



Suggestions From Heredity and Environment

All suggestions that in any way have an influence upon a human being are supplied from one of two sources, Heredity or Environment. It is a question as to whether or not we can receive suggestion from any source except from our surroundings and the instincts

which we have inherited from our parents and and the ages before us.


Let me explain suggestion so you will understand what I mean by the use of the term. A suggestion is anything which causes one to believe something. That which we see, hear, taste, smell or feel, that impresses the human mind and causes it to believe something, offers a suggestion.

The school of Nancy held for years the proud position of being the authority along this line, not only for France

but for the world. They emphasized the term, suggestion. They believed there was something in the suggestion itself and acting on that principle, fell far short of reaching into the subject deep enough to grasp all there is in mentality. In fact, they overlooked the effect of suggestion in trying to give suggestion itself a peculiar power. The average thinker regards hypnotism in the same way, if he does not understand it. He regards the hypnotic

power as some invincible, dynamic force passing between the operator and the subject. He does not understand that it is the belief of the subject which is changing the vibrations in the subject's body and thus making the arm rigid or lax, forcing the blood into some part of the body or withdrawing it from that part. But the idea is prevalent as the school of Nancy thought. that this power is a power belonging to the ator, being used upon the subject. Through later investigation it has

been determined that there is no dynamic force or hypnotic power such as has been thought to exist; that there is no power which controls the human soul except what that soul believes; that the



belief which relates to your body, after it has entered your mind, becomes your thought and brings about the changes that take place in your body.

Each thought has its own rate of motion just as the apple has its particular flavor. Each thought causes a different kind of movement. Those thoughts which produce sickness and death invaribly lower the rate of vibration and every additional impulse causes the movement to become lower and lower until finally there is no longer any vibration, motion is stopped and death is the result.

Suggestion, as we define it, is that influence which makes us believe something. Taking another view of it, suggestion is anything which causes one to think or form an opinion. An opinion is nothing more than a belief or a series of beliefs combined into definite thought. A statement of an opinion is a statement of belief.

Out of the world around us we get impressions which make us think. Out of our dispositions we get certain propensities. Thoughts have been impressed upon us for generations by our parentage in the direct line of ancestry.

At first thought, the investigator who has determined for himself a great many truths, concludes that man is not wholly subject to either his environ-ment or the law of heredity. Environment offers its suggestion. All of the world outside of ourselves is environment. Everything that does not come from within but relates to the forms of being outside of the individual, comes from environment. No one can grasp out of a scene anything which that scene holds which is very far beyond the horizon of the line that marks the limits of his usual experiences. People who have lived in one of the valleys of Switzerland and who have ascended the mountain, find it a difficult matter to believe there is a world beyond those hills. Just as much of our environment as we can comprehend offers us a suggestion. Just as much as we believe we

have inherited from our parents, we allow to influence us.

We are constantly widening the range of our environment by our travel and the study of the world at large. It would be impossible to estimate the full value to the human mind of the suggestions offered by the study of astron-Pythagoras had seen the stars and not only was he impressed with a suggestion of immensity and harmony but he was enabled to give to the world a system which he called "The Music of the Spheres". His environment was not confined to the earth. He lived in an environment which was millions miles in extent and he gathered out of it thoughts that were clear beyond the comprehension of the ordinary individual and even of the scholars of time.

If the law of heredity would confine man to doing only those things which his parents had done, then we say the law of heredity has not furnished us suggestions out of which the progress of the race has grown. Often when the physician studies his case, instead of taking it as he finds it, he begins to ask the patient about the health of his father or mother, whether or not this disease existed in some member of his family. His purpose is to learn whether or not it can be traced to some hereditary taint. He runs back to get the history of the case. The history that comes from the past has not changed very much since the days when Jesus disposed of it by explaining that people who delved in the past find nothing but dead men's bones.

Out of heredity man can learn what are his rights. Out of his environment, if he can trust himself, he will learn what there is for him to do. His accomplishments, so far, have transcended anything conceived of and have reached out into every field of endeavor. It has not been very many years since a man wrote two volumes outlining "The Conflict Between Religion and Science."

