DEMONSTRATION.

"And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils, they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover."

From almost the first hearing of Divine Science and the reading of its literature we have heard and seen the above words quoted again and again and again.

At first in our zeal and warm gratitude at what had been done for us, we believed every word of it could be accomplished and was being accomplished.

Our ardor was so warm, and our faith so great that these works could be done, that we forgot to look to see whether they were being done or not. Directly our attention was called to the fact that these things were not being done; that the metaphysicians did not court the society of serpents nor think of quenching their thirst on poisons, any more than did any other sect or peoples.

We saw a great many sick who did recover, and also about as many who did not. Our disappointment can never be described nor such bitterness of grief ever again be experienced, as when we first believed that these blessed words were untrue, and that what we had heard was only to be compared to a fairy tale.

But the Truth in Its Omnipotence never leaves nor forsakes any of Its children, and It stayed by us until Its law was revealed to us; until we discovered within ourselves that Jesus spoke truly when he said, "Except ye eat the flesh of the son of Man and drink his blood, ye have no life in you."

We found that this was said to us individually, to one as well as another, and that no matter what other people did or did not do, that we must eat this flesh and drink this blood.

It seemed like a hard saying, but it must be heard.

We looked into Principle—Truth—and found that all of the teachings of Jesus were of growth in consciousness; and then did we know for a surety that these words are true and that when we have attained the Christ mind that "these signs shall follow them that believe." In the name of the Truth we shall cast out devils; we shall speak with new tongues; we shall take up serpents. If we drink any deadly thing it shall not hurt us; when we lay hands on the sick they shall recover.

We also found that these things are all done now according to our degree of understanding of Principle, and that when they are not done it is because of lack of understanding, and never

the fault of Principle.

In consciousness everything has its "day and generation." The day of looking for "signs" is one of the first days or stages in the unfoldment or growth of living soul.

The looking for a thing to be done and the expectation that it can be done, generates the faith that it can be done; and faith generates investigation of Principle; and investigation of Principle brings sure knowing.

David investigated and found—"Thy testimonies are wonderful; therefore doth my soul keep them. The entrance of thy word giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple."

"Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness, and thy law is the truth."

"The righteousness of thy testimonies is everlasting: give me understanding, and I shall live."

When the world speaks about having anything demonstrated to it, it means proved according to the evidence of the senses; therefore to the world Jesus said, "believe me for the very works' sake."

Man has always been seeking Truth uncon-

sciously; but there is a time when he begins to seek it self-consciously.

Every good gift is of God; therefore, whenever a good gift is sought, God is sought, even if it be in the subconscious mentality.

After carnal sense is outgrown and we are clothed upon with spiritual perception, we no longer need "signs" for our help or encour-

agement individually.

After we have been blessed with even one ray of spiritual perception, on and on we climb up to the Mount of Transfiguration, until matter ceases to be a reality to us. Evil has taken the wings of the morning and flown to the uttermost parts of the sea; human personality is nowhere; errors fade away as a tale that is told. There is no more night, for in the light of perfect understanding we see ourselves transfigured from the Son of Man to the Son of God.

We depend no more upon signs, nor seek the glory of man. We live in a new heaven and in a new earth.

In understanding faith we say, "I will behold Thy face in righteousness; I shall be satisfied when I awake with Thy likeness."

The carnal mind is always wanting something for nothing, therefore it naturally wants the power to do the works of God, before it has paid the price for that power.

It wants to be able to perform miracles before it has been baptized with the Holy Ghost. These signs are to follow them that believe.

Webster says, to believe is to have a firm conviction of Truth. The world has asked for the "signs" first, promising that when their carnal senses were satisfied to their fill that they would then believe.

But Divine Wisdom says, Not so; believe first, and then shall you have your signs. Law is inexorable; you must believe first.

Are you lacking in signs? Then cultivate greater belief. "What must you believe?" "The teachings of Jesus, the Christ."

"Why believe his teachings?" Because he demonstrated to a greater degree than anyone else has ever done, that he knew the Truth.

The metaphysicians themselves are to blame that the world is so incredulous of their Truth, for they themselves have taught the world to look to them for "signs," instead of teaching that "signs" are results, or effects.

If a child is healthy and happy, eats well and sleeps well, growth is a *sure* — nay, an inevitable — result. It follows in every instance. Just as surely as the condition of a child is normal, it grows.

