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THE LAW OF ATTRACTION

In the realm of physics, it is a truism that "unlike attract while likes repel." This is the significant aspect of anything which is electrical and whatever is true in physics is likewise true in metaphysics. The same law runs through both and has no limits to the field of its operation.

If one could see an ordinary bar of steel microscopically and observe the molecular content, it would be noticed that without external magnetism the molecules are not arranged in order, in series, or in systems, for the reason that the magnetic currents rise within and are contained within. Under magnetism, the molecules rearrange themselves in straight lines with all north ends pointing toward the north polarity. This is by reason of the application of external magnetism.

While it is impossible to see molecules thus operating within a steel bar, the fact that such movement takes place can be proven by placing iron or steel filings on a sheet of paper and putting a magnet under the paper. The orderly manner in which the filings arrange themselves symmetrically under complete magnetism can then be observed. It will be discovered that the magnetic lines complete their independent circuits without cross cutting or merging into each other.

You should understand that electricity in motion produces magnetism and that electricity is the agent of magnetism. It cannot be touched, tasted, seen, or handled. It is an invisible force everywhere present but only known by its manifestations.

Electricity is produced within the human body, which is a perfect electrical plant. The food we eat, the water we drink, and the air we breathe constitute the fuel used in charging the battery - the solar plexus.

The nervous system known as the sympathetic is the medium by which the whole body is charged with magnetism. During sleep, when the electrical charge is dispelled very slowly, the body is renewed, the battery recharged, and the vital forces replenished. The process of sleep is, therefore, essential and is in consonance with the whole process of human life in that it simulates the long period of rest (sleep) in which the soul reposes in the interim prior to each of its successive advents.

If we bring two magnets into play with the same group of filings, a different action takes place. Putting the North ends parallel and one-half inch apart, the arrangement becomes an entirely different matter. There is a circulatory movement, each line passing from magnet to magnet. By placing the North end of the one magnet next to the South end of the other, the filings immediately cease motion and all become united in one. They group and cling in clusters and the arrangement will be found to be the same as with one magnet for the twain have become one.

In the human family the male is positive, or electrical, and represents current, energy and force, while the female represents resistance, capacity, and power. The attitude of the male is active and that of the female is passive.

When one enters the presence of the opposite sex, a current is at once generated, like in the bar of steel which changes its character under magnetism, and by the process of induction electrical currents are transferred from the one to the other. Immediately the one becomes charged electrically and the other magnetized. When all the conditions which make the one the perfect complement to the other are present, the probability of marriage follows.

THE PERFECT COMPLEMENT

The moment all the conditions are recognized as present, that moment the perfect complement is found. The experience is a thrill, a sensory tingle over the entire sympathetic system, polarizing in the solar plexus, acting upon the heart, and stimulating the cerebellum. The cerebellum, being the seat of the subjective mind, perceives subjectively every factor present in the body, mind, and spiritual being of its opposite. There is immediately set up through this cerebellum an electrical action stimulating the cerebrum to thought. In the one is the active intent to possess and in the other a corresponding intent to be possessed.

The perfect complement seldom satisfies the head but it satisfies the heart - not, of course, the literal heart, but the cerebellum used as a figure of speech for subconscious mind. This is the Biblical heart. "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he."

OPPOSITES IN CHARACTERISTICS

The perfect complement, therefore, to the intellectual man would not be an over intellectual woman. Cases of high intellect in both parties to a marriage are rarely satisfactory. No woman wants to be admired by her husband (nearly all women want to be admired by other men) for her mental qualities. She wants to be adored as having what the husband does not possess.

It is due to this law of attraction of opposites that dark men love blondes while light colored men are merely entranced by them. The small man seeks a larger woman and many weak women love the "cave man."

An aggressive man should never marry an aggressive woman for there are too many bricks, pots, and pans still left to be thrown and too many broom handles and rolling pins ready for other uses than sweeping and rolling out dough.

A thrifty woman should refrain from marrying a miser. Children from this parentage will have slender allowances and wear too many cast-off clothes.

Persons given to loquacity should avoid marrying an over-talkative woman. The open mouth, the blabbing tongue, and the nosey gossip, should have no open ear to listen to their pettiness, be it man or woman.

The highly nervous should marry the phlegmatic and no woman with a sharp tongue and a bad temper should marry at all. "A tart temper seldom mellows with age, and a sharp tongue is the only edged tool that grows keener with constant use."

TOO WIDE VARIATIONS

However, it is inadvisable to go too far in opposite directions. It would be a calamity for a very deep thinker to marry an equally deep thinker, but it would be a greater calamity for one of this type to marry an ignoramus.

An Aryan inter-marriage with a Negro can bring but little joy to the parents and none to the hybrid children who are neither black nor white.

An over-aggressive man would prove too great a contrast to a timid, retiring, gentle, little lady.