"The Spring of Perpetual Youth"

E. C. Worth




Fig. 1. Ameba, one of the simplest cell types-a complete individual animal whose body consists of a single cell. This animal shows in very primitive form all of the phenomena of life. It is so little differentiated in form that it can use any part of its protoplasm for the expression of many functions. Either of a pseudopodia (P) (false teeth) which appear in the diagram may be used as an organ of locomotion (foot), an organ of prehension (hand), of ingestion (mouth), or of digestion (stomach). The digested food may be absorbed by the surrounding protoplasm and the remainder expelled from the animal's body by the action of this same part. In higher one-celled animals different parts of the cell are given special form for the carrying on of certain functions, and in the manycelled animals different groups of cells are especially developed for the performance of special functions. All cells, however, are fun-damentally similiar to the ameba, no matter how highly specialized in function and differentiated in form they may become, cv, contractile vesicle; ec, ectoplasm; en, endoplasm; n. nucleus; p, p, pseudopodia. (Diagram after Shute). (From "The Practice of Suggestive Therapeutics.")

Look into a microscope at a drop of ditch water and you will be sure to see some form of unicellular life. You may see diatoms, slipper animalcules, even amebas, (Fig. 1), or any one of a numerous tribe of single-celled animals and plants. The living things you see there have no dead ancestors. Every one of them is a living branch of the original ancestor of its race. The first ameba was endowed with the ability to drink periodically at the fountain of youth. When it began to grow old and the powers of youth began to flicker and wane, it drank at the fountain and its youth was renewed, its life powers were restored in full strength. Speaking in less metaphorical but no truer terms, I will attempt to describe the processes of reproduction in the ameba and its kind.




Fig. 2. Diagram illustrating Mitotic Cell-Division, (After Shute). In the diagrams shown above we have represented in a very diagrammatic manner the stages of cell-division. Starting with No. 1 we have the cell beginning the active, dividing stage when the chromatin material (chr) of the nucleus begins to form into the chromosomes, a process which is complete in No. 2, where we see the chromosomes (chrs) formed into distinct elements which present the closed ends of their open loops to the centrosomes (sp) which have resulted from the subdivision of the original centrosome (ct) appearing in No. 1.

As unicellular animals grow larger their growth and motions become slower, and all of their life activities less vigorous. This occurs apparently because the mass of living matter to be supported with food and oxygen have become too great for the powers of the surface layer of the cell to feed it properly. The surface does not increase at the same rate as the mass. The only way in which the surface can recover an efficient proportion to the mass of the cell is by sub-division, (Fig. 2), and this is what happens now. The cell divides into two, resulting in a great increase of the surface through which food and oxygen are taken. The new cells, called daughter-cells, consist of the material of the original cell, called the mother-cell. Where before division the mother-cell grew and moved slowly, the daughter-cells now are very active and grow very rapidly.

The divided mother-cell has renewed its youth in the daughter-cells. The death of a single-celled creature means the end of life for its line. Life is perpetual in the material of the ancestral body.

In all the unicells the occasional union

or conjugation of two individuals is necessary for the perpetuation of life and the processes of multiplication. In this process of the conjugation of cells. we have the beginning of sexual reproduction. The essential feature of cell conjugation is the union of the two cells and the transfer from each to the other

life processes by conjugation takes place even though the conjugating cells are degenerate specimens of their race.

The prevention of conjugation inevit

In No. 3 we see the centrosomes separating, the attraction sphere (sp) forming between them and the chromosomes (chr) losing their orderly arrangement under the influence of the forces of the attraction sphere. Observe also at this stage that the nuclear membrane (mn) which appear-

ed in Nos. 1 and 2 is lost.

In No. 4 we find the chromosomes (chrs) ranging themselves bewteen the centrosomes under the influence of the attraction spheres (sp). It will be observed that each chromosome has split into two parts and in No. 5 we find each half of the original chromosomes moving toward an opposite centrosome.

In No. 6 the separation of the halves of the chromosomes has become complete.

In No. 7 we see them grouped around their chosen centrosomes, In No. 8 we find the cell-body becoming constricted and divided.

