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

Again and again we receive suggestions from our readers asking that we comment Editorially on some phase of Spiritualistic practice that does not meet with their complete approval. For instance they may not like the manner in which some group conducts their services, and they want us to comment on the evidences of selfishness, and most of all jealousy, on the part of some Mediums towards others.

We appreciate these suggestions. and sometimes we have just enough of a flash of Psychic ability to see that beneath the request there is the smouldering hope that we will point our comments in such a way that some individual will be lead to believe that they are being criticized.

CHIMES Editors have all the work they can possibly do to care for the tasks of publishing and mailing each month's copies, without meddling in such things that are clearly none of their business.

There is a peculiar quirk in practically everyone, that makes them resent success on the part of other persons. If they cannot equal or surpass then they want to tear down and destroy. We see evidence of this peculiarity everywhere and everyday.

Several years ago the "TOM THUMB GOLF COURSES" became an overnight success, and multiplied like mushrooms. If one seemed to be prospering on one corner, someone else built across the street. It was not very long until they were so thick and close together that people lost interest, and thousands of dollars were lost by those who had allowed avarice to over-balance good judgment.

It is easy for one to judge others by using themselves as the measuring stick. We have always liked the statement credited to the Master Jesus in the Aquarian Gospel, when He said that He wished to experience all the problems and experiences of Earth Life, in order that He should be capable of "judging aright." Unless we know all the details that lead up to a problem, our opinions are bound to be biased, and we are incapable of making a fair and just decision.

Perhaps the reader is wondering just exactly why we are pursuing this line of thought. It all goes back to a book which has been a best seller in England, and which came close to achieving the same position in the U.S.A. This is "The Third Eye," by Tuesday Lobsang Rampa, who writing in the first person, has given the world an autobiography of the lives of Ti-

betian Lamas. The book is fascinating, and having read other accounts of the life of the Tibetian Lamas, and having seen the colored plates printed in The National Geographic, magazine as well as seeing on TV the travelogue of Lowell Thomas, portraying his visit to the land of mystery and fascination, we cannot help but feel that there is much truth and realism in the story as it was presented.

Because the book was such a huge success, (sales of nearly a half million dollars in Great Britain alone) there are those who have endeavored to discredit the author, and who even went so far as to employ private detectives to search into the life of the author. These men came up with the apparent evidence that he is the son of a plumber in Plympton, England. The story of the exposure, well publicized, has caused no end of excitement in England, and has had not a few repercussions here in the United States.

There were detailed accounts of the life of Cyril Henry Hoskins in both the "Psychic News" and "Two Worlds." weekly Spiritualistic publications in London. Briefly it seems that the personality of the man has gone through a complete change. His wife states that he spends a great deal of his time in silent meditation. He has changed his name from Cyril Henry Hoskins to Dr. Kuan-Suo, wears the robes of a Lama, and has adopted the beard and other marks of a venerable old Tibetian

In the book the author states that he was held prisoner by the Japs during part of World War II. and that he underwent many sessions of "Brain Washing." Is it too far fetched to believe that the spirit of the real Lobsang finally left the physical body and took possession of one who was capable of telling his story? Stranger things have been proven in the past!

Regardless of how or what happened, "Third Eye" is fascinating reading, and one can best evaluate its authenticity by reading and studying it for themselves.

We have sort of got a bit sidetracked from our original thought, that success of any sort arouses the instinct of destruction in the hearts and minds of those who are less successful. That so many will seek to tear down and destroy, is proof, that deep seated in their minds they feel they are inferior to those who are making a success, and the re-action to destroy is more or less "instinctive and automatic."

We have, as everyone does, heard

criticism of everything that is a part of living. There is an old saying in military life that when the men stop growling or complaining something is wrong. It is this very criticism that keeps "doers" awake and alert. It is criticism that keeps the "ego" from showing too much, and whether we like it or not it is wise to heed and obey its implications. On the other side one must learn how to separate personal opinion and jealous envy from that which is constructive and correc-

We have no sympathy with those who tear down because they resent success. Neither have we sympathy for those who profess and claim powers and abilities which they do not possess.

We have always loved the couplet "There is so much bad in the best of us, and so much good in the worst of us, that it hardly behoves the rest of us to talk about any of us."

Chapter 2

"Anyone who denies the reality of psychic phenomena without having investigated it thoroughly does not deserve to be called a skeptic; he merely doesn't know."

This is the conclusion of a scientist, J. Gilbert E. Wright, for 35 years a research chemist with General Electric, who first came into contact with Charles P. Steinmetz when the electrical scientist was with that company. Wright reports that he was in communication with the spirits of Steinmetz and Thomas A Edison as early as 1940-41.

Of his own background Wright says:

"I was born in Glasgow, Scotland, January 16, 1883, of Presbyterian stock, at the tail end of the Darwinian revolution. The previous generation believed in God, freedom and immortality. My generation was told by the high priests of science that belief in an after-life was worthy only of illiterates and savages. Life for us had become an ante-chamber of extinction. We came out of nothing and we vanished into nothing.

"Before I was twenty-one I was an out-and-out materialist and atheist. But I was always an empiricist. Like Huxley I wanted to sit down before a fact and regard it reverently. Facts, I saw, were permanent; theories changed. I became a research chemist, and chemical research has since been my sole means of support. My bread and butter depended upon my ability to recognize a fact and have due respect for it."

Wright, now 74, retired at 65 from the General Electric laboratories, and has since devoted most of his time to psychic research, which he began more than 40 years

ago. He continues:

"My conversion came about the hard way. I had to accept the facts eventually or give up being intellectually honest. I know of no scientist, or anyone else, who has remained unconvinced of the reality of psychic phenomena, especially as to spirit communication, after unprejudiced investigation.

"My first job, at 19, was with Joseph Haworth & Co. of Balford, Manchester, England, where I was engaged in research work on the fireproofing of flannelette goods. That job was over in about a year. There was then an interlude of about another year, when I was in Scotland, doing analytical work for the Scottish Cyanide Co. at Leven, Fifeshire. This was the parent company of the now famous American Cyanamid Co. After a year the company closed down.

"For the next ten years I was superintendent of the celluloid thread department of the Edison and Swan United Electric Light Co. and general chemist of the South Benwell plant at Newcastleupon-tyne. I was doing research work on new metallic film which was about to replace the carbon filament then in use, when Dr. Coolidge of the General Electric Co. brought out the tungsten filament lamp. We collapsed.

