Objective and Subjective Concentration

EDITORIAL DEPARTMENT

It has been said that he who would pierce the veil and come in touch with the life back of the form must first realize and comprehend the life within himself, though it is often the case that in the attempt to penetrate Nature's secrets, the attention is chiefly directed toward the exoteric.

Thus the most delicate mechanical apparatus are becoming more essential and more complex, in order to accentuate the senses of sight, hearing and touch. To some these outward appliances would seem to be the only means by which they may come to an understanding of these scientific truths.

There is occasionally one who adopts First of all, he considers other methods. that as a fundamental principle, life and consciousness are one and the same, that these terms are synonymous, and that if the individual will study and endeavor to unfold the consciousness within himself he will become responsive and receptive to finer and more delicate vibrations, and be able to receive knowledge by direct perception and receptivity. In such investigation there is much work and study, but at the same time he is unfolding his own consciousness, his study is himself, and he seeks by careful training of thought to bring to the surface from the depths of his own inner being, the powers and forces that are there. As in the tiny seed lie hidden all the possibilities of food and nourishment for the physical man, or the great tree under whose spreading branches man may rest from his daily toil, it is all there, waiting unfoldment, so, hidden within each human form, is this life of the divine, one aspect of which is the power to know by direct cognition. Then again, the individual who seeks to study the life from within applies science to life rather than to form, and this constitutes concentration and meditation.

Concentration is taken from the Latin con, with, and centrum, the centre, the full interpretation, with the centre. This term concentration may be divided into two parts, that is, external and internal, objective and subjective. Objective concentration gives the individual a perception and knowledge of differences, while subjective gives one a perception and knowledge of likenesses and similarities.

To Hold an Idea as the Hand Holds an Object.

In objective concentration, an effort is made to draw the mind to one definite thing and force it to hold an idea or subject in much the same manner as the hand is made to grasp an object and hold it so long as the individual wills. Thus in one instance the thing is taken up for investigation from an external point of view, while in the other instance the mind takes a subject for investigation from the esoteric, though in both instances the object or subject must be held for a given length of time before any definite knowledge can be gathered from it.

In the daily life of each individual there are many opportunities for the cultivation of the objective concentration, and no matter whether he realizes it or not, he is cultivating these qualities whenever he seeks to become the master of his work, no matter what that work may be, or however relatively unimportant the task imposed upon him.

The shoemaker who makes a pair of shoes perfectly has become an expert along that line of work. The mechanic who can build a perfect machine and operate the same; the carpenter who can build a house that will withstand the wintry blasts, all these become masters in their particular line of work, and have consciously or unconsciously cultivated objective concentration, but just at this particular point in

the unfoldment, the individual must face more or less danger of becoming too much absorbed in the object upon which he is concentrating; as for instance, one who is entirely devoted to the acquisition of wealth, fleeting honors and fame, at last becomes totally absorbed by that object which usurps the place of master, while he becomes the slave, and even should this condition not arise there is ever a danger that often may be observed, viz.: of unequal development; the mind, being permitted to rush outward without careful thought or consideration, or subjective concentration being practiced in order to gain and hold the proper centralization, balance and harmony.

Subjective Concentration Gives the Inner Life an Opportunity to Manifest Itself, thus Gaining Power and Ability in Action.

On the side of the objective concentration we have reasoning, deliberation, forethought, calculation and practical common sense, while on the side of subjective concentration we have calm passivity The mind becoming receptive and permits the knowledge that lies within the soul to become manifest to the lower consciousness, and by its being impressed upon the brain centre it naturally becomes of use and lasting service to the individual. and creates an environment about himself that impresses and affects those who may come in contact with him according to their sensitiveness and receptivity. When an individual seeks to live in this higher expression of life, he will have an influence for good in the community in which he resides, and be of service to himself and others.

By investigation it will be found just as difficult to cease all mental activity at will, as to compel the mind to hold to any given subject for any given length of time, and it is well that this is so. The mind is found to be the only true instrument of investigation and research in the science of life divine, and until man has become master of that mind the secrets of life must remain more or less hidden from his view.