In No. 9 the nuclear membrane and nuceoli reappear, the cell subdivides into two and in No. 10 we have the two daughter-cells similiar in every way to the original mother cell, No. 1, with which we began. (From "The Practice of Suggestive Therapeutics.")

ably results in racial degeneration which can be stopped only by allowing conjugation to take place again. The explanation of this miracle of rejuvenation is not yet entirely clear but it appears reasonable that it is due to

Easy Lessons in Experimental Metapsychology

Ernest Weltmer

Lesson 1 *

Psychology deals with the states of consciousness and the accompanying life activities.

Metapsychology deals with those phenomena of life which appear to be partly mental and partly something more (or less) than mental.

Psychology studies conscious sensa-

tions, thoughts, and feelings, and the associated bodily activities.

Metapsychology studies maneffluvium, the auras, telepathy, clairvoyance, etc.



Psychology is of very general, almost universal importance in life. There is no life situation in which the psychological factors are not important. Metapsychology is useful chiefly as a means for demonstrating the extra-ordinary powers of mind which can be drawn upon in emergencies and brought into powerful expression in healing, etc.

Before beginning the study of these lessons cast aside every preconceived notion about metapsychology. Most of what you believe about the different topics of this subject is entirely false. If you try to interpret these lessons in the terms of what you already know about these matters you will probably never understand what I am trying to teach and you will certainly not get the greatest good from the study.

I can make these lessons of great value to you if you will follow my directions and learn what I have to teach you.

Maneffluvium is one of the most easily demonstrated of metapsychical prenomena. Maxwell's experiment demonstrates maneffluvium to about 8 out of 10 observers under proper conditions.

Place a high-backed chair before a window with the back of the chair toward the room. Hang a piece of black

velvet—a black velvet coat—over the back of the chair. This is the screen. See Fig. 1.

Stand facing the back of the chair and the window. Leave the window blinds open so that the light shines in the eyes of the observers. The light should not be too bright; a north light is the best. At night an electric lamp will do if it is not too bright and if it gives a diffused light.

Reach out the arms in front and bring the fingertips of the hands together just in front of the screen and its shadow. See Fig. 2.

The fingertips of the two hands must be brought into close contact and held so for a few moments while the "current" is started. To start the flow, you endeavor to cause to flow from your right hand into your left hand through the fingertips, the very life force of your body. You have the feel-

ing that you are pumping out through your fingertips the life energy of your arm and hand and after you learn to do this, you can even feel that you draw these energies from other parts of your body.

When you get the feeling that you are sending out the manefluvium, as

we call this emanation, and that it is passing from your right hand into your left, that a "current" has been established, then draw the hands slowly apart while you continue to transmit the "current" across the gap between your fingertips, Fig. 3.

If you have really started the flow and the optical conditions are right, and if you are ordinarily "sensitive", you will see lines as of thin fog connecting the fingertips of the two hands.

Usually this stuff has the appearance of cigarette smoke, gravish, barely

visible. To some observers, however, it appears reddish, flame colored, or purple.

It is very important that the eyes are not strained when looking for maneffluvium. Look at the space between the fingertips with resting eyes without strain and without shading the eyes. The emanation is never very ob-

vious, but straining the eye to see it will make it only harder to see.

When you have learned to produce visible maneffluvium then you can begin making experiments with it. Make contact again, then draw the hands apart slowly while you watch the form of the emanation. You will note that at first each fingertip is connected with its opposite fellow by a distinct band. As your hands are drawn farther and farther apart the bands become less distinct and the breadth of the area of

maneffluvium shrinks midway between the fingertips. Usually, by the time the hands are about 12 inches apart the emanation has been drawn down to a

thread in the center and with a little farther separation, breaks and disappears entirely. This phenomenon varies, however, with different operators.

There is always a suggestion that this whole appearance of maneffluvium may be a result of suggestion and optical illusion. We will study the matter

of optical illusion first.

If you will place one hand in front of the screen as for the experiment, and then draw it slowly to one side you will observe a projection of the fingertips. You will readily see, however, that the appearance of this optical projection is entirely different from that of maneffluvium if you have seen the maneffluvium at all. Furthermore, if you

"The Expectant Gardener"

Our garden plans and expectations are as perpetual as many of our garden flowers. Our anticipations of the flowers we are to have give us almost as much pleasure as the blossoms themselves, especially when we have the seed and plant catalogues to stimulate hope and imagination. March is the time to plan in the north, the time to begin cultivating and resetting in the

south, and between these extremes there is always something of planning or preparation to keep the gardener busy and happy.