"For the next 35 years I was in the research laboratories of the General Electric Co. at Schenectady. I got settled there in August of 1913. By the following year I was deep in war work. My smoke screen, with a slight modification, was adopted by the U.S. Navy. I made a signal improvement in spark plugs for airplane engines, and contributed to the first submarine detection device.


"During the peace years, socalled, that followed World War I I pioneered in the field of plastics. I was also engaged in the development of Glyptol, which has been called the greatest contribution to the paint industry in the last halfcentury. I have a patent for making artificial silk from one of the Vinyl resins. My latter work was with zilicone resins, rubbers, and 'bouncing putty'."

Wright's conversion to belief in the continuity of life after physical death, and communication between this life and the next, was a slow process. His scientific mind at first "rejected the spiritual explanation. He now says:

"The alleged physical phenomena (materialization of spirits as living bodies), simply could not be, I felt, despite the testimony of such a scientist as Sir William Crookes. As a student of physical science I could not accept the accounts of the materialization of 'Katy King.' I was sure something was wrong somewhere.

"I was well into my fifties before I completely changed my mind. The person who changed it for me was the famous medium "Margery' Crandon of Boston. After one sitting with Margery I capitulated.

"There were only five of us in the group. The room was lit by a powerful red light of much more candlepower than one would dare use in a photographic dark room. Margery was entranced opposite me. Her features were clearly outlined, and I could observe that

they were immobile. Under these conditions Walter, her late brother and spirit control, spoke and whistled behind her. A strong white light was then turned on, and for at least ten seconds Walter spoke, mainly in small talk, and moved about behind his sister Margery.

"I returned across Boston Common to my hotel that night in a state of exaltation."

Wright's experience was not unlike those of most skeptics convinced of psychic phenomena for

the first time. The contents of the messages in themselves are usually of little importance and relate mainly to personal matters.

Many so-called trivial messages, concerning personal relationships, are not trivial to the recipients, and are such as are contained in family letters between the living.

Most families have ghost stories of their own which they believe; yet more than a hundred million Americans, to put it conservatively, have never sought contact with relatives and friends in the spirit world-such contact as is available to anyone who cares to investigate spirit communication for himself. Some who have tried to make such contacts have become discouraged because they have not been successful the first time, or have attended seances operated by inferior or unlicensed mediums. It is best for the beginner to look for an authentic medium connected with a chartered Spiritualist church.

Wright's first contacts with the spirit voices of Edison and Steinmetz were exploratory, sometimes vague, and unlike the clearly spoken messages recently received and reported in the previous article.

"In the summer of 1940." says Wright, "at Lake Hopatcong, N. J., the late Frank Decker's Spiritualist summer camp). Edison was described by a clairvoyant as standing beside me. I could not believe it. I had seen Edison in this life, knew some of his associates, but had never spoken to the man him-

"The following summer, at Chesterfield, Ind., one of Clifford Bias' spirit guides said that I was to work on an invention to make possible communication with the spirit world without recourse to a living medium."

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Chapter 9

ED NOTE: The material contained in this month's lesson, and in that of the following month, is of such a nature that the student would do well to study it closely. It will serve a useful purpose in learning to distinguish spirits of the various planes, for spirits must show their true colors when requested to do so in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Thus a masquerading spirit can be detected, and creditlence given to those who prove worthy.

COLOR VIBRATION OF THE PLANES

The color vibrations of the planes are as follows:

Plane		Color
I		Brown
II	-	Purple
111		Red
IV		Green
Λ.		Blue
VI		Yellow
VII		Violet

The subdivisions of each plane are of the same color as the main planes. The shade of the color of the plane and of the subdivisions grow lighter as the degree of the plane advances. For illustration take the plane of III which is red.

- 3:I-Brown blended with red.
- 3:II-Purple blended with red.
- 3:III-Red blended with red giving a decided red.

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- pink.
- 3:V Blue blended with pink.
- 3:VI Yellow blended with a light pink.
- 3:VII Violet blended with a delicate pink.

When the third subdivision of a plane is reached, as 7:7:IV, and the spirit is ready to progress into the next plane, (in this case V) the shade of color becomes so light that it is frequently mistaken for white. On the lower planes up to 5:5:III this lightening of the shade causes the spirit to appear clothed in gray; on the planes above, the gray gradually becomes lighter until it appears to be white. The pure white is seen only with spirits who have advanced to 5:5:V or higher,

By observing the color of the garment that the spirit is wearing one is enabled to tell from which plane the spirit comes and thus know immediately what to expect from the spirit. The predominating color of the garment denotes the main plane; the secondary color the division of the plane. Remember that the garment is never of one color; there are always two or more colors. For example, the medium will see a spirit with a beautiful red gown trimmed with purple. This would indicate that the spirit was from the plane of 2 (purple) :III (red). From this information the medium would immediately know that the spirit was a doctor on the plane of III and that he would use much force in his healing. Again, the spirit seen may be dressed in a yellowish green robe; this would indicate that the spirit was from the plane of 6 (yellow): IV (green) and had come to present a devotional religion. Sometimes it becomes necessary to resolve the color of the garment into its component colors, for example, a spirit clothed in orange. This, when resolved into its component colors, would be yellow blended with red; or 6 (yellow):III (red), a religious teacher of an emotional religion. However, all spirits do not come in their colors. For when they desire to give a

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3:IV Green blended with deep message they must appear as they were clothed on earth in order to be recognized. But all "guides," "controls," teachers, etc., appear in the color of their planes for they are produced by the colors of their auras. Those that show themselves garbed as they were on earth can only do so for a short time for their aura will force its way through any outer covering that the spirit may assume. By a little practice the student will be enabled to tell instantly from what plane the spirit comes and hence, know his capabilities and limitations. If, for no other reason than the ability to distinguish the spirits who come to communicate with him, the student would be well repaid for the time spent in the study of the spiritual planes.

In taking up the study of the spiritual planes, the student should always bear in mind the fact that an individual or spirit may manifest on many planes during the course of a single day. An individual or spirit ascends or descends through these planes and their subdivisions, as there is various work to do. For instance, whenever there is work to be done that requires physical exertion the individual steps to the plane of 3 (Force and Power); when healing is to be performed, to the plane of 2 (Creative); when a prayer is to be offered, to the plane of 6 (Soul)

Nearly all people and spirits live their lives on one main plane and merely step to its various subdivisions as the occasion requires. The vast majority of people live on the plane of III (Force and Power); a small portion of the plane of IV (Psychic or Sensitive); and a few on the plane of V (Mental). The plane of 5:V is the highest that a mortal can touch and still remain in the physical body. A person traveling on the astral can reach as high as 2:VI.