Now, as we put off the old man and put on the Christ mind, "these signs" will accompany our understanding *just as surely* as growth takes place in the child.

What, then, are we to do—study to learn the art of healing? strive to be able to demonstrate to the world that we can give the "signs"?

No, we are to let the signs alone. They are the *natural consequences* of understanding. "Knowledge is power," and power is for everyone who seeks Knowledge, and Knowledge is God.

Every child of God is born to demonstrate to himself and to the world that he is a genius. Intensity and fidelity must be characteristic of him who would demonstrate the Christ.

All the life, all the courage, all the fervor, all the strength and love of the soul must be given to the one work of the attainment of the Christ mind.

If we apparently come into a wilderness during the course of our journey toward this attainment, to every temptation of fear or doubt we must say, "Get thee behind me! I have faith in God!"

We must boldly march forward with our eye fixed upon the mark of our high calling, unheedful of the scoffs and sneers of the world, who seek only for signs.

Wm. Ordway Partridge, in his "Art for America," says: "To be a genius requires not only divine patience, but courage.

"No critic could shut off Shakespeare. We know that in his day he was criticised caustically; but he had a song to sing, and he had the courage to sing it!

"Let us have done with the idea that genius gives birth to its creation without labor. Rather is it born with an agony that brings drops of sweat from the brow.

"The spiritual man has a grasp upon the universe that Napoleon, with his armies and his train of kings, failed to possess. The world cannot give a man this; he must win it. Like heaven, it is a result, not a reward.

"A man may possess it in the humblest walks of life; he may be ostensibly a slave, and yet, like Epictetus, one of the kings of thought.

"A man may also possess this genius and live in a palace, like Marcus Aurelius, surrounded by fawning courtiers, with an empire at his feet; and it keeps him unspotted from the world."

Do you want the power to demonstrate the signs of healing the sick and raising the dead, to the world?

Then "love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, with all thy soul, with all thy mind, and all thy strength."

Your power will be measured by the intensity of your love; your greatness will be computed by your consecration. Your very desire to do and to become is a promise of attainment.

Love with all your heart. Do with your might what your hand finds to do each day, each hour, each minute. Love and bless and praise all the day long.

Your perfection will be a result, not of your doing extraordinary things, but of your doing ordinary things with an extraordinary spirit.

An extraordinary love, an extraordinary

THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT.

ANNIE RIX MILITZ.

VI. PURITY.

27. Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery;

28. But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.

Not only must man be chaste in word and deed, but also in his most secret thoughts. Thinking is the source of action, and to cleanse a fountain one must begin at its source.

Lust has no place in the spiritual mind. Whatever feeling is not high and holy is adulterous—that is, idolatrous—and must be cast out of the heart by the Truth. Freedom from adultery and impure thinking comes from loving God alone. When a man loves God, the Spirit only, in a woman, then no carnal desire can enter his heart, even though she be his lawful wife.

Jesus does not make any exception in this statement; there should be no lust in the heart of a man toward any woman—not toward his wife, even; for the truth is, that there is but one marriage,—the union with God. The true bride of every man is the Holy Spirit, and Christ is the true bridegroom of every woman.

"All men cannot receive this saying, save they to whom it is given."—Matt. 19:11. Those who follow close upon the Christ put away every sensual appetite, that its true spiritual correspondent may be made manifest in them.

20. And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.

30. And if thy right hand offend thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.

The word "right," used in the Scripture, signifies our belief in what is good and right; and the word "left," our belief in what is evil and mysterious. For example, God, reasoning with Jonah, says: "Should I not spare Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand people that cannot discern between their right hand and their left hand?"—Jonah 4:11. They were like those children described in Deuteronomy 1:39, who could not discern between good and evil, yet because of their innocence entered into the promised land.

The "right eye" is the perception of what is good and right. If your sense of what is righteous and lawful stands in the way of your spiritual advancement ("offend you"), put it away from you. It may be a relationship which according to the law is right and just; but "whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple."—Luke 14: 33. The plucking out and casting away is a heart process. Right self-denial taken in season saves the wise man from being submerged in mental and physical gehenna, some vice or sickness, sorrow or mistake.

The "right hand" is a deed or a power that one believes to be righteous and conducive or necessary to one's happiness. When Jesus told the young man who had great possessions that in order for him to advance further in the spiritual life he must sell all that he had and give to the poor, it was the same advice as the cutting off the right hand.