As we learn that life is not destroyed by its constant change of expression, but must go on to the goal of perfection, we may realize how these qualities of concentration and meditation affect the various expressions of life and change the personality; in a careful study of the animal life we may observe the power of thought, as for instance, some insects and animals are enabled to conform their color and appearance to their surroundings in order to give them a fairer chance against innumerable enemies, and on the other hand to enable them to more readily approach unperceived their natural prey, and by this fair division of possibilities, is the balance of Nature's law maintained. How often do we have to deplore the disastrous results of man's interference with this balance, and it is thus we find the necessity of concentration and meditation on the part of humanity.

Concentration and Meditation.

Many are quite apt to confuse concentration with meditation. While concentration is a centralization of the mind or thought, meditation is drawing to the centre of one's own being, and from that centre being able to direct the mind and guide the senses.

We have been taught "the kingdom of heaven is within," still many today are seeking the kingdom in all directions, looking everywhere but within their own being; the peace that passeth all understanding is not to be found in the objective world, and can only be attained when emotion and external thought is dropped, and a higher state of consciousness has arisen wherein is reflected the peace of the infinite even as the tiny dewdrop mirrors and reflects the glorious sun.

Meditation is the door to the kingdom within the individual and it must be kept in mind that at the centre of one's being, the soul, the individual is no longer identified with any modification of the mind expression for it is there alone, where mind itself is quiescent, can peace truly be found and realized, and there are but a comparatively small number in the world today who are truly able to practice meditation and the reason of this that all their mental images gather around them and bar the way to the cenre; the demon of doubt is one of these images, which when

left to his own freedom has the power to weaken and retard the action of the will.

Astrologically we have found Saturn to be the planet that has chief control over the power of meditation, and thus while his lower influence is unpleasant, disagreeable and even severe, his true higher influence is most essential. He is the planet of steadfastness. His vibrations produce profound thought, earnestness, patience and a desire to know. He is the great pain producer and the reaper of experience. Saturn afflicted is considered to bring sorrow and pain, though sorrow exists for the purpose of driving the individual from the external to the centre of being, and Saturn is really the planet Jupiter reversed in his influence, and the experience of sorrow as essential, in order to compel the soul to find its own peace within, and through this peace comes a realization of unity and bliss .- Science and Key of Life Vol. VI.

It Is a Crime to Have a Cold.

Dr. H. W. Wiley, chief of the bureau of chemistry, department of agriculture, in a recent lecture to Cornell students said:

"Sanitation has been defined as the function of the sciences of engineering and chemistry. The science of public health is the science of the individual always. Man is an animal that is intended to live a certain time. Of course accidents happen and people die by disease, mostly preventable. Because disease is preventable, death may be said to occur either by suicide or homicide, whether it is brought about by personal carelessness or the condition of environment.

If you wish to beautify the outer, you must first beautify the inner, for every thought and every motion shapes the delicate tracings of your face for ugliness or beauty. Inharmonious and destructive attitudes of mind will warp and mar the most beautiful features.

Most destructive to beauty of face, sweetness of expression and delicacy of coloring, are fear, anger, jealousy, pride, and above all, self-pity. All such inharmonious emotions poison the secretions, jar the nerves and distort facial expression.

The beautiful face is produced by harmony of mind, sweetness of thought, cheerfulness, joy, kindness, and the inward consciousness of the beautiful. Feel the beautiful and you will express that feeling in your face, and your ordinary appearance will give place to the loveliness of a charm that is attractive and beautiful.

Do not try to improve the beauty of your face by painting the surface. There is nothing so repulsive as the dead, mask-like expression of a painted face. Keep your system clean, your mind wholesome, and express in your face the harmony you feel in your soul, and your complexion and expression will soon become far more beautiful than any artificial product of the beauty shop; the expression of your face will not be that of a painted wax figure, but the living reflection of a fascinating mind and a beautiful soul.

On your birthday do not worry because you are growing older, but say to yourself: "I am one year younger, in mind and soul." The youth of the real man, the spiritual man, does not depend upon the worn appearance of the outer garment; it depends

Cooking.

