Power of Cardinal Signs; you may be further inform'd in my Astrological Discourse, entituled *Cardines Cæli*.

Three things are principally observable in this Scheme.

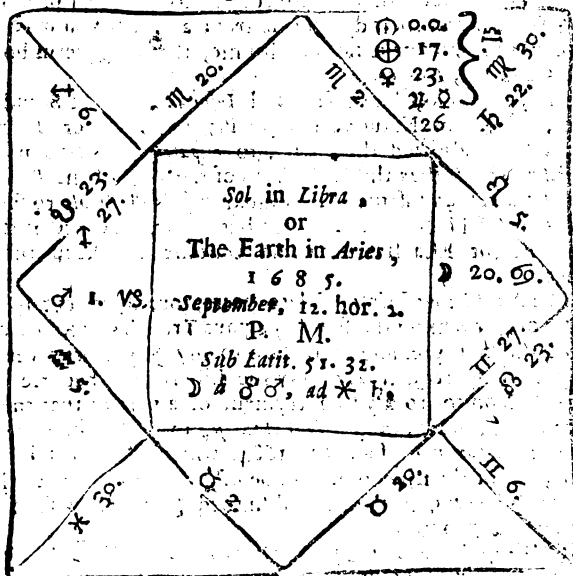
(1.) ♀ Lady of the Horoscope in ♂; ♀ in ✕ in the 8<sup>th</sup> house. Cardan says, *Nunquam junguntur in bono*. They are never united for good. The reason is plain. ♀ signifies the soul or desire of mankind, and ♀ denotes the Temptations, Delights and Pleasures of the World. And when the Soul shall be set upon the vanity of things below, and take delight in the Syrene Songs of Transient and Fading Felicities, It is then become opposite to God, and every thing that is good. Surteits, Debaucheries, Leud and Lascivious Courses bring Epidemical Sickness, or a fear of Mortality among us: ♀ is Lady of the 8<sup>th</sup> house. as well as of the Horoscope. *Morbos odimus sed accerrissimus*. We hate Diseases, and yet pull them on us. (2.) The ☐ of ♄ and ♂, it is an angry lasting ☐, and no less then three times particularly repeated. Now ♄ in ♄, causes cold and dry Diseases proceeding from Melancholly mixt with tough Phlegm, causing Obstructions and Indigestions in the Stomach, heaviness of the heart, windiness in the Guts and Bowels, &c. Colicks, Pains in the Head. ♂ in ♂, Infects the Blood, engenders Red cholera, hot and dry, procuring Fevers, Plague, Pestilence, &c. but ♂ is not only in ☐ ♄, but of ♀; and ♀, as here placed too, engenders cold, stinking, thick, tough flegme; occasioning Indigestion, Rottensness of Liver, Dropsies, Impostumes, Coughs, &c. I fear a sickly year in earnest. (3.) The Opposition of ☉ and ☿ which may shew an unhappy, stubborn spirit in the People against Authority, for which they will meet with just reward. The ☿ is in the twelfth. But here I meet with something of noble signification that will mitigate the murmurs of the ☿ ☿ ☿. And that is —

Jupiter, Lord of the Medium Cæli by exaltation, and in reception with ♀, Lady of the Horoscope, seems to render Princes and Magistrates (those Images of the true Divine wife, powerful and gracious in the Eyes of their Subjects, and procuring obedience from them. Nay, I can nearly aver, that even many

Many of the late *Associators* and *Appendixes* to the late *horrible Conspiracy*, will now come to see their errors, and repent, and probably endeavour to make some *Amends* for their former *turbulent unquiet behaviour*.

And here give me leave to mind the world of an excellent passage wrote by a most *Learned Loyal Pen*, in a discourse entitled, *Mr. Sydneys Dying Paper, condemned to live, &c.* p. 25. *What our Saviour said unto the Jews—Many good works have I shewn you from my Father; for which of these works do you stone me? The like may our merciful King apply to his perversish and stubborn Subjects—Many acts of Grace have I passed in favour of you; for which of these do you conspire against me? For the truth is, He hath stript himself so much of his Prerogative, That a more sober Generation may become so wise and dutiful, as to think of some act of Resumption needful to support the Government.* And so I come to consider of —

The Ingress of ☉ into ♎.