Whatever pleasure, lawful or otherwise, causes us to forget God and our spiritual nature, is a stumbling-block, and the Truth must remove it. Better to cast away a temporal joy than to remain without the consciousness of our eternal happiness.

31. It hath been said, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement:

32. But I say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery.

There is no divorce in the spiritual mind. True marriage is of the spirit and not of the flesh, and in the divine marriage, as in the divine life, there is no beginning and no end. Divorce is death; and going from one married state into another is like going from one plane of existence (physical) into another (psychical), neither of them being the true state, shown by their having beginning and end. They who look for divorce to free them from a false marriage are like one who looks for death to release him from life. It may bring temporary relief, but it leaves the problem unsolved. In the Christ knowledge, that to God only you are marriage, is freedom from the woes of a carnal marriage.

Jesus gives no cause for divorce. It is Moses alone that justifies divorce. Men have said that Jesus allowed divorce when the cause was adultery, saying that in verse 32 he meant adultery by the word "fornication"; but that is not so. He carefully used his words, and porneia (fornication) is very different from moicheuo (to commit adultery). The first is the act of an unmarried person, the second of one who is married. In what sense, then, can this word, used of the unmarried, be applied to married individuals? In one sense only,—the spiritual.

One who consecrates his or her generative powers to God enters into the regenerative state, and thenceforth generates spiritually and no longer physically. Such a one, whether married (after the world) or unmarried, becomes a virgin or eunuch, one who is unmarried (Matt. 19:10, 11, 12). If such a one puts away his wife that he may refrain from fornication, he is exempt from causing his wife to commit adultery.

Impure thinking is put away from the heart and mind by continually remembering that you are not a fleshly being in your real nature, but spiritual, like unto your Father, God. The flesh is not yourself. You are spirit, not created by carnal or sensual laws, but created by pure and holy Love; and only chaste and pure

thoughts can enter your mind or go forth from your heart, "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God."

VII. SWEAR NOT AT ALL.

33. Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths:

34. But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:

35. Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King.

36. Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black.

37. But let your communication be Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.

Whoever swears to anything or makes a vow, takes an oath, gives a promise, makes a resolution, or in any way binds himself by his word, places himself under the Mosaic Law and is liable to incur penalty through breaking the law he has made for himself.

Swearing, promising, and vowing arise from two common errors,—I, belief in the future; and 2, distrust and lack of faith. There is only the eternal now in which we should live, and all that we affirm should be of the present. The Wise One says, "It is," and it is so; "It is not," and of a surety it is not; whatever is more than plain and direct affirmation or denial comes from belief in evil.

He who trusts his fellow beings needs no promises or vows. He who trusts the divine Spirit within himself knows his word to be as good as gold, and that it needs no indorsement of oath, vow, or promise; and he is willing to let it go forth in all its simplicity, trusting the Truth in it to give it acceptability and substance.

Heaven is the throne of God. Heaven is within you, therefore God is enthroned now in your heart and always has been; for God, the unchangeable, does not come and go, but remains ever in the same state or place. "Lo, I am with thee always. I will never leave thee nor forsake thee." The earth is his footstool.

The earth is the great negative state in which is included all that is material, evil, and inimical to God. It is the state that is to be overcome, or come over, and to be put under foot. Man, following after God, must learn to have dominion over the earth, and to put all that is earthly under his feet. "Sit thou upon my right hand (in the power of the good) until I make thine enemies thy footstool."

"Thou canst not make one hair white or black" by using false words, which oaths are. Only true words have the real magical powers. He who desires all his words to be magical and to bring forth that which he desires, must be careful always to speak words that are absolutely true and which are based upon divine principles.

Let your communication be Yea, yea, to all that is everlastingly good and holy; and Nay, nay, to all that is not of God-evil, and of the carnal or fleshly nature. Ever honest, straightforward, fearless, and loving, the simpler and more direct the speech, the more Godlike is your manifestation.

December 2.

Christ's Testimony to John. - Luke 7:24-35. GOLDEN TEXT: Behold I send my messenger before thy face .- Luke 7:27.

What do we go out for to see? What does existence mean for us? It is the process of finding out what we are, whence we come, whither we go. We call this process time, and say we live so long and then die.

But this is not true; it is only our sense-belief. We are eternal in our real being, which has neither beginning nor end in time. We are to gain consciousness of this real being, and its eternal wholeness. We are to reach the divine self-consciousness, and its messenger goes before our face now.