The leaves that have blown up on the columbines, the wild flower border and the oriental poppy beds, must be carefully raked off as soon as the frost is out of the ground. These leaf piles must not be removed too soon, however, nor too suddenly, for they will hold the frost in the ground and prevent the dangerous freezing and thawing that

may destroy some of the tender plants and lift some of them out of the ground. The leaves must be off, however, before growth starts.

When the ground freezes every night and thaws out during the day the garden must be watched carefully to see that the longer rooted plants are not left sticking up out of the ground where their exposed roots will be both frozen and dried out and destroyed. plants must be carefully pressed down into the earth again and protected against repeated freezing and thawing by a light mulch if possible. plants are lost from repeated freezing and thawing than from the hardest lasting winter freezes. While garden is freezing and thawing watch it carefully and protect your plants

against exposure from being lifted out

of the ground.

We look in the garden now to see whether the plants we started last fall have come through the winter successfully. When we see that they have weathered the winter's ice and snow we congratulate ourselves that we started

the Flanders poppies. These most beautiful of red flowers will grow nicely from seed and bloom the first year, but when they can be started in the fall and carried through the winter they will produce ten blooms to one and are far earlier to unfurl their flaming banners.

We look at the greening beds of field daisies we started last fall and then in fancy picture the great snow-drifts of bloom that they will give us during the coming summer. We examine the oriental poppy beds reset last July and see that their green hearts are all alive.

We remember the luxuriant foliage of their last fall's growth and the great clusters of dead leaves assure us that stored in the fleshy roots of these wonderful perennials is ample food for the making of their great blossoms, the biggest of all in the garden with the possible exception of the mallows. The fern bed just beside the poppies is beginning to break the ground with its uncurling fronds. The buds are swelling on the woodbine that hangs upon the wall.

The fern bed on the north side of the house is not started yet. The shadow of the house will hold it back a week later than the ferns inside the wall.

The shaded fern bed will be the more beautiful through the summer, however, and when the Solomon's seal that is beginning to spread among the ferns, droops its graceful spikes of leaves above their softer green, we will be glad that we had to wait for them in the spring. Lily-of-the-valley will grow wonderfully well in the same situation

as the ferns and the Solomon's seal. They may be grown together for a time but they all spread so much that unless they are frequently reset our combination bed of shade loving plants will become a grim battle-field.

March is a good time to gather new plants for the wild flower boarder. The wild blue phlox often called sweet Williams, is evergreen and it can be easily found in the bottoms. If you




Selecting Wild "Sweet Williams"

wish to select among the great numbers of varieties that are found among these flowers in a wild state, you must wait until they are in full bloom, but by choosing those with the richest leaves and the most deeply colored stems, you are sure of getting good varieties even where you take them so early in the year.

If you did not set your field daisy bed last fall you can do it now. You can also find the braunerias by last years' stems. You may be able to find some of the blue mints and the orange milk weeds in the same way. The horse mints cannot be mistaken, for

their dead flower heads are still characteristically fragrant. If the tradescantias, spider wert, or snake weed, are getting green and if you are going to plant a very large bed of them, dig them now, as many as you have room for. If you wish to select the different colors you must wait until they bloom. These are one of the best of all the wild flowers to bring to your garden. We have had as many as 25 varieties and shades of color in bloom at the same time.

If you live very far north you may prune your roses in March. However, in most parts of our country that has already been done for the roses should be carefully pruned as soon as the buds begin to swell. Remove all of the dead and unproductive wood and pay some attention to the shaping up of the bushes. All of those bunches of small

twigs that grew last fall around the places where blooms had been cut off during the summer, must be removed so that the new growth will start from single stems or canes. Now is the time for your first spray. Be sure that every part of the plant receives attention. Now is the time for transplanting roses. Remember the importance of proper preparation of the soil. Deep



HOW TO RELAX FOR TREATMENT



UNIVERSAL TELEPATHY

Telepathy is a fact of very common occurence. Some of its manifestations are so common indeed that they pass unnoticed. I have just been reading again an article by Mark Twain written in 1878, which points out in a way that has never been improved upon, some of these common manifestations of universal telepathy. I strongly recommend that any one who has access to Mark Twain's "Literary Essays" published by Harper & Brothers, New York and London, should take up volume 22 and turn to page 111.