THE PLANE OF BEING 1 : I

Being of Being

In the first plane, we deal with what relates to your body, your being on the plane in which you dwell right now, and on which you all must manifest. It is, in comparison, the plane of the little child that lives but does no thinking of its own; the machinery of its little body moves on because it cannot help it. On this plane, the power that manifests itself governs the

inner consciousness. It acts independently of the objective will; it acts independently of your mind-we call this subconscious mindinvoluntary action. We know the action takes place, for instance, the beating of the heart, breathing, the digestion, and functions of the nervous system; we give all this no mental thought; it is independent of your volition. The first plane then, belongs to the realm of the body exclusively, and pertains wholly to the upbuilding and upkeeping of your physical bodies.

The "controls" from this plane

look after the physical health of the medium. No messages are giv-

The spirits on this plane are clothed in brownish gray.

2 : 1Creative of Being HEALING

Healing means the harmonizing of body with spirit; it means a gradual awakening of the mental forces of the individual. On this plane all things are created and brought into activity. When we turn the creative force of this plane into healing, we raise the physical vibration of the one who is inharmonious. As sickness and disease lower the rate of vibration in the body someone bubbling over with vitality is needed to replenish it. But in order to awaken and intensify the constructive energies in your being, it requires an outside energy, the help of the spirit force. Through the strong force of a magnetic person the vibration in the diseased body can be raised and thus the destructive forces are raised and changed into constructive ones. If the healer can harmonize with you magnetically, and with the spirit that endeavors to work through him, then will he be able to touch the forces of your being, and healing take place. The destructive forces of your being are overcome through the inflow of a greater force intensifying and building up that which is deficient. This is commonly brought about through the "laying on of hands," as it is called, because we here deal with magnetic healing on the plane of I. In this case we do not heal the Body through the Mind but the Mind through the Body, hence the relief may be very gradual. Abscesses and other inharmonies are in this way eliminated, and

CAN SPIRITS BLEED?

I had an interesting discussion with a high I. Q. spirit voice manifesting through an entranced medium, and received details I never had recorded before. The spirit claimed to have been an army officer whose body had bled to death through a shrapnel wound. Here is a question I put to him: "Do spirits bleed if wounded?

His answer came quickly: "Bleeding in the spirit world is a matter of thought. If I think of the mortal wound I received on Earth, I can see the blood flowing -- but the moment I dismiss the thought by high concentration, my spirit body is perfect."

"This is along the line of Christian Science, isn't it?" I asked. "To a certain extent," he said-"but it doesn't work on the flesh body as it does on the spirit, although it helps, for if a mortal can visualize his body as perfect, it tends to heal the flesh; but by a slower process which can be hindered by mortal laws--for flesh is matter and can be damaged by matter, while spirit is energy which cannot be damaged by matter, only by the force of spirit. It is hard to explain because the chemistry is so different. It is like comparing the light of a candle with a sunbeam. You can put out a candle, but only dim a sunbeam by a cloud of mist. Mortal bodies are healed quickly when the healing Light of God is intensified by high spirit force through mortal will-power and faith."

Our discussion brought up the subject of so-called haunted houses, frequented by earthbound ghosts. Here is an interesting explanation received: "A spirit or ghost which haunts, is one which relives in his mind, his mortal tragedy, such as I mentioned about my bleeding. And thought can become so intense that it projects the condition into the mortal environment and can be detected by sensitive mortals who are present. But high spirit can de-haunt and remove the condition. And to a great extent, a strong mortal mind calling upon Godly Light such as Jesus the Christ utilized, can remove haunted conditions and dispel the low spirit force which energizes such hauntings."

This explanation of a haunted house is the best I have received in 40 years of occult reporting. And it indicates the advisability of spirituality which religions try to pro-

SUNBEAM OF GOD

(Lily Dale, N. Y., Easter 1958) Fulton Oursler, the celebrated author of The Greatest Story Ever Told about the Master of Nazareth, told me a month before he died, that he turned against Spiritualism because he saw too much darkness in it. Oursler, who was also an expert magician, said: "Spiritualism without the Resurrection and spirit protection of Jesus Christ, is Black Magic."

I had to admit that not many years ago I heard several prominent Spiritualists emphatically state that Spiritualism didn't need Jesus Christ, nor the Bible which they called "The Black Book." It seems quite obvious that such Spiritualists were prompted by the same black forces that crucified Christ 2,000 years ago: for blackness cannot tolerate the righteous Light of Christ as a purifying sunbeam of God. When you see a Spiritualist displaying hatred, jealousy, greed, vanity or lust, you can conclude that such is the reflection of spirit blackness and not the Christ Light of good-will to man.

A certain dislike of the orthodox Bible and Jesus Christ might result from insults by orthodox anti-Spiritualists-but only a foolish person who has been hurt by his own brothers and sisters, will, in revenge to his kin, desecrate the grave of his mother. One cannot overcome an enemy by poisoning the air which both breathe.

It is about time for Spiritualists as well as orthodox religionists, to take stock of the common Spiritualistic heritage of First Century Christians who were not hampered by doctrine and dogmas, but who saw only the Divine Light from the Spirit World as they walked with God on the Highway of the Nazarene, leading to the Kingdom of Heaven with its Peace and Good

THE BAND OF FORCE By Thurman Rodgers

I was sitting on a farm house porch, several miles from the Atlantic ocean, and some thirty miles south of Philadelphia. Thru psychic power, I became aware of a band of what can best be described as magnetic force, extending from where I was sitting to the eastern end of Long Island, New York, and an unperceived distance beyond. There was no motion in this band that I could perceive, but I saw, where the band crossed the eastern tip of Long Island, something like a small picture, in which were the hands of a friend, a Mr. Johnson. They looked watersoaked and were dead looking, definitely the hands of a drowned man. I carefully noted the exact hour of this experience.

I did not believe that Mr. John son was drowned. He was athletic, experienced in sailing boats. I wrote and asked him the meaning

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of what I had seen, he being well versed in psychic phenomena. When he received my letter, he did not know the answer, so waited several days to reply.

