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## REGULATIONS

#### IN REGARD TO APPLICATIONS FOR A GRANT.

- I. This Form of Application must be accompanied by a separate Letter from the Applicant, stating the causes of his (or her) Distress, and any other facts relating to the nature of his (or her) Works or circumstances, which it may be considered desirable to communicate.
- II. No Application for a grant shall be entertained, unless the same shall have been sent in writing to the Secretary, at least seven days previous to a meeting of the General Committee; nor unless accompanied by letters from two or more respectable persons authenticating the merits of the case.
- III. No grant shall be made to any person who does not come under the following description, to be proved in such manner as shall be satisfactory to the General Committee, viz.:—
  - I. Authors of some published work of approved literary merit, and Authors of important contributions to Periodical Literature, who shall be in want or distress: such Authors not having previously received a grant from the Society within a year of the date of the application.
  - 2. Widows, Mothers, Sisters, or Orphans\* of deceased Authors eligible for a grant: such Widows, Mothers, Sisters, or Orphans never having previously received a grant from the Society. In such cases one grant only shall be made.
- IV. Every grant shall be given as a donation towards the removal of the distress of the Applicant, and not as a loan, nor for the completion of any literary work.
- V. The literary claim of every new Applicant shall be affirmed by vote of the General Committee before the question of want or distress shall be considered. The Works upon which the Application is founded must therefore be submitted for examination, and must be delivered to the Secretary at least three weeks before the meeting.

  \* The term "Orphans" is understood to apply to children or unmarried daughters who are left destitute by the recent death of these parent.

The General Committee meet to receive Applications on the Second Wednesday in the months of January, February, March, April, May, June, July, October, November, and December.

By the preceding Regulations, all Applications, Books, and Documents must be delivered on or before the First Wednesday in the month, to the