It is evident that Mark Twain was a very sensitive receiver. One would expect him to be a good receiver for otherwise he could not have got so closely the characteristics, thoughts, and feelings of humanity; he could not have held so true a mirror to the eyes of man.

Some of the telepathic phenomena to which he calls attention are "crossed letters," fore-known meetings, simultaneous inventions and the duplication of ideas in stories, poems, essays, etc.

Mark Twain even undertook to theorize about telepathy and made at least one very fruitful suggestion. He accounted for the difference in the wording of the same thought by different persons who evidently had been in telepathic communion, by suggesting that each person expresses the thought in his own words. This is certainly true and it must be taken into account in the study of the results of all telepathy experiments.

Telepathic transmission as suggested in my article last month is without words. Telepathic transmission and reception is in meanings. I have successfully given suggestions to a receiver who could not understand one word of what I said and who could not speak a word that I could understand. An interpreter was required when we wished to communicate in words, yet he received my suggestions and acted upon them so as to leave no doubt as to the fact that I was communicating my thought to him without words.


At the very beginning of our study of telepathy I wish to emphasize the fact that no one can force another to receive a telepath. You can no more force another to receive a telepath than you can force him to listen at a telephone or open and read a telegram. If you telephone someone and he listens to what you say it is because he wishes to do so. If he wishes to listen to what you have to say it is because he is interested in what you have to say. He may dislike you very much and he may be very angry because you say what you do but he listens or "hangs up" as he chooses and his own interest is what causes him to choose to listen.

No one can force another to receive and act upon a telepath. One may send a telepath but if another receives it, it will be because he is interested and responsive to it.

If you wish to close your mind against the reception of any certain type of language or thought you have

EDITOR'S COZY CORNER

In times not long past the wonderseeker turned to the metaphysicians, fairy story writers, and the Jules Verne school of novelists for his wonder stories. In modern times the imaginative writers and the metaphysicians are unable to compete with the scientific explorers of the universe.

Some 25 years ago I figured out a scheme for transmitting pictures by wire and now they are doing it on essentially the same plan by radio. Jules Verne imagined men traveling under the sea in his fanciful submarine but the submarine he imagined was a simple toy compared with the modern reality. In a former issue of Weltmer's I published some ideas about the city of the future. I expect to live to see those ideas realized in some degree.

We are coming to see more and more that men can achieve what men can conceive and that the greatest limitations on human achievement are not found outside but inside of man's life. When man learns to think more he can do more. Most of his limitation is mental.

I have a copy of the March Popular Science Monthly. I imagine that Jules Verne would have found this Magazine unbelievably visionary. The scientific wonders which are treated in these pages as common fact would have seemed to the author of "Twenty Thousand Leagues under the Sea" beyond the limits of even the novelist's license. There are submarines, airplanes, search lights with one and a quarter billions candle power, the new Ford, movie marvels, radio, battle ship guns with a range of 30 miles mounted on railroad cars, the guidance of ships through the fog by radio signals, the making of medicine, dyes, fertilizer, from coal, the capture of helium from the air, the erection of houses in three hours, and a hundred other mechanical marvels that Verne could not have understood.

I have long preached against giving children fairy stories to read. I am

usually met with the argument that fairy stories stimulate the imagination. If one is looking for something with which to stimulate the imagination of either child or grown-up, he has only to pick up one of the present day Popular Science Magazines or any one of a hundred odd books dealing in a scientific way with the natural and mechanical marvels of the actual world in which The following quotation man lives. from page 65 of the March number of Popular Science Monthly suggests the speculations of a metapsychician. As a matter of fact it is modern science.

"DO RADIO WAVES NEVER DIE?"

