The River of Life

Every living cell lives in a drop of sea water in a quiet little bay at the edge of the river of life. The drop of sea water in which each cell lives is the lymph around it and the river of life is the blood stream. These are the agencies

numbers of so-called red and white cells, about 5,000,000 red cells and 10,000 white cells in a drop of $\frac{1}{25}$ of an inch in diameter, and certain substances in solution as well as food and waste solutions. The blood in the blood vessels is directly of no value to any of the cells except the inner linings of the blood vessels themselves. It serves the cells of the tissues by furnishing lymph to them. Even the most of the cells of the blood vessel walls have means for the secretion and the constant renewal of their supply of lymph.




Figure 1. The lymph vessels and nodes of the neck and armpit. These are the larger lymph vessels and more important nodes. Every tissue has its lymph vessels and every lymph vessel its nodes for the protection of the blood against the poison carried from the cells by the lymph.

through which Divine man builds and maintains the body, the physical tools of the creative purpose, the hands of the spirit.

The blood is contained in the heart, the blood vessels, and the sinuses of the spleen, adrenal glands, and red bone marrow. It is a carrier (1) of food, internal secretions and oxygen to the cells and (2) of wastes from the cells to the organs of elimination. The blood is largely fluid but also contains enormous




Figure 4. The original blood vessels throw out a projection which is hollowed and developed for carrying blood.

The capillaries are the primarily important part of the blood system. The blood does its work in the capillaries. The arteries are for the purpose of bringing fresh blood to the capillaries, the veins are for the purpose of taking used blood away from them. The heart is merely a mixing chamber and pump to keep the blood circulating.

One of the most remarkable things we know is the blood stream, yet we pay little attention to it. It is a marvelous thing. If Divine Wisdom had not invented and developed the blood circulation no animal could have lived at a higher stage than the star fish.




Figure 3. New blood vessels forming among the masses of cells in granulation tissues where the body is repairing some injury.

The blood system is necessary in order that all the cells of the body may be able to receive their food and air. There are some 25,600,000 millions of cells in the body and only a few of these are in contact with the food in the intestines or the blood stream. Yet every cell of the body must be fed and cleansed. It is lymph secreted by the capillary walls which does this.

As I have said lymph is secreted by capillaries wherever there are capillaries. The secretion pressure and the blood pressure in the capillaries help to move the lymph out of the tissues but most of the motion of lymph is given by muscular action. This is one of the chief reasons for exercising. When a muscle contracts it squeezes the lymph out of the tissues into the lymph vessels and sends it back to the blood. Thus exercise carries away the wastes of the cells and clears the way for fresh lymph from the capillaries. When exercise cannot be taken massage can take its place if massage is properly done. In any case exercise or massage is necessary to the perfect nutrition of the cells.

As the lymph goes away from the tissues it carries wastes which may be poisonous. It may also carry toxins from infection or even the living germs. The blood stream is protected against these poisons by the lymph nodes. All

the lymph passes through at least one lymph node before it returns to the blood. These lymph nodes act as censors on the lymph stream and when there is poison in the lymph they stop it or neutralize it. This is why we have sore kernels in the groin, armpit or neck when we have infection or colds. The lymph nodes are protecting the body against poisons. The blood and lymph are under control of the mind. The mind governs digestion, the organs which supply the foods, the liver, kidneys, lungs, spleen, skin, bowels, and glands of internal secretion which govern elimination and produce the secretions which control the vital processes.




Figure 2. A lymph node with vessels which carry the lymph into it and other vessels which carry the lymph out on the way back to the blood. The lymph nodes consist of masses of cells which censor the lymph and protect the blood against any poison it may carry.

The thoughts you think have their influence directly upon these organs and through the blood, upon all the tissues of your body.

The body has not been finished. It is in

My Summer Lecture Trip

Very early on the morning of Sunday, June 16th I will start on the lecture trip that will take me to the New England States and back. I will be accompanied and assisted by Mrs. Dorothea Hoffman Weltmer, my wife, and Pierre and Denise Weltmer, my children. We have planned a very strenuous month's work but we expect to put it over for we are very strenuous folk and used to work. Furthermore, we are counting on the good thoughts and prayers of our friends, and we have always found that when we employ all the power of our human resources, the Father supplies any further need. Some of my friends have told me that it is not possible to keep up with such a schedule as I have planned but I know it is, for we will be in the keeping of Him in whose interest the work is being done.

I will outline our trip as planned to date, so that you may follow us in your thoughts and so that you may know where to meet us if you wish to attend the lectures or where to send your friends to meet us. We will even be glad to hear from you by letter if we can be of any special service to you in any of these places and if there is anything you would especially wish to call to our attention. If you write be sure to start your letter soon enough to reach us for we will stop in most places only long enough for the lecture or over night. In some places it may be necessary for us to drive on after the night lecture but usually we will spend the night in the city in which that night's lecture is given. I will give an address for each stop. Please write briefly and do not be offended if you do not get a prompt reply for it may be necessary to let correspondence wait until we get home.