At the very hour I had seen the mental picture of the hands, Mr. Johnson's teen-age son Louis, had been sailing. As he came in to shore, he had found the body of the father of his special friend. He carried the body to the beach and started artificial respiration. No results followed, but he kept at the task, tho weary, thinking "what if this were my father." Physically exhausted, he kept looking at the man's hands, thinking, what if these dead hands were my father's . . . over and over, goading himself to further efforts at resuscitation.

Thus it was that, through the magnetic force field, I had picked up the image in the mind of the lad, not the actual fact. A fair conclusion is that there are channels of force, latent as to motion, sometimes hundreds of miles long, which a medium may find an aid for long distance psychic faculties. The incident also illustrates the truth of what the New Testament teaches: "There is nothing hidden that shall not be revealed.'

Chapter 2 Astral Adventures

The cry of the average person today is "Light, more light! Our ministers do not tell us how we live when we die, neither do they prove that we do live. Our scientists tell us the end is near—any time; we have no promise of the morrow. Where do we go, if anywhere; what is it like; and how do we get ready for it?"

Of course, it is rather late to awaken to the present situation, but it is better now than never. It is true that we may have firsthand witness concerning all these suggestions of interest; it is also true that many of us go nightly to work on the astral plane, see what is there, and know many of the spirit people and their manner of living.

Many a conversation we overhear of the so-called "dead" who find, to their surprise ,that they are more alive than ever. Not only have innumerable discarnate travelers returned to tell us of the continuity of life, but all nature says "There is no death anywhere in all God's universe." We know that the seemingly dead tree of winter buds and blossoms in the spring; that an Egyptian kernel of wheat buried with a mummy in darkness for thousands of years retains its vitalizing life principle, and when planted lives and waves victorious with other seemingly dead seeds. If you have some personal problem to solve, some need to be met, why not try adding loving action to your prayer?

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
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To The Four Winds

I replied: "In my safe deposit box in the bank." Voice: "Look again"; which I did the next day and found the bond inside the mortgage!!

How did spirit dematerialize the bond from my correspondence basket and take it through the steel vaults of the bank and place it inside the mortgage in my box, for it most certainly was not there when it was returned by the Register of Deed office in Camden?

The Mystery of the Vacant Garage

I am president of a company in North Camden which deals in real estate. The company owned a small garage contiguous to a neighboring corporation, which offered to buy the garage. It was leased to a trucker who housed his trucks therein. I notified him a few

months in advance that we wished to terminate the lease on a certain May 1st, when we were obligated to deliver the vacant garage to the purchaser. On the last day of April the trucker was still in possession and gave no indication of vacating! On May 1st I walked down to the garage which was not far from our company's office to see what the situation might be. The garage had been vacated!

Not long after that I was again sitting with LS. I said to Barbara: "I have had a business development in Camden, New Jersey, which has greatly surprised me. Is William Forward around? I would like to ask him whether he had anything to do with it." Man's voice: "He was out. wasn't he?" I said: "Yes," and thanked him. We are left to draw our own conclusions!

What lessons may we learn from this experience and others similar thereto? That our spirit friends are working with us, helping us in our daily tasks in ways we may not be able to understand, but in which we can believe.

Spirit Communication by Telephone

I had frequently discussed with my friend Henry Balderston the subject of psychic research. I believe he was convinced of the validity of spirit communication and its attendant mysteries. In February, 1953, his wife, Cara Balderston, after a protracted illness, passed on and within twenty-four hours Henry also "died" from a heart attack.

About two weeks later on a certain evening, my mediumistic friend LS called me on the phone and said: "Mr. Wood, I feel impressed to call you on the phone. I am told you will be sitting in your living room listening to the radio," (which I confirmed). "I always like to obey these impressions for if I don't they cease coming. Yet I am always surprised when I find they are true!" The voice of Barbara Hutchinson then came over the wire, I said, "Barbara, two of my very dear friends have just passed on to the World of Spirit and I told my wife before supper this evening that I could not get their names out of my mind." "Sure," said Barbara, "they were impressing themselves upon you and they are now standing in front of you, a man and a woman." With that a man's voice came over the phone: "We have been so glad to discover that what thee has been telling us is true. We are free from all pain and suffering and worry." I replied: "Is this thee, Henry?"

"Yes," said the voice.

Then LS' voice came over the

phone, "I hear her saying, 'Come along Henry, come along'." (Very typical) I asked LS whether he could hear what the Spirits were saying on the phone. He replied: "It sounds as tho you were speaking with someone at your end of the line but I cannot tell what they are saying." Evidently he heard clairaudiently what Cara was saying to Henry!

This is but another example of numerous experiences of having spoken over the phone with those who have passed into the World of Spirit. I know of others who claim to have had the same experience. So we advance in learning the laws of the spirit world.

One More Evidential Incident

On a certain evening a spirit came in, stating that his name was Albert Sergeant, that he had lived on Cotswold Road, Bedminister Downs, Bristol. His accent was very English, so we assumed it was Bristol, England. He said that he had been crushed to death at the Avonmouth Docks January 1, 1955, that he was 58 years old, and that he was an electrician by trade. Beatrice Morris, deceased 50 years ago, wrote this record on the tablet which we found after the meeting was over.

I immediately wrote to the Mayor of Bristol, stating these facts and asked if he could confirm them from the records of their Bureau of Vital Statistics.

I received the following letter from the "Council House of Bristol" under the date of February 15, 1955:

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Accordingly I set about arranging an interview. A recorded verbatim account of the program follows.

Telecast interview arranged by Dr. Hal Styles for Rev. Keith Milton Rhinchart with Paul Coates of Station KTTV. Channel 11 March 28, 1958, 10:30 p.m.

Coates: These are the hands of a spiritual medium in a trance state. He claims to be controlled by one, Dr. Robert Kensington from the world of spirit. Coates: Now if you believe that psychic healing is the real thing, why do you recommend that they go to the doctor first? Why isn't the quickest route to the psychic healer?

Keith: Because, both I and those who guide and control me from the other world, do not believe in infringing upon man-made laws; and there are many laws throughout the United States against doing various things involved in healing unless one has a medical license Coates: Now I wasn't able to see

you when you were in trance and when you were touching those things (referring to coals) am I correct in assuming that he did touch his face with them in his hands? Do you have any feeling of being burned by what you Keith: No. I have no feeling of

being burned whatsoever, sir, (Camera on hands) Coates: Have you ever seen this

done by any person who didn't feel that they were psychic? Who might have just been under a hypnotic trance? Keith: Yes, such a phase in and

by itself, does not prove survival. But in my particular case, coupled with other phases of mediumship, I do believe, because of my assumption of being controlled, and the fact that another entity claims to be manifesting through me, that this is a reasonable proof of spiritual protection, and of mind over the physical body.