All matter is composed of little electrical charges called ions. These ions are grouped in certain fashions to make the atoms of the chemical elements; and these atoms, in turn, are arranged in various combinations which determine the chemical compounds or substances of which the sea, earth and air, tadpoles, albatrosses and automobiles are composed. The manner in which these ions and atoms are combined determines which elements or compounds are formed. Two ions chased by four abreast, followed by three more driving tandem, may be hydrogen, and six hydrogen atoms around two of carbon, with an oxygen atom circumnavigating the whole, form alcohol; and three billion molecules of alcohol, four billion of water and one of common sense, make a "plain drunk." All these myriads of little eddies of electricity are in neverending motion, whirling, turning and revolving in their orbits like an infinite swarm of tiny comets, moons and suns.

Just as the difference in the way in which these minute particles of matter are combined constitute the substances they form, so does the rate at which they move constitute what we call temperature. The form of motion and the rate of motion are intimately related. Certain forms of motion, and hence certain forms of matter, can exist only at certain temperatures. In the hottest stars we find only hydrogen and helium and the lighter elements. As the stars cool, nickel, iron and other metals are formed; much later, when the cooling process has progressed far enough so that the motion or temperature is slowed down to something near the temperature we have on this earth, carbon, oxygen and nitrogen, the elements of life, are formed.

But these life elements cannot combine to form the life substances until a temperature below the boiling point of water is reached. At a temperature between 32° and 150° F., all the life on this globe was created. Were the temperature of the

earth to pass again without that range, all life would perish, for this is the only range of temperature at which that most complex of chemical compounds, protoplasm, the essential substance of every liv-

ing cell, can exist.

In all that great range of temperature, from the hottest stars down to the absolute zero of interstellar space where the lightest of gases freeze as hard as steel, only in the one brief span of a hundred degrees, scarcely one-hundredth part of the whole, can life exist; while warm-blooded life, which is the highest form, can exist only within a range of ten degrees or twelve degrees. We are even alarmed if the clinical thermometer shows a change in the temperature of our blood of two degrees.

Aided by the energy of sunlight, the vegetable or plant takes inorganic matter and converts it into organic or living matter, such as is found in leaves, fruits, nuts, cereals—the natural foods of man. It is

only through this process that mineral elements can become a part of animal life.

As the life substance can exist only within a limited range of temperature, when we apply artificial heat to our food in the process of cooking it results in such a change as destroys the elementary plant form, and the mineral elements return to their inorganic condition. A leaf of cabbage, if immersed in water that can easily be endured by the bare hand, will wilt, showing that part of its cellular life is destroyed at that temperature.

The degree of heat necessary to change the chemical properties of a substance depends upon the substance. Gold may be heated in a furnace to the highest temperature which human ingenuity can attain, and it will still come out gold; but let a young housewife get her biscuits a few degrees too hot and they will come out of the oven a radically different substance

from what she had planned.

The Sacred Name—Yod: He: Vau: He.

I find in the March number of "The Stellar Ray" that the same error has been made by a contributor in translating the letters of the Sacred, that is, Secret, Name into our Roman or American letters, which has for centuries been used by the priests to blind the unthinking and ignorant masses.

In the Hebrew, that is the sacred or secret language of the ancient priesthood, the letters of this sacred name are Yod: He: Vau: He; to this day this word is never pronounced save once a year by the chief priest, but is translated and spoken Adonai, that is Adonis, The Sun.

The Hebrew letters, Yod: He: Vau: He: are the tenth, the fifth, the sixth and the fifth letter repeated of this sacred alphabet, to translate them as I. H. V. H. is ridicu-

lous, as our letter H has no part in this name, but is used to trick the uninitiated and prevent the Truth from becoming too easily attained.

The fifth letter of the Hebrew alphabet, the He: is our letter E, and "The Word" placed as below will convey a world of meaning:

That is, The One and Eve or Adam and Eve (for Eve—the Moon—is the rib taken from the side of Adam—the Earth), and also The One—the Sun, and Eve—the Moon, the two great lights, "the Sun to rule the day and the Moon to govern the night."

By Saint, by Savage and by Sage, Jehovah, Jove or Lord."

