The Second will be a defect of the San on June the 21 day, at eight a Clock at Night in ten degrees of Cancer; but will fearcely be visible to us, because the Sun is just Setting; pefides it will be but a very inconsiderable and finall Eclipse

in it self.

The Third and Last, will be an Eclipse of the Moon, on Nevember the thirtieth day, about eleven a Clock at Night. It will be a Visible, Total, and Central Eclipse, and admirably well worthy of the Industrious Astronomers, Observation. This Defect is Celebrated in ninteen degrees of the Twins or the Colistial Gemini, and both Luminaries are in exact Conjunction of the two Nodes. The Light eclipsed, is with the North Node, and therefore to these Northern Nations will this defect be of most concern.




