

NE of the greatest handicaps we have that hold spirit communication to be true is, that the English language does not define the great difference between those communicators that seek material gains and those that seek spiritual upliftment. One

of the most difficult problems is to persuade newcomers in the field of communication to desire and expect such messages from the spirit side as will prepare them for the great hereafter, rather than to be told it would be more advisable to sell their real estate now or a year hence. In other words, the average so-called spiritualist is not enlightened as to what lies before him in the hereafter. He is convinced that he can get in touch with those loved ones that had passed on and from them he seeks material advice and profit.

The sincere communicator for truth and light enters his meeting place, or his closet, to commune with the high spiritual forces to learn how to live this earthly life and thereby prepare himself for that long life which is to come. In seeking the highest and most uplifting, he is following out the teachings which Jesus of Nazareth had brought to humanity nearly two thousand years ago, but unfortunately through the ages these teachings have been misinterpreted. Those that claim to follow the teachings of Jesus and yet deny spirit communication are not the least consistent, for did not Jesus bring the point of wisdom, that God is a spirit and they that worship God must do so in spirit and in truth?

Remember we are all mediums, or contacts, more or less, dependent on the development. Some are gifted, it seems, more than others, but every one can develop. It is sad that any power should be used for material gain. In doing so, the way is barred to get in contact with the advanced spirit forces capable of bringing upliftment to humanity. Like attracts like and the selfish in physical body can only attract the selfish in spirit which do not bring the truth. The material medium or instrument therefore is a detriment to the hungry for spiritual food, both in the messages which he conveys and in the effect his work does have on the spiritual seeker of truth. Due to the vast difference of instrumentality, the unconvinced is apt to class all communication as the "bunk," although in his ignorance he is a communicator each time he offers up his prayers. So there is a need for some one to coin a word that will mark the difference between material and spiritual communicators.

ESSON V — Commandment numbered three — THOU SHALT NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD THY GOD IN VAIN FOR THE LORD WILL NOT HOLD HIM GUILTLESS THAT TAKETH HIS NAME IN VAIN. The s commands warn us all that we must not trifle with

two previous commands warn us all that we must not trifle with God or His wondrous works, and now we come to the command that neither must we trifle with His name.

God is Love and when we use His name let it be in Love. God is Spirit and in Spirit and in Truth we should call to Him. God is Supreme so we should understand His name is above all, above everything, all highest.

His name is too great to misuse or besmirch. Whether we call Him God, Jehovah, Creator, The Great Spirit, Supreme Force or Allah, let it always be with reverence. His name is holy, sacred, pure. We must be neither careless nor unthinking when using His name. Our ignorance and foolishness in the right use of His name makes us guilty of direct violation of His Will.

To call rightly to Him is to bring ourselves closer to Him. He hears us, so let us be as little children calling in innocence and purity of thought, giving praise and thanks, all knowingly. In this manner we do not take His name in vain and accordingly His blessings come forth.

His name must not be used flippantly. Neither must we in careless manner associate His holy name with profanity. Therefore, be it in speaking or be it in writing, violate not the Law. Discourage violators at every opportune occasion, for the offender needs to be reminded that his vulgar habit serves not good.

LESSON VI—Part one—Commandment numbered four— REMEMBER THE SABBATH DAY TO KEEP IT HOLY. SIX DAYS SHALT THOU LABOR AND DO ALL THY WORK, BUT THE SEVENTH DAY IS THE SABBATH OF THE LORD THY GOD. IN IT THOU SHALT NOT DO ANY WORK, THOU, NOR THY SON, NOR THY DAUGHTER, THY MAN SERVANT, NOR THY MAID SERVANT, NOR THY CATTLE, NOR THE STRANG-ER THAT IS WITHIN THY GATES. One day should be held apart for God. It makes no difference what the name of that day may be, so long as we hold it out of Glory to the Creator.

On this day we must not do those things which we do and can do on the other six. Participating in sports, theatricals, merchandising or other conditions of labors for the material at the sacrifice of the spiritual self should be avoided. We must not give cause for others, whether of our own household or of another, neither must we subject the beasts of burden to labor for material or selfish purposes.