Coates: You don't feel this is merely self-hypnosis . . . that you engage in . . . perhaps without even realizing it. Keith: I know it is not

Coates: Let me phrase that another way. Do you feel that with other people, self-hypnosis would make it possible for them to put their hands into this burning charcoal?

Keith: Yes I do. Because I believe that the mind of man, when tapped to its fullest extent, can produce much of such supernormal phenomena that humanity is seemingly unaware of.

Coates: This is your first trip to Los Angeles, is n't it Reverend? Keith: Yes sir.

Coates: What is the purpose of thic vieit?

Keith: This visit is part of a world tour that I have just completed for the cause of Spiritualism, in which I am a duly ordained minister I have just completed visiting over 40 countries and demonstrating various phases of mediumship in 20 of them. This is my last stop before going to my home church in Seattle

Coates: How were you received in most of these countries?

Keith: Very well, Mr. Coates, I find that Spiritualism, while being a minority group in America, is a majority group in many other countries, even though the organized, legalized movement only began about 110 years ago anywhere in the world. I have discovered that in many cities where I visited, the cities would have tables of newspaper men and reporters, and various prominent people in politics, even kings and prime ministers who were interested in these things and felt that there was something beyond normal everyday happenings.

Coates: In what countries do you feel that Spiritualism is gaining the most success?

Krith: I believe Brazil is one of the greatest countries in which it has shown success, where there are approximately 18 million Spiritualists in the organized churches. There are many hundreds of thousands of Spiritualists in England and in the Union of South Africa. There are over 3 million Spiritualists in Indo-China functioning under the name of Catoists, a move-

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MEDIUMSHIP AT WONEWOC

Camp Wonewoo, the only Spiritualist Camp in Wisconsin, is rapidly becoming known for the excellent talent it provides each year for the people of Wisconsin and surrounding states. It is located on a bluff about 150 feet above the village of Wonewoc. Highway 33 runs through the village, and signs are placed there to direct visitors to the Camp.

When I went to Wonewoc last year, I was privileged to attend some of the seances of the prominent Rev. Warren M. Smith, Pastor of the Two Worlds Spiritualist Chapel of Coldwater, Michigan. His seances are well known and well liked, and the spirit forces are able to build up so strongly that the red light is one of the strongest one will find in seances anywhere in the country.

On the first day of his engagement, last year, a group of twelve gathered for a seance. There were people in this group from Wisconsin, Michigan and even as far away as Florida. 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fully developed.

When it came time for the people from Florida to go to the cabinet, a mother and daughter, Firefly promised them an unusual experience. The father of the girl materialized and asked his daughter why she wore her hair in a pony tail, adding that he disliked it that way. Then he went around in the back and untied the ribbon that held her hair, handing it to a friend who sat across the room

A few minutes later, as the girl's mother stood in front of the cabinet, the maternal grandmother came thru and asked the girl if she had ever seen her hair. The girl said no, whereupon the grandmother described the hair she had had when on earth as a beautiful auburn, adding that she would give her a lock of her hair to keep. However, she instructed the girl to check this against the medium's hair to be sure it was not some of his, Rev. Smith has red hair, not auburn as was the grandmother's!

Several times the materialized forms came clear across the room and sat down on chairs vacated by those at the cabinet. When I stepped to the cabinet, my Indian jested with me concerning my new crew cut. He then walked over to my mother, took a bobby pin from her hair and placed it in mine, or what was left of it! Such strength at a materialization seance is unusual, because it takes much energy from both the sitter and the medium to produce such excellent re-

Toward the close of the seance, Clarence Britten made an appearance. His work was well known as he had worked at the Camp many times before his passing. Firefly in closing, as a special treat, sang the Lord's Prayer. For a world of rapturous beauty in sound, I can truly say it was the most beautiful singing I have ever heard from the world of spirit.

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SUPPLY THRU PRAYER By Arthur B. Hartley

As my beloved teacher, Rev. Florence S. Becker, Pastor of the Golden Gate Spiritualist Church of San Francisco, Calif., has told her students so often, real prayer is the aspiration of one's Soul to the Oversoul. Real prayer is giving thanks for the munificent bounty of God and Nature, not the fearful cry of cringing humanity asking forgiveness for fancied sins, or relief from pain and distress.

Everything that primitive man did not understand was attributed to the Gods, and prayer was the vehicle through which he contacted his God. So he gave thanks to his God for the good things of life, and endeavored to have the disagreeablé features aleviated by petition, sacrifice, or some other method. As all people over the centuries have fashioned a God unto themselves, so these gods were considered capricious, wrathful deities which must be placated in some fashion. Thus prayer became a give and take proposition--We will sacrifice that which we hold dear if you will withhold your wrath from us, and relieve us of the storm or pestilence which is causing the distress, said man to his god. Therefore fear was the motivating impulse behind prayer all through the ages for a large segment of humanity.

At first prayer was probably a personal affair, each individual praying for protection or for supply. Then prayer in groups came into use. As religious groups became larger and more powerful, those who originally were the guardians and keepers of the temples, altars and religious shrines, were in a position to take over the lucritive duty of being the intermediaries between the members of these groups and their particular deity, dispensing that deity's munificense for goods or treasure. Thus prayer took on an undesirable aspect. Slowly mankind is realizing that prayer is an elevating and inspiring thing, and is powerful for good when used intelligently.

The realization that God is an all-pervading power-All Good, All Love-which is everywhere present, and that we are part of God, gives an entirely different viewpoint regarding prayer. We do not pray to someone at a distance from us-out there somewhere, who may or may not hear our prayer. We realize God is within us, and that potentially all things are ours now. Our problem is to bring all these things into manifestation through our right thinking and acting, and our endeavor to obey God's Spiritual laws-then it becomes evident "a good man's life is


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Stainton Moses

By A. E. Powel

"Two Worlds," quoting from "Light," reports an address given by Constance Sitwell, revealing hitherto unknown facts about Rev. Stainton Moses, author of "Spirit Teachings," often named the "Spiritualists's Bible."

She found the data in eight large typed volumes, which he did not want published in full during his lifetime, considering that the time was not "ripe" for complete disclosure.