"That the voices of famous present day men, transferred into radio waves, are now wandering around the earth and may be picked up a century hence is the startling contention of engineers of the Marconi Company, London. Such waves, they say, never die out completely; with sensitive enough receivers they might be heard in 2028! Already they have heard programs that have circled the world three times.

"Commenting on the idea, Dr. Lee de Forest, inventor of the vacuum tube, said, "Theoretically the waves exist forever, as do those of the ocean. The splash made by Noah's ark is still in existence. Radio waves are too weak to be recorded by existing receivers even a few minutes after their emission"."

Scientific research will yet prove that the speculations of ancient philosophers, seers, and metaphysicians were true visions of reality. In the early days of scientific development every step in scientific progress seemed to broaden the gulf between the realm of metaphysics and the realm of fact, but as scientific research nears the goal of the ultimate explanation of its "Facts", it more and more closely approaches the philosophical and metaphysical realms and it is evident that eventually, they will be in perfect agreement.

EXPERIMENTAL META-PSYCHOLOGY

raise and lower the hand you will observe that the projection raises and lowers with it. If you draw the hand farther to the side you will see also that the projection goes along with the hand and does not act as the maneffluvium has been seen to act.

Now place the hands before the screen in the position for the experiment, Fig. 2, but do not start the flow. Draw the hands away as if you were doing the experiment and observe the intervening space just as though the maneffluvium were there and vou will see a distinct difference in the appearance of such light as you do see in that space. In this way you can compare the purely optical phenomena with the combined optical and maneffluvial phenemena observed in the first experiment. A few trials will enable you to distinguish the difference.

A still better test for the genuineness of maneffluvium in this experiment is made as follows:—

Take position for the experiment as in Fig. 2. Start the flow. Slowly draw the hands apart until they are separated about six inches and the maneffluvium is quite visible. Now raise one hand while you lower the other and observe the diagonal displacement of the position of the emanation. It will have the appearance shown in Fig. 4. By reversing the position of the hands the line of emanation can be made to change position at will. No optical illusion can account for this. In order to study the affect of suggestion upon the observer it is necessary to have some assistance from others.

When you are sure you know how to produce and demonstrate maneffluvium in this way, prepare the setting and then ask some of your friends to help you make an observation. In order to avoid giving them suggestions as to what they shall see, do not tell them

what to look for or what to expect. Tell them to look for and remember

whatever they see.

Have them stand so that they look over your shoulders, Fig. 5. Explain the conditions of observation but do not suggest in any way what they are to see. Tell them to watch the space between your fingertips as you draw your hands apart and not to describe anything they see until after the observation is complete.

At first separate your hands horizontally, repeating the experiment until all of the observers have had a good chance to see the maneffluvium.

After you feel sure that everyone has had a fair chance to see it, ask them to tell what they saw and you will find, if you have done your part well, and the observers have really understood what they have to do and have made an intelligent effort to do it, about 8 out of 10 will report having seen the emanation.

The question of optical illusion will now arise. This is to be answered in the manner above described. Some one will also be certain to suggest that the observations are due to suggestion. If you have performed the experiment according to directions you can point out that no one had received any suggestions as to what was to be seen, yet most of them saw the same thing.

Our next lesson will discuss other methods for demonstrating maneffluvium and for proving that it is not an illusion due to suggestion.

The educational world has not kept pace generally with the practical world. 

loosening and fertilization of the soil

will insure fine blooms.

Perennials are the standby of the permanent garden, but there are some of the annuals that deserve a place in every garden and some such tropical affects that can be got by the use of the banana, canna, cleome, pugens and nicotania that these plants always deserve a generous corner.

Bananas and cannas are very easily grown if some care is taken to carry

their roots over the winter. Their enormous leaves make a fine background for the groups of smaller plants and they make an excellant screen for hiding unsightly outbuildings, etc.

For constant bloom the single petunias, portulacca, phlox drummondii, the dwarf nasturtiums, zinnias, marygolds, Iceland poppies, and four-o'clocks cannot be excelled. We might almost crown the zinnias king of the garden. The improved varieties with enormous bright colored flowers, stand cutting well and produce a constant show through-out the late summer. To get the best affect, plant them in beds of a single color.

If you have overlooked mallow marvels start a packet of seed in a box in the house as soon as possible, to be