The Name is generally understood to

stand for Jove, that is Jupiter, the greater benefic, Jew Peter, hence the free translation, the usual appellation Jehovah.

As an additional proof I give an exact copy of the Catholic hymn to the Blessed Virgin, "Hail, Bright Star of Ocean:"
"Hail, bright Star of Ocean, God's own

Mother blest,

Ever sinless Virgin, Gate of heavenly rest.

Taking that sweet AVE, which from Gabriel came,

Peace confirm within us, changing EVA'S name."

Eva or Eve is the Moon, and in proof thereof, Gabriel, Angel of the Moon, is given as the source of this name. There are many such admissions in the Christian prayer and hymn books. The elucidation conveyed in the statement that the bright "Star of Ocean" is "God's Own Mother Blest," needs no comment to enforce conviction from truthseekers.

As the letters of the sacred alphabet had their cabalistic value and were interchangeable therewith, so also they represented The Trinity of Mothers or Father, Mother, Son, with the seven planets and days of the week, and the twelve signs of the Zodiac or months, or Tribes of Israel or Apostles of Our Lord, together.

Mothers or Trinity— 3
Planets— 7
Zodiac— 12=22

The name placed in another formation, gives a wonderful light:

Vod- I- 10 Virgo—Mother of Our Lord, the Virgin.

the Virgin.

He- E- 5 Aries—Exaltation of the Sun,

The Lamb of God.

Vau- V- 6 Taurus—Exaltation of the Moon, Eve.

He- E- 5 Aries (as above).

Now 26 or 2 plus 6, equals 8, which is the Hebrew Heth, or our letter H, that is Cancer, the Mother sign, or the Manger or Benjamin or Justice, Nizah. See "Science and Key of Life," vol. 6, for an explanation of these and other numbers.

That I may not appear singular, and as numerous other mistranslations are in daily use, I give an instance of another, entirely in the words of that eminent astrologer and Hebrew scholar, the Rev. Robt. Taylor, B. A. of St. John's College, Cambridge; member of the Royal College of Surgeons; author of the Diagesis, etc., who was born at 3 p. m., Edmonton, England, Aug. 18, 1784.

In his lecture on "The Star of Bethlehem," part 2, on page 27 of vol. 1, he gives this remarkable explanation, viz:

"As Jesus Christ is made to say of Himself in that beautiful and scientific astronomical mythos called 'The Revelation of St. John,' 'I am the Amen, the faithful and true witness,' so the name of Yesus or Jesus, so deceitfully sheltered from the discovery of its true (real) meaning, by the Latin termination—us (which is no part of it) in its dissyllabic and earlier form, is Yes, which has become our English form of assent or pledge of fidelity and truth. As we say Yes with the same meaning as Amen, that is, verily, it is so—or I consent—I will—that is, by God I will.

"Hues-Yes-being the most ancient name of the God Bacchus (God of Wine), and absolutely retained to this day upon all our Christian altar pieces and pulpit cloths in those three mystical letters I:H:S:, which are Greek letters, absurdly read (translated) as Roman letters, by our Romish monks, as if they were to stand for the words Jesus Hominum Salvator, Jesus, the Savior of Men, whereas they really are the name spelled at full length of the Pagan God, Bacchus, the god of wine, in whose honor at those altars our Christian Bacchanals, not knowing what they do, continue to this day to drink the Sacramental wine, which is the blood of the grape, that is by metonymy upon metonymy, the blood of Bacchus, that is of Ies or Yes-the personified genius of the Sun, whose name is written in those letters I:H:S: and surrounded with that circle of golden rays, than which your ingenuity could not write the word Sun, nor depict it in an hieroglyphical representation less to be mistaken, even if you were the most ingenious man alive. And this same I:E:S: is composed of the Ammonian radicals, 1, The One; and E S, The Fire; ie., the Sun, the One Great Fire, i.e., the Sun, under which identical name he was the supreme

deity of the ancient fire worshippers of Persia, from whom his rites were adopted by those who are absurdly called the primitive Christians."

I wish this was really so, then Truth would not be so difficult to find, for Jesus-is—The Truth!