Before we take up the schedule of the trip let me tell you something about how we are going to make it: For three years we have been driving a little Whippet and we have been enjoying it very much but when a car has traveled over 50,000 miles without more than cursory attention from time to time, it ceases to be very dependable for a long journey that must be made on a definite schedule. Furthermore it no longer recommends the success and importance of the folk who ride

in it. We would have wanted nothing better than our little Whippet with an elastic allowance of time and no concern for what people might think about our appearance. We have had so many joyous rides in the little Whippet that we parted with it regretfully and we still think of it with love in our hearts for the loyal service it gave us.

In this trip we are not pleasing ourselves. We are working for a great cause and we know it is necessary to "look like somebody" when we come into a new place. Our appearance advertises and either recommends or disparages the cause in which we are engaged. I am going to considerable pains to see that our personal appearances are good when we come on the stage and to just as much pains and greater sacrifice to see that we are able to keep our appointments on time and that when we arrive people will think that we stand for something materially worth while.

On this account we discarded the faithful old Whippet and mortgaged 18 months of our future for a Pontiac Big Six Coach. It is a beautiful car, gray-blue, well proportioned. On the rear it has a trunk in which we will carry a big supply of books, circulars, Magazines and other supplies. Inside, there is room in front for the drivers and in the back seat for our baggage in the middle and one of the children on each side. When you think of us, think of my wife at the steering wheel most of the time. She loves to drive and is a good driver, cautious and reliable and sure to bring us in on time.

We are now "breaking in" the car and finding it exceedingly tedious business. At the time I write these words we have 425 miles on our first 500. We have driven at less than 25 miles an hour with constant care to see that the engine never races and that it is never pulled too hard. The children decided the other night that at the rate we were going it was impossible to go any place, that all we could do at 25 miles an hour was to stay some place. But when we get the engine nicely limbered up, we will be able to "step on it" whenever we like, sure that we will have immediate response and that we can keep right on "stepping on it" as long as necessary. you know how we will travel; think for us that we will be safe and that no Sunday driver will get too fresh with our right of way. Let me give you a schedule of our journey so that your good thoughts may help us to make it on time and in safety.

We will leave very early Sunday morning, June 16th. We expect to get breakfast in Kansas City, Missouri, (100 miles) with friends and immediately drive on to St. Louis 256 miles further where we will spend Sunday night. We may have a lecture in St. Louis and we may not. That arrangement has not yet been made. We will probably spend Monday visiting Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Myers at Kirkwood, Mo., R. 13, Box 76, Bach Road, Mrs. Paula Verdu, Melbourne Hotel, St. Louis, Mo., and other friends in St. Louis.

Tuesday morning, June 18th we will drive to Dayton, Ohio (346 miles). We plan to reach there late in the afternoon and to give a lecture that night at the home of Mrs. Amelia Oaks. 1430 East Third St., Dayton, Ohio, under the sponsorship of Mrs. Oak's daughter and husband Mr. and Mrs. Harry Gabriel, 20 S. Terry St., Dayton, Ohio.

On Wednesday morning, June 19th, we will drive to Indianapolis, (103 miles) where I will give a lecture Wednesday evening in the Unity Truth Center. 417 Kresge Bldg., Indianapolis, Indiana. Our hostess will be Rev. Murrell G. Powell, President of the International New Thought Alliance. Friends and students from all over central Indiana have promised to meet us and we are looking forward with pleasure to our reunion with them.

Thursday morning, June 20th, we will drive to Richmond, Indiana (68 miles) where we will visit friends for an hour and then on to Mansfield, Ohio (181 miles), where I will lecture Thursday evening at the First M. E. Church, on the public square. Our host will be the Mansfield Psychology Club., C. G. Silcott, Secretary, 161 W. 5th Street, Mansfield, Ohio.

On the morning of Friday, June 21st we will visit our friend, Mr. M. F. McMullin, 63 Oregon Ave., Crafton Pittsburg, Pa. I will lecture Friday evening, June 21st at the William Penn Hotel, sponsored by Mr. E. B. Anthony, Cathedral Mansions, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Saturday, June 22nd, we will drive to Cham-

bersburg, (148 miles) where we will call on some patients and possibly lecture in the afternoon or night. If a lecture has not been arranged we will drive on to Hazelton, Pa. (154 miles) by the way of Gettysburg. We hope to have time to visit the Battlefield. In Hazelton we will visit Mrs. Weltmer's cousin, Karl Baberadt, 502 W. Diamond Avenue. If I lecture in Carthage I will drive from Carthage to Ames, Iowa, (261 miles) or if I do not go to Carthage, I will drive from Chicago to Ames, (356 miles) on Friday morning, July 19th, I will lecture there that evening. My host will be Mr. C. F. Hughey 1607 Grand Ave. Ames, Iowa.

On Sunday, July 21st. we will drive from Ames, Iowa, to Nevada, (385 miles and the trip will be finished.