Here are no less then *six Planets in Cardinal Signs* continuing the activity of the Year, which the Spring began, the ☉ and ♂ are in Hostile ☐ of each other; ♂ vitiates the Ascendant corporally. *Averte oculos a Figura* (saith Almanzor,) *in qua ♂ fuerit in Angulo.* ♂ is Lord of the Horoscope (almost) by Exaltation, and the ☉ Lord of the 8th. The ♃ also is in ☌ of Melancholly ♄ posited in the eight house. *A very sickly crasse Autumn and Winter,* is to be feared; Together with many Hot-headed rash Actions, and Contrivances, which (we doubt) may be brewing about these times. The *Satellitium* of Planets in the ninth house, denotes some *People or Sects of Men* pretending to Religion, Piety, &c. Very active and busie to oppose the publick, legal Establishments among us, and slight things Honest and Praise-worthy. ♀, ♁ and ♄ are in ☐ to the tropical ♃ in the seventh Angle: [The ninth and the seventh are ingaged.] Many men will pretend *Conscience*, when their design is *Interest*; and that you may be sure it is so, pray take notice with me, that ♀ governs both the 9 and 7th Angles.

I hope no more *Narratives and Informations of a Scandalous, venomous Nature*, nor yet *Poysonous Vosses or Addresses*, will be allowed the *Press*, to bespatter the Honour of Majesty, and Distain the Noble Names of the *Peers of the Realm*, and Intoxicate an Insatuated, unthinking Sort of *People* to such a degree of Madness, as nothing but the Destruction of the Government Established, could content and keep them quiet.

The *Mischivous Prints* of late years, ought to put us in mind of preventing the like Egregious Troubles. And, altho I will not presume to Dictate to my Superiors; yet I may modestly request and pray the Liberty, to become an humble Monitor to my Countrymen, of a part of that most excellent Prudent, and Loyal *Address*, made by the *Grand-Jury of Southwark*, June 27. 1684. which if pursued in other parts of the Kingdom, will be of great Advantage to the Peace and Tranquillity of this disturbed (but otherwise most happy) Kingdom.

It is this. *Considering the constant method of turbulent Spirits, as well in Printed Libels, as written News-Letters, &c. to Re- and Slander the King and Church, to Calumniate His Maj- sties*

ties Ministers of State and Justice, and all his Loyal Subjects, &c. They Present it as a necessity of fixing some mark of Infamy, upon all Scandalous and Seditious Books, Pamphlets, and Papers, &c. to prevent the Transmitting of so many Honourable Names with Infamy to Posterity.

A most useful, Worthy and Loyal Presentment, I say it is, very proper to be followed by all other Burroughs and Corporations in England.

Secondly, *Of the Eclipses which happen this Year*  
1685.

**T**HE Inhabitants of this Terrene Star will in this Year 1685. be three times subject to Luminarian Obscurities, viz. Once the Sun, the greater Light, and Twice the Moon, the lesser, will be Eclipsed from their sight.

And the First of these will be of the Moon, on June the sixth day, about our six a Clock at Night, in 26 degrees of the Cœlestial Sagitary, or Archer: It will be invisible to us in England, by reason of the Moons being below the Eastern Horizon at the time thereof with us.

The Second will be a defect of the Sun on June the 21 day, at eight a Clock at Night in ten degrees of Cancer; but will scarcely be visible to us, because the Sun is just Setting; besides it will be but a very inconsiderable and small Eclipse in it self.

The Third and Last, will be an Eclipse of the Moon, on November the thirtieth day, about eleven a Clock at Night. It will be a Visible, Total, and Central Eclipse, and admirably well worthy of the Industrious Astronomers Observation. This Defect is Celebrated in nineteen degrees of the Twins or the Cœlestial Gemini, and both Luminaries are in exact Conjunction of the two Nodes. The Light eclipsed, is with the North Node, and therefore to these Northern Nations will this defect be of most concern.

The Figure thus.