The sabbath day becomes a day of worship. In it we proclaim God and His blessings. We see the beautiful creation about us and more closely then do we reach to its uplifting power. In our communing direct with God on this day especially set for Him, we do those things pleasing to His Spirit, and in turn we clear our own conscience of any misgivings that lurked about.

Let us define a case of labor. Eating is not labor, whereas preparation of the food for eating is. We must not undernourish the body on any day, but being free of certain labor

on the sabbath is no reason why we should overdo the few necessities of such a day. The main point is we must keep the day HOLY, for GOD and for SPIRIT.

LESSON VII—Part two—FOR IN SIX DAYS THE LORD MADE HEAVEN AND EARTH, THE SEA AND ALL THAT IN THEM IS, AND RESTED THE SEVENTH DAY. WHEREFORE THE LORD BLESSED THE SAB-BATH DAY AND HALLOWED IT. The day is for God and not for man, although man shares in its blessedness when that day is rightly revered. God proclaimed a sabbath day for man to hold. This day should be held in remembrance of His blessings and we can best on this day give thanks and to sing His praises. Our actions will, however, speak louder than words.

Instead of grumbling, let us meditate righteously, that is, Spirit to Spirit. It is not our clays or bode is that hold the spirit or life that worships, but it is the Spirit that should on this sabbath worship the one loving, living God. While we are thus strengthening the inner self, we are strengthening the outer.

The sabbath or holy day is also a time in the realms for the spirit loved ones who have gone on before to reach higher and get closer to God. They have not any material temples or places of worship to enter in, but like we they worship in spirit.

The week of seven days as the calender is now arranged gives us six days for useful labor or occupation for the material welfare and one day set aside for the spiritual upliftment. By doing the little things well will we be able to take care of the big, and by obedience to the command, we soon shall come to know every day a day for God.

LESSON VIII—Commandment numbered five—HONOR THY FATHER AND THY MOTHER, THAT THY DAYS MAY BE LONG UPON THE LAND WHICH THE LORD THY GOD GIVETH THEE. It is for us to obey our Heavenly Father, and we perfect ourselves through honoring our earthly parents. Honor to earthly parents should be now and before they pass over the border.

Our earthly parents can do much for us as is their duty and opportunity, and unless we properly do them honor and stand by them we can hardly come to appreciate what our Father in Heaven has done and will do for us. So we should be gin right at home by being dutiful and honorable in return. Do not call them the "old man" or "old lady" any more than to take the name of God in vain. Trust them and be not deceitful. When they become old and feeble, help and not forsake them.

Overlook their shortcomings and bear them no ill will same as they have done you from infancy up. Wait not for special days to give honor, but make every day a thoughtful one for them. Speak kindly and bear patiently and defend them against malicious and spiteful attacks from others. Do all these things and more that are true, good and noble while in their material presence and out their sight. More especially do them honor when they have passed out of body.

Then the good deed you did in beginning are easily continued and comforts are yours and theirs in spirit.

COMPLEXIONS



HE HABIT of using cosmetics is increasing among girls and women, judging by the sales of powder and rouge. Elaborate beauty parlors abound to beautify the complexions of the fair sex and those who refrain from the use of cosmetics are con-

sidered oldfashioned. The common practice of adorning the face, among young girls particularly, is disgusting. Many high schools have forbidden the use of cosmetics among their students, and with good reasons.

The claim that cosmetics containing oils are beneficial and not injurious to the skin is not of importance. It is more vital to realize that our girls and women were not born with a case of rouge in their hands and should be naturally attractive without artificial aids. It is true that lovely complexions were lost in the past due to the modes of living, and it is to be hoped that artificial complexions will soon be discarded in favor of sane living that will ultimately produce complexions far above the chemical laboratory product.

STEALING

IN EVERY business will be found those things that have a fascination upon the employees and which either are in the stockroom or the office. Screws, nails, small hand tools, brushes and other items are stolen "because they might come in handy around the house." Office supplies disappearing through the practice of stealing include such items as twine, paper, stamps, pencils and elastics.

