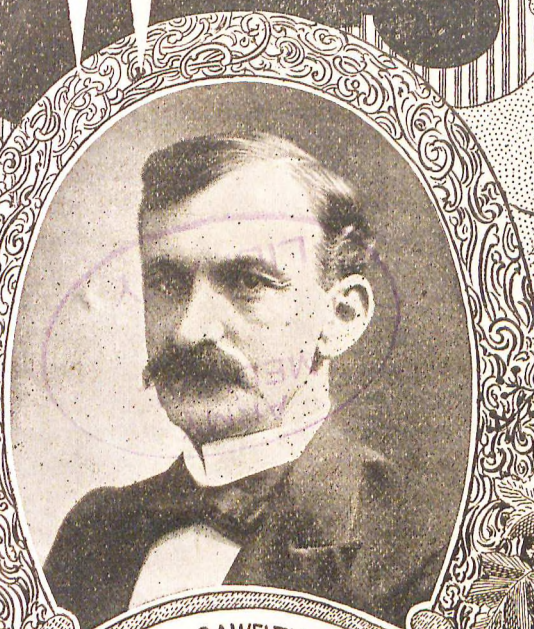

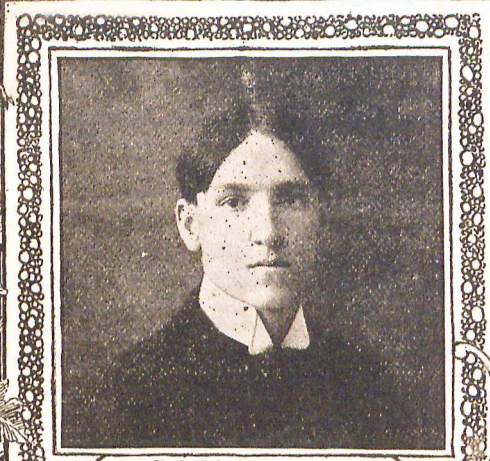

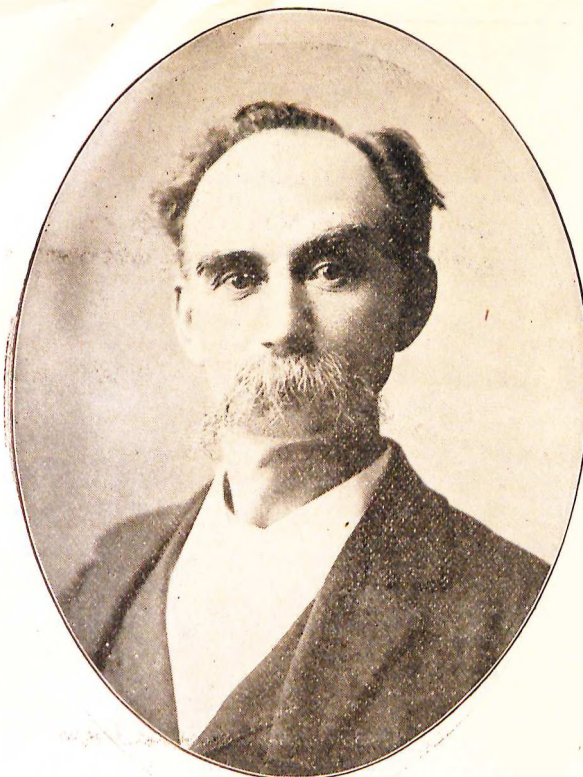

ABSENT OR HOME TREATMENT

A Definition of What is Termed the "Absent Treatment," Which Shall be Hereafter Known as the S. A. Weltmer Home Method of Healing.

The purpose of this article is to give a clear and concise idea of what is termed the "Absent Treatment." I dislike the term treatment, and use it simply because persons suffering from bodily ailments have been educated to term whatever is done for them, or by them, to alleviate such suffering, a treatment.

