The last issue of the Triangle served its purpose excellently well and has been put to very good use. However, notwithstanding what was said in the last issue and what is told again in this issue there are those in some cities as, for instance, New York City. Chicago, and even as close to us as Oakland, Californo, who claim that one or two other Rosicrucian movements or societies in this country are authentic ones or branches of the Ancient Rosicrucian Brother-bood and carefully avoid the definite claims made in our last issue of the Triangle. In Chicago, for in-stance, there has appeared one who claims to be a great Rosicrucian Light, revealing the Rosicrucian teachings of Egypt and offering these in series of ten and eleven lectures for a hundred or more dollars along with some other Hermetic verbiage. This great teacher held forth in England for a long time and then in New York under different names and conducting different movements, all designed to reach the innermost recesses of the purse. Some are mislead into believing that in such manner as a few brief lectures or lessons and under the cloak of mysterious phraseology and incomprehensible ceremony the great se-crets of life will be revealed and mystic power attained. The hour is soon at hand, however, when such methods and movements will come under a formidable ban and cease to exist even in the deepest In the meantime don't be deceived or led from the path upon which you have entered if you have been fortunate enough to find the path.

REGARDING OUR AFFILIATIONS

Referring to the matter presented in the last issue of the Triangle under the Pronunziamento No. 777, we wish to say that the A. M. O. R. C. has received efficial communications from various parts of the world relating to the reconstruction of Jurisdictions of the Reservacian Order decreed since the great warended. From these communications we learn that our Resignation Order (in its Latin name or translations) is organized in the following countries: North America, South America and its countries, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Great Britain, Russia, Poland, Germany, Austria, France, Switzerland, Spain and Portugal, Italy, Persia, Arabia, Egypt, Sicily, Malta, North coast countries of Africa, South Africa, Gold Coast of Mura, Australia, New Zealand, Tasmania, South Sea Islands, Japan, China and India. In such other coun-

tries as Belgium and Holland, Turkey and the Balkan States, plans are not completed, while in Palestine the Order is about to announce its reorganization.

We further learn that the Jurisdiction of our Order here has been added to and that we are also empowered to act as representatives of certain English Lodges in other countries. But more important than this are the official papers of affiliation and fraternal relationship sent to us from many foreign centers and the honoring of our Imperator as an official of the highest Lodges of the Order in other countries.

One other item may interest our members. large and interesting document was received during the month of August from a Sovereign Sanctum of Freemasonry abroad conferring upon our Imperator the highest Masonic degrees such as Honorary 33rd and the 90th and 95th Degrees of the Ancient and Primitive Rites of Memphis and Mizraim (under a charter of authority issued by John Yarker, 33rd, the eminent Masonic authority and historian and Sovereign Grand Master General of England) whereby our Imperator is given the Masonic titles of Prince of Memphis (Egypt), Member of the Sovereign Tribunal and Defender of the Order; and Sovereign Patriarchal Grand Conservator of the Rites, Sublime Prince of the Magi. The Honorary 33rd Degree carries with it the title of Knight Grand Inspector General. The document further makes the Imperator an Honorary Member of the Sovereign Sanctuary of Switzerland, Austria and Germany. These Masonic honors are contria and Germany. These Masonic honors are con-ferred under the charter and authority of Grand Orient of ancient Gaul and the Supreme Sanctuary of Great Britain. Also the Ordo Templi Orientia (Oriental Order of the Temple. Fraternity of the Hermetic Light), has conferred its high degrees upon our Im-perator with the title of Most Illustrious Sir Knight and Fratre R. C., appointing our Supreme Lodge in This country as Gage of Amity for the Ordo Templi Orientis of Europe.

Furthermore, the world council of the Rosicrucian Order, under its official title (translated), "The Supreme High Council of the Universe," through its Great White Collegium (Lodge), announces its forthcoming annual pronouncements, conferring upon our Order some high honors and making all our high dagree members of the Supreme Grand Lodge of North America, Honorary Members of the Grand Shrine of Egypt and of the Illuminati of India by virtue of the power of the Magister of the Temple R. C. at Calcutta. This Supreme High Council of the Universe has under its immediate direction more than thirty of the Secret Orders of the world which have existed since the dawn of civilization, which means all the esoteric Orders or Ersternifies, including the Essenes, Oriental Theosophies, Esoteric Masonry, Rose-Croix de Heredom, Krata Repoa of Egypt, Rites of Mithras, Knights of Jerusalem, Oriental Druids, L'Ordre du Martinisme, Oriental Knights Templar, the Order Rosae Crucis, etc. The practise of all the ancient

and primitive rites of these Orders, the conferring of their degrees and the establishment of their Lodges are under the control of this Supreme Council, and thereby all are united into one large and co-operative, harmonious, secret organization. Our Imperator is a high officer of this Council and all our members who reach the Twelfth (Illuminati) Degree of our Order will be appointed official representatives of this Council.

REGARDING NEW MEMBERS

The new plan of accepting new members by having them first initiated into the National Lodge and then transferred to local lodges after proper test and invectigation as voted upon by all lodges will be put into operation by January first in all jurisdictions. Most jurisdictions have already adopted this plan and new members are being accepted on this basis. In some jurisdictions, however, applications of candidates have been on hand for some time under the old plan and for various reasons they have not yet been initiated, consequently until all applications on hand in all lodges have been cleared from their present status the new plan cannot be put into effect universally, but the Imperator has issued a statement deciding that not later than the end of this year-which means only a few months more—this new method of accepting members must be in general use.

HELP FOR MEMBERS

Several new books are being prepared at headquarters for the guidance and help of our members in the mastery of their work. One is a complete dictionary of the terms, words, symbols, phrases and principles used in our teachings with not only complete defini-tions but cross references, examples, illustrations and indications as to what lectures and what phases of our work the words and terms relate and refer to. other book is an account of a great cosmic principle and law recently revealed and pertaining to much of our higher work and especially to the peculiar experi-

ences that members in the higher degrees are having from time to time. It will no doubt be one of the most valuable helps we have ever given to those of our members who are above the 7th degree.

Time and funds are the two elements which at the present time prevent the issuance of these books. A third publishing matter is in our minds at the present time and that is the issuance of little leaflets, one for each degree of our work containing an abstract of the teachings of the degree in such form that the members will understand and be able to use them but reveal nothing to those who have not had the complete lectures. These leaflets will serve in place of the taking of notes at lectures and at the same time be more accurate and have certain cross references and illustrations which the member's note books do not have. Unless we have specific help in the matter of funds for the purpose of publishing these various books and leaflets they will remain for the time being in embryo.
