One of the most magnificent books on the Art-Monuments of Spain, and probably superior to any other in the accuracy and learning of its author. The series of illustrations was selected from works of art which were excellent by reason of their historical character or the beauty of their execution. Only 275 copies were printed, of which about 150 were absorbed by subscribers amongst the aristocracy of Spain. The book may therefore be regarded as virtually unpublished, and as likely before long, in consequence of its intrinsic worth and the short supply of copies, to become a costly rarity.

"His great work, the 'Iconografía Española,' published in 1853 and 1864, contains seventy-four 'portraits, statues, and mausoleums,' dating 'from the eleventh to the seventeenth centuries.' Not only the original drawings, but the text in Spanish and French, were his own work. Amongst the gems of this collection may be named the bas-reliefs of Charles V and his Empress, attributed by Cean Bermudez to Pompeo Leoni, and now in the Museum at Madrid; portraits of Philip II when young, and in his old age; the unhappy Don Carlos, Don Juan de Austria, Philip's wives, and the famous 'one-eyed' Princess of Eboli. That of Hernan Cortés is exquisitely finished. He executed several copies of portraits after Goya, which have never been published, notably that of the famous Andalusian beauty 'La Duquesa de Alva.' The mantilla, maja jacket, short black lace dress, silk stockings, and high-heeled shoes indicate the provincial costume of the 'duchess of the period' to perfection. That of Maria Luisa, the less beautiful and austere wife of Charles III, indicates Goya's character. He seems never to have flattered his sitters, even when nature had been gracious to them. Maria Luisa de Borbon, Duchess of San Fernando, figures in an empire dress, with a head-gear of feathers; and albeit nature had forgotten to favour her, the wayward artist painted her as she lived, plain and dowdy."—*Athenæum*, April 10th, 1880.

| Of these extraordinary productions that which contains the most curious and singular matter is the first; the present copy of it is the best and most rare edition, subsequent ones being so much mutilated as in a great measure to deprive the work of its peculiar character. The second work is of a description little varying from the first, but to describe the precise nature of either, could not with due regard to propriety be done. The third was written in a fit of repentance, and therefore of a very different character from the others. Most of the conclusions reached have followed after the putting on paper of the facts which are their grounds, and the most important theory I have put forward is quite opposed to my former pre-conceptions, quite different from anything I had an idea of in the beginning.</p> <p>"More than a half century ago there came to my knowledge a series of strange occurrences just like those which, a few years afterwards, disturbed the quiet of the village of Hydesville, and which are at this time disturbing the quiet of scientific people the world over. From that time to this I have been an observer of such things and all other phenomena of occult origin. Twenty-five years ago, without having been in the meanwhile able to make anything out of them, I entered on a rather thorough course of reading in mystical literature, ancient and modern, and have continued it ever since. Fifteen years ago, baffled as much as ever, I undertook to write out some results of my observation and study to see how they looked on paper. The German alchemist had ſo thoroughly investigated the properties of this metal, ſcarcely indicated before him, that we find many facts ſtated in his treatiſe which in our own day have been brought forward as modern diſcoveries. In the ſame work Basil Valentine ſpecifies many other chemical preparations of the firſt importance, ſuch as ſpirit of ſalt, or our hydrochloric acid, derived after our own manner from marine ſalt and oil of vitriol (sulphuric acid). - “Mr. Adams must be congratulated on having furnished a valuable contribution towards the ‘History of Human Error.’ After an introductory chapter dealing with the progress of alchemy in Europe, the author divides his work into two books—the first dealing with the English magicians, and the second with witches and witchcraft. We read of the prosecution of witches through the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. The accession of James I gave a great impulse to these mock trials. With the Restoration a more sceptical and more merciful spirit began to prevail. Unfortunately, one of the best men of his day—Sir Matthew Hale—was behind the age in this respect. Strange to say, one of the judges who first took pains to prevent convictions for this fictitious offence was Lord Jeffreys. At the very time (1685) he was engaged on the Bloody Assize in butchering his political opponents he managed to procure

- acquittals of witches (p. 289). This good work was continued by Chief Justice Holt, whose common sense brushed away the tittle-tattle on which these charges of witchcraft were brought. We had thought that the last execution for witchcraft in England took place at Northampton in 1712; but we learn from Mr. Adams that Mary Hicks and her daughter were executed for witchcraft in 1716. It was not till 1736 that the laws against witchcraft were repealed.'—*Academy*, May 10th, 1890.