In the above two instances it will be plainly seen, some of the means adopted by the learned, the historians, the writers on religious subjects and by the clergy generally, to deceive the masses and prevent the connection between Astrology and Religion from being instantly seen, known and recognized.

In any other case the translation of the Hebrew He and the Greek Epsilon into our letter H would subject the writer to ridicule, but here all seem to combine to assist the fraud.

The Hebrew He and the Greek Epsilon are our letter E, and when properly translated in the instances given will immediately throw a flood of light on some religious ceremonies and symbols. I therefore protest against such mistranslations, whether done through ignorance or with a view to deceive, and call upon all astrologers, occultists and truth-seekers to aid in the finding of the Christ as given in Colos. 1 verse 27, to seek elsewhere is useless effort. If you have an average good Horoscope, these aspects as given will apply to you; because if you are having a good or bad transit of any planet, a transit being the every-day motions, of the planets through the houses of the Zodiac and houses of individual horoscope, and the aspects of the planets as given here will be the aspects formed to the planets by transit in the Horoscope. I have noticed these daily aspects of the Moon (and in judging them as to good and bad I consider the aspects between the other planets), for several years and I find that it is profitable to choose days when there are good aspects and avoid days when there are bad aspects for doing important business, asking favors, etc.

The Chemistry of Taurus. By Dr. George W. Carey.

"The ancient Greeks and Romans had a myth that in the veins of the gods flowed a fluid called *ichor*, that their food was ambrosia, their drink elixir, and that they dined on Mount Olympus. While this was purely myth, it was, nevertheless, based upon an idea, the conception of which was founded in a principle that is universal. From "Blood of the Gods." By David P. Hatch, Los Angeles, Calif.

It is slowly dawning upon the mind of man that blood is the essence of life materialized—made manifest—and that a recognition of this awful, sacred Truth enables the neophyte to become an adept—a master. Pure blood is pure intelligence, operating in the divine temple, or workshop, creating concepts, and moving the cosmic panorama across the canvas of consciousness.

The blood of Christ means the blood of the anointed—or wise—one. No one is wise who does not know that blood is the result of chemical action. The mysteries of the divine procedure within the rivers of life, the veins and arteries of the human microcosm—man's body—will never be solved by any religious sect or mysterious cult. The analysis of chemistry—the test tubes—the spectroscope—the electric current or vibration—by these material

fingers will the keys of life be tuned and played.

Professor Loeb truly says: "The ultimate source of living matter is mineral."

The soul's house is built on a rock. Mineral salts of iron, lime, potash, soda, magnecia, silica, etc., form the base of bone, flesh, blood, and all fluids of the body, as well as the saps and tissue of vegetation.

Without a proper amount of the inorganic blood salts—tissue builders—health cannot be maintained.

Those born between April 19th and May 20th need more of the cell-salt that eliminates and regulates the water in fluids of liver and pancreas than those born in other signs. Natrum sulphate, formed by the union of sulphur and soda, is the salt that predominates in the liver and corresponds with Taurus. Deficiency in this cell-salt causes so-called bilious symptoms—malaria—as the wise doctors like to name it, and aches and pains in back, extending up to back of neck and cerebellum or lower brain. The first symptom of so-called disease always indicates a lack of the special liver salt nat. sulp. (sodium sulphate).

This salt, in crude form, is known as Glauber's Salts, and is too coarse to be taken up by the mucous membrane absorbents and carried into the circulation; it must be triturated with sugar of milk, according to the biochemic method, up to the 3d or 6th decimal before using as a remedy to supply the blood. Glauber's Salts (crude sodium sulphate) acts as a cathartic, and cathartics are never used in the biochemic system of healing.

So-called malaria, Latin for bad air, fevers, chills, or ague, yellow fever and cholera, are all caused by an excess of water in blood.