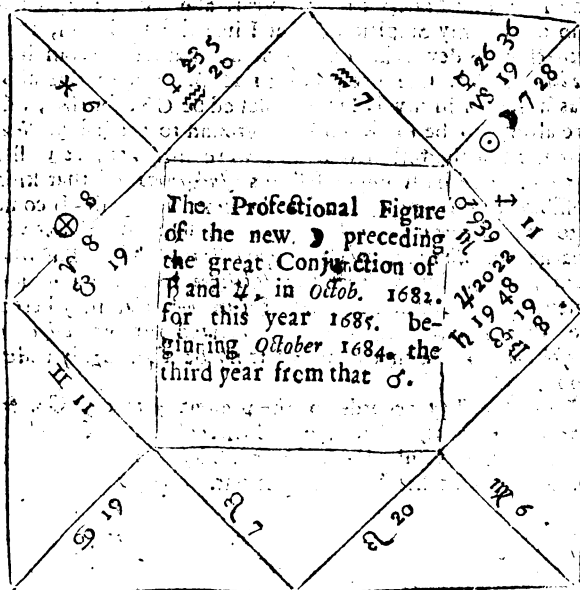
The nimble ☿ opposes the Moon in this condition, and fallen Saturn casts an envious Quadrant to him, and unto both the Luminaries also: Some People may be Mad under a Saint Andrews, as well as at a Midsummers Moon. And since the Learned Author of *Cometomantia* hath allowed us, That Eclipses are signs of Future things, and Productive of considerable Events, (and surely, this is as much as any Astrologer need to desire of him); if they be Productive, then surely are they in some sense Causes as well as Signs: For if they are Productive, they want not Power to produce the Actions or Events they are Productive of. Nay, the same Author affirms further, p. 191. *Cometom.* That the sober and well order'd Actions of Mans life, receive Lunar Impressions. And in p. 190. The Moon works upon the Bodies and Minds of Men. This is a Favour Gassendus would never afford us. It is a Truth, and we thank the Learned Author for his allowing it to be such.



Now let Astrologers, *Proclus*, *Guiffus*, and the rest, tell us what they mean. I cannot stand here to relate what they say. But this I must tell you, that in these Northern Countries, I like not Eclipses in *Gemini*. God sends these Monitors on purpose to warn us to amend our sinful Lives, to reform the Animosities that are too rise among us; which if we do not take notice of, we shall justly incur such Judgments and Punishments they naturally menace us withal, and become deservedly Subjects to the Wrath and Fury of an Angry and Incensed Deity.

Thirdly, Something further touching the late great triple  $\odot$  of  $\text{h}$  and  $\text{z}$  in  $\text{Q}$ .

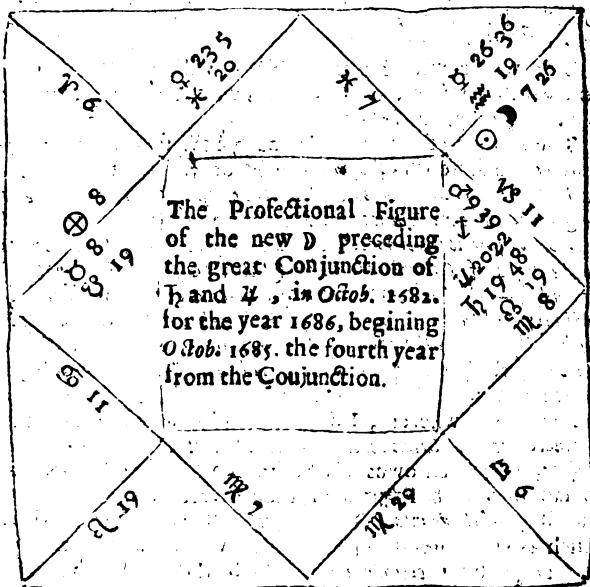
Finding the subject of this  $\odot$  so various, so intricate, and not so easie to be judged, as talked of, I have thought fit to insert the profecional Figure of the New  $\text{m}$  preceding it; which is as follows for this Year.