Working for a livelihood and to take something that does not belong to us is all too often overlooked as being deliberate stealing. A COMPILATION of religious statistics would indicate that there are less than one hundred and thirty-three Spiritualists and approximately four thousand Sunday School members in the United States. In comparison with other memberships the numbers seem very low indeed.

There are, however very great numbers of them that have been overlooked. This is due primarily to two reasons, the first of which is that they have been included under other names, and secondly, many do not profess their interest and association with its phenomena. This latter reason is to be regretted.

The hundreds of thousands who will not admit their connections publicly but will do so privately are needed to help stamp out imposters and false teachers. Much rather they do it

helpfully than to have the other memberships from positions of alarm bring about unfair criticism.

ANY times has the premonitory of death been the subject of discourse, but as is usual with subjects we do not quite understand, we either veer from them or explain them lightly. But I believe we each and every one have a spiritual warning a short time before the event.

This is an experience in which I was deeply interested and more or less concerned. My grandmother and I were so alike in our dispositions and our fondness for the same things that we understood each other to the extent that one might almost say we thought the same thoughts. At least, we could always understand the other's viewpoint.

I had been visiting my aunt in Tarrytown, and while there a gypsy fortune teller stopped at the place. When she caught sight of me she droned out in that sing song voice that seems habitual to the band of Romany.

"I won't tell your fortune. For little girls should not be unhappy, and I can see black clouds hovering near, and sickness, and death."

Of course, I was frightened for a few minutes, but, being of a happy and carefree disposition, with which it was impossible for me to be troubled over anything for very long, I soon forgot.

My grandmother and her sister were visiting at my home at this time. And as soon as I had returned from my aunt's, they told us that my grandmother had decided to leave immediately for home; and in spite of all our entreaties in view of the fact that she had intended to spend at least a month with us (the first week of which was hardly over) some inner urge seemed to be impelling her to return.

We were very much worried, for my grandmother had always spent the winter season at our city residence. Her home was in Gloversville, N. Y. The place had been in the family since the first settlers came through Johnstown and straggled into what was then called Stump City, which later developed into Mittenville and still later became Gloversville. Grandmother was far more attached and loyal to the old homestead than she ever became to the new home, which, in a way, was no more than natural, and I could readily understand her attitude.

Still she had always cared so much for the social side of life that we could hardly believe she would voluntarily relinquish the many delightful affairs that my mother had planned in anticipation of her visit and also in celebration of the first year after my formal coming-out party. A debutante enjoying her first season was as nothing in comparison with the enthusiasm of my grandmother. She imbibed with an unquenchable thirst all the events hitherto given in my honor. Nevertheless, she seemed homesick, and, in a way, my mother and father sympathized while not wholly understanding her attitude.

The day dawned when we could keep her no longer, and her sister (who had come from the West) decided to leave at the same time. There seemed to be an undercurrent of unrest, of something we could not quite explain in a satisfactory manner even to ourselves. But of which I was intensely aware.

My father left for business at nine o'clock, and the train they had decided to take left around ten. So my grandmother

and I stood at the window watching father as he walked down the street. We could see him from one of our library windows until he passed the third block, where he had been in the habit of turning and raising his hat before he passed from sight. This morning while we stood watching, I wondered why she didn't cry as she usually did when she was leaving to go home. Grandmother was so fond of father. It had always been in times past a very sad occasion. But this time was entirely different from the preceding ones, for as we stood at the window grandmother just looked, and looked with her soul in her eyes, as if she couldn't let father go from her sight. But never a tear or a word that she wouldn't see him again. We watched, and twice it seemed that he would return, but in reaching the end of the third block he raised his hat, and disappeared from our view.

Grandmother stood still, and there was such an unaccountable feeling in the air, the same as I would feel had I blundered into anothers' room and found them at their prayers. I waited, and after a while timidly touched her arm; she turned with a sweet and serene countenance. And swift came the thought wave impelled from her mind, she never expects to see him again!

When our emotions are stirred to the depths we are very apt to converse about trivial and unimportant things, and this time was no exception; grandmother and I were soon in the midst of a heated discussion as to the advisability of my wearing a pink or pale yellow gown that evening.