John is the letter, the Christ is the spirit. The letter is the messenger of the spirit. The letter declares or preaches, the Spirit does the

John's disciples go to Jesus and ask, "Art thou he that should come? or look we for another?" (20-23). And Jesus does not say, "Yes, I am," but "Tell how the blind see, the lame walk." No works are recorded of John and his disciples, only of Jesus Christ and his disciples. "He that cometh after me is greater than I."

The letter of the truth must precede its spirit for the soul. We hear, and then do. Demonstrations of the truth of being (miracles) never come from the letter alone. We may repeat the letter-"two and two are four"-indefinitely; but till we put it into practice, till we apply it to conditions and things, its spirit is never demonstrated to us.

Do we go about to find and hear the letter of the Science of Being? We had much better apply what we already have, and prove the truth. It is through the application that "the blind see, the lame walk."

Theories and isms contain some truth. Any one of them may be a letter indicating some truth. The letter is the statement which is in exact conformity to truth, and is therefore impersonal. The personal element cannot enter into it. John's teaching is always a reference to that which comes after him. An absolutely true statement is always a reference to that impersonal truth it indicates. The hearer is directed to that impersonal truth—to the spirit

which proves all things.

Some time the soul, weary with isms and ologies, will get its own revelation from "the right side of the altar" (1:11), and then it will voice a doctrine no more. It will be dumb till it can make the statement which accords with its revelation, till it can "speak as the spirit giveth utterance"; for it will be "filled with the Holy Ghost" (1:15).

True teaching is that statement which is in accord with the truth of being. To see, feel, and apply that true statement is to produce the work of the spirit, is to uncover and reveal

the real man.

Verse 28. He that is least in this proof and demonstration is greater than the greatest of those who but repeat the letter, even though that letter be absolutely true; for through his proving he is ruling his sense-consciousness. Let us keep our mental eye fixed on the true letter, but let us also labor with diligence to bring forth the fruits of the spirit.

"Wisdom is justified of her children" when the powerlessness of any mere letter, form, or ceremony is seen, and the might of the spirit is recognized. The one who walks in the spirit is freed from the bondage of the limited letter, and has power over all that inhabits the sense-

consciousness.

Christ Teaching by Parables.—Luke 8:4-15.
GOLDEN TEXT: The seed is the word of God.—Luke
8:11.

"Spiritual things are spiritually discerned."
Undeveloped souls cannot see realities, because they have not the faculty of spiritual perception through which only they can be seen. Jesus came to save them that were lost—lost in the darkness of sense-consciousness, blind to the verities of being. His teaching was put into the form which could bring it before them—parables, or object lessons.

The sense-soul can see only objects (all things were brought to Adam to see), representatives of the invisible real. All teaching for that soul, however true, must be put into the objective form. With objects the soul's education or development begins. It must

learn to see what the objects indicate.

Jesus' parables indicate hidden realities.

These realities are very mysterious to those as yet unable to see; but to disciples—to those who are having their understanding opened—there is no mystery. They begin to "know the mysteries of the kingdom of God," for they find immutable Principle back of all things. They know the real is eternal and changeless.

11. The truth of being is the word of God.
"Thy word is truth." It is the seed which if sown in the soul and given a chance to germinate, will bring forth fruit—that fruit which is con-

sciousness of our spiritual wholeness.

5. Some of the good seed falls by the side of the road in which we are traveling back to the source from whence we came. It gets trodden under foot in the push and perplexity of the sense-life. Truth is never without a witness in the world, and divine seeds of wisdom fall beside us frequently in life's journey—in the passing over to divinity. But in our ignorance and eagerness for sense pleasures we tread on them and pass them by unheeded.

6. And again, the divine seed falls upon a hard surface—a soul so hardened with merely intellectual knowledge that there is not enough yielding soil to give it proper conditions for growth. Springing up quickly, the growth has no stamina, because it has not sufficient root, and it cannot stand the heat and strife of mortal experience. It withers away because it is not sufficiently fed. The seed was good, but the soil was insufficient for permanent roots that should strike deeper and deeper continually, drawing nourishment from the eternal.

7. And some seed falls among the thorns of suffering, the pains and woes of sense-existence. And the soul says, "It cannot be true that I am a spiritual being now, whole and harmonious now, health and strength belonging to me now. I suffer, and my suffering is the real." These thorns choke the word and prevent it from bringing forth fruit. Future experience is needed to show the soul that the thorn in the flesh can be plucked out by its master.