This Projection is in \* to the New Moon, preceding the Conjunction of  $\hbar$  and  $\mathcal{U}$ . And herein you may observe several strange and stupendious returns of the Planets. (1.) The swifling Planet  $\mathcal{Z}$  return'd to the opposite places of  $\hbar$  and  $\mathcal{U}$ , intimating sundry smooth tongued Treacheries from abroad, as well as at home. Ambassadors and Statesmen can guild the Pills they give, as well as Apothecaries. (2.) The  $\odot$  and  $\mathcal{D}$ , are come to the twelfth Angle, Irritating divers Fears, Jealousies, and Suspitions, not alwaies without Ground. Captivities, Incarcerations of many. (3.)  $\sigma$  is returned ad loc.  $\odot$  &  $\mathcal{D}$ , Plots, Contrivances, Accusations, and Impeachments, with their usual Consequences. (4.)  $\hbar$  and  $\mathcal{U}$ , the Planets concern'd, are returned to the eighth Angle, whereby a Mortality is menaced.

And here give me leave to tell you, That tho I intimated my Fears of a Pestilence the last year, and gave some Reasons also of that my Suspition; Yet I likewise told you, that I expected no devouring one then, but rather of your lesser Pestilences, &c. like unto that in 1636. But in this also I was mistaken in my Judgment. Blessed be God for that, I desire always to be so, when I see ground to predict ill News. But most of the rest that wrote, were mistaken, as well as my self. God hath suspended his Judgments of that kind, possibly to this, or it may be the next Year, till  $\hbar$  comes into  $\mathcal{M}$ , or toward the latter part of  $\mathcal{M}$ , which some very Learned in Astrology, account Equinoctial with it. But when hath it been known that the Pestilence hath been so long absent? The Learned Author of *Cometomantia*, may hereby see that Astrology is not yet arrived at its height of Perfection, or else that it is not truly or thoroughly understood.

This Projection accords to the present year of 1685. for that it reaches almost to the end thereof. But if it please them not so to think. let them consider also the Projection following, and take that to help it out.



To shew those that are diffident of the Sarry Influences, that the great Conjunctions are not insignificant, Let them be pleased to call to mind what a stupendious year 1683. proved. (1.) The great inroad of the Turks into Christendom; their spoiling more then 3000 Towns, and carrying away Captive 200000 Christians. Vienna besieged, and the Turk at last totally routed there, and beaten again at Barkan, and sundry other places; several of their Bassa's strangled. (2.) The King of Portugal dies, and soon after the Queen Regent. London loseth its Charter, and most Cities and Corporations surrender theirs. (3.) The Presbyterian Conspiracy fully discovered, and many executed for it, and confess, but not repent of it: Many of them fly beyond Sea, to prove their guilt. (4.) An Earthquake in September, and another in October, felt in Oxford, Gloucestershire, Staffordshire, Derbyshire, Cheshire. (5.) An unparalleled Frost, at least in our Age. (6.) The

French and Spaniards engaged in a War. (7.) The Noble Lord of Dartmouth, order'd with a Glorious Fleet to demolish Tangier in Africk, &c.

And who considering these things, will deny an Influence to great Conjunctions, or refuse to own 1683 for a remarkable and prodigious Year?

The Author of *Cometomania*, page 198. seems to impugn, and at the same time, affirm the  $\odot$  of  $\text{h}$ , 4. to be Influential. Thus ——— It is certain that Aspects, &c. may signify in general, Future Events; yet contain nothing in their own Nature boding or Unfortunate. Nor are they designed (as Comets) to be signs of Calamities. For (saith he) I build upon this ground ——— That extraordinary Events are not foresignified by ordinary and natural Accidents. But such is the  $\odot$  of  $\text{h}$ , 2, so much talked of by the common Prognosticators, &c. These Planets fall into such Figures of themselves, and are the natural shiftings of the Stars, &c.