Ten o'clock found us at the station, and, the train being on time, grandmother and my aunt were helped aboard; as my grandmother kissed me it seemed as if she was trying to tell me something. She probably was herself unconscious of the thought, but she seemed to tell me to keep her secret, our secret. And when I kissed her good-bye, I felt then that it was to be forever, as far as this world was concerned—and it was even so!

Grandmother arrived safely, but early the following morning had an apoplectical stroke and passed quietly into the oblivion of the dreamlands of the unknown before father could reach Gloversville.

REQUENTLY we hear the expression "Every knock is a boost." This is far from the truth. Knocking or criticising is not the least uplifting, either to the person you are criticising or to yourself, the criticiser. We are prone to value ourselves so highly that we do not see much value in our neigh-

Criticising from an artistic point of view is proper if our intentions are above criticism. If we can improve anything, or the method of doing it, let us offer our suggestions in a kindly manner, without offense.

One of the worst habits that we have acquired is that of criticising. It is so easy to do and we like to indulge so often, that this habit has grown on us with the passing years.

It makes no difference whether we criticise thoughtlessly without intent to injure, or criticise from the basest of motive, we have sent out the poisonous shafts of thought or deed that find their mark and leave the scar.

The mean habit of criticising is found in all walks of life, and, since habit is not limited to any race, color or creed, we find humanity without love for one another.

Due to this habit, homes have been divided, fraternal organizations have disbanded, friction and hard feeling has invaded our temples of worship, yes, warfare has resulted and many other low conditions have been hatched from this monster, criticism.

The great teacher of Nazareth, when amongst men, taught us not to judge, lest we be judged. These words of wisdom are in absolute agreement with the Ten Commandments or Law of God.

We are part God, created in the spiritual image of the Supreme Force. Each time we pass judgment on our fellow man, who is also part God, we judge our Heavenly Father. Have we the right to judge the Supreme Force, God? No person who is sane would dare assert it is right to judge our Creator. We do this very thing each time we judge our brother and sister.

If you have carefully weighed all the facts of the matter to the smallest detail and feel that your opinion is correct, do not pass judgment, for the very thoughts and deeds of the one you would accuse are recorded on the pages of his own life book, to be read only by the all-seeing eye of God.

Let us briefly trace the principal reasons why we criticise our brother and sister. Invariably we have forgotten that they are part God, and when we see with physical eyes the apparent defects of another, we have simply measured by physical standards. The spirit, or real life within, has been overlooked.

Often we have exclaimed what a wonderful personality that person possesses, as we are attracted either by the form, the face or the voice. Due to the attraction of the physical, we hesitate to criticise one so favored and would lavish judgments on others that did not appeal to our physical likes and desires

We have been swayed by the eloquence of the preacher as he thunders forth his word pictures, appealing ofttimes to our physical senses only, when he maliciously condemns those who do not agree with him, and we judge the purposes of the honest, unsought minister or priest up there in the woods, who teaches humanity that we should love our God with all our heart and our neighbors as ourselves.

We judge the methods by which the rich have acquired

their wealth and use it. We judge the poor for being poor and have very little good to say of those who comprise the middle classes. What right have we to judge the wealthy? We do not know their trials and tribulations. Why should we condemn the poor? If we knew their cares and crosses we would assist them more than we do.

Let us break this habit of criticising at once. It has retarded our spiritual progress long enough. We want to reach the highest point of spiritual development, when our disrobed spirits have reached out from their earthly bodies. You can be sure, brother and sister, that there will not be any judging of one another in Heaven. If we do not love our neighbors as ourselves while we are living here in body, we can be equally sure that we are far from Heaven.

If we have not thought along these lines, it is either because we have not been taught along these lines, or because we have attached too much importance to our physical bodies, which at their best function for a brief time and then are returned to mother earth to crumble into dust. If ever the silver cord be loosed, or the golden bowl broken, or the pitcher be broken at the fountain, or the wheel broken at the cistern, then shall the dust return to the earth as it was, and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it.

