LAW AND LABOR

BEGINNING with our earliest recollections, the word 'work' has symbolized a task imposed either by force or circumstances, or undertaken through duty or volition of the individual will. We were taught to believe that a command had been disobeyed, and the penalty for that disobedience was that man should work for his sustenance, and in pain should he learn the price of disobedience.

As man evolved from the primitive state, he developed ideals; and work was given a higher meaning for it represented accomplishment, although its significance still presents an unsolved problem to the masses. Youth resents restraint, and at times the successful and ambitious feel they have reason to complain of a surfeit of labor as compared with material return. People compare constructive labor with pleasure that requires an equal amount of strenuous exertion, and though pleasure exhausts as well as labor, without being constructive, they invariably wail over their work, because it is compulsory, and clamor for more and yet more laborious pleasures. Why? It is because they choose their pleasures, but must labor whether they want to or not, and human nature resents compulsion in any form. So much so, in fact, that their aversion becomes a weakness, that in turn perverts their natures and makes them lose sight of true values.

A command arouses resentment and the word Law a protest. Both are considered a form of oppression by men who like to have their own way; yet these same men delight to make conditions for other people, and cannot understand why anyone should not fall into line with their propositions as soon as made. Man is full of conceit; a little frightened at his limitations, but unwilling to acknowledge them. Now success or failure depends upon his acceptance of conditions as they are and making the best of circumstances. Nature provides us with a precedent: Her system allows no changes or corrections, but follows the schedule of each cycle, going through the same process eon upon eon; never making a mistake, never abusing her priviledges, never complaining of the routine, NEVER NEGLECTS TO SUBMIT TO LAW AND ORDER! Wonderful, evolving NATURE, so true to her objective, so loyal to the UNI-VERSE, that accidents to the heavenly bodies never occur. Man can well afford to tear a page from Nature's book of instructions and apply them to his own career, and he will never be in a position to complain that he does not succeed. Why, if Nature seems to destroy some object, she but changes its form, so that it becomes more useful. Even her terrible storms that tear up sections of country, and her volcanos that pour forth lava, are all following precedent and preparing for a greater demonstration of power for God and man. Nature whines it is while in the throes of misery and when she gives birth to a new form of creation. She is a part of DIVINE LAW, and, therefore, she performs her duties according to Divine direction and does not resent the LAW. Is it because we resent compulsory DIVINE LAW that we likewise reject the idea of man's version of LAW? But if that be the case, we should take time to consider why Law is necessary and what would happen were there no laws to guide the Commonwealth. Had man been a willing servitor of DIVINE LAW,

It is largely due to this duality of man that he writhes under restraint and endeavors to free himself from conditions he cannot interpret. To him labor is unwholesome, no matter how necessary or productive, simply because he is unconsciously reaching after the unattainable, and is not willing to wait and perfect himself by severe discipline to gain moral and spiritual fiber, after which he could govern his actions according to the requirements of Nature. Once man has learned the lesson of submission to necessity, he will find most of the obstacles removed from his path and the way made easy for spiritual progress.

No man can understand himself until his divinity is awakened, but once he realizes that within himself is stored a FORCE that is unlimited when properly applied, and that SPIRIT is not confined within the human body, any more than the air he breathes, but is an independent agent and can leave the physical habitation, going to regions of greater knowledge and power, where it will absorb information that will make his earthly life more bearable and far more useful to himself and to others.

It was because Jesus gained this knowledge that he was able to endure hardship with no feeling of bitterness toward God or man, and his esoteric knowledge carried him through trials that were literally beyond endurance, leaving no trace of malice in his handling of the multitudes. The modernist is a slave to prejudice as much as the peoples of ancient times whom he so freely criticises. He accuses the ancients for negligence that he himself is guilty of, and is apt to limit his vision to the school that handed him his diploma, and to feel satisfied that he has done very well for himself in preparing himself for every emergency. But to cultivate the mind to meet material does not furnish it with spiritual culture, which is so much finer, and which provides an alibi when materialism fails to satisfy or answer the question: Why must I suffer so much and labor so hard to get a meager living, that is little more than a bare existence. To answer that vital question one must know that to conform to DIVINE LAW is very easy once one comes to knom IT. But ignorance of DIVINE LAW is the cause for much misery and retards SPIRIT in its effort to evolve.