For answer whereto, I demand of him, why are not such Conjunctions as Significant and Productive also, of Future Events, as himself owns Eclipses to be? They are known also to fall into such Figures of themselves, as well as these. But if (as He grants) They signify Future Events; 'tis as much as we contend or plead for. We know that the Planets move by a certain Law, which they cannot but Obey; but yet they may be foreboding for all that. The  $\text{J}$  in  $\odot$  of  $\odot$ , from Angles, comes in a natural course of order; but what then? I say, He that is born under it, and lives to Maturity, will find cold comfort from the Popularity, or Multitude. Also,  $\text{h}$  in  $\odot$ , in  $\square$  of  $\odot$ , comes in a natural way, But Gassendus found its ill Effects. The position of  $\text{h}$  in  $\odot$ , on the Horoscope in  $\odot$ , comes in a natural way; but the late Earl of Shaftsbury carried the Influence thereof even in his very Countenance, and in his Side, which had the Tap in it, to his Grave, which he at last found in a timorous wilful Banishment.

It is not sufficient to say, that extraordinary Events cannot be signified by ordinary Accidents. For it is a Question whether there be any thing extraordinary in it self, altho it seem so to us. *Nihil est Novum sub Sole*. There is nothing new, or extraordinary under the Sun. And Comets themselves, as well

all as Planetary Conjunctions, &c. have a certain Law to  
 obey. As Monsieur Auzont, and many of our Vertuosi con-  
 sently ayow.

Fourthly, Of the Majestick, stately, and tedious Transf  
 of ♄ through ♎ this year.

That which is next to be minded, is the unusual and ted-  
 ious Transf of ♄ through the Cœlestial Sagittary this  
 year, 1685. A Transf as it is not common or frequent, so  
 it is of no ordinary or minute Signification. It levels its  
 Arrows at the great Twin-City, and at all Persons and Places  
 subject to II and ♎, and probably III and ♋ too; for some  
 Astrologers do not (as I conceive) unjustly, or without Rea-  
 son, contend for its concern thorough the whole Quadrang-  
 le, as in Eclipses.

Shall I give you a short account of the like perambulations  
 of this turbulent Planet? (Pardon the word, for so he is ge-  
 nerally esteem'd, tho there be others as violent and impe-  
 rious as he) To begin then.

You must know, that it is not common for ♄ to be much  
 above six weeks in a Sign, and for him now to be more than  
 so many months, is somewhat more than ordinary, tho it be  
 not more than natural. For Nature hath its Wonders, (at least  
 such they seem to us) even in the very Motions of the Planets,  
 as well as in their Effects, or in the Apparition of Comets, new  
 Stars, &c. wonderful are all Gods Works!

Nor doth this Motion of ♄ so long together in a Sign,  
 come to pass in any just or equal and proportional number of  
 Years; which possibly hath been the reason, why Astronomers  
 have been so crucified in finding his true place.

Sometimes he falls into the like Figure of Motion in 15  
 Years time. As from 1512. to 1527. and from 1670. to  
 this Year 1685. Sometimes again in 32 years time. As  
 from 1527 to 1559, and from 1606 to 1638, and then to 1670.  
 Sometimes again in 47 years, as from 1559 to 1606, to  
 mention no more.

One might, even from this his Anomalous motion, conclude  
 an Irregularity and Violence in his Nature and Effects. I wish  
 the Heavens were as liberally Studied, as they are contended  
 against.

against; for then the Enemies to *Astrology*, like the *Adversaries* to Government, would see their Error, and Repent. And it is as possible for men to prove Non-conformists and Dissenters to the King of Heaven, as to his Vicegerent on Earth. I dare aver the Crime Synonymous.

For your better satisfaction herein, take this short Septenary Table of *Mars* his unequal motion through the Sign *Sagittary*.

It is very observable, that  $\♂$  begins this his Stupendjous Motion, somewhat near the *Vernal Equinox*, and performs his admired *Perambulation* between that and the *Autumnal Equinox*. It is a point I hope to Study more fully, if God shall give me leave. And also some of the tedious Transits of *Venus* and *Mercury* too. For they are guilty of Excesses in this kind, as well as *Mars*; and are as much worthy to be noted.

In the mean time I could wish some Industrious Son of *Minerva*, would take the pains to Collect into a Table the Commencement of all Wars, Sieges, Fires, Sacking of Cities, Famous Battels, and all other remarkable Violences, and gratifie the enquiring World with a sight thereof; that we might be the better enabled thereby to discover, not only the common heats of  $\♂$ , but all his various and astonishing Influences.

Thus much for this Year 1685. *Laus Deo.*