It is more important that we value the life, the spirit within and know that the man-made body of ours is secondary and of little account. If we will begin to do this we will love our neighbor. His faults will disappear. We will then be willing to analyze ourselves. Oh brother, we will all be surprised when we see our own shortcomings. How imperfect we will find ourselves as we stand under the light of an honest and personal investigation. The result will be appalling. We will then decide to be more charitable in thought, word and deed to all humanity. We will be ready to join our brother in his gladness and sympathize with him in his sadness. We will be happy children of the Supreme Force, God. Earth will be what we vaguely understand Heaven to be. In the plain language of the times, stop your knocking.

THE SPIRIT SIDE

HE ORIGIN of the belief of the indestructibility of spirit is lost in antiquity. The teachers of all ages taught the survival of the spirit after death of the physical body. There were many beliefs relating to the destinaton of a departed spirit, from the Heaven of bliss, down through

the stages, to a hell of fire and brimstone. However, the most important fact for us to know is, that spirit, or life is indestructible and necessarily must function after departure from physical body in conditions suited to itself. Right at the onset we urge all to find this fact for themselves and we do not ask anyone to simply believe it, or to take our word.

Creeds formed by the so-called holy men of the past, chosen to teach humanity, were unreasonable and absolutely in opposition to the Love of God, which they proclaimed. The church fathers taught that if little children were not baptised they and their sinning parents would suffer the eternal flames of hell. Heaven, or Zion, was reserved for the faithful, who had regularly attended church services and had complied with all articles of faith and ceremony. Fear having gripped the hearts of the faithful, the spiritual instructors set out to keep control over their flocks and invented further terrors, until the temples of worship were seats of ritualism and form, resulting in the elevation of the teacher and the subservience of the flock. Obedience was the name of the whip used to keep the sheep within the fold and the sublime teachings of the master teacher of Nazareth, in his sermon on the mount and in all of his aids to uplift humanity were obscured. Instead of love, as the Nazarene had taught would earn our reward in Heaven and that we should become like little children, pure in heart, to see God, our pious fathers consigned to hell the millions of human beings not agreeing with them.

Such destructive teachings quite naturally had their destructive terminations and were responsible for the formation of other creeds or beliefs that contained sufficient of the older faiths to be equally destructive. Being at variance with each other, disagreements arose and bitter feeling often resulted in actual warfare, under the banner of love and brotherhood. Due to hate and strife families were divided, all because one person believed a little differently than another. There were, however, exceptions to the rule, those consistent individuals who could not subscribe to a policy of love and kindness under a cloak of ecclesiastical power and found little comfort in any form of church service whatsoever. Again the destructive teachings bore fruit of its kind as many made gods of materialism and repudiated the Supreme Force. As the numbers of backsliders increased, the churches predicted terrible calamaties, which, of course, did not materialize, thereby giving fresh courage to others in their search for truth. As the power of manmade creed weakened, many clergymen became less arrogant, and indulged in social activities with their flocks, while their style of dress both in public and in pulpit became similar to that followed by the layman. We find that the fear of hell fire has practically been destroyed in its hold on the followers of various faiths and today is seldom mentioned in many temples of worship. While this vicious doctrine of eternal damnation was ebbing out, many of the lowly flocks quickly grasped the sig-

nificance of the change and in the joy of religious freedom consigned all superstitious forms to the rubbish heaps. Believing that they were now out of bondage, they no longer feared the results of their sins. Each was to obtain the full and plenty of an earthly life, regardless of the methods employed and brotherly love and righteousness as proclaimed in temples of worship and in fraternal halls was not taken seriously. These virtues were admitted to be proper for the preacher in his pulpit, but could not be practical in the busy world of materialism. The pendulum swung to the other extreme as men and women drifted from the faiths of their youth and, sad to state, many repudiated the Supreme Force, God. The founders of creeds were primarily responsible for this regretful condition, because they founded on special privilege and selfishness instead of on love and justice. Subsequent teachers made similar mistakes, and when the pendulum of thought did move in the minds of men, they brought forth teachings designed to please and to retain their followers, although insisting on the observance of traditional forms of worship. Elaborate sermons were prepared on current topics for the sole purpose of amusing the audiences, and many worldly methods were followed in temples of wor ship which had been dedicated to the Living God. Church attendance was considered more vital than spiritual growth and worship continued to be a matter of custom. Revivals and drives were frequently resorted to in hopes of arousing interest in church activities, but forgetting the most important fact that man is part God, created in the spiritual image of the Father and the Creator of all requires no special form of ceremony in which to converse with His children. Humanity must call to the Father as loving children, in simple and direct thought and not through man-made forms.

