- 3. The subscription to the Institute is five shillings per year, payable in advance, except in the case of pupils of the Institute, who are entitled to the first year's membership free of charge.
- 4. Each member is entitled to the following benefits:—Use of Library, Initials of the Institute, and Registration, Financial Assistance in cases of Prosecutions, etc.
- 5. Certificates are granted to members who can give two good references of persons who are able to state that the said member is an earnest student of one of the above-named sciences. A fee of two shillings-and-sixpence must be sent with application.
- 6. Diplomas are granted to members who can reply successfully to a series of questions put by the examiners, through the post or otherwise, to suit the circumstances of the applicants.