Moses, an Angelican parson, was not a professional medium; in fact, the whole subject repelled him. "Spirit Teachings," which came through his own hand, was practically forced upon him.

Mrs. Sitwell lists some phenomena that occurred in his presence. Seated in a chair, with others round him, luminous spirit figures were seen standing near, as well as materialized arms and hands. Spirit lights of many kinds were frequent. Spirit hands were seen to write at a distance from the medium, the writing sometimes needing a magnifying glass to be legible. Occasionally it came in mirror form.

Drawings were made at lightning speed: red and blue writing, when no such pencils were in the room. Writing included Greek lettering and old English Black Letter Script.

Spirit drapery was seen and handled. There was music of harps, bells, violins and pianos, and clashes so loud as to be startling. Heavy furniture was moved, impossible for a man to accomplish normally. Apports included flowers, gems and rings.

Amongst many delectable scents were those of roses, violets, heliotrope, sandalwood, musk, peppermint, verbena, and others. Liquid scents ran down from the ceiling, stained papers and handkerchiefs, and remained for days.

Knowledge communicated through automatic writing surpassed that of the medium, including obscure musical history—Moses being devoid of musical sense.

In the dark, signatures of famous men were produced, and found to be facsimiles of specimens in the British Museum. Also in the dark, there was spirit writing at a distance from Moses. He refused to make public the names of his communicators, some of whom were famous. He saw them as luminous figures or as pillars of misty light.

Two of his intimates were Dr. and Mrs. Speer, who record various scents being brought to the

circle, sometimes on heavy breezes that swept round. At request, liquid musk would be poured on to hands or handkerchiefs. Scent was nearly always found on the medium's head, and the more it was wiped off the stronger and more plentiful it became.

A light was seen in the shape of an upright cup, which felt hard and cold to the touch—light without heat!

Spirit drapery was felt by Mrs. Speer across hands and face, described as more like flax than muslin. At this seance, with the med'um in trance, the light being held by a communicator, a long thin, hairy arm and hand, quite unlike that of the medium, beame visible.

While all sitters' hands were joined around the table, sounds came from a harmonium; other sounds were produced with no musical instruments in the room.

Fairy bells sounded like glasses being struck by a hammer. At request, they would run up and down a scale, in perfect tune.

Often there were sounds of an instrument like a 'cello, but more powerful and sonorous. There was the soft tone of a clarinet, increasing to the loudness of a trumpet: also an exact imitation of an ordinary handbell.

All information given was exactly true.

Moses developed clairvoyance till he could see and converse at length with the invisible friends. Once a communicator promised to produce a jewel, which Moses had seen clairvoyantly, like a topaz, but of a delicate pink hue. The medium was told to have it made as a ring-amulet, which he was to wear, for its influence.

A fortnight later, Moses, on waking, found, in the place where he kept his watch, a large pink topaz set as a ring.

prayer perpetual."

So it would seem that we must pray to open up the channels through which God answers our prayers, and that our constructive, positive thinking and our grateful realization of God's presence within, does much to open up these channels and bring to us things that are in divine order and that we merit. And the more we pray and the more grateful we are for the present supply-even though it be scanty-the more we will receive. The supply will not be scanty long if we pray with a grateful heart.

In February of last year Bias was one of the mediums at St. Petersburg, Fla., through whom both Edison and Steinmetz gave spoken messages to the present writer, and in the following June similar messages to Wright and myself together at Schenectady. They were quoted in the first article of this series.

"During the visit to Chesterfield." Wright resumes, "Steinmetz materialized for me(so that his spirit form could be seen) through the mediumship of Mrs. Mary Langlie Beattie. He said, 'I want to get in touch with my own people.' There was the same characteristic strut, the hunch back, the jutting beard, the long thin cigar, and he carried a small American flag."

Steinmetz, born in Germany, had been an American citizen many years before his passing, and never overlooked an opportunity to assert his Americanism.

"Is that an American flag?" I asked. It was not clearly shown, for it hung in folds.

"'Yes, can't you see it?' And the materialized Steinmetz held the flag up by opposite corners, so that it was clearly visible.

"'He wants to get in touch with his own people,' interjected Jewett Clark, attendant at the cabinet from which Steinmetz had emerged. Such obvious repetitions are sometimes made for emphasis.

"What does he mean by that?' I asked. It was evident that the

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spirit-scientist was having difficulty expressing himself. This happens frequently in first contacts.

"'Would you know an Alexanderson-a Dr Alexanderson- Are you of General Electric? Schenectady? Wasn't this man (the spirit) a German? Wasn't he connected with public life? Wasn't he known as C.P.?'

The following then came through

Clark, himself a mental medium:

"Yes, to everything,' I replied.

"What does he mean by his own people? His former associates? His relatives?'

"'I don't know'."

The next morning Wright arranged for a sitting with Clark. Steinmetz, he felt, had more to tell him; that the flag had a significance that had been missed. The great scientist had been a familiar figure in the laboratories and offices of General Electric, and for years Wright had seen him almost daily, and sometimes was present in small groups over which Steinmetz presided.

"I don't think he has come to me for any particular reason," he told clark, "but because I meant General Electric to him and engaged in defense work, or because through me he wants to get in touch with others. Can you supplement what we received last night?"

"I will try . . . I think it is his former associates he wants to reach, and I get the impression there were four of them."

"Would Dr. Alexanderson be one of them? He was a pioneer of radio communication and inventor of the Alexanderson Alternator. Hewhose boy was kidnapped. I know him."

"Didn't Steinmetz have his own cypher?" Clark asked.

"Not exactly a cypher, but he kept his notehooks in a shorthand of his own devising. I have a copy of the key."

"The reason I mention this is because I see a notebook and writing around the edges of one of the pages. Some of the characters resemble Hebrew script. He signs it C.P. He seems to want to call attention to this notebook; that it contains information which may be valuable in connection with national defense. Is that right?"

"Yes."

Nothing further of evidential interest came through at this time.

"The following day," continues Wright, "I had a sitting with Mrs. Mary Murphy Lydy (since deceased.) She transmitted spirit voices in broad daylight. Any scientific man not willing to bow his head in humility after having been a witness to this would no longer be a scientist. There were several other witnesses.

"The room was as well illumin-

ated as a sun porch. The voices were audible to all of us. This may seem incredible, but so it was. The only other medium who could so well produce this phenomenon, to my knowledge, was Mrs. Sophia Williams of Chicago-the medium whom Hamlin Garland (late popular American novelist) used in his search for some buried crosses."