The way most people interpret rest is to remain idle, and idleness is a negative state, while SPIRIT FORCE is positive motive power. All creative Force is positive and without action existence would cease to be. To overcome inertia one must have ideals and be willing to exert every ounce of will-power to obtain the realization of those ideals, and the one sure way to get strength for the effort is to get in touch with denizens of the spirit world, that they may direct our course and bend us to the LAW governing our actions, so that we shall grow upward, not downward; straight, and not crooked.

By conforming to Natural Law, we work with SPIRIT FORCE, not against it, and who is so capable to teach us as those who have passed through experiences similar to our own? THE FLOWERS

A FURTHER study of flower life reveals the symmetrical flowers or those having an equal number of parts of each kind. Flax affords a good illustration, having a calyx of five sepals, a corolla of five petals, five stamens and five styles. In other unsymmetrical flowers, the different organs do not match in the number of their parts. The anemony has many more stamens and pistils than it has calyx leaves.

When the parts of each sort are all of the same shape and size, the flower is said to be regular, as in the case of flax mentioned above. In the irregular flower, the parts of the same sort are not alike, as in the case of the violet, displaying five sepals and five petals, one of which differs from the rest, having a sac or spur at the base.

Unlike the roots hidden under mother earth, yet performing work necessary for the plant's growth, are the showy blossoms. Made up of the rich green calyx, and stamens and pistils nestling within the colorful corolla, they spring up and live in the world above the ground. There, turning their faces toward the sun, they send out sweet perfumes and vibrate a message of cheer and happiness in the ether about them. The internal organs of the physical body, like the roots of the flower, are hidden from view, yet upon their proper functioning depend the health of the body, but it is through our five senses, of sight, hearing, smell, taste and touch, that we come into direct contact with the outside world. Through these avenues or nerve telephones we send out and pick up thought vibrations.

As the flowers lift up their faces toward the sun, so we should turn our eyes toward the East from whence cometh the Light. It is by means of the brain and the nerves of sight that we see. If the promptings of the spirit within are heeded, the thought waves sent out by the brain will be of such an uplifting character that the eye will look for the good in everything. It will always detect the Supreme Force, God, in all His creations, great and small, and will not fail to apprehend the God-part in his fellowmen. In this attitude of charity toward all, the individual will ferret out the good points of his associates, instead of picking out and disclosing those shortcomings that characterize them and that most humanity look for. By acquiring complete mastery of self and kindly consideration of others, we reach this state of development. The Nazarene spoke along these lines when he said:

"And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?

"Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye."

And even though the physical eye were to be deprived of its sight, shutting out the material world from view, the psychic eye might be gladdened by wonderful manifestations that God has allowed the spirit loved ones to bring to those who are reaching out rightly. And the higher the aspirations, the more elevating and uplifting the manifestations become.

When the rain falls on the flowers it brings out their fragrance. The rain sets going the chemical changes which

result in the production of many pleasant odors which are added to the air. When the sound waves, caused by something capable of making a sound, are made in the air, they move forward in circles, and when they strike against our ears the nerves carry the message to the brain and cause us to hear. We cannot see the sound waves, as we cannot see air, and yet we do not doubt them. As the sounds produced may be pleasant or discordant, so the information coming through this sense will be made up of good and evil. If our thoughts have been trained to run in a righteous manner, then we will pick up and register only those messages that will be constructive toward truth and righteousness. In this way we would discourage all forms of gossip and banish from our midst this evil, with its baneful influence on brotherhood.

Like the sound waves that strike against our ears are the vibrations set in motion by the spirit forces. Through these spirit vibrations or waves, the psychic ear picks up the communication of the unseen and ofttimes hears the melodious strains of music, as they waft through the ether from the realms of love, peace and goodwill.