The devil of the theological seminary as preached in the days of the past has been taken away, just where no one seems to know. However, we do not escape the harvest that we sow, be it good or evil. If we reach high in this earth plane while in physical body, we will reach high in spirit life. Our spirit homes are nicely suited to our spiritual development and we will not own mansions in the skies when we have really earned but modest cottages.

The Supreme Force does not compel us to do anything distasteful to ourselves, and if we do not want to exercise our free will for the highest things of life, which are unquestionably based on the Law of God, we take the consequences. One child of God is as important as another. No special act or dispensation can save us from our shortcomings, or sins, and symbols and forms will not aid spiritual growth. The Nazarene taught, as we sow, so we reap, and did not teach that his blood which was shed by the high priests of his times would wash away all spots and permit the spirit to again stand pure before the Father in Heaven. He did preach and teach and heal (that was his mission as a saviour to humanity), that there is none good but God and to see God we must become as little children and keep the Father's commands. How simple these sublime teach ings of wisdom! Why so much confusion about simplicity? Who said anything about hell fire and the host of impossible things? As a man thinketh in his heart, so he is.

Humanity has lost its hold on spiritual things and is travely

ing downward at a fast pace, living only for the present day of gain and pleasure. It is obvious to any thinking person that there will be a readjustment. Our civilization is not dissimilar to previous civilizations which reached their highest point of material accomplishments and luxurious splendor, but unable to continue further, were drawn down by their mistakes to destruction. The modern way of living under high pressure is not conducive to spiritual development, regardless of any cult or creed, for we are going in the same direction as our predecessors, along the road of a forgotten God and his Law, and disaster is just ahead of us unless we change our ways. If you doubt the truth of the foregoing, look for the signs in the sky, in the elements, what is happening in different parts of the world, and review history in the light of understanding. Notwithstanding all of the comforts of our surroundings, there is little contentment in the land. Dissatisfaction abounds in all walks of life and the real happiness from within will not be found in the possession of earthly goods, or in the rounds of passing pleasure.

To those who will carefully weigh all the facts, the foregoing will ring true, be their church affiliations what they may We therefore urge all of humanity to realize now and for all time that the Ten Commandments are the only laws ever given by God to man to be followed each day of our sojourn from our Heavenly Home, and have never been changed. Our Father in wisdom knew the paths which his children should follow while traveling the earth plane. He gave the children special instructions to avoid danger, just as you would give your children if they were leaving your home for a temporary journey to a foreign land. If some of us have forgotten the instructions which the loving Father gave us, it behooves us to study the Ten Commandments to find our homeward path.

The orthodox churches are complaining bitterly of dwindling membership. We can be certain that they will not analyze themselves or their teachings by an honest investigation or accept suggestions from any of the wanderers from the fold, who have reasons for their departure. The blame will be placed on the progression of thought and our spiritual instructors will again attempt to stop the wheels of progress. They have al-ready placed some of the blame on the world war, which they indorsed and supported themselves in every country of the world, in absolute violation of the Law of God and as ambassadors from Heaven they should have followed the law and instructed their flocks to do likewise. If a shepherd senses the true situation affecting the grievous thing complained of and offers a remedy to stop the growing evil, he is labeled a radical, or modern, to be shunned by his fellow pastors, and if he should voice his views a little too loudly, he may be unfrocked. The motto seems to be, obedience to the beliefs of the past, as founded on authority and harshness. It is sad that our shepherds stubbornly adhere to out-worn creeds of men and refuse to preach truth to their remaining followers, even after truth has started to shine in their very midst. Manifestations of truth are observed day by day, and if our spiritual shepherds are too

blind to see them, even in their own homes, the flocks seeking green pastures of truth and brotherhood will stray farther from the fold.