A thrifty woman would be deprived of all that her economical soul craves if united to a spendthrift.

Tolerance cannot be unequally yoked to tyranny. Nor should sympathy, faith, hope, and veneration be daily associated with a hard, unbelieving and irreligious mate.

THE DETERMINING FACTOR

The determining factor is the "heart" and the "head" in a joint union. In the magnetism that is passing from person to person is an embodiment of all the virtues - naturalness, purity, justice, courage, wisdom, truthfulness,

beauty, and grace. There are all the emotions - joy, peace, sympathy, fervor, hope, faith, and love. All the triumph, aspiration, ambition, success, achievement, and victory are there. All these, in such degree as present in any individual, are at once registered in the subconscious self. Over the wireless currents of electricity, they travel to magnetize the receptive, plastic medium of that inner self.

The question then occurs, "Are we conscious of these impressions?" We are not. The senses do not contact intangible substantialities. And these impressions constituting, in the aggregate, LOVE are not able to touch, taste, smell, see, or hear LOVE. The recognition of the degree of the virtues, the emotions, the achievements of each party in any contact is immediately recorded in the subconscious mind. The only way to become conscious of this degree is through the operation of the sense of CLAIRVOYANCE. This is not difficult and the student should recall what has been said heretofore regarding its cultivation.

The law of attraction brings personalities together. The intuitive self reveals them.

READING CHARACTER

Nature works in a uniform way throughout all her varied manifestations. There must be an outside to every inside, and the outside will ever be a true representation of the inside. This we found to be the case in the process of creation. Thoughts held in the mind of God externalized as a universe. The universe is an exact picture of God's ideas. If we could read this picture aright, we would know God.

Nowhere is this rule more plainly in evidence than in the physical self and it is possible to read the character of two individuals contemplating marriage to uncover the characteristics which form the basis of a happy wedded life. There is a science of character, exact to the degree of the

individual's knowledge of its principles. It, therefore, behooves the thoughtful who are unable to intuitively recognize all the factors known to the subjective self to have an analysis made.

THE LAW OF ATTRACTION IN HUMAN AFFAIRS

The following illustration shows what the power of this law is in business: A young man wants to operate a store. He first centers his thought on a desirable location. Now, by the operation of the above described process, his picture of desire at once starts an electrical current operating in lines, each of which follows an unbroken course to such places as fulfil his concept of location. These magnetized areas in turn become current acting over very large circles. A knowledge of all this is in the subjective mind of the youth but of that fact he may be unaware. Yet he is impelled by that inner prompter to read a certain "ad" at a certain time and click, presto it is the answer to his desire. Or, he may be impelled to drive down a street he has hitherto not traveled and there in a prominent position he finds his location. Or any one of a dozen different lines of electrical discharges and receptions may take place. The significant thing is that he recognizes the location when he sees it. And see it he will, as a young man whose name is withheld did.

Next comes the matter of fixtures, and the same course is followed. Mental action, the attractive power of thought generating the currents to answer the need, is put into motion. Then display, etc., are considered in their order.

Finally he operates to attract his customers. "Come hither" thought

is put into the current and the people who vibrate to his consciousness begin to arrive. Each, in turn, now becomes new centers of electrical action. This youth, being a wise one, looking squarely in the eyes of each one of his buying clients, now thinks, "I like this place and I will tell these friends subconsciously to trade here." Soon the whole neighborhood patronizes his store and becomes his happy and satisfied customers.

Now, although this youth is wise, he is not wise enough. His business grows so fast that he needs help. So he hires another young man to work for him. This starts a new stream of consciousness in operation. Unexpressed, but active in the mind of the assistant is the idea, "I am working for \$40 a week and that's all I'm interested in."

The proprietor now has something between himself and his public. His consciousness is split for he finds currents must be generated around his assistant.

He resorts to advertising around his assistant and his store becomes merely "A store," not "The store,"

Had he employed a female helper with a receptive mind, the currents would have been accentuated rather than cut off.

The deductions are obvious:

1. The Law of Attraction cannot operate through a negative medium.
2. As unlikes attract and likes repel, dangers of negative and harmful emotions may create an atmosphere repelling customers.
3. The combined positive and negative produce joint attractive forces and business is fostered thereby.

It is apparent, therefore, the constant enlargement of the business will tend to make it become less and less personal.

Continued advertising must become an adjunct to the personal equation

and the assistants fairly evenly balanced as to sex.

THE LAW OF ATTRACTION FOR HEALTH

We will not go into the details of healing as that subject will be handled in the several lessons on the healing art. At the present moment, it is sufficient to say that when we can be wholly harmonious in thought, word, and deed, health is attracted for the conditions for maintaining life, power, and vigor are right. Diseased thoughts attract disease as a magnet attracts the iron filings.