Wright later was to sit in experimental seances in daylight with the Rev. Frederick Mitchell at Schenectady. I was present at one

"My brother came through first," reports Wright. "I then asked for Steinmetz, and immediately a voice announced that he was C. P.

"Dr. Steinmetz, when you materialized for me your message was incomplete."

"Yes. I want to get in touch with Arthur H. Compton-C-O-M-P-T-O-N." (The name was spelled out slowly, loudly, and deliberately.)

"Have you any message for him?"

"Tell him I am still carrying on. He will understand."

Dr. Compton is the Nobel Prizewinning scientist who has had much to do with the development of the atomic bomb.

Previously, in the sitting with Clark, the medium had asked whether the names David and Roger or Rodney meant anything to Wright, who said they did not, at the time. But now, following the Steinmetz mention of Dr. Compton, the Wright report says:

"It was then that I suddenly awakened to the meaning of Clark's question. David was William David Coolidge, and Rodney was William Rodney Whitney, my superior in the research laboratory at General Electric. They were known to their intimates, respectively, by their middle names. Steinmetz would have called Dr. Whitney 'Rodney' and Dr. Coolidge 'David' just as he used to call Dr. Alexanderson 'Alec.'

"Dr. Whitney at that time was vice president in charge of research and Dr. Coolidge director of the laboratory. He is best known for his invention of the Coolidge X-ray tube. Dr. Arthur H. Compton at this time was director of the Ryerson Physical Laboratory at the University of Chicago. I wrote a full account of the foregoing seances to Dr. Compton. Here is his reply:

ment that started in 1925 as a result of spiritual philosophy and c om munications which began through what is commonly known as an ouija board.

Coates: How many believers of Spiritualism are there in the United States?

Keith: I would say, at least 100,-000, probably more. But an accurate census has never been made.

Coates: In just a moment I'd like to ask you some questions, if you don't mind, about your personal life. Will that be all right? Keith: Yes sir.

Coates: We'll continue in just a moment. (to audience) I'll be back after this message from . . .

Commercial

Keith: . . . May I please correct my last answer to your question, as I did not realize that you meant the full membership in the United States. I do believe that there are approximately 100,000 Spiritualists in the Southern California area, however, in the United States, I would estimate at least 2 or 212 million organized Spiritualists, plus many millions of people who are interested, and sometimes investigate without letting it be known they are interested.

Coates: Well now . . . how old are you Reverend?

Keith: I'm 21 years of age, sir.

Coates: And when was the first time that you exhibited psychic ability?

Keith: I believe that I first demonstrated psychic ability, without being aware of it, between the ages of three and eight. In this period of my life, phenomena came, manifestations from the spirit planes (known, as I later discovered) as Poltergistic phenomena. That is telekenetic phenomena . . . movement of objects around a room without any physical contact. However, this was disorganized, and I did not fully comprehend its meaning until later in my life when I began reading books on Spiritualism at the age of eight, after my mother had introduced me to the Science and Health books - the textbok of Christian Science which has a chapter against Spiritualism in it.

Coates: Now it seems to me that it's rather routine for objects to crash to the floor in a mysterious manner whenever a three year old child happens to be in the room. What would you say made your case a psychic one?

Keith: From my investigations later into the organized movement of Spiritualism, I would say that the phenomena at its greatest, in my early youth, was a result perhaps of a seperation between my parents, because it has been discovered by such great psychical researchers as Hereward Carrington, that often psychical phenomena is associated with the nervous system of the medium; an emotional disturbance will often produce a helter-skelter display of unorganized phenomena. However, after my association with the Movement itself, my phenomena became organized and I was completely awaye of it and its full meaning.

Coates: Isn't it possible, don't you think, that the break up of your home at that very crucial time in your life, caused you perhaps to start imagining things that just didn't happen?

Keith: No, I'm positive of it, because my mother and my grandmother both witnessed such things and felt that they were supernormal manifestations. Without fully realizing their significance.

Coates: Are you the only psychic member of your family?

Keith: My mother and grandmother were both intuitive, and had the phase of mediumship known as Precognition. That is the phase in which one is able to pierce the veil of the future and be able to see sometimes, personal events that will come into one's life. They were psychic or intuitive in this manner, but I am the first in the family to develop an organized display of mental and physical phenomena. That is, phenomena coming through me, and phenomena caming apart from my physical organism.

Coates: When did you decide that you were being contacted by spirits?

Keith: I first was fully aware of the fact that I was being used as a telephone between two worlds, when I was 15 years of age, when Dr. Kensington first controlled me without my expecting it. I had left the Baptist Church at the age of 12, because I was told miracles could no longer occur. When I was 14, I saw an ad in the personal column of the newspaper in my home city, saying that a Spiritualist church was opening. I joined the church, and I sat in what is known as a Psychic Development Class under a very spiritual minister of the church. It was in this class that a visiting medium called out my name in full, although he did not know me) and gave me other proof of communication and survival. Then he told me that a man whose name was Dr. Robert John Kensington was present from the world of spirit, who would be one of my guardian angels and some day take me in trance and that I would become a medium who would cross many oceans in my travels.

Coates: Well now, as we know, you founded, later in life, your own-not too much later incidentally-you founded your own Spiritualist group which now haswhat did you say?-300 members?

Keith: Over 300 members.

Coates: . . . over 300 members? Keith: Yes sir.

Coates: Now . . . how are you able to support yourself?

Keith: I am a minister of the church and I receive a salary as any other minister of any incorporated church does.

Coates: Would you care to tell us what that salary is . . . or would you rather not?

Keith: I'll be most happy to. My salary is \$300 per month.

Coates: Do you charge anything for holding seances?

Keith: I charge nothing. Everything is on a complete donational. free-will basis.

Coates: Now Reverend, how much formal education have you had?

Keith: Well, I completed high school, and was offered four scholarships when I graduated from high school. I took none of them so that I could come to the West Coast where I knew quite a large group of spiritualists. And I have been going to the University of Washington in Seattle for three years now.

Coates: What about your classmates? Do they kid you about your Spiritualist work?

Keith: No . . . the ones whom I feel would not fully comprehend the truth of the matter, do not know fully, my work. The ones who do understand and know, are usually quite sympathetic and skep-

Keith: Well, I have done dating in my life. Especially my first year at the University. I lived at the fraternity house, and they had many social events every weekend. But since my church has increased in membership from the 15 members I started with two years ago, I have had less and less time for personal things, and therefore do no dating now.

