THE CHRIST AS SAVIOR

Last summer a traffic cop was shot, while on duty at one of the downtown crossings in Kansas City, by fleeing bank robbers. The murdered man was no common traffic cop. He was a man who, in the discharge of his duty, had been so unfailingly courteous and so pleasant in his dealings with the public that he had endeared himself to the whole city. He was called "Happy" Smith. The following quotation from a letter by John Thomas Harding a prominent lawyer of Kansas City tells how "Happy" Smith's courtesy paid premiums on life insurance for the benefit of his bereaved family.

"HAPPY" SMITH

I have known young Smith since he was a boy. For several years he was elevator boy in our building. Even then he manifested those delightful traits that afterwards brought him into favorable notice.

His life demonstrates that the public is quick to appreciate courteous treat-

ment whether it emanates from those in high places or from those in the humble walks of life.

Young Smith was a courteous elevator boy before he was a courteous police officer. He was not only a courteous officer; he was a happy man. He stood on duty at Eleventh and Walnut for a long time. He was good natured and patient while standing in the snow and sleet, and he was good natured and patient in the dust and heat. He was good natured while dealing with the crowds and jaywalking public and he was good natured in private life. His

well-known, familiar smile was not affected; it was perfectly natural. It was not an empty gesture for self-promotion; it was the philosophy of his life. To put it another way, he did not smile for the sake of popularity, but because he was mentally a happy man.

Three thousand years ago a wise man wrote, "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." "Happy" Smith knew this and turned it to his profit. He knew that one cannot secretly harbor hate and be happy, for sooner or later it will manifest itself outwardly. DAILY HELPS

Every life has its key note, every day some variation of the same note. Usually we allow circumstances, the suggestions of our associates, or the conditions of the endocrine glands, the nervous system, and digestive system to determine our key note. We can choose our own key note whether for our whole lives or for a moment when we know that we can and constantly assert our authority over our own lives.

The best of all life keynotes is the one suggested by Jesus of Nazareth, "The Kingdom of God is within you." Translated as you think of your own life, it will be something like this: "The Kingdom of God, the power to achieve my own high destiny, the ability to meet and overcome all the difficulties of my life is within me," or in the terms of the master affirmation, "I am Man, child of the Infinite Father, whose nature I inherit and express."

We print each month a series of affirmations for each day of the month of issue. These affirmations will be variations of the master affirmation. Practice making the master affirmation and the daily affirmations the keynotes of your life and every day of your life. Learn to meet all difficulties with the affirmation of power. Learn to think of yourself in the cosmic sense and as a source of forces and powers which create conditions and overcome obstacles to the realization of the conditions you create. You may put either form of the master affirmation in the place of the daily affirmation and you must always make the master affirmation its background.

Each night as you go to sleep think of the affirmation for the next day, and each morning when you first wake, think again of this affirmation and start your day's activity with it fresh in your mind. During the day when any situation arises in which you are called upon to consider your relation to the conditions with which you deal, think again of the day's affirmation and the master affirmation and make your adjustment on the basis of the resulting consciousness. The consistent use of these affirmations will give you an increasing consciousness of power and ultimately will result in mastery.

Easy Lessons in Experimental Metapsychology

An Experiment With "Magnetism."

Lesson VI.

One night at a class in Seattle, one of my students presented a very striking, and for a time puzzling, experiment for the demonstration of "Magnetism." I will describe the experiment and before you finish the article try it on

someone. If you do not get the full effect the first time, try again until you learn just how to do it to get the full effect as described. Then read the rest of the article unless you are able to make check experiments of your own which will disclose the true nature of the phenomenon.

Have some one stand holding the right hand horizontally with the palm upward. Tell your subject to hold his hand as still as possible. Stroke his hand briskly and with considerable

downward pressure. Repeat the stroking several times at regularly spaced intervals about one second apart. After stroking in this way about half a dozen times make the motion as if you were going to stroke again but instead of doing so stop your hand about three inches above your subject's hand. His hand will jerk up toward yours with irresistible force.

My student presented this experiment as a proof of magnetism. His explanation was that by the stroking of the subject's hand the magnetism was generated which caused the subject's hand to be pulled up toward his. It certainly feels like something draws the subjects hand as you can easily discover if you

allow the subject to try the experiment

on you.

Try the experiment on yourself. Stroke your left hand with your right and see what the result will be. You will discover that you can't get the effect on your own hand. This apparently is another reason for believing that the phenomenon is due to magnetism.

If you have not got the desired result something is wrong with the way you have performed the experiment. Let us define more closely some of the The conditions of success: subject must hold his hand horizontally with the elbow bent and the forearm and hand straight out from the elbow. He must hold his hand as still as possible the while he makes strokes. strokes must be made with considerable downward pressure and evenly timed. It is best for the subject to watch what you are doing but not always necessary. You must make the false stroke in the same time as the true strokes and just as if you were going to stroke his hand again except that you stop just above his hand about three inches. It will be observed that his hand does not jump up at the moment you stop your hand but instead at the time that you would begin making the stroke. You have already discovered that you cannot get the effect with stroking your own hand.

As I suggested above see if you can discover the real meaning of this experiment before you read further. If necessary devise experiments which will check the results and prove conclusively whether they are due to magnetism. After you have checked up the experiment as far as you can, read the rest of this article and see if you reach the same conclusions and whether the methods you employ to reach your conclusions are the same as those I used in my class that night in Seattle.

Recalling an experiment conducted in one of my classes in physiology I asked the most "sensitive" subject to lay his hand on a table with perfectly relaxed arm and let us see what result we would get there. We stroked his hand just as before with the same stop and waited for his hand to jump up, but the reaction did not occur. We repeated this experiment a number of times with different persons until we were satisfied that we could not "magnetize" the sub-

ject's hand when it was supported by something besides the strength of his own muscles. We then had the true explanation of the results of the first experiment.