During hot weather moisture (water) is held in aqueous vapor in air, and is thus breathed into the circulatory system through the lungs. The blood requires an exact portion of water in its composition, and too much or not enough breaks the chemical formula called blood and symptoms manifest to which medical men have given names in Greek and Latin. As above written, sodium sulphate molecules eliminate any excess of water that may from any cause accumulate in the blood, fluids, or tissue of man's body. When an extra

amount of water is drawn into the blood by breathing, more of the salts of sodium sulphate are required than usual, and the molecular chain is often broken, and thus water becomes a disturbing element. Chills are caused by nature's spasmodic effort to wring the water out of blood and tissue. The cold sensation is caused by the excess of water—too much for the normal rate of blood motion to heat. After a violent chill profuse perspiration proves the excess of water theory. It generally requires about 48 hours to again overcharge the blood and bring on another chill.

Cold dry air always cures chills, and be it known that all cold air is dry air. The cure for chills when cold air cannot be had is sodium sulphate in biochemic potency. Yellow fever is caused by too much water in bile and other liver fluids. These fluids are distributed through the system, and in their union with oil, albumen, etc., become vitiated and cause the yellow skin.

Nature in her efforts to throw off the heteroplasm, combination of vitiated substances, increases the circulation and the increased motion causes the heat, called fever.

Cholera is derived from chole, Greek for bile. In cholera the bile is also over-charged with water, but for planetary and other reasons at that particular time, the specific gravity of the liver fluid is such that it flows quickly down the intestinal tract completely emptying the liver, and by its acrid quality eats up and destroys the delicate membranes of intestines, causing death in a few hours.

Mosquitoes do not cause yellow fever. The theory is too absurd for discussion. Neither are yellow fever or cholera contagious. Those who catch these conditions catch them from the air, as shown above.

Not many years ago, the Medical State Board of Health (?)—Ye gods!—caused cannons to be fired in the streets of New Orleans, thinking thereby to kill the germs of yellow fever by *jarring* them. (Wouldn't that jar-you?) Now these same medical seers say mosquitoes cause yellow fever instead of microbes.

Watery blood causes yellow fever.

When man learns to keep his blood at

the proper rate of motion by the proper dynamos—the mineral salts—he will not fear fevers, microbes, mosquitoes, nor devils.

The coming astrologer will not only foresee the planetary aspect that indicates physiological changes, but he will also understand the chemical need to assist that change, and astrologer and physician will be one again as they were in ancient days.

U. A. L.—Why are the 60 and 120 degrees aspects more benefic than the 90 and 180 degree aspects? Again, Why are the Swastika and the Horseshoe symbols of good luck?

"The Earth, the Sea, the Starry Sky,
Are cyphers writ by hand divine,
That hand which tuned their harmony,
And bade their varied glories shine;

In them e'en heathen's eye may see Symbols in one grand Truth combine, But in the Book of Books there lies

A key to read their mysteries."

"As above, so below" is the rule in all things, and aspects are the "Music of the spheres," some harmonious, some discordant, according to our moods or how we apply them.

In geometry, mathematics and music the

angles or chords are demonstrated and their uses explained. The more perfect or complete the angle is, the greater the stellar ray influence, or vibration exerted upon us or upon matter.

The symbol of harmony is a triangle and every benefic *stellar ray* constitutes a part of the trine, triangle, or angle of 120 degrees or third part of the Zodiac.

Double the triangle and we have the six pointed star, combining the sextiles and trines of the Zodiac. This is the double angle of joy and happiness.

Aries, the first sign, is sextile to, or 60 degrees from Gemini, also musculine, but airy and harmonious, as fire cannot live without air, and Gemini is sextile to Leo a fire sign, and Leo trine Aries. The triangle Aries, Leo, Sagittarius, all fire signs are harmonious, and so with all the trinities, Fire, Air, Earth and Water, which form the four trinities of the Zodiac, all

harmonious and the same sex and element, therefore benefic.

Fire and air agree, as do earth and water and they are needed to purify and assist each other.

The symbol of discord is a square the angle of sorrow, and every discordant or inharmonious vibration constitutes a portion of this angle of 90 degrees, or the fourth part of the Circle of the Zodiac, and the Cross represents the opposite signs or the angle of 180 degrees, thus + the sexes opposing each other.