Here and there stand out children of God, both preachers and laymen, who realize that humanity can only be saved from approaching destruction by their own efforts in well doing. We prayerfully appeal to these progressives not to hide their talent of understanding, but to help spread the light of truth which has been hidden through the ages. This is not an attempt on our part to close the doors of any sanctuary, if we should be so accused, but it is an open invitation to all creeds to join us above the limitations of man-made forms, and give humanity the real manna from Heaven. This must be done before it is too late, ere the night cometh when man can work no more. The twilight of indifference to God and his law is casting its shadows and humanity is now faltering in the gloom. We must hasten and bring light to the straying. Place the "Greater Light" on the heights above the differences of men; to lead humanity back to God and not to the out-lived creeds now crumbling piece by piece. Teach and preach to humanity to follow the dictates of the inner self, that God-part which counsels in wisdom not found in books and forms and which sent forth pure must return purified of earthly shadows, through the only purification process, the Law of God. Live this Law and the eternal spirit will take care of itself, both in this material world and in the spirit world we will soon enter.

THE FLOWERS

"Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin; And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."—Matt. VI. 28-29.



HEN the Nazarene spoke of the lilies of the field, he wanted to direct the attention of his hearers to the beautiful adornment of flowers covering the earth plane. And when he directs us to notice how they grow, how numerous, varied and attractive they are, and how with such exquisite skill they are fashioned, he surely expects us to learn a lesson from them.

If we studiously considered this phase of God's handiwork, we would find the study not only pleasant and interesting, but we would do much for our spiritual growth by developing the powers of observation and discrimination. For if the keener development of these faculties enables us to correctly classify flower and plant life, would not the practicing of these same powers aid us when in our earthly journey we are called upon to discern the right from the wrong, the true from the false.

Flowers are most interesting to the botanist not only for their beauty, but for the marked characteristics that they display. These markings classify them as certain sorts of plants, belonging to certain families. However, irrespective of class division, all the flowers strive to grow and thrive that they might form the fruit, the essential part of which is the seed. When we look at the little seeds and then think of the

steady growth that culminates in the attractive blossoms, we must pause and glorify the Creator; for it was the life He implanted in the tiny seeds that started the growing. This life is the essential part of the seeds. The botanist calls it the germ or embryo or plantlet in the seed, ready to grow into a new plant when the seed is sown.

After being sown, the seed containing the germ or embryo imbibes some moisture through its coats and swells a little. The

embryo feels the warmth and gradually wakes from its long sleep and stretches itself. This pulsing life of the seed pushes its tiny stem through the seed-coats, and the two leaves that it bears straighten themselves and so throw off the seed coats as a loose husk. Thus the seedling plantlet stands revealed, ready to further the work laid upon it by the Supreme Force. May we in our earthly cloaks as spontaneously respond to the demands made upon us by the Divine Will.

It is interesting to note that although alive, a seed may be dormant and feel neither the summer's heat nor the winter-s cold. Still, it lives on where it falls, in this slumbering way, until the next spring, in most plants, or sometimes until the spring after that, before it begins to grow.

So the God part within many individuals seems to be in a drowsy state. This has been brought about by the individual constantly refusing to listen to the dictates of the inner voice, until the remonstrances of that God Part have become so feeble as to be hardly discernible above the clamor of the outside conditions. Cultivation of the habit of listening to the inner self and of the habit of constantly calling on the Creator for guidance and strength, will break the shackles of the material conditions that hold the spirit down and keep it undeveloped. Thus the spirit awakens to the realization of its earthly mission, stands revealed in the sunlight of God's love as a bulwark of purity and strength against all down-pulling conditions.

So we see that according to God's purpose, the object of the flower, the fruit and the seed is to produce, protect and nourish the germ or embryo. The object of the embryo is to grow and become a new plant. In the same way a mission is laid upon each one of us traveling in our earthly cloaks, and may we fulfill it in as beautiful a way as the flowers.




CHART OF SPIRITUALITY FOR TRUTHSEEKERS