When the subject stands and holds the hand steady while it is being stroked he has to resist the downward pressure of your stroke by tightening of the biceps muscle of the arm. After the stroking has been repeated, a few times he gets in the habit of making a preparatory resistance so as to be ready

It isn't work that kills, it's worry. A person can over-tax his nervous system through hard work but there are not many people who like to work well enough for that.



Beggars and Street Fakirs in the Streets of Bombay, India.






An Indian devotee lying on a bed of spikes to win favor with his God.

degrees of wisdom. The light is increased in proportion as the aspirant continues boldly in welldoing. Knowledge is gained through being receptive to greater degrees of truth; wisdom is purchased through the sacrifice you will make in extolling the virtues, grace,

and power of God.

The power in spiritual life is realized not as one conforms and adheres to the beliefs of his parents, to this or that creed, church or other organizations, but primarily and fundamentally upon one's abhorrence of sin, shutting it out for all time from one's life, knowing that there is but one sovereign power—God.

mer and not being financially able to go to the Institute for treatments, he advised me to take the home treatments, which I did at once. teachers, and friends, and in being so situated, that circumstances do not rob them of this realization, they may go through life blessed by the power that such realization gives.

Others by study and training may achieve some degree of realization.

The third way is open to a few more. By shutting themselves away from the world and its claims upon their attention and then transcending their interest in themselves, they may become conscious of the realm of cause and principle and more or less capable of dealing with all things and events from this basis.

These states of abstraction from the surrounding world and the personal self with awakening consciousness of the realm of principle, are familiarly known as "trance."

Some persons spontaneously enter the trance states but some method of induction must be used with most persons to whom trance is possible. There are many methods for inducing trance but all have essentially the same object:—The induction of a bodily sleep with the awakening of the powers of inner vision which are just dawning in the human consciousness, while maintaining the conscious use of the brain speech centers and motor apparatus.

When deep trance is attained one is conscious in the realm of principle, cause, and divine purpose. If religious longing, desire and aspiration have supplied the motive for the induction of trance and the mind is free from dominating prepossessions of creedal superstition, the wisdom of divine purpose then becomes known and the neophyte is for the time a conscious dweller in the Kingdom of God.

THE GREAT DISCOVERY

The future will record that in the closing years of the nineteenth century Sidney A. Weltmer, an American, made one of the great discoveries of his time:

EASY LESSONS IN EXPERIMENTAL METAPSYCHOLOGY

when the pressure comes. When he sees your hand coming back for another stroke he makes this preparation and when the pressure does not come he meets no downward pressure and therefore his hand jumps up, apparently pulled up because your hand is stopped above his.

Another check on this conclusion may be made by having the subject look away or close his eyes and then make the experiment as at first except that, instead of stopping your hand above his, you merely finish the last stroke you make and put your hand behind you. The subject's hand will jerk up at the time that you have been making the stroke, even though your hand is nowhere near his.

Another experiment that will show this very nicely is to take three small boxes all just alike. Fill two of them with shot or some other heavy substance and leave the third empty. Tell the subject that you are going to test his ability to judge the weight of an

object.

Have him to hold his hand as if for the experiment. Place one of the boxes, which should weigh about a pound if possible, on his hand and let him heft it. Take that off and place the other heavy box on his hand. As soon as he has hefted that, take it off and place the light box on his hand and you will find that he will throw the light box over his shoulder because of the upward jerk of the arm which was prepared to receive a heavy weight.

These simple experiments show us the importance of checking up on our conclusions and the results of careless,

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

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CONSECRATED HANDS

For years it has been the custom of the Weltmer School to publicly consecrate the hands of its graduating students who have arrived at the spiritual realization of such consecration.

The ceremony of the consecration of the hands is a very beautiful and impressive one. Coming as it does at the end of the study and the beginning of his ministry to the sick and sorrowing, it is a fitting climax and milestone in the healer's life. Some healers come back to the Institute when they achieve a new realization or when the buffets of life have dimmed a bit the clarity of their vision of consecration, to have their hands consecrated anew.

The ceremony of the consecration of the hands of the students of the Weltmer Method establishes a succession which, through these students who shall consecrate the hands of their students in turn, will perpetuate through the years to come the healing by the laying on of hands as originated by S. Sometimes consecration comes from some outstanding, illuminating experience. Sometimes it comes from a slowly developing consciousness of the increasing power of the hand as an agent of healing. The ceremony of consecration of the hands at the Weltmer school grew out of an experience of Ernest Weltmer's boyhood.

One day in mid-August a telephone call came to the Institute for S. A. Weltmer to treat a man who was supposed to be dying of gallstones and typhoid. It was impossible for the healer to go at that time. He called his eldest son Ernest, and sent him to treat the dying man. He told the boy to go and lay his hands on the sick man and that he would get well.

When that boy felt the parched, hot skin of the sufferer turn cool and moist under his hand and heard his labored, moaning breathing change to the easy quiet breathing of restful sleep, his hands became something more than merely the means for expressing his boyish will; they became to him agents of Divine Purpose and Love.

Not every healer has this experience in such clear-cut form that it becomes a distinct experience of consecration. The ceremony of the consecration of the hands brings together the experiences of the old practitioner, the hopes, the training, and the crystalized purposes of the student and definitely interprets these experiences, hopes, and purposes, so that forever after the neophyte's hands will be, to him, definitely consecrated to the purposes of God in healing.

The ceremony of the consecration of the hands on the fourth day of the 1929 A. S. T. A. Convention will be one of the most important features of that meeting. The Weltmers plan to make this an occasion of the deepest, spiritual significance to all who take part in it.