The reason that these vibrations or stellar rays are discordant or evil is that they must strike each other and us—cross-ways from opposing angles, thus: +. This opposing current between two powers must produce a violent commotion, and for reason note some signs in square aspect, Aries, Cancer, Libra, Capricorn, all cardinal and all varied; Fire, Water, Air and Earth all mixed cannot avoid being discordant as all are in cross aspect and each pair opposed to or opposite to each other.

Each aspect can be formed from any point of the Zodiac, sign or house of the horoscope both direct and converse. When these influences flow in straight lines and cut through each other from cross angles, we call them bad, or evil, because discordant or inharmonious, but when they flow in straight lines but convergant angles either from or towards cach other, then we call them good, benefic, because harmonious: explaining the law "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

The Swastika is one of the most ancient occult symbols composed of four letters of the ancient glyphs joined together. Amongst the more recent, the four Greek Gammas and four Hebrew Daleths, which fourth letter of the sacred or secret alphabet it is well known represents Jupiter, Jew Peter, Zeus or Jew, Jehovah, the greater benefic from whence this cross has become the symbol of success and luck to some.

This Swastika, also formed of four of our sevens, representing the seven Evangelists, seven archangels, seven gates of the Holy City, seven heavens, seven summer months, seven stars in right hand of Jesus Christ, seven planets, seven days of the week, seven candlesticks, seven seals, seven vials of wrath, seven deadly sins, etc., etc., and in this form explains the origin of all things.

The centre where the lines meet and cross is the conception point, the lower point, the birth, the arms representing the four ages of man: The birth, youth, manhood and death of mankind and of all

things, even a thought.

The Swastika again is Thor's hammer and represents the four cardinal and four fixed signs, only the common signs being wanting to make the circle complete. You must be an initiate before you can gain full explanation of this secret symbol which was used in the ancient mysteries.

The Swastika is a sanscrit word meaning "Of Good Fortune," the Chinese word is "Wan," meaning "Many long years, or happy returns," the Anglo-Saxon word is "Fylfot," all of these pointing out the annual path of the Sun and the Planets through the Zodiac and also to the Phallic worship which the priests used to illustrate the power of God to the ignorant masses.

The Swastika is the stellar key, the arms representing the elements, Fire, Earth, Air and Water, or the four fixed signs or Zodiacal animals mentioned in the Bible, Ezekiel, 1, v. 10, and 10, v. 14, as well as Revelations 4, v. 7. The wards or branches on the end of the arms properly have the trinities arranged under their elements, the three fire signs on one arm, and so with the others. These alchemically expressed are Salt, Sulphur, Mercury and Azoth, also Carbon, Oxygen, Nitrogen and Hydrogen. The symbol represents universal generation and the occultist will write the letters I. N. R. I. on the arms to represent "Igne natura renovatur integra," or "In nobis regnat Jesus," in the original, "IAMIN, NOUR, ROUACH, IEBESCHAL!"

Horseshoes.

To the astrologer the horseshoe is the Parabrahm as well as the sign of the Sun, Leo, the lion, and Rahu, the dragon's head or the Moon's north node, often said to be as beneficent as Jupiter, which reversed is Keeto or Ketu, the Keturah of the Bible, wife of Abram or the Earth. The symbol for the 12th sign of the Zodiac (Pisces) is

the double horseshoe joined by a band, or the sexes equal and united, and this sign, Pisces, is the exaltation of Venus, the Goddess of Love.

It will interest those who nail a horseshoe over the door to know that this custom is one of the relies of the most ancient Phallic worship. It was the universal practice of some tribes to nail up in front of their tents or over their doors the external generative organs of the mare, cow or camel for good luck and to keep away witches and the evil eye, and when it was impossible to obtain these, a rude drawing thereof was thought to be sufficient, which assumed many shapes but always approximating nature. Thus it finally took the shape of the horseshoe, and when the original meaning had been forgotten by the masses, the priests to encourage the deception allowed the horseshoe to be a talisman of good luck, now recognized the world over.

In Ireland, carved figures representing the external female organ of generation have been found over the entrance to churches and the male organ is symbolized by the church steeple and spire.