12. The devil of an error believed by the soul to be truth, takes away the seed, because the soul is possessed and ruled by that error.

The seed has no chance.

13. But many hear with joy when they are told there is a way out of all the difficulties which hedge the soul about. They are delighted, but because they do not at once have

that which is waiting in the way, and because they have not yet walked to it, they fall back and say, "Oh, I guess this is not true after all. It has not taken away my dyspepsia yet." "For awhile they believe, and in time of temp-

tation fall away.'

14. The riches and pleasures of the senselife even more than its cares prevent bringing the fruit of the Spirit to perfection. The scourgings of the senses help more than their allurements. Indications that the divine seed has fallen into the soil and is sprouting are often seen; but the bringing of its fruit to perfection is hindered for a season by the value placed on that which is less than the highest.

15. The ground from which the fruit is sure to grow to perfection is the "honest (look at that word over and over again) and good heart." Those who honestly pay the price of the divine self-consciousness, keeping no part of it back, keep the seed within the soil where its roots will strike deeper and deeper, and bring forth its fruit in an orderly manner—"first the blade, then the ear, then the full corn

in the ear.'

This requires patience, for we all want the "full corn" at once. "Let patience have its perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing."

December 16.

The Twelve Sent Forth. — Matt. 10:5-16.

GOLDEN TEXT: As ye go, preach, saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand. — Matt. 10:7.

Heaven is not a far-off locality reached by the death which comes from sickness. Heaven and hell are in the heart—in our inmost feeling. To establish the kingdom of heaven we must rule our feeling. The kingdom of heaven

is at hand; it is possible for us now.

But first all unclean spirits must be cast out. All thoughts, all beliefs which are contrary to harmonious being, must be east out of our mentality. We must not think them, for our thoughts give quality to our feeling. To rule our feeling we must rule our thoughts. To rule our thoughts we must keep our mental eye fixed on what we spiritually are. To think according to what we spiritually are, is to have that quality of feeling or self-consciousness created unto us.

We are disciples of our own true selves, and we have power to cast out all the errors formerly possessing us, and to prepare the way for the divine to heal us of their consequences.

The house of Israel (6) is the higher realization of being which is typified by Jacob. "The seed of Jacob shall take root, and bud and blossom and fill the whole world with its fruit."

The lost sheep of this house—those lost in the mazes and darkness of sense-consciousness—need the preaching and demonstration of the disciples—of those "sent out" from that darkness, and therefore able to minister to those who are still in it. It is only the lost sheep that need the healing.

8. The true disciple gives as freely as he receives, for he knows that the water of life is free to all who thirst. It cannot be bought with what we carry in our purses. It will be had by everyone who can appropriate it.

9, 10. The pitcher which brings from the well fills a worthy and high office. The water is free, it belongs to all; but the one who needs the pitcher should not fail to recognize the part it plays when his need is met. "The workman is worthy of his meat." And the "meat," or material means he requires, should come to him from this recognition on the part of those who benefit by his services.

11. He can work only for those who are worthy,—only for those who are ready to receive the truth of which he is the bearer,—not for those who are only desirous of proving that

what he offers is not the truth.

13. If they are worthy his peace will come upon them, for they will experience the same results from drinking the water of life freely, that he has experienced. It is the same for all, with no respect of persons. But if they are not worthy,—not open to receive what he would give them,—all his efforts in their behalf will return more peace to him. He will have done what he could, and every true word spoken will bring result to the speaker of it, whether the speaking is in his own behalf or for another.

to. The disciple which shall win souls—restore lost sheep to the fold—must be as wise as a serpent and as harmless as a dove. He must be wise with that true knowledge which is wisdom; so wise that he will be discreet in

the use of it.

Recognizing the mighty power of thought, he will never use it to command followers for himself. Keeping watch and ward over his own thoughts, his acts will be "for the glory of God," not for his own glory. He will take care that he never thinks about another as he would not wish that other to think about him. He will recognize the value of "the word spoken in season, and not speak continually out of season. The gospel of the kingdom is only for those who will receive it.

December 23.

The Prince of Peace. Isa. 9:2-7.

GOLDEN TEXT: Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end.—Isa. 9:7.

The "prince of this world" is the opposite of the "Prince of Peace." While the government of existence belongs to the first there is war, turmoil, confusion, and strife. There is great darkness, even the darkness of the shadow of death.