I will tell you all about our trip in the September number of Weltmer's Magazine and I am sure I will be able to tell that our labors have borne fruit in an increasing interest in the Weltmer Method, larger enrollments for classes, increased Magazine subscriptions lists and larger numbers of patients getting well under the Weltmer Method. I am so confident that I can give you this kind of a report that I am happy to take on the financial burdens that the Institute and I will share to make this expedition possible; I am happy to undertake its arduous labors.

Mental Pictures For the Spiritual Healer

You must not bind yourself to the past by accepting faulty expressions as belonging to you. You must realize that your life constantly is being renewed from within and that the spirit of life from which you are renewed is the Infinite Father's heart.

Such a paragraph taken from a Home Treatment letter is equally applicable to you, dear reader, if you are feeling the need of encouragement or need the assurance that God is your supply and that He is always ready to answer any call made upon Him by His children in their extreme need. If you are one of these, accept the help that He offers you now and be renewed in body and mind.

If you would have more air to breathe you need only to breathe more; if you would have more life you need only to live more. God has given us more air than we will ever breathe. CONCENTRATION

Making the mind a blank is not easy to do. If you know how to rest you can rest anywhere and if you don't you will be disturbed and restless on a feather bed in a sound proof chamber. The first thing to do is to withdraw the mind from any definite subject and make it a blank. This is easy to say but not easy to do without practice.

I do not mean that it is difficult not to think of something, for in fact, few people make a habit of thinking at all for more than a few seconds at a time. Thinking requires effort and concentration. But imagining is what occupies the brain of most of us. We see mental pictures of various conditions, pleasing or distressing. We see ourselves acting various parts and on the lighted screen of the mind pictures of life as we experience it or as we hope or wish to experience it, are continually projected.

The first thing in resting is to learn to turn the lights off that screen and see nothing but a blank. Now, if you try this lying in bed or sitting in an easy chair you will find it at first quite difficult to do. The screen will be blank for a moment but some sound or thought will suggest a picture and the cinematograph will begin again. The first thing to do then, is to concentrate on nothing at all, which is a very difficult thing and different from not concentrating on anything.

Resting requires almost as much concentration as hard work. That is why people who have the greatest power of

concentration have also the greatest power of resting. The restless and overtired people are the people who have not learned the habit of concentration or mind control. That is one of the greatest defects in our system of education. Children are taught to control their muscles and balance their bodies and are given exercises to aid them in acquiring this control. They are even taught to control their passions, but they are hardly ever taught to control their minds, although the mind is the one piece of machinery which controls the whole of the rest of the body.

The power of resistance tells a story of your safety or danger. We cannot escape contact with the germs of disease but we can live in such a way that we need not worry about the germs. recognize that the mental state has a lot to do with it. Freedom from fear gives a long start but if you will live right and think right and eat right you can hold up your head and go forward unafraid.

There was a young man running a footrace and he was coming home lagging behind. His sweetheart told him she would be there. He failed to see her on the start, his mind wasn't on his running, but all at once he saw this girl and he leaped forward and in a few seconds was ahead of the other boys and won the race.

He who wishes to fulfill his mission must be a man of one idea, that is of one great mastering purpose overshadowing all his aims and controlling his entire life. Blessed is the man who has found his work.

the state of constant building and rebuilding. Your thoughts constantly mold it according to their nature.

Of course any single thought does not produce very much of an effect and your thoughts do not have a directly specific effect to any great degree. However, you may be sure that if you picture an ideal of bodily form or appearance and hold steadfastly to this through the necessary weeks, months, and years, conscious of your power over the blood stream and the organs through which you regulate the condition of the blood, you can in time make the body what you will.

You are master of your body and of all the tools of life. You control every organ and you can build and rebuild your body by your ideals quite as well as by your memories and convictions.

One of the illustrations of the plasticity of the body of the living tissue which strongly appeals to the student is found in the formation of new blood vessels in granulation tissue where healing is taking place. New blood vessels will form in the masses of new cells so that they have a rich blood supply from the very beginning. That intelligent power which makes new blood vessels certainly is capable of cleansing and healing other tissues already organized. We must learn to have more faith in the power of our bodies to get well when they fall sick. We must learn to believe in and love them more.

Learn to know something about your body and to respect and love it. Too often you hate your body or despise it for some fault which you may have inflicted upon it by foolish or wrong thinking. You only perpetuate the fault by recognizing it and allowing the thought of it to dominate you. Picture instead the ideal and steadfastly hold to that ideal.

If I take in my hand a lump of clay and begin to shape it to represent my thought I can give a rough outline in a

little while but in order to make it show exactly what I think I must work patiently for long hours. I must have faith enough in my vision and in my ability to express my vision to work with apparently no results for long periods. When I do work faithfully I can always be sure of final success. This is true of your body. It is more plastic than clay and so vitally subject to your thought that you can be sure that if you hold steadfast to your vision of the body you desire and work intelligently and persistently you can certainly expect some day that the picture you have lovingly cherished and faithfully nurtured will be visible to all.



PRACTICAL PSYCHOLOGY






