirit's message should be found to 6 found to

coincide with the words therein written, there will be as good a proof as we can get that that message has at any rate not emanated from any living mind, and has emanated, therfore, from some unlimited source of knowledge, or—which will seem to most persons more probable—from the surviving mind of the original writer."

It is understood that Mr. Myers himself carried out this plan, which might be usefully initiated by all who takes an interest in the subject. As yet he has not been able to reproduce his test meage. We shall said with interest to hear whether Dr. Hodgsmonth has been more successful, as the rumors afloat seem to indicate to be the case. A single successful effort of this kind would out-weigh all the mass of vague and usually uncheckable statements which form the both of "spiritualistic" ilterature.

### A Curious Experiment.



Mr. Godfrey as illustrative of similar deference of experimental hallacinations. In the Godfrey case the 'willing' begin at 10:45 p. m. on the night of Nov. 13 and hasted only eight minutes, after which Mr. Godfrey fell asleep, whereas it was not until 3:30 a. m. of the following moming that the hallocinatory vision appeared to the 'perceptiont.'"

He sent for militard Tbompson, the village carpenter, whom he instructed to make his coffin from a quantity of walnut lumber from a tree grown on his farm, which he had been saving for forty years. The coffin was made at the house, under his super-vision, and was carefully examined by the sick man when completed. He paid the carpenter for his work and settled with his attending physician, saving that he was going to die and would be useless for him to come Then, sending for 30 or 40 neighbors, he divided among them \$900, all that remained of his savings, in sums ranging from \$10 to \$50, according to the needs of the beneficiaries, after which he peacefully awaited the end, which came two days later

In the above we find a very good example of the power of suggestion, or thought, or imagination.

"He became ill and concluded he was going to die," here is where the suggestion became an auto-suggestion; and watching the carpenter prepare a coffin was very strong suggestion; making preparations for death served to strengthen his auto-suggestions of death and the expected result followed. 