The proposition of Weltmerism is based upon the principle that the mind controls the body through the exercise of the WILL; that the WILL can be exercised in only one way, that is by relying upon it. Every effort of the WILL which brings to the patient health or happiness or prosperity is a compliance with Law.

The power to heal disease is not in man; there is a First Great Cause, an Intelligent Creator, an Immutable Law, which governs the lives and actions of all beings and all things. This Law operates constantly through man, with our knowledge or without it. If without our knowledge, we are subject to all the adverse conditions that may assail us, and helpless so far as ameliorating these conditions is concerned.

A knowledge of this Law and perfect compliance with it gives us mastery over disease, over adverse conditions, and this knowledge constitutes our power and compliance with it builds us up. However, in this Law "we live and move and have our continual being."

By a careful investigation we find that in everything there is a principle that we call Life. In the apparently inanimate rock, in the vegetable and animal kingdoms, of which latter kingdom man stands at the head, we find this Life that stimulates the body or plant in which it exists, but we note that the moment this departs from its habitation, that moment the body once occupied is dead. We call this Life principle the First Great Cause, the Creator, the Law, the Law of Nature, God.

Man uses this force either consciously or unconsciously all the time, and man is said to be created in the image and likeness of God. This same Law, operating through man, causes him when he exercises the executive part of himself, which is his Will, to move about, to work with his hands or to think with his brain, and this we call voluntary action. Without his knowledge of how it is done, this law operates through him, keeping his heart in motion, his lungs inhaling and exhaling, the pores of the skin constantly exuding impurities of the body and absorbing life, and this force we call Involuntary Force.

By fully understanding the nature of man we find that what we once considered Involuntary force becomes Voluntary force. The purpose of the healer is to bring into action this law, to instruct the patient so he will know how to live in harmony with this law which, if properly observed, will enable us to use this power to the upbuilding or rebuilding of the human body. The peculiar feature of this law is that it operates regardless of man's knowledge of its existence, or of his knowledge of how it operates. Man has control of his physical forces, just in proportion to his understanding of this law, and its manner of operation. His body becomes stronger and healthier as he obeys the law and weaker and more diseased as he disobeys it.

The purpose of Weltmerism is to give an understanding of this Law and how it acts. Disease and pain are registered upon his physical organism and he can not think the thought that will set him free. Here is where the healer comes in. This condition is the agreement of two minds as I have above stated. If it is asked, "Is it not the agreement which cures?" the answer is that the agreement may be regarded as the formal cause, but the efficient cause is the Law.

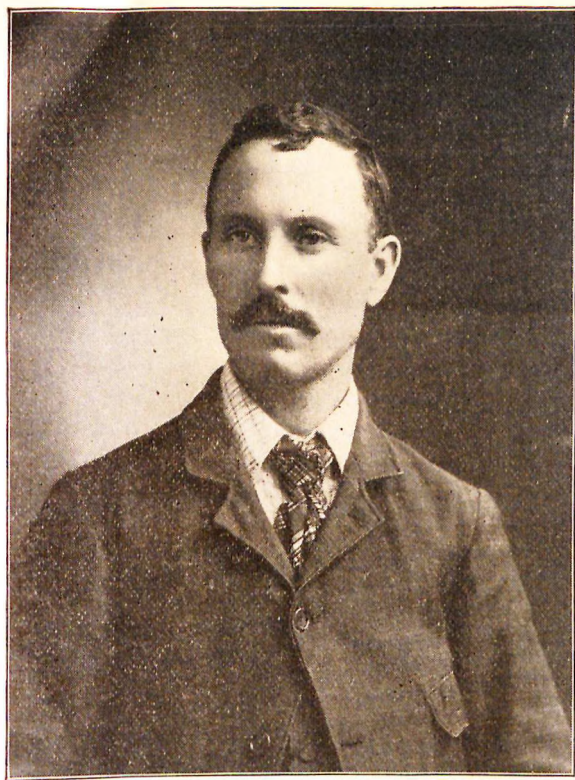