Coates: You feel the sacrifice is worth it?

Keith: I certainly do.

Coates: We'll continue in just a moment . .

Keith: Thank you very much. Coates: I'll be back after this message from . . .

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Coates: Now Rev. Rhinehart . . . again on the personal level, I think you'll agree that the story you told me tonight . . . the story of a broken home . . . a home without a father . . . is not really a healthy

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place for a child. You yourself said that this might have incited some of the psychic powers within you. Now it seems you're still living an abnormal life . . , you're busy with your church and you're not dating . . . you're not planning to get married in the immediate future, or the near future. Do you think that you're giving yourself a chance to develop into an emotionally healthy adult?

Keith: I certainly do! I perhaps . . . (to the average mind which is quite ignorant about the organized movement of Spiritualism) would appear to be abnormal in that respect. However, I feel that I'm mature enough to control my life with just as much dignity and education and work as anyone else. I work for my living . . . I study . . and when the right girl comes along, why I certainly won't be against marriage. So I feel that I am capable of handling my life in a perfectly normal manner.

Contes: You say the average mind is ignorant . . . the average mind that doesn't understand these things. Is that mind . . . do you think . . . less happy than the psychically developed mind?

Keith: No. not necessarily. We, in the movement of Spiritualism do not believe that Spiritualism is meant for everyone. Neither do we recommend it as the only path, or as the best path. For we believe in the essential goodness of all religions, and that only those who are ready to see more of the mysteries of man's inner nature and his inner Divinity, and his contact with greater forces than his own, are ready, and therefore will seek out, these things.

Coates: Well Rev. Rhinehart, thank you very much for being here tonight.

Keith: Thank you very much, Mr. Coates.

Coates: Well that's tonight's report. As far as I'm concerned, I don't know. I'll leave it to you . . . what do you think? Now, until Monday's headline . . . this is Paul Coates saying goodnight.

Announcer: Tonight's guest was Keith Milton Rhinehart, America's youngest Spirit Medium.

Ed Note: The following day, Rev. Rhinehart called on the phone, and during the conversation mentioned that the coals had been preheated for better than two hours before the broadcast, and were the hottest he had ever handled. (Rev. Rhinehart works in semi-trance and is somewhat aware of what transpires.) Watching the televised program, it was easy to see that the coals WERE extremely hot, as many burst into fragments on being touched. The only result to Rev. Rhinehart during this demonstration were black smears from the coals, where they had been placed upon his face. One fact is well worth mentioning here. Many have claimed that those who accomplish this difficult feat of handling red hot coals, have used something to keep from being burned. Before the broadcast, Rev. Rhinehart was carefully examined for any protective coating, and none was found of any kind.

The demonstration was a remarkable feat, using power both from the world of the Unseen Realms, and Rev. Rhinehart's ability to become an instrument for spirit demonstration.

" 'Thank you for your letter of September 28th with regard to Dr. Steinmetz. In the form that the message comes, I must say that it means nothing to me. I shall, however, see if it is possible to follow up the matter here. If anything develops, I shall let you know'.

"This letter meant to me that had the message come in another form, it might have been intelligible. Also, it meant that Dr. Compton was in touch with mediums or a medium through which it might be possible to 'follow up the matter' and finally ,a willingness to let me know the result if he obtained any corroboration.

"A few weeks afterward. Dr. Compton lectured before the research staff of General Electric. I approached him after the lecture. introduced myself, and asked if he had anything to report. He said he had been having sittings with Mrs. Sophia Williams, that he had tried to arrange a sitting with her before coming to Schenectady, but had been unsuccessful on account of his activities for the National Research Defense Council.

"I met him again about two months later in the Tuder Room of the Hotel Commodore in New York. At that meeting he expressed his regret that thus far he had been unable to have further sittings with Mrs. Williams for, 'Mr. Wright,' he said, 'I have no doubt whatsoever but that Steinmetz returned to help us in our war work.' Brave words from an eminent man."

They were brave words for Dr. Compton to speak, for at that time few scientists would admit belief in survival of human personality and communication between this life and the next.

In the next installment Mr. Wright will tell of another return of Steinmetz and Edison, and of his search for Steinmetz's notebooks in the Schenectady Museum.

Sometimes she tactfully adds that she sees no reason why Gabriel, the arch angel, should ever blow his horn, since very few souls ever wait for him to do so, but come out of their graves just the same, even as great people such as Moses and Elijah who some 2000 years ago came back to talk to the Master Jesus about his dying, were seen and heard also by Peter, James and John. Samuel came back and talked with Saul; and at the time of Jesus' resurrection, the Bible says 'the graves opened and people went into the Holy City, Jerusalem, where they appeared to many,' and seemed to disregard Gabriel and his trumpet." The physician smiled an understanding, friendly smile.

3 : I

Force and Power of Being

On this plane people dwell in all the various manifestations of force and power. Here we use force and power to overcome some of the conditions in which we may find ouselves. In the first plane, Might is Right; Might to overcome the weakened condition wherever found. It is here that we find the Darwinian theory very much in evidence, the survival of the fittest-the strong will overpowering the weak. It is the plane where, if you are hurt, you retaliate and hurt the one that hurts you. Here then, we find the beginning of war; the supremacy of might and strength and power.

The "controls" from this plane are those who use the body of the medium forcibly, for example they cause the medium to go through contortions during the process of entrancement. The "controls" do not use the medium intelligently, they merely use the force. They commence the drawing of the force necessary for the production of physical phenomena. No messages are given.

4 : I

Psychic or Sensitive of Being

This is the plane where sensitive and psychic children dwell. We here can understand why sensitive children should be dealt with kindly and not harshly. In place of gruff treatment and continued fault finding, we should reason with them, and touch their little souls instead of their bodies. We should speak to them in a kindly tone of voice and try to gain their confidence and not punish the body, thus antagonizing these little ones; if we do this, we lose ground, and instead of rising, we slip further down. What a foolish idea to say, "I must hurt it, otherwise it will never mind me."

Here you have been ruling through fear. (This world has always been ruled through fear.) This is wrong as you cannot reach the Mind through the Body; only Mind can reach Mind. The body is only a tool of the mind. We need not reach the mind through the suffering of the body. If the mind is awakened and the soul senses are aroused, we must govern well our voice for the tone of the voice may hurt more than physical torture. Soul of Being

This plane commences the awakening of the soul and reason of the individual; and we are prompted to pray.