2. But those who have been governed by this ruler, who have walked in the darkness till suffering has begun to open the inner eye, "have seen a great light." Dwelling in the land of the shadow of death (believing in sense-existence and its illusions as the reality of existence) it has shined upon them and lighted up the way out of sense-illusions. It has revealed the freedom of the spirit.

Some time in the course of the soul's experience, it gets its revelation of the hidden mystery of being. Then that child—its own divinity—is born to it, and it sees that the government of all future existence must be according to its nature. It turns from the prince of this

world to that Prince of Peace.

7. The mortal quality of self-consciousness is voluntarily given up, that the spiritual quality may increase. The power of the prince of this world is temporal. When we see its nature and what comes from it, we turn gladly, willingly to the eternal real, feeling that to its

government there can be no end.

It is set up on the throne of David. Spiritual perception (David), not mortal sense, is the basis for this peace which shall have no end. The government of the Prince of Peace shall be established according to the divine order, with right judgment and justice. The ceaseless activity of our eternal individuality (the Lord of Hosts), which pushes its way through all opposing obstacles, will accomplish it, once the divine child is born to us.

December 30.—Review.

GOLDEN TEXT: Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever.— Heb. 13:8.

The Son of God is manifest through the Son of man. God's Son is begotten in our humanity, is born out of our humanity, and ascends beyond it, remaining forever "at the right hand of power."

This individual Christ that is to be the universal Christ as all mankind grows into conformity to the divine pattern, speaks through the human teacher in the world. Well will it

be for us if we do not reject him.

He is the realization of the highest possible ideal. We have to push away from the hard and fast coast line of tradition and dogma, and launch out into the deep to find him, "the one altogether lovely." When we have found him and desire him only, he will never leave or forsake us.

He will speak as the old man never spake, because he will know what the old man was incapable of seeing. He will be at once the interpreter and the fulfillment of prophecy. He will heal all our diseases and put our sins—our errors—far from us.

THE WEEK OF HEALING.

To be asked to write a report of the week of healing seems like having a stupendous responsibility thrust upon us when we consider the influence such a report may have upon people who read it. It must be free from bombast or exaggeration, and at the same time it must tell of the health and joy that dawned upon many of the stricken souls who came, with their various maladies, sorrows, and misfortunes, to ask for the help and healing which other methods had failed to give.

On Monday morning, November 5, promptly at ten o'clock, Hall 210, Masonic Temple, was opened, and a band of earnest, faithful "Students of Truth" were on hand to begin the work of the week, while the anteroom for the reception of patients was already well filled

with applicants who desired healing.

At first the patients were admitted one at a time; but it was found impossible to reach every case that came in that way, as several had to leave without treatment the first day, after which they were taken in groups of three and four at a time.

Each day from thirty to fifty received pres-

ent treatments. A large portion of them knew nothing at all of the principles of divine healing from experience, but came through the solicitation of those who had proven its efficacy. Most of the cases were chronic diseases that had refused to yield to ordinary methods of cure.

Many voluntarily testified to the benefit they had received day by day, some claiming to be perfectly healed and others confident that their troubles and ailments were rapidly disappear-

ing

One woman, who came with a sprained arm which had been useless to her for months, left the hall rejoicing, and flourishing the arm above her head, while before she could not lift it but

slightly.

Many whose eyes were treated received immediate help. Some discarded their glasses at once. A marked instance was a young man with an aggravated case of astigmatism, who took off his glasses and at once discovered that he could read the finest print without them.

Many came solely for spiritual uplifting, and went away filled with joy and gladness never

before experienced.

In the six days devoted to this work there were over two hundred patients who received present treatment, and more than that number applied for absent treatments, which it was found impossible to give to each case *individually*, although they were not forgotten nor neglected; and as many as *could* be reached for want of time were treated individually.

As the space allowed for this report is somewhat limited, we shall have to forego the mention of the many faithful workers by name, there being from fifteen to twenty-five on duty daily during the week; but we cannot refrain from speaking of the faithful service of Mrs. Bessie Umstot, who gave such graceful and cordial attention to those in waiting; and to her we are indebted for many items of report and of testimonials from the reception room, where many lingered to talk over their experiences, which otherwise we should not have known.

Altogether the week of healing was a blessing to all concerned—healers as well as patients; and the blessed influence was felt by some even before they came into the hall.

The Truth Students' Association, under whose auspices this work was inaugurated, will

doubtless show their faith by their works in many ways; and may it ever be as harmonious and blessed as this first endeavor!