Department of Psychical Sciences and Unfoldment

Since writing my last contribution I have had the pleasure of reading two weighty and admirably written books by Rudolf Steiner, a Theosophist and occulist of Berlin, Germany, whose physical development is by some regarded as very high and superphysical. Though his books are by no means easy to read or to understand, many, no doubt, will find them both instructive and corroborative of their own mystical and supernormal experiences. While the style is similar to all German mystics, not excepting Du Prel in his excellent works on the "History of Mysticism," very heavy and without much joy or sunshine strewn along the path of initiation, still whoever reads the books will feel, as all must, that Steiner is not a trifler. many take up a work of unfoldment for only selfish reasons, and the result is that before they have proceeded very far along the normal path, they meet the "Dweller on the Threshold," who sends them back into materialism or into the chaos where they seem to belong. Before one can advance very far along the path of initiation he must learn as Rudolf Steiner and others have learned, that "The Lord or

master is in (not outside) his Holy temple," and unless he purifies himself, he will never see the master, nor see into the spiritual world. This these books of Dr. Steiner exemplify and amplify. Anyone can be a medium who is organically qualified, but only those who love spiritual living and spiritual things can become adepts. Let the would-be artisan or contractor of Solomon's temple consider the cost, before he starts in to bargain for material, or he will have a Babel on his hands and not what he originally desired.

There is something peculiar about a certain school of modern, western occulists who are neither avowed Spiritualists or Theosophists, but who seem to have a cult of of their own. They seem ever ready to say that they have certain inside information, or a secret knowledge, which if they revealed, or the masters, with whom they are on the most familiar terms, desired them to divulge, they could reveal things which would make one's hair stand on end, or threats to that effect; whereas the truth is, that they have nothing more than the most humble disciple of wisdom can receive, when he stands in the purity of

his soul before the Supreme Master of the universe. It is well for the beginner to know this, else he will be misled to expect much more of a certain kind of supernormal evidence than he may ever receive.

The object of spiritual development is not that men may become wonder workers, amazing and dumbfounding the eyes and ears of sense, but rather that they might know first, that they are spiritual beings, immortal and divine now and here, and secondly, that as such, they can know their place, find their work and do it with a true understanding of the word, karma, which imposes upon us a deep sense of the meaning of obedience, and a still deeper sense of the value of our present life, in view of eternal life.

Now I wish also to add a word about the fourth dimension, so far as I am able to understand it mystically or divinely. It is the source of all dimension, vet it is itself no dimension at all. It is the true measure of the other, which, in reality, is no measure in the sense of length, breadth or thickness. It has to do with the spirit and the spiritual world, and is not to be translated into sensuous terms of finite comprehension. Time and space are not the sphere of the fourth dimension, but eternity. Mathematics can never define it. It is more than a process, and deals with esoteric rather than with exoteric life. Still. when Iesus materialized in the upper room to his disciples and drank and ate with them, he, as a spirit, took on the three dimensions, and when he vanished from their midst, he re-entered the plane and sphere of the fourth dimension. Like clairvoyance, which does not need a pineal gland or any physical organ with which to see spiritually, so the man of the fourth dimension needs nothing physical to reduce it to realization. As Paul wrote, spiritual things must be spiritually discerned. And yet the so-called mathematicians and popular mouthpieces of old thought and old theories, are trying to adjust the "new wine to old bottles." Neither oxygen nor hydrogen can be made visible except through certain modes of motion. You can see them in a fluid as water, or a solid as ice, but as gases, they are beyond visibility and audibility, and can be known

only chemically. So it seems it is with the fourth dimension.

And here I wish to add one further word. I have been reading and am still reading Mr. Hodges' most excellent volume (the 6th in the Science and Key of Life series). and to say that I am pleased with its contents is to express my admiration faintly. Outside of Gerald Massey's books on the Natural Genesis and The Book of Beginnings, I have never read a more intelligent and comprehensive exposition of the so-called pagan mysteries, nor have I seen mythology and astrology, to say nothing of the origin, magical significance and uses of numbers so luminously and eloquently set forth and explained. Any ordinary reader can understand the book and this is a charm which simple minds will appreciate. The book should be bought and read by every one, and especially since the price is reduced to but \$1.50. I shall say more in another article about the great scope of this truly great work-"The Science and Key of Life."


